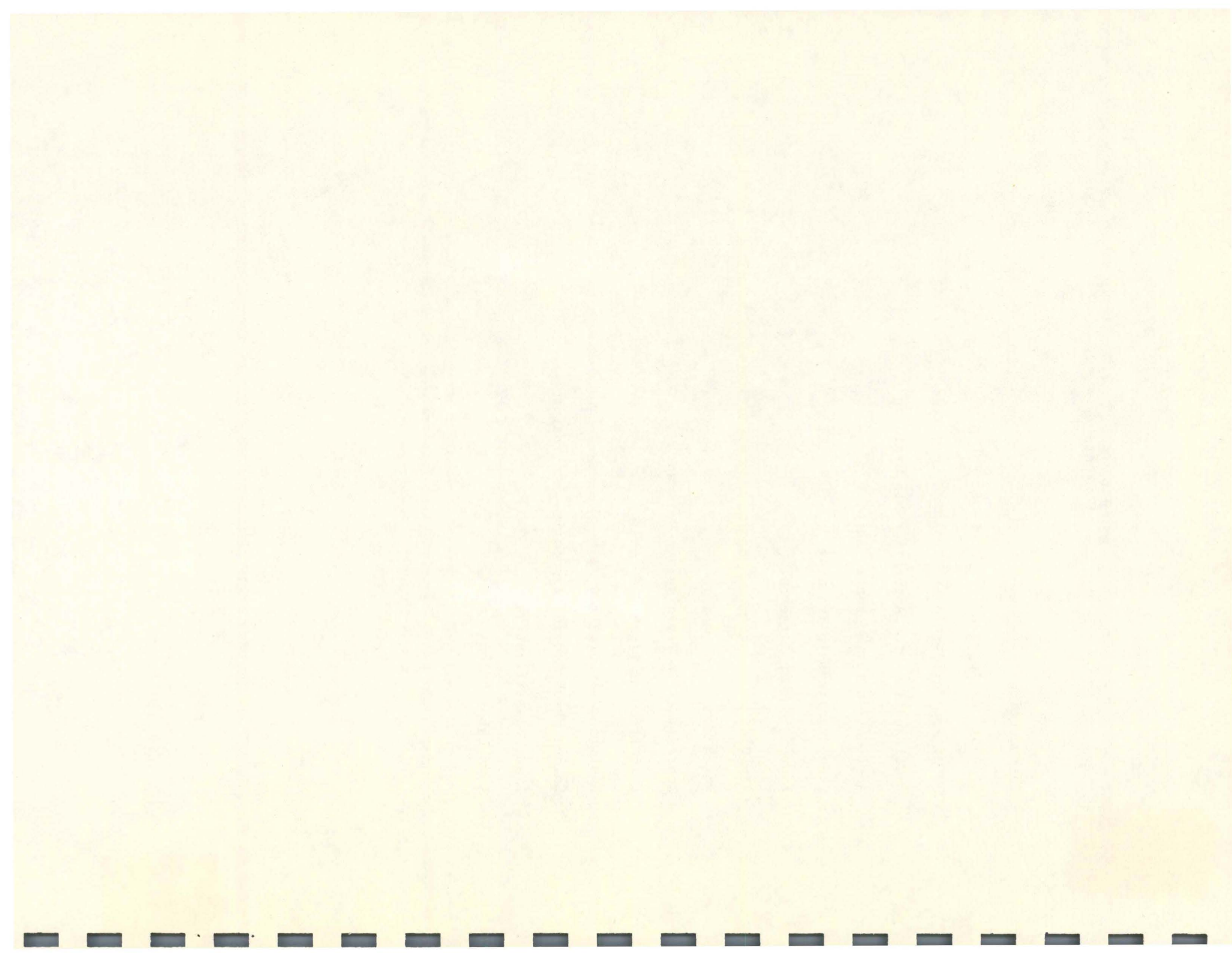

## Introduction

Not everyone graduating from high school will go on to college to become a doctor, a teacher, an accountant or a scientist. For every person who enters these professions, there will be many who eventually become skilled workers - every bit as important in their own realm of work. The nation's economic strength depends to a great extent upon the initiative and competence of its skilled work force. Skilled workers make the patterns, models, tools, dies, machines and equipment, without which industrial processes could not take place. They repair the equipment used in industry, and the mechanical equipment and appliances used by consumers. They also build homes, commercial and industrial buildings and highways.

