

HEINZ TO RETIRE



Henry Heinz, long time Adjutant of the Iowa Soldiers' Home, announced his retirement effective July 15, 1970.

Mr. Heinz came to the Iowa Soldiers' Home from Knoxville, Iowa, where he was Executive Secretary of the Marion County Soldiers' Relief Commission. He was secretary of the Marion County Fair Board and served as Marion County Auditor for one year. Along with these responsibilities he operated a variety

store in Knoxville. After World War I he worked for a number of years as a store manager for J. C. Penney Company at stores in Iowa and South Dakota. He is an Elder of the First Presbyterian Church of Marshalltown. He is a fifty year Mason and belongs to the Elks Lodge of Marshalltown.

Service to the Veterans of Iowa has been the key to Henry Heinz's working years. He is a World War I Veteran who served on the Mexican Border; World War II saw him serving in the Iowa State Guard.

Mr. Heinz is a fifty year member of the American Legion and a Past Post and County Commander. He holds membership in the Marshalltown World War I Barracks, and the 40 and 8 as a Past Chef de Gare. He also is a member of the Mexican Border Veterans Association.

Mr. Heinz has been active in veterans work for fifty years beginning with serving as Adjutant of his Legion Post in Madison, South Dakota, in 1921-1923, and has followed the growth of the Veterans Administration seeing veterans programs develop from zero to the programs we have today.

Mr. Heinz has served under five Commandants and has served as Commandant during the vacancies of this office.

VISITORS HERE




gracious ladies brought with them a check for \$50.00 for the Patio Courtyard which President Hill is shown presenting to Commandant Jack Dack.
