



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SUMMARY OF GOVERNMENT REPORT

This report was prepared in response to State Agency Issuance No. 108-79, dated Feb. 1, 1979. This SAI was prompted by the June 1978 enactment of a property tax reform initiative in California, more commonly known as Proposition 13. The instructions in the SAI directed SESAS to prepare a packet of labor market information on state and local government in the event tax legislation similar to the California enactment was passed in their states. The prepared information was to provide a background for evaluating the effects on state and local economies caused by reduced hiring and increased layoffs in state and local governments.

This report is made up of two parts; employment data and occupational data. Tables 1 and 2 are Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data. All state and local government employees are grouped as two units. The employment is not broken out functionally, such as by putting hospital employment in SIC 806, for example. The only breakouts are state and local school and nonschool. BLS employment is shown for 1972 through 1978, with 1978 data being preliminary.

Tables 3 through 8 are based on state and local government employees covered by Job Insurance in 1978. Iowa state government employees were covered by law in 1972, while local government employees were not under mandatory coverage until 1978. The Job Insurance coverage excludes certain state and local employees. Among these are: (1) student employees (2) elected officials (3) members of a legislative or judicial body (4) state national guard (5) employees serving on a temporary basis in case of fire, flood, snow, earthquake, or similar emergency (6) positions designated by law as a major non-tenured policy making or advisory position which ordinarily do not require duties of more than eight hours a week. BLS employment covers (3) and some of (1), (2), and (5), above. The employment covered by Job Insurance is according to 1972 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) codes. Local government includes counties, cities, local government school districts, area community colleges, plus some other units.

Tables 6-8 show CETA Public Service Employment (PSE). CETA PSE employment is sent to the Department of Job Service by employers on a separate form from regular covered employment. The separate reports are then sent to the CETA prime sponsors who certify them as being correct, and return them to the agency.

The source of the occupational tables in the second part of this report is Occupational Employment Statistics (OES) projections for 1974 for the state, prepared by the Research and Analysis Department, Iowa Department of Job Service in 1976. The OES projections are based on the 1970 Census classifications, Third Edition of the Dictionary of Occupational Titles (DOT), 1965 and the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) codes for 1967. The latter two of these references have been superceded by subsequent editions. The general methodology in preparing these OES projections was to base them on the 1970 Census and project them forward to 1974, using various factors. Table 9 which precedes the OES projections shows state and local government employment used and the page number in the report on which the occupational table for that employment may be found. In general, the OES breakdown for state and local government is based on functional lines. For example, strictly governmental employment is included in public administration (SIC 92 and 93), hospital employment is in SIC 806, and college and university employment is in SIC 822, etc. The functional breakout of OES employment does not always coincide with that used in the employment tables for employment covered by Job Insurance, which was discussed earlier.

The OES projections did not include occupational employment for state and local government, except for public administration. Therefore, the assumption was made that the occupational percents for the statewide private sector would coincide sufficiently with the government sector in the same SIC. The statewide percentage distributions of occupational employment for the private sector for 1974 for hospitals, (SIC 806), for example, were then multiplied by the state or local government employment in SIC 806 to obtain the employment in each occupation in government employment.

The percentage distributions of occupational employment were available to the nearest one-hundredth of a percent. Thus, due to rounding of the occupational employment to the nearest whole employee, the detail does not always add to the total. This is particularly true if the total employment is large, such as the 73,826 employees in local government elementary and secondary education (SIC 821). Also, in some cases, the government employment in that SIC is small, such as the state and local agricultural employment. Then the employment in many occupations may be zero due to rounding (less than 0.5). As may be noted from Table 9, an occupational table was not developed if the government employment in that SIC was less than 200.

In conclusion, this report is designed to provide a statistical background for evaluating the effects of large scale layoffs in state and local government employment due to tax reduction legislation. The employment tables give an idea of the number of state and local government employees and their percents of total employment. The occupational tables are to give some indication of how readily laid-off state and local government employees might find employment in the private sector, based on the experience they have acquired in government. Public Service Employees (PSE) are dependent on appropriations of the federal congress which provides funds through CETA prime sponsors to contracting government and nonprofit employers to hire low income persons. Also, regular state and local government employees are partially dependent on federal grants for their continued employment. Even the federal government does not appear completely immune from tax reduction pressures.