In 1970, there were about 10.2 million skilled workers in the United States. More than half of these workers were employed in two broad occupational groups - construction craftsmen and mechanics and repairers. Although skilled workers are employed in almost every branch of industry, more than three-fifths work in manufacturing and construction. About 9 out of every 10 skilled workers are employed by private firms; others are self-employed or work for Federal, State or local governments. The building trades have a fairly high percentage of self-employed craftsmen. As might be expected, the skilled work force is concentrated in the highly populated and industrialized states. Job opportunities, however, are found everywhere.

Skilled workers must have a thorough knowledge of the processes involved in their work. Consequently, they require considerable training to qualify for their jobs. Most training authorities agree that the best way to learn a skilled trade is through a formal apprenticeship program. Apprenticeship is a period of systematic on-the-job training, supplemented by related trade instruction, which is designed to familiarize the apprentice with the materials, tools, and principles of the trade. The apprenticeship program provides the trainee with a balanced knowledge of his trade. Furthermore, Federal regulations state that all apprenticeship programs must be conducted and operated in a nondiscriminatory manner in all aspects, regardless of race, religion, color, sex, or national origin.

### Occupations Approved for Apprenticeship

The following 92 jobs have training periods of at least 2 years and some as many as 6 years. Counting specialized jobs which are grouped under the occupations listed below, there are approximately 350 jobs in the United States which require periods of apprenticeship.

## Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee

A joint apprenticeship and training committee is a group, equally representative of management and labor, established to carry out the development and administration of apprenticeship and journeyman training programs. The committee may represent labor-management interests at the National, State, or local level.

State committees, which also guide the development and operation of apprenticeship, have been established in some of the construction trades. These committees encourage local organizations to foster and standardize apprenticeship.

As administrator of the area-wide program, the local joint apprenticeship and training committee is responsible for the quality and comprehensiveness of the training the apprentice receives. Within the framework of minimum national standards recommended for the trade, the local joint committee develops standards governing the training of apprentices at the community level. An area joint committee has general supervision of the program, including the selection, indenturing and placement of apprentices.\* To assure every apprentice of the variety of experience he requires for all-around work in his trade, the committee supervises his transfer from one employer to another.

The typical local joint apprenticeship committee is comprised of three employer and three union representatives, appointed by their respective organizations. Most area-wide standards of apprenticeship place responsibility for the selection of apprentices on the joint apprenticeship and training committee. In most instances, committees make up a list of qualified applicants and refer the applicants to employers on the basis of an agreed upon formula, such as referring the best qualified applicant first if he is still interested and immediately available. Apprenticeship and training committees consider the selection of applicants for apprenticeship a most important factor in assuring the success of a program. In selecting apprentices they consider the applicant's school and work records, hobbies, physical condition, personal traits, acquired skills, aptitudes, educational background, and interests.

Careful selection of applicants for apprenticeship has proved to be of vital importance from the standpoint of the employer, the apprentice, and the committee. Research studies have shown that it reduces turnover of apprentices, thus cutting down the cost to the employer and saving valuable time of the committee members. Of particular importance is the time that it saves the applicants. If an applicant is not qualified, it is in his own interest to be guided to a more suitable trade or an entirely different occupation.

The committee endeavors to impress upon the applicants the opportunity provided by apprenticeship for careers as craftsmen in the skilled trades. They also give them a frank definition of their duties and responsibilities as apprentices, including hardships and disadvantages of learning a trade. The rules and policies of the committee directly affecting the apprentice are summarized on paper and a copy furnished the prospective apprentice before employment. A clear understanding of these things will assist prospective apprentices in deciding whether they wish to spend several years in learning a trade through apprenticeship.

### Qualifications for Apprenticeship Training

The particular trade for which a student is qualified will depend on the type of skills and the amount of technical knowledge required and the abilities and interests of the student. Mechanical aptitude, average intelligence and a sincere interest in the occupation will usually provide for success in a skilled occupation. The basic applicant qualifications that are of interest to the Joint Apprenticeship Committee are as follows:

Physical Requirements - The applicant must possess the physical requirements to work in the trade involved.

Age - The minimum age for apprenticeship training is 18 years in most programs.

