### Enrich Iowa: Overview

"I hope that having some special events for the Summer Library Program will be a way to get more children excited and involved...and reading! We've never had funds to pay for special programming before." *Albert City Public Library* 

"Children are taking advantage of another afternoon when the library is open. We have several children who are loners or run the streets. The library is a fun and safe place to spend a couple of hours."

"We had eight Hispanic families move into town and {with the Spanish collection} we can now offer information to them." *Fredericksburg Public Library* 

"Each month, over 100 people use our computers. We also provide Internet classes for senior citizens." *Lowden Public Library*  In accordance with 2000 IOWA ACTS 1223 (5)(5), the State Library of Iowa submits this status report on the uses and impact of state funding provided to Iowa public libraries through the Enrich Iowa Program.

Enrich Iowa funds allowed for:

- Increased library hours
- Improved Internet access for the public
- New books, including audio and large print
- Enhanced programs for children and adults
- Safer, more accessible buildings
- Staff training

This year, the majority of Enrich Iowa funds were used to purchase books and other materials. New encyclopedias, books-on-tape and large-print books were especially needed in many communities. The remark from the Ventura Public Library was indicative of many others: "We had an elderly lady who could only read large print. She was homebound and we would try to get as many books to her as possible. She was so thankful for the books. Enrich Iowa funds really enrich everyone's lives."

Enrich Iowa is also a great incentive for continued professional development. Participation in continuing education programs such as Public Library Management I & II increased last year, bringing the total number of certified public library directors to 394 of 540.

The impact of last year's Enrich Iowa funding increase to \$1 million is reflected in the myriad ways library boards and directors improved services according to community needs. For many, the local library is the only place in town to use a computer, access the Internet, make photocopies or do research. Yet some libraries struggle to meet people's basic informational needs. Enrich Iowa means the difference between living in isolation or having the world at your fingertips. As reflected in this report, public libraries play a central role in their communities. Libraries are a critical part of Iowa's rich educational tradition.

> "Enrich Iowa funds have helped us toward our goal of accreditation. The new ramp has created a very good impression with patrons. The bathroom is to be completed in December 2000. None of this would have been possible without Enrich Iowa funds." *Stanton Public Library*

> "We have a family with an autistic child who are regular patrons. We were able to purchase books for children and adults to help them understand autism. The parents have been able to provide these books to his class and teachers to help make school a more comfortable experience for him. As a small town with a small budget, this would not have been possible without Enrich Iowa funding." *Sutherland Public Library*

> "One of our library customers has terminal cancer. Her late husband was Italian and she lived in Italy for 10 to 15 years. She wanted to see some classic Italian films. ### Enrich Iowa: Program Description

Enrich Iowa moves library service in Iowa closer to the statewide vision for library service:

"Each Iowan will have equal access to information and ideas in order to lead an enriched life through lifelong learning and to participate knowledgeably and productively in a democratic society." (Unified Plan for Library Service in Iowa, 1994)


The direct state aid program for public libraries was recommended by the Governor of Iowa and passed by the Iowa General Assembly in 1999. The program is designed to improve library service and reduce inequities in library services among communities; to enhance, not replace local funding; and to encourage achievement of recognized and adopted public library standards.

The three-part funding formula includes:

- 1. Base amount based on level of achievement within three tiers of standards.
- 2. Per capita amount based on level of achievement within three tiers of standards.
- 3. Three percent (3%) of the funding received by the library in the previous year for services to rural residents and to contracting communities.
