#### The Intersections Initiative and Libraries

Maryann Mori with the Central District Office shares this news from the "Let's Move in Libraries" Newsletter. It's all about a healthy lifestyle project called **Intersections Initiative**, which seeks to connect community leaders, organizations, and local government services to technical assistance and funding to help make streets more accessible for people to walk, jog, and bike.

Intersections Initiative is a year-long partnership between America Walks, the League of American Bicyclists, and the Safe Routes Partnership, all supported in part by the CDC. More from the project website: "Engaged community leaders, organizations, and local governments understand what communities need to be safer, more accessible, and healthier. But so many don't know how to make their vision a reality. The Intersections Initiative can help. We bring active transportation projects to life by helping navigate federal funding opportunities and building community demand. The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides billions for investments in public transportation infrastructure ... now is the time for local communities and organizations to use this funding and their voices to build safer, more connected, people-friendly streets."

Funding is available for a range of different projects, from creating more walkable neighborhoods, to building better biking infrastructure, to planning and establishing safe routes to libraries. The **Intersections Initiative** suggests doing a "Walk Audit," which will help you identify how easy it is to walk to your library.

## The Board's Role in Staffing Transitions

The next *Boardroom* webinar, scheduled for **May 25**<sup>th</sup> (6:00-7:30PM) takes up the topic of staffing transitions. Having successfully hired a new library director, does the board have another role to play in

helping with orientation? We say yes!

Like any other organization, libraries need to plan for staffing transitions, whether expected or unexpected. This program suggests practical approaches that help pave the way for new directors and ease the learning curve.

We'll consider questions like: What are the library's annual routines? Likely budget prepping, policy review, job evaluations, and more. Those tasks have accompanying documents, where are those docs found? Is the library accredited or meeting standards at any Tier level? What's the cycle for that? When does the library renew its participation in the Bridges eBook Service? When is the Public Library Annual Survey due?

With an annual calendar showing program participation and deadlines in hand, with needed documents and passwords easily retrievable, with a listing of people willing to help, library boards can play a part in lighting the path for the new directors they've hired. Plus boards should work on their own brand of transition planning. We have ideas for that, too!
