




UI Stanley Museum of Art opens today



The University of Iowa's Stanley Museum of Art opens today in a new, state-of-the-art facility, **marking its return more than 14 years after a historic flood** devastated downtown Iowa City and the UI campus.

Following a public dedication at 3 p.m., which will be [streamed live](#), visitors will be able to **view the inaugural exhibition, "Homecoming,"** featuring the museum's world-class collection of art that has been housed at the **Figge Art Museum** since the flood, and enjoy live music and art activities through Saturday.



The opening events are supported, in part, by funding from the **Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs** through its partnerships with the **National Endowment for the Arts** and **National Endowment for the Humanities**.

Former Iowa poet laureate to be inducted into Iowa Women's Hall of Fame

Former Iowa Poet Laureate **Mary Swander** is one of four women to be inducted this month into the Iowa Women's Hall of Fame.

The celebrated author, playwright, storyteller, educator and musician will be formally inducted during an **awards ceremony at 9:30 a.m. Aug. 27 at the Des Moines Playhouse**. The three other new inductees are **Elizabeth Cowles, Mary Richards and Laurie Schipper**.


Swander, pictured, served as Iowa's poet laureate 2009-2019 and is a distinguished professor emerita who taught creative writing for 30 years at Iowa State University. She has also published numerous books of poetry and nonfiction, and contributed radio commentaries for National Public Radio, The Nation, The New York Times Magazine and Poetry Magazine.

Today, she is executive director of **AgArts** and hosts the podcast, "AgArts from Horse & Buggy Land." She also serves as artistic director of **Swander Woman Productions** and has performed her dramas in venues across the country.


Co-presented by the **Iowa Arts Council** and **Iowa Alliance for Arts Education**, this is a great opportunity to take arts education to the next level.

The journal, established in 1863, is distributed quarterly to hundreds of subscribers throughout the United States and Canada, and its digital footprint is even larger, with **more than 2 million downloads from readers throughout the globe**, including more than 400,000 downloads in 2021.

The call for art is organized by the Iowa Arts Council and State Historical Society of Iowa, both divisions of the Iowa Department of Cultural Affairs.

Iowa Creative Placemaking Fund

Iowa cities and counties that want to create attractive and memorable places for people to live and work are encouraged to apply for the Iowa Economic Development Authority's Iowa Creative Placemaking Fund, now available through the **Destination Iowa** program. Nonprofit organizations may submit a coordinated application with a city or county. The program encourages cities and counties to develop transformational projects that leverage local community assets to improve the experience for visitors and residents of the area. Community placemaking projects and recreational opportunities are vital

Iowa Tourism Grants

Tourism-related organizations – including nonprofits, for-profits, cities, counties, and regional government and planning entities – can apply for the Iowa Tourism Grant. The program is overseen by the Iowa Economic Development Authority and is targeted to tourism-related marketing, meetings or events. For the FY23 grant cycle, \$300,000 is available and awards will range from \$2,500 to \$10,000 with a required 25 percent cash match.
