- In PY 2021-22, adult basic education made up 57.1 percent (5,328) of participants served and ESL was 42.9 percent (4,000) for a total of 9,328 participants served.
- In PY 2020-21, lowa integrated education and training (IET) served 159 participants with a measurable skills gain of 38.3 percent, compared to the national at 34.2 percent (lowa median wage: \$6,437; National median wage: \$4,888).
- In PY 2020-21, lowa integrated English literacy and civics education (IELCE) served 90 participants with a measurable skills gain of 49.5 percent, compared to the national rate of 35.3 percent (lowa median wage: \$11,045; National median wage: \$6,533).
- Iowa AEL students completing the high school equivelancy test (HiSET) in 2021 had the highest passing rate (95.9 percent) in the nation for all states. Iowa's AEL programs and instructors provide a curriculum and platform environment for learning that is designed to generate greater preparation which allows for higher scores nationally. This establishes a confidence level for subject understanding that translates to higher scores and passing rates, but also positively follows the student along their career pathway trajectory to postsecondary education and training.
