INTRODUCTION

This report provides a summary of the information collected from the ninety-nine county applications for the fiscal year 1984 allocation portion of the community mental health and mental retardation services fund.

THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THIS REPORT IS BASED ON THE COUNTIES RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS CONCERNING THE FOLLOWING KEY AREAS:

- COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION COORDINATING AND ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERSHIP AND MEETINGS.
- EXPENDITURES OF COUNTY MONIES FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES.
- IDENTIFICATION OF SERVICE GAPS IN MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION;
- SUMMARY OF PLANNING NEEDS BY COUNTY.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

WITH THE PASSAGE OF SENATE FILE 572 (CHAPTER 78, ACTS OF THE SIXTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY) IN MAY OF 1981, THE STATE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES FUND WAS ESTABLISHED. IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THESE FUNDS, COUNTIES MUST COMPLETE AN APPLICATION THAT ESSENTIALLY COMPRISES AN ANNUAL PLAN THAT DESCRIBES HOW THE COUNTY WILL IMPROVE OR MAINTAIN THE AVAILABILITY AND ACCESSIBILITY OF COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES TO RESIDENTS OF THE COUNTIES.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COUNTY MENTAL HEALTH/MENTAL RETARDATION COORDINATING AND ADVISORY BOARD

EACH COUNTY IS ALSO REQUIRED TO ESTABLISH A MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION COORDINATING BOARD. TWO OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE IN FORMING THE COORDINATING BOARD:

- OPTION 1 THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MAY APPOINT THEMSELVES AS THE EX-OFFICIO COORDINATING BOARD. WITH THIS OPTION, THE SUPERVISORS MUST ALSO APPOINT AN ADVISORY BOARD.
- OPTION 2 THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MAY ESTABLISH AN INDEPENDENT COORDINATING BOARD.

THE COORDINATING BOARDS HAVE FOUR MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- DISTRIBUTE THE COUNTY'S SHARE OF THE GENERAL ALLOCATION AFTER THE NEEDED SERVICES AND AVAILABLE RESOURCES HAVE BEEN ASSESSED.
- DEVELOP A MENTAL HEALTH/MENTAL RETARDATION PLAN THAT IS CONSISTENT WITH THE STATE PLAN.
- PREPARE AN ANNUAL FISCAL ACCOUNTING OF THE GENERAL ALLOCATION MONIES RECEIVED BY THE COUNTY.
- NOMINATE AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS TO APPLY FOR THE SPECIAL ALLOCATION GRANTS AVAILABLE FROM THE DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH, MENTAL RETARDATION AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES.

INDEPENDENT COORDINATING BOARDS:

REQUIREMENTS OF COMPOSITION:

- COORDINATING BOARDS ARE COMPRISED OF PERSONS WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED A CONCERN FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES.
- ONE OR MORE SUPERVISORS MAY SERVE ON THE COORDINATING BOARD.

INFORMATION ON COORDINATING BOARDS IN FISCAL YEAR 1982:

- Twelve county boards of supervisors chose to establish independent coordinating boards.
- COUNTIES MARKED WITH AN ASTERISK ALSO ESTABLISHED AN ADVISORY BOARD.

ADVISORY BOARDS:

REQUIREMENTS OF COMPOSITION:

- COMPRISED OF PERSONS APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.
- ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS MUST HAVE DEMONSTRATED A CONCERN FOR MENTAL HEALTH

 AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES AND ARE NON-GOVERNMENTAL OFFICIALS.

INFORMATION ON ADVISORY BOARDS:

- THERE ARE 87 ADVISORY BOARDS IN THE STATE.
- NUMBER OF BOARD MEETINGS HAVE RANGED FROM 0 TO 9 WITH A CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF 178 MEETINGS WITH 15 COUNTIES NOT REPORTING THE DATA.
- MEDIAN NUMBER OF ADVISORY BOARD MEETINGS IS ONE, BASED ON APPROXIMATELY SIX MONTHS OF OPERATION OR LESS.
- SIZE OF THE ADVISORY BOARD VARIES FROM 3 TO 15 PEOPLE WITH 5 BEING. THE MOST FREQUENT SIZE REPORTED (MODE).
- THERE WERE APPROXIMATELY 165 JOINT MEETINGS OF THE ADVISORY AND COORDINATING BOARDS IN THE STATE.

