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Report Bypasses Using Updated 5-Day Written Report Form

Due to dry conditions, the number of wet weather bypasses has been low this year. However, mechanical failures and plugged or broken sewer lines can happen at any time.

Operators are reminded that all wastewater bypasses must be verbally reported to your local lowa DNR Field Office within 24 hours. Bypasses can be reported via the lowa DNR emergency response line at 515-725-8694 outside of normal business hours. Basement backups are also reportable unless caused by a problem with the building lateral or private sewer line.

Following each verbally reported bypass, a written report must also be submitted within five days. In December 2022, the DNR updated the Bypass Written Report Form. The new form is available at the previous link or online on the NPDES Operator Information webpage. Operators are strongly encouraged to use the form to ensure that all the necessary information is reported to the DNR.

One key feature of the updated form is the inclusion of new fields to record the date, time, and name of the DNR staff member to whom the bypass was reported. Recording this information will demonstrate that the bypass was reported in a timely manner and will aid in internal processing by the DNR.
