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[Teach Iowa has new look, new vendor, starting October 2020](#)

Starting in mid-October, the Teach Iowa job board and candidate application system will transition from using FrontLine/ApplicantTrack to using PowerSchool/Enterprise as our statewide vendor. More information about the new system and information regarding online training will be shared in upcoming months. Currently a Talent Acquisition/TeachIowa Focus Group, consisting of representatives from PK-12 districts, AEAs, and colleges and universities from across the state, are working with the Iowa Department of Education to help guide the development of our new system. Until the new system is fully functioning in mid-October, we will continue to use the current TeachIowa/ApplicantTrack system.



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[Registration open for summer 2020 Iowa College and Career Readiness Academy courses](#)

Registration is now open for summer 2020 courses through the Iowa College and Career Readiness Academy. The Academy was developed by the Iowa College Student Aid Commission in partnership with Iowa AEA Learning Online and the Iowa Department of Education and has been endorsed by the Iowa School Counselor Association (ISCA). These Iowa-specific online courses designed for administrators, school counselors, teachers, and other college access professionals will begin on June 8 and run through August 2. Courses can be taken for license renewal credit, grad credit, or no credit (free).



IOWA COLLEGE & CAREER READINESS ACADEMY

A Program of Iowa College Aid

Participants who complete courses 101 through 301 can earn a College Access Professional Certificate. Participants who complete courses 101 through 501 can earn a College Access Specialist Certificate, and those who complete course 601 can earn an Equity Badge.

Each of the courses available through the Academy is specifically tailored for Iowa college access professionals to improve effectiveness in preparing all students for education and training beyond high school.

To register, individuals will need to log into the [AEA Iowa Professional Learning website](#) using their current AEA Learning System user name and password. If a new account is created, courses will not be accessible until the following business day. If you

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GOLD mass archiving



All districts and programs under the Iowa GOLD license will have child records in GOLD mass archived on Aug. 11. All child records present in districts, programs, sites and classes will automatically be archived. Programs who use the summer checkpoint will have time to generate reports after the summer checkpoint closes on Aug. 7. Districts and programs should reactivate returning children in classes for fall and create child profiles for children newly enrolled. Districts have the option to use the child import tool to enter child information for the fall. The mass archiving service is at no cost to districts and programs and will assist in maintaining data hygiene.

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Shared Visions Preschool Program grants awarded



A new cycle of the competitive grant process for Shared Visions Preschool Programs was recently conducted to award grants for programming in FY21 through FY25. Submitted applications were scored by a team of trained reviewers with expertise in early childhood programming. A set of criteria for determining awards was applied and the Child Development Coordinating Council made final approval of awards. Out of the 80 applications received, 49 will be awarded grants, contingent upon state legislative funding.

Grantees will provide comprehensive quality preschool programming to children with identified risk factors and ages three to five years old. Services begin in FY21 and grantees may renew the grant for a total of five years.

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Spring Student Reporting in Iowa reminders

Below are a few Spring Student Reporting in Iowa (SRI) Season reminders.

Get your data onto SRI as soon as possible so you can start reviewing your reports. Pay special attention to:

1. Non-fall Supplementary Weighting
 - o Make sure all non-fall concurrent enrollment courses have a section FTE populated
 - o If you have students from another district taking courses with you, make sure those courses have a section FTE populated
2. Graduates
 - o DO NOT report a student as a graduate until that student has a signed diploma in hand
 - o IEP students continuing next fall to complete their IEP goals are NOT graduates



Spring SRI Certification deadline is **June 22**.

- Applications accepted until June 12.

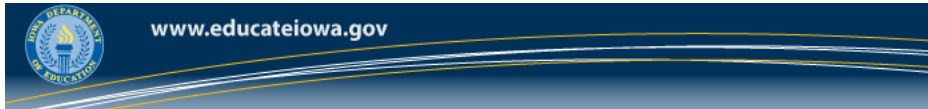