Character - One of the basic qualifications listed in the standards of most of the trades states that applicants shall possess a good character and a good reputation in the community. Interpretation of this is up to the individual committee. Usually the committee does not eliminate from consideration an applicant who has been convicted of a crime. However, the committee is interested in the reason for the conviction and whether the applicant has made an attempt to rehabilitate himself.

Education - A high school diploma or a GED certificate is recommended but not required for entrance into apprenticeship training. Recommended high school courses will vary with each trade. Suggested courses for preparation in the building trades are listed below.

carpenter - general math, plane geometry, wood shop, mechanical drawing and blueprint reading

iron worker - physics, shop math, metal shop, welding, mechanical drawing, blueprint reading



brick mason - shop math, general math, blueprint reading, mechanical drawing

sheet metal worker - plane geometry, metal shop, shop math, mechanical drawing, blueprint reading, chemistry (metal properties), welding, algebra

pipefitter - physics, plane geometry, shop math, blueprint reading, mechanical drawing, welding, solid geometry, algebra, trigonometry, college math

roofer - plane geometry, shop math, wood shop, blueprint reading

electrician - physics, general math, plane geometry, metal shop, blueprint reading, mechanical drawing, algebra, trigonometry, solid geometry

plumber - physics, plane geometry, shop math

toolmaker - plane geometry, solid geometry, metal shop, shop math, mechanical drawing, blueprint reading, chemistry, physics, trigonometry

cement mason - shop math, general math, blueprint reading, mechanical drawing

machinist - chemistry (metal properties), physics, plane geometry, shop math, machine shop, mechanical drawing, blueprint reading, trigonometry, solid geometry

glazier - plane geometry, general math, physics, metal shop, blueprint reading, mechanical drawing, algebra

#### Application for Apprenticeship

The yearly application period for apprenticeship training varies greatly with each trade. Most trades limit this period to two weeks per year, while others accept applications on a year-round basis. Final selection of applicants is entirely in the hands of the Joint Apprenticeship Committee or group that sponsors the apprenticeship program. Selection interviews are held periodically, depending largely on the current need for apprentices.

The time between the date of application and assignment to an apprenticeship varies. After meeting the basic qualifications, there is a wait of from one week to six months until the apprenticeship committee of the particular trade meets for selection purposes. At the selection



committee meeting, the applicant is rated and placed on a list. Depending upon the demand, it could then be as long as six months before the applicant begins an apprenticeship. Therefore, the waiting period from the time of application until apprenticeship begins can be as long as one year, although the average time is from two to six months.

Some other points to consider when applying for apprenticeship training:

It is permissible to apply for more than one apprenticeship. However, it is generally felt that concentration on one trade is a good barometer of interest and proper attitude.

The apprentice can expect to work as steadily as the average journeyman in the trade. He will be subject to the usual layoffs of his particular trade but most employers will make an effort to have the apprentice work as steadily as possible.

It is possible for a non-union shop to participate in an apprenticeship program.

It is possible to become a journeyman other than by serving an apprenticeship. Some trades journeymanship can be gained through experience as a helper or assistant, although the apprenticeship is preferred because it affords a well-rounded training usually covering all phases of the craft.

The recruitment and selection of new apprentices shall be conducted without discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin.

#### Preapprenticeship Training

Because of unfamiliarity with the trade, the new apprentice in his early states of employment sometimes finds his efforts diverted to secondary duties from which the employer realizes little productive value, and the apprentice receives little training. To avoid this situation, it has been found expedient, where this type of training is feasible, to give prospective or newly indentured apprentices short concentrated pre-job training before entering regular apprenticeships.

The preapprenticeship course, authorized and supervised by the local joint apprenticeship and training committee, exposes the participant to designated basic knowledge of the craft. When he enters his



apprenticeship, he does so with a knowledge of the basic principles of his trade, and a measure of productive ability and worth to his employer.

The focal point of preapprenticeship programs is the committee and the vocational school authorities. The schools can provide the necessary facilities and equipment. They are also helpful in selecting instructors who are not only skilled at the trade, but who are capable of teaching.

Preapprenticeship programs also serve as a good selection tool to assist the committee in determining the prospective apprentice interest, aptitude, and ability to learn the trade.

### Apprenticeship Agreements

Area-wide apprenticeship programs usually provide that each apprentice sign an apprenticeship agreement with the committee rather than with the individual employer, but some programs provide that the agreement shall be directly with the employer.

