

#### **Work locations**

Students will work at lowa DOT offices, labs, and construction sites across lowa.



### To qualify, students must:

- Be available to work 20-40 hours per week.
- Be enrolled as a college student majoring in engineering with completion of at least two years in an engineering or an engineering management curriculum at an accredited four year college or university with eligibility for junior status upon return to school.
- Meet their college's co-op or intern program requirements.

Students may be required to periodically submit written summaries and make oral presentations to summarize their internship efforts, outcomes, and relevance to degree programs and career aspirations.
