### Next in the Boardroom Series ...

Policy Watch on November 30 The fourth installment of *The Boardroom* series for this year turns to policies, with a discussion of some topics not commonly addressed. *Policy Watch: Policy Topics Lost and Found* is scheduled for Wednesday November 30 (6:00-7:30PM)



Standard #7 calls for library boards to adopt four required policies: personnel, circulation, collections, and Internet use. All libraries meeting standards at a Tier 1 level have those policies in place and many others. But there are some policy topics that are not as commonly found. State Library consultants Samantha Bouwers and Bonnie McKewon will point to some of those like determining closed holidays, as well as issues surrounding library programming and the library's use of social media.

November's **Boardroom** webinar also welcomes guest speaker Rachel Onuf, Program Director with Vermont Historical Records. Rachel has expertise in disaster preparedness, another topic not often addressed in libraries. She will talk with trustees about their role in developing disaster-related policies.
