FUNDING

The SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY of all employers of four or more persons within the Area Ten Community College district was financed on a matching basis with funds made available from Section IV-C of the Vocational Education Act of 1963, through the Iowa State Department of Public Instruction, Division of Vocational Technical Education.

ADMINISTRATION

The SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY research was supervised throughout by Dr. S.A. Ballantyne, Superintendent of Area Ten Community College, and was directed by Mr. Ralph Wahrer, Director of Adult Education, and by Mr. G. W. Eddings, Director of Vocational Technical Education. Financial arrangements were handled by Mr. Kenneth K. Kupka, Business Manager.

Actual SURVEY design, collection, coding and analysis of all data, was coordinated by Mr. James H. Rogers, Coordinator of General Adult Education and Special Projects, and by Mr. John L. Niemeyer, Labor Market Economist for the Iowa State Employment Service in Cedar Rapids, who have co-authored this report.

THE PROBLEM

Since the establishment of Area Ten Community College from the enabling legislation in Senate file 550, it has become apparent that existing research is wholly inadequate for the purpose of assessing the need for specific vocational-technical training programs. Moreover, it would seem that currently there is no agency nor technique yet available to gather and disseminate the necessary information.

A review of the existing research reveals that no comprehensive data is currently available on the total number of trained workers in the job titles which were included in this SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY. For example:

- 1. Mr. George Lawry, Occupational Analyst Supervisor for the Iowa State Employment Security Commission, reported that his agency does not have any State-wide (nor local) statistics on the need for semi-skilled, skilled or technician level workers.
- 2. Mr. Richard Konicek, Director of the Iowa Development Commission, reported that he does not have statistics which relate to the need for trained workers in the Area Ten Community College district.
- 3. Mr. John Ropes, Director of the Iowa Manpower Council, reported that his agency does not have access to any statistics which indicate the need for semi-skilled, skilled or technician-level workers in the Area Ten district.

Nevertheless, the need for this kind of demographic information is, and will continue to be, most urgent.

It was felt, therefore, that Area Ten Community College should take the initiative and conduct a comprehensive SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY of the businesses and industries in its seven-county district, to determine from employers their need for workers who might be trained by the College. Thus, the following is that attempt to so determine the current number of employees, current job vacancies, trainees, turnover, and projected

number of employees who will be needed in this area, so as to establish the need for certain specialized training programs. To accomplish this objective, more than 500 job titles in 12 major occupational groups were surveyed.

OBJECTIVES

The SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY of all employers of four or more persons within the Area Ten Community College district was intended:

- 1. To determine the number and kind of semi-skilled, skilled and technician-level workers that are needed in the Area Ten Community College district.
- 2. To determine the number of current vacancies in each occupational group and for the job titles found in each.
- 3. To determine the number of workers that each employer anticipates he will employ by September, 1968, and in September, 1970:
- 4. To determine the per cent of workers leaving employment due to death, retirement or promotion in each occupational group or job title.
- 5. To determine the extent of formal in-plant training available, and to determine the current number of trainees.
- 6. To secure from employers their estimation of the availability of trained workers as being short, adequate or surplus, in each job title.
- 7. To develop a questionaire and establish a procedure for conducting such a SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY that might be adapted later for state-wide usage.
- 8. To develop procedures and data processing materials necessary to continue this SUPVEY on a periodic basis, and to specialize the survey activities of Area Ten Community College so that an area-wide survey of labor supply can be accomplished via sampling techniques and selected community surveys.
- 9. And in light of the above, to better plan the curriculum in Vocational Technical and Adult Education programs at Area Ten Community College.

IMPLEMENTATION

To fulfill the above objectives, the following procedures were adopted and carried out under the supervision of the Area Ten Community College staff:

- 1. Using the questionaire designed by Dr. Phillip Langerman of Area XI Community College as a model, a questionaire form was developed for use in the Area Ten district. Modifications were then made by a committee of Area Ten staff members, Mr. Robert Frye and Mr. John Niemeyer of the Iowa State Employment Service in Cedar Rapids, and Mr. Carroll Luckey of the local Personnel Managers Association.
- 2. Mr. Ken Wold, Director of the State Occupational Research Development and Coordinating Unit, supplied Area Ten officials with a tabulated list of occupational groups and the (1965) number of employees in each area. An analysis of the tabulated lists indicated that there are 12 major occupational groups in the Area Ten district.
- 3. Mr. Wold also supplied the research team with a print-out listing of all forms in the Area Ten district employing four or more persons. This information was obtained from the Iowa State Employment Security Commission's unemployment insurance records.