The objective of the agreement with the joint apprenticeship and training committee is to provide the degree of flexibility needed to conform with actual employment practices. It also gives the joint apprenticeship and training committee the freedom of action it needs to transfer apprentices from one firm to another and, in the building trades, one construction job to another, so as to assure diversity of work experience and as nearly full employment for each apprentice as possible.

The joint apprenticeship and training committee should enter into a written agreement with the apprentice before he is employed. Some committees prefer to wait until a three to twelve months probation period has been completed. The agreement or required information on each apprentice is sent to the appropriate apprenticeship agency for registration.

### Training

Training is spelled out in apprenticeship standards developed by the local Joint Apprenticeship Committee or sponsor with the assistance of the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training. The processes of the trade and the number of hours to be spent learning each process are defined. The period of training varies from two to six years, depending on the trade, but most programs are for four years.



In view of the fact that the greatest part of the apprentice's training time is spent in actual work experience with and under the supervision of journeymen, the importance of the quality and comprehensiveness of on-the-job training experience cannot be overemphasized. An equally important part of the job of supervision is to see that apprentices receive a sufficient amount of experience in each of the basic operations and processes in the trade. Early in their training, apprentices are given instruction in the use of the tools of their trade. In most trades they are not allowed to use any power-driven machinery until they are well advanced in their training. In some occupations, apprentices may be required to furnish their own hand tools.

A quality apprenticeship program includes the development of sound related instruction. This principle has been developed and accepted as standard practice in every trade. A minimum of 144 hours of classroom instruction per year is recommended, although it is recognized that additional time may be required to keep pace with technological developments within the trade. This instruction supplements the training given on the job and gives each apprentice a comprehensive understanding of the theoretical aspects of his work. Courses of study may include such subjects as safety laws and regulations, mathematics, draftsmanship, blueprint reading and other sciences connected with the trade.

It is the responsibility of the joint apprenticeship committee to make arrangements for related instruction and to require the apprentice to attend classes regularly. Within this policy, standard rules for absenteeism in bona fide cases of necessity are provided. Usually, however, joint apprenticeship committees with successful programs find it wise to accept few excuses and to require apprentices to make up all lost time.

All apprentices serve a probationary or trial period ranging from 3 to 12 months. During the probationary period the apprenticeship agreement may be cancelled at the request of either party thereto, and due notice given the Committee. After completion of the probationary period the agreement may be cancelled by the local committee after adequate cause has been shown, and all parties to the agreement have had an opportunity to be heard.



## Wages

Apprentices usually start at a percentage of the journeyman wage and receive increases at regular intervals. Starting rates average 50 per cent of journeyman wages and increases are usually given every six months in most trades if satisfactory progress is made. However, some occupations start above or below the 50 per cent rate. In a number of trades and industries, apprentices receive various fringe benefits including vacation pay, health and welfare benefits and pensions, in addition to their regular wages.

While journeyman wages may vary from one area of the state to another, the percentages paid to apprentices in each occupation are similar.

Listed below are percentages paid and time period required for apprenticeship training in the construction trades in Des Moines.

#### Apprenticeship Training for Veterans

Public Law 92-540, effective October 24, 1972, provides for the payment of a monthly training allowance by the Veterans Administration to an eligible Veteran who is pursuing a full-time on-the-job training or apprenticeship program that is approved by the Veterans Education and Training Section of the Iowa Department of Public Instruction.

Veterans are eligible who served on active duty for more than 180 days, any part of which occurred after January 31, 1955, and received an honorable discharge. Length of eligibility is eight years after date of release.

A wage scale with increasing steps is adopted by the employer. Regardless of the wages paid by the employer, the rates of Veterans Administration payments are as follows:

\*For each dependent in excess of two, add \$10.

The maximum entitlement for Veterans Administration payments is 36 months.



Interested employers:

1. Write to the Veterans Education & Training Unit, State Department of Public Instruction, Grimes State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319, and indicate that you wish to be approved for either on-the-job training or apprenticeship training.
2. If approval for an apprenticeship program is requested, two copies of apprenticeship training standards will be required. These standards will include training outlines and salary schedules. If an apprenticeship program is to be offered, appropriate training outlines, etc., will be mutually developed with the approving agency.

