## DRIVER IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

It is felt that the Driver Improvement Program played a definite part in the decrease of Iowa traffic accidents in 1953.

The Division maintains an accumulative permanent record of over 2,000,000 drivers, showing all restrictions, violations, traffic convictions, accidents, suspensions or revocations against their driving records. Under the driver improvement program the records of potential bad drivers are reviewed. The driver may be issued a warning letter, re-examined, interviewed or suspended. The record of a driver showing two or more traffic convictions and/or involvement in two or more chargeable accidents during the past year is reviewed.
