## State Revolving Fund FY 2023 Intended Use Plan Approved

The Iowa Environmental Protection Commission (EPC) approved the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Intended Use Plans (IUP) for fiscal year 2023 (July 1, 2022-June 30, 2023). The Commission took the action on June 21, 2022 during their meeting.

## Reminder - Upcoming Hearing on Proposed Renewal of NPDES General Permits

The NPDES Section is proposing a rule change that will renew five of Iowa's NPDES general permits for wastewater discharges. These general permits cover certain wastewater discharges from mining and processing facilities (GP5), well construction activities (GP6), pesticide applications (GP7), hydrostatic testing, tank ballasting, and water lines (GP8), and dewatering activities and household geothermal systems (GP9). GP8 and GP9 are proposed to be renewed because these permits will expire on June 30, 2023.

A public hearing on the proposed rule will be held via Zoom on July 6, 2022, from 1:00 to 2:00 pm. Persons who wish to attend the public hearing must register in advance using the following link:
