## SRF Socioeconomic Assessment Tool is Now **Available for Public Use**

At their meeting on September 20, 2022, the Iowa Environmental Protection Commission approved the state fiscal year 2023 Intended Use Plan (IUP) second guarter updates and Annexes for both the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) Programs. With this approval, the SRF Program will begin using the Socioeconomic Assessment Tool (FY 2023) as the affordability criteria to determine if a community is considered disadvantaged for the purposes of SRF loan forgiveness.

Beginning with the December 1, 2022 application cycle, SRF applicants will be asked to include a copy of the Socioeconomic Assessment Tool worksheet with their Intended Use Plan Application. The Socioeconomic Assessment Tool can be located on the SRF Resources page under General Information or on the SRF BIL Funding Opportunities page.

The Socioeconomic Assessment Tool uses 15 data points representing social, economic, and demographic information from public sources to evaluate a borrower's relative disadvantage compared to other lowa communities. SRF applicants with a socioeconomic score between 11 and 30 points will be eligible for consideration of SRF base program loan forgiveness and may qualify to receive loan forgiveness from the federal fiscal year 2022 BIL General Supplemental Fund (when combined with the other elements of the loan forgiveness equation).