COUNTY IDENTIFICATION OF SERVICE GAPS

THE FOLLOWING TABLES SHOW THE GAPS IN SERVICE AS REPORTED BY THE COUNTIES, IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT FROM THE STATE PERSPECTIVE MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICE GAPS VARY FROM THE INFORMATION INCLUDED IN THE COUNTY PLANS.

THE VARIANCE COULD BE THE RESULT OF FOUR FACTORS:

- POSSIBLE CONFUSION OF THE SERVICE DEFINITIONS GIVEN IN THE APPLICATION.
- NOT ALL PROVIDERS WERE IDENTIFIED IN THE APPLICATION.
- SOME COUNTIES ONLY LISTED PROVIDERS FUNDED BY COUNTY DOLLARS,
- APPARENT SERVICE GAPS IDENTIFIED IN THE RESOURCE INVENTORY WERE NOT ALWAYS SPECIFIED BY THE COUNTIES AS GAPS.

COUNTY IDENTIFICATION OF MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE GAPS

COUNTIES IDENTIFIED THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE GAPS IN THEIR AREA. THE FOLLOWING LIST RANKS THE ORDER OF THEIR RESPONSES WITH NUMBER 1 REPRESENTING THE SERVICE GAP MOST FREQUENTLY REPORTED AND DESIGNATES THE PERCENTAGE OF COUNTIES THAT MARKED EACH SERVICE GAP.

- 1) INTERMEDIATE CARE/PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION SERVICES (49%)
- 2) RESIDENTIAL SERVICES (45%)
- 3) COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES FOR THE CHRONICALLY MENTALLY ILL (33%)
- 4) EMERGENCY SERVICES (26%)
- 5) INPATIENT SERVICES (21%)
- 6) EVALUATION SERVICES (17%)
- 7) OUTPATIENT SERVICES (14%)
- 3) EDUCATION SERVICES (11%)
- 9) CONSULTATION (6%)

THE COUNTY GENERAL ALLOCATION APPLICATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1984 REPRESENT THE FIRST SYSTEMATIC EFFORT MADE TO OBTAIN MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION DATA FROM ALL OF THE 99 COUNTIES. THIS EFFORT HAS IMPACTED ON THREE AREAS:

- 1) PLANNING: THE DATA FROM THE APPLICATIONS PROVIDES A BASE FOR STATEWIDE PLANNING.
- 2) FISCAL INFORMATION: THE APPLICATION FORMAT PROVIDED FOR THE FIRST TIME AN ACCOUNTING OF EXPENDITURES FOR MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES BY COUNTY, BY DISTRICT AND STATEWIDE.
- 3) PROVIDERS AND CLIENTS: THE APPLICATIONS PROVIDE A LISTING OF THE MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION PROVIDERS BEING UTILIZED AND THE NUMBER OF CLIENTS USING THE SERVICES.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS PROVIDES AN EXCELLENT OPPORTUNITY FOR LOCAL PLANNERS TO IDENTIFY THEIR NEEDS, AS WELL AS ENHANCES THE COORDINATED DEVELOPMENT OF A COMPREHENSIVE MENTAL HEALTH AND MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICE SYSTEM. COLLECTION OF ACCURATE INFORMATION ON PERSONS SERVED AND SERVICE COSTS WILL ASSIST BOTH STATE AND LOCAL POLICY MAKERS IN MAKING DECISIONS.

DURING THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR, THE DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH, MENTAL RETARDATION AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES WILL CONTINUE TO WORK CLOSELY WITH THE COUNTIES TO FACILITATE THEIR PLANNING EFFORTS.

CONSULTATION SERVICES	SERVICES WHICH PROVIDE PROFESSIONAL ASSISTANCE AND INFORMATION ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH OR MENTAL ILLNESS TO INDIVIDUAL, GROUPS, AND/OR ORGANIZATIONS TO INCREASE THE RECIPIENT'S EFFECTIVENSS IN CARRYING OUT THEIR SERVICE RESPONSIBILITIES.
EDUCATION SERVICES	SERVICES WHICH PROVIDE INFORMATION AND TRAINING CONCERNING MENTAL HEALTH, MENTAL ILLNESS, THE AVAILABILITY OF SERVICE, THE PROMOTION OF MENTAL HEALTH, AND THE PREVENTION OF MENTAL ILLNESS TO COMMUNITY LEADERS, ORGANIZATIONS, AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