Interested veterans:

1. Contact the Veterans Education and Training Section, State Department of Public Instruction, State Office Building, Des Moines, Iowa 50319, indicating a desire to have your job approved for either on-the-job training or apprenticeship training.
2. Application for Education and Training (Veterans Administration Form 21E-1990) should be secured from the Regional Office of the Veterans Administration, Federal Office Building, 210 Walnut Street, Des Moines, Iowa 50309.
3. This completed form, along with a copy of the Discharge Certificate (DD Form 214) should be sent to the Veterans Administration.
4. To obtain the extra allowances for dependents, you must submit a certified copy of your marriage certificate, and copies of the birth certificates of your children to the Veterans Administration.



## Definition of Terms

**APPRENTICE:** A qualified person of legal working age who has entered into a written agreement with an employer and/or Joint Apprenticeship Committee under which the employer is to provide an opportunity for the apprentice to learn an apprenticeable trade. If the apprentice is a minor the agreement must be signed by his parents or guardian.

**APPRENTICE INDENTURE:** A written contract or agreement among parent or guardian, apprentice, and employer and/or JAC concerning terms of employment and training experience of the apprentice during his learning period.

**APPRENTICEABLE OCCUPATION:** Is one which:

- A. Customarily must be learned by practical training on the job.
- B. Is clearly identified and commonly recognized or accepted throughout the industry.
- C. Requires 4,000 or more hours of work, experience to learn.
- D. Requires related instruction to supplement the work experience.
- E. Involves the development of skill sufficiently broad to be applicable in like occupations throughout an industry.

**APPRENTICESHIP AGREEMENT:** A written agreement, registered with the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, providing for not less than 4,000 hours of reasonably continuous employment, and for participation in an approved schedule of work experience through employment, which shall be supplemented by a minimum of 144 hours per year of related and supplemented instruction.

**APPRENTICESHIP STANDARDS:** The document which embodies the procedure for the training of apprentices, setting forth the terms and conditions associated therewith, including wages, hours, conditions of employment, training on the job and related instruction. The duties and responsibilities, including administrative procedure of the committee are also set forth.

**BUREAU OF APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING:** An agency of the United States Department of Labor that stimulates and assists industry in the development, expansion, and improvement of apprenticeship and training programs. The Bureau's principal functions are to encourage the establishment of sound apprenticeship and training programs and to provide technical assistance to industry in setting up such programs.

**BUREAU OF APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING REPRESENTATIVES:** Individuals who are the representatives of the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training at the local level. Their duties are to act as advisers to all registered apprenticeship programs.

**COMMITTEE:** This is a term used for the Joint Apprenticeship Committee representing the Union and the Employer, who shall develop and administer the apprenticeship program as provided for in the local apprenticeship standards.



**JOURNEYMAN:** A worker who has satisfactorily completed his apprenticeship and is classified as a skilled worker in his trade.

**PROGRAM SPONSOR:** An individual employer, a group of employers or a combination of employer and employee group or groups who have undertaken to establish and operate a formalized apprenticeship program to develop skilled craftsmen in apprenticeship or apprenticeable occupations.

**REGISTRATION AGENCY:** The Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, U.S. Department of Labor, or a State Apprenticeship Agency recognized by and conforming to the standard established by the Federal Committee on Apprenticeship.

**RELATED INSTRUCTION:** Apprentices are required to attend classes in subjects related to the trade each year of their apprenticeships (144 hours per year is normally considered necessary). To accomplish this, program sponsors request the local schools to establish classes of supplemental related instruction for apprentices. They also cooperate with the local vocational school officials in determining the subjects to be taught and the qualifications of instructors. The program sponsor may further recommend journeymen in the trade who have the knowledge and ability to teach related classroom instruction.

**SELECTION:** Selection of apprentices is made on the basis of qualifications alone, as set forth in the approved standards and selection procedures of the Joint Apprenticeship Committee for the trade. All applicants are afforded equal opportunity without regard to race, creed, color or national origin, sex and age.

**UNION:** The term union shall mean the duly recognized contractual bargaining agency for a specific company, trade area and industrial group or groups.

**VOCATIONAL EDUCATION:** The primary purpose of vocational education is to equip persons for useful employment. The program is designed to serve the needs of people in two distinct groups: (1) Adults who have entered upon, and (2) youth and adults who are preparing to enter occupations in agriculture, business, homemaking, distribution, trade, technical and industrial fields requiring less than a college degree.

**WORK EXPERIENCE:** The time an apprentice spends on the job under journeyman supervision, learning, step by step, through demonstration and practice, the individual work processes of a chosen skilled occupation.
