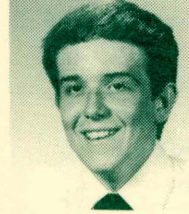


THERESA HAYES, 17, Hazelton

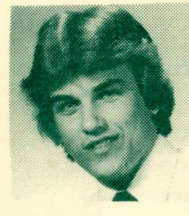
JOHN D. HOLSAPPLE, 16, Blockton

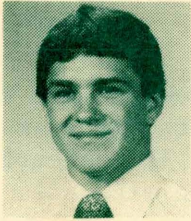
SCOTT COOK, 18, Hubbard

Your responsibilities at conference!

This is your 4-H Conference. Each of you can help make it a success. We have prepared this statement of expectations to help you accept your responsibilities.

1. Attend all sessions and be on time. Show respect for and give attention to those leading the sessions.
2. You have a responsibility to your host - Iowa State University - to summer school students, and to the Ames community. You are especially responsible for your dormitory room.
3. No boys in girls dorms, and vice versa, except in designated lounges. You must be in your dorm by 11:30 p.m. on Monday night and by 12:30 a.m. on Tuesday night. You are expected to be in your room with lights out and quiet within a half hour after the above times.
4. To leave the campus or drive an automobile, you must get permission from the adult in charge of your delegation. During 4-H Conference, campustown is considered part of the campus.
5. Wear your name tag at all times . . . we'd like to know you!
6. Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are not allowed at State 4-H Conference. Although some delegates may be of legal age, we ask that all participants abide by this expectation.
7. Taking screens off windows is not allowed. Firecrackers or other fireworks are not allowed at State 4-H Conference.

8. Adults at State 4-H Conference are to assist in all phases of the program and with all delegates. All delegates are expected to cooperate with all of the chaperones.