DEFINITIONS

DIAGNOSTIC AND EVALUATION SERVICES

INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE PSYCHOLOGICAL, SOCIAL, PHYSICAL, EDUCATIONAL, AND VOCATIONAL ASSESSMENTS NECESSARY FOR THE PREPARATION OF AN INDIVIDUALIZED PROGRAM OF REQUIRED SERVICES AND OBJECTIVES LEADING TOWARD INCREASING INDEPENDENT FUNCTIONING.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

ACTIVITIES NECESSARY TO FACILITATE THE ACCESSING AND DELIVERY OF OTHER SERVICES TO INCLUDE, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, INFORMATION AND REFERRAL, CASE MANAGEMENT, ADVOCACY, TRANSPORTATION, AND LEGAL AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES.

PREVENTION SERVICES

ACTIVITIES PROVIDED TO PREVENT OR AVERT THE OCCURRENCE OF A DISABILITY AND/OR ACTIVITIES TO IDENTIFY EARLY AND TREAT DISABILITIES SO AS TO LESSEN THE SEVERIY OF IT OR ITS CONSEQUENCES. INCLUDES ACTIVITIES SUCH AS, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, PUBLIC EDUCATION AND INFORMATION, NUTRITION, PRENATAL AND DELIVERY CARE, GENETIC COUNSELING, FAMILY PLANNING, RESEARCH, EARLY INTERVENTION, AND DISABILITY SCREENING.

TREATMENT SERVICES

INTERVENTION ACTIVITIES TO HALT OR CONTROL CONDITIONS WHICH CASE, AGGRAVATE, OR COMPLICATE MENTAL RETARDATION. THESE ACTIVITIES INCLUDE, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SURGICAL PROCEDURES, DIETARY CONTROLS, CHEMOTHERAPY, OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY, PHYSICAL THERAPY, BEHAVIOR MANAGMENT, DENTAL PROCEDURES, MEDICAL PROCEDURES, AND COUNSELING.

SPECIALIZED LIVING ARRANGEMENT SERVICES

SERVICES PROVIDED TO ASSIST THE MENTALLY RETARDED INDIVIDUAL IN MAINTAINING SUITABLE RESIDENTIAL ARRANGEMENT IN THE COMMUNITY. THESE INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, IN-HOME ACTIVITIES, FAMILY SUPPORT SERVICES, FOSTER CARE SERVICE, GROUP LIVING SERVICES, RESPITE CARE AND STAFF TRAINING, PLACEMENT AND MAINTENANCE SERVICES. THESE ACTIVITIES MAY BE PROVIDED IN A VARIETY OF SETTINGS RANGING FROM MINIMUM SUPERVISION TO 24-HOUR CARE.

EDUCATIONAL/FUNCTIONAL ACADEMIC SERVICES

SOCIAL ADJUSMENT AND DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

VOCATIONAL SERVICES

DEFINITIONS

ACTIVITIES DESIGNED TO ENABLE INDIVIDUALS TO ACQUIRE BASIC KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS WITHIN A FRAMEWORK OF WELL-DEFINED CURRICULA AND GOALS PRACTICAL TO THE INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL, SOCIAL, AND VOCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT.

THE PROVISION OF ACTIVITIES THAT FOCUS ON MEETING NEEDS RELATING TO FAMILY UNITY AND THE MENTALLY RETARDED INDIVIDUAL'S PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND ADJUSTMENT, E.G., PERSONAL, FAMILY, AND COMMUNITY LIFE. INCLUDES SUCH ACTIVITIES AS IN-HOME ACTIVITIES, OUT-OF-HOME ACTIVITIES, LEISURE ACTIVITIES, LEGAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES, AND INCOME SERVICE ACTIVITIES.

THE PROVISION OF ACTIVITIES THAT RELATE TO THE PRESERVATION, RESTORATION, AND DEVELOPMENT OF SKILLS FOR REMUNERATION THROUGH SUCH ACTIVITIES AS WORK AND VOCATIONAL EVALUATION, SKILL TRAINING/DEVELOPMENT, VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE, JOB PLACEMENT IN SETTINGS SUCH AS SHELTERED WORKSHOPS, WORK ACTIVITY CENTERS, AND WORK STATIONS IN INDUSTRY.
