## Joint Enrollment in Iowa

Highlights A snapshot of high school students enrolled in Iowa community college coursework

Each year, tens of thousands of Iowa high school students enroll in community college credit coursework. Most jointly enrolled students enroll through Senior Year Plus programs such as Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) and concurrent enrollment. Other students enroll independently as tuition-paying students or enroll in courses delivered through contractual agreements that do not meet the definition of concurrent enrollment.

Among high school students, **97.1 percent** participated in joint enrollment courses delivered through a contractual agreement between a community college and school district. Tuition-paid courses accounted for the remaining **2.9 percent** of total joint enrollment.
