2. The data, as noted above, has been reviewed to assess and improve the effectiveness of the Department’s sexual abuse prevention, detection, and response policies, practices, and training. This review included the following:
 - A. Identification of problem areas— **Residential officers were not accustomed to conducting pat searches in view of video cameras.**
 - B. Any corrective action taken for each facility and the Department as a whole—**Residential Officers were trained to perform pat searches in view of video cameras.**
 - C. Comparison of current data to data collected in previous years—**2013 is the first year that the Annual PREA Report has been completed for 2nd District.**
 - D. An assessment of the Department’s progress in addressing sexual abuse—**PREA Policies were updated in 2013 to address PREA Standards. Policy was reviewed and acknowledged by staff. All staff members are trained annually in preventing and detecting sexual abuse in the facilities. Staff knowledge and awareness of PREA has increased in the past few years. In our residential facilities it appears that residents are more comfortable with reporting and staff is better prepared to respond to reports.**
