MISSION STATEMENT:

Project 9 was approved as a pilot program for the National STAWRS office. The purpose was to develop and test a system that will give Iowa employers the option of filing an electronic, combined wage tax report to a single state agency who will then electronically forward the return data to the other agencies. This will save employers the need to file separate paper returns to each of the three agencies.

The project is one of several tests being conducted by the IRS to determine viable single-point filing options for the future.

- The federal 941 quarterly return submitted to the Internal Revenue Service
- The unemployment insurance quarterly return submitted to Iowa Workforce Development
- The annual state withholding reconciliation form (VSP) submitted to the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance

EMPLOYER BENEFITS

- No longer file three separate paper returns
- Eliminates redundant reporting
- Immediate acknowledgment that the return was received
- Eliminates errors by use of provided software

GOVERNMENT BENEFITS

- Eliminates handling of paper documents
- Eliminates data entry of return data
- Data available sooner and error free
- Improves customer service by having data available on demand

PROJECT EVALUATION

- Employers who participated in testing software encouraged us to move forward to statewide implementation.
- A national meeting with constituent groups and states working on prototypes ranked Iowa project as the number one priority.
- Iowa Workforce Development counterparts from across the country applaud the project and its progress.
