

Girls Who Code

Girls Who Code is an organization that supports girls to learn coding. This summer, they're offering two **free** virtual programs!

The Summer Immersion Program is a 2-week virtual program that teaches game design concepts.

The Self-Paced Program is a 6-week program that teaches coding and computer science concepts. Both programs are open to 9th-12 graders who identify as girls or non-binary.
