

It's The Law

In 1978, the Sixty-Seventh General Assembly passed "An Act relating to the establishment of a depository library center within the Iowa library department."

What The Law Means To You

It means that citizens throughout Iowa can easily find what publications state agencies have issued and obtain copies of those which interest them.

The Depository Center

The Center collects and distributes the official publications of Iowa state government agencies to depository libraries.

Thousands of new publications are issued each year and include directories, reports, regulations, newsletters, pamphlets and other printed material paid for with public funds.

Most Iowa libraries have some Iowa publications. What they don't have, they borrow for you from Iowa depository libraries. These depositories, selected on the basis of geographical location and population to be served, are sent copies of Iowa publications by the Depository Center.

All Iowa residents have access to Iowa documents through the depository system. Residents of other states have access through interlibrary loan.

How To Obtain These Materials

Go to (or call) your local library. Even if your local library is not a depository library ... the staff there can get you the material you need from the depository library through interlibrary loan ... or they can tell you how to obtain a copy from the agency.