- 4. Mr. John Niemeyer, Labor Market Economist for Iowa State Employment Service in Dedar Rapids, prepared lists of typical job titles and descriptions for each of the 12 major occupational groups. Packets including questionaires, job titles and descriptions for each of the 12 major occupational groups. Packets including questionaires, job titles and descriptions, and general instructions for each major occupational group were then developed and reproduced.
- 5. SURVEY packets were then mailed to all businesses and industries in the seven-county area employing four or more persons. Over 2200 employers were included in this initial mailing.
- 6. Three weeks after the SURVEY packets were mailed, a simplified questionaire form and a reminder were sent to those who had not returned their questionaires. During this same period of time, personal contact was made with all non-responding firms to enlist their cooperation in returning the completed questionaires. By using the Adult Education Area Supervisors and their Local Coordinators, we were able to make personal contact with non-responding employers in every community in the Area Ten district. To canvas the populous Cedar Rapids metropolitan area in making these contacts, assistance was graciously provided by the Senior Men's Bureau of the Cedar Rapids Chamber of Commerce and the Marion Jay-Cees.
- 7. This procedure was repeated two weeks later, at which time a postcard reminder was also mailed to non-responding firms. In this way, of the more than 2200 firms originally contacted, a positive response of over 51% was accomplished. This figure does not include a small percentage of questionaires returned in an unusable condition. Total response was close to 53%.
- 8. Upon receipt of each completed questionaire, the responses were key-punched so that they could be cross-referenced according to S.I.C. (Standard Industrial Classification), D.O.T. and ZIP codes. When necessary, new job titles were supplied and tabulated by John Niemeyer. Approximately 40% of the job titles represented in the SURVEY were supplied in this way.
- 9. When all pertinent data received had been key-punched and processed, the authors asked for and were provided several print-outs detailing this information in a variety of ways. The print-outs were then correlated and summarized in the following tables.

FACILITIES

The Data Processing facilities of Area Ten Community College were employed throughout the SURVEY, for obtaining mailing lists, progress-reports, and for the coding, compiling and processing of all data collected.

DISSEMINATION

Copies of the SKILLED NEEDS SURVEY have been distributed to the Iowa State Department of Public Instruction, the Iowa Development Commission, the Iowa Manpower Development Council, Iowa State Employment Security Commission, the Industrial Relations Center of Iowa State University, and are being made available to all agencies and industries who participated in the SURVEY.

LOOKING AHEAD

The first table of data, organized according to major occupational groups, represents a direct translation of the information received from employers responding to the questionaire. Certainly, this information, of itself, will be extremely valuable in evaluating and planning curricula in the Vocational Technical and Adult Education programs at Area Ten Community College. In this sense, the SURVEY was successful.

However, the second table of data, detailing job titles according to S.I.C. codes, represents the major accomplishment of this SURVEY. Heretofore, this information has not been available from any source. As a result of this breakthrough, in the future, Area Ten will be able to look at any industry (or group of industries), classify it by S.I.C. code, and obtain an accurate portrait of that industry, in terms of its job titles, exactly as they are reported in this area. Conversely, we can now work backwards from any particular job title (or group of job titles) and ascertain exactly those industries in which this job title obtains.

The implications of the above technique on future research at Area Ten are profound: we shall be able to pinpoint a relatively small, precise number of employers in a particular occupational group (or employers cutting across many major groups) and to design specialized, simplified survey forms and questionaires which will yield only that information that is pertinent and desired. Mass surveys, like the present one, will no longer be necessary.

Thus, in the future, projected survey samples will be small and easy to manage, and the survey itself will be inexpensive and efficient. The savings, in terms of manpower and money, will be enormous! This alone will be enough to justify our labors.

TURNOVER ESTIMATES

Each employer was requested to indicate by percentage his estimate of annual turnover in each occupation. This information is not included with this report for the following reasons.

Many employers, especially those with a large employment and variety of occupations, were reluctant to indicate turnover rates because of the time and cost involved. These firms felt that estimates should be based on statistical data, which would involve clerical time in searching personnel records or the use of valuable computer time.

Some of the firms that did respond reported the average turnover rate for the company, rather than for individual occupations. While this information is valuable, it can not be used in establishing turnover norms for occupational groupings, nor can it be used to indicate occupations with unusually high or low turnover rates.

Therefore, in order to obtain an accurate turnover picture, turnover information must be analyzed from raw data for each occupation. To do this for all occupations would involve a disproportionate amount of time and effort compared to benefits received. However, turnover rates for individual occupations or occupational groupings will be made available as the need arises.

EMPLOYMENT PROJECTIONS

The survey form also requested employers to answer the following question for each occupation:

"Will the total number of employees increase (+), decrease (-), or remain the same in the next 12 months."

Some skilled needs survey forms developed in other areas requested employers to project their actual employment by occupation for one and two years hence. However, the response to this quantative approach was not encouraging. Therefore, the Area Ten questionaire asked employers to indicate just the direction they estimate their employment by occupation would take during the next year.

Nevertheless, several employers felt that too many factors were involved to attempt to predict trends. Therefore, this section was left unanswered on many forms. Rather than to attempt to interpretate the information that was received and to fill in where no information was received, data concerning employment trends will be analyzed when needed.

In interpreting the following data, please note that the number of employers indicating supply of trained workers does not necessarily represent the number of employers indicating employees, vacancies, or trainees. In some instances, employers failed to indicate the supply of workers, although they completed the other sections of the survey.
