lowa farm land rental rates for whole farms averaged \$102 an acre in 1981, up \$6 from 1980. The greatest increase, \$12 an acre, was in the northeast district. Increases ranged from no increase in the southwest to \$12 in the northeast district.

Cropland rental rates averaged \$113 an acre in 1981, an increase of \$6. Greatest

increase was \$14 in the northeast.

Rental rates are based on a survey made about March 1 from approximately 1000 tabulated reports from land owners and farm operators in their localities. District rental rates were weighted to the State average by district all land in farms.

lowa farm land rental rates for whole farms averaged \$106 an acre in 1982, up \$4 from 1981. The greatest increase, \$8 an acre, was in the northeast district. The only decline was in the south central district where the average rental rate declined by \$2 an acre.

Cropland rental rates averaged \$118 an acre in 1982, an increase of \$4. The greatest increase was \$10 in the east central district. Cropland rental rates in the south central district declined by \$1 an acre, while the rental rates in the southwest and west central crop reporting districts remain unchanged.

Rental rates are based on a survey made about April 1 from approximately 1000 tabulated reports from land owners and farm operators in their localities. District rental rates were weighted to the state average by district all land in farms.

lowa farm land rental rates for whole farms averaged \$105 an acre in 1984, down \$1 from 1983. The largest decrease, \$5 an acre, was in the southeast district and is a reflection of the severe 1983 drought in that area. In contrast, the east central district showed the largest increase, up \$5 per acre. For the entire state, four crop reporting districts increased, four decreased, with one district unchanged.

Cropland rental rates averaged \$116 an acre in 1984, a decrease of \$1 an acre. The largest decrease, \$7 an acre, was in the southeast district. Cropland rental rates

increased in five crop reporting districts but decreased in the other four.

Rental rates are based on a survey made about April 1 from approximately 1000 tabulated reports from land owners and farm operators in their localities. District rental rates were weighted to the state average by district all land in farms.

Pastures rented for a cash average of \$42 per acre in 1984, unchanged from the previous year. The tables on the back contain the series as far back as records will allow.
