The <u>Catalog</u> provides a description of state services to local governments by program title, eligibility, identification of the administering agency, the authorizing legislation and funding of the program, a listing of printed material available, and a source of further information. A directory of agency addresses and regional locations of state agencies appears at the conclusion of the <u>Catalog</u> to provide local governments with central addresses and field contacts for programs of community or regional interest.

The <u>Catalog</u> is arranged alphabetically by department and by services within the department, as indicated in the Table of Contents. An Alphabetical Subject Index is located at the back of the catalog.

The <u>Catalog</u> has been compiled by the Division of Local Affairs, Office for Planning and Programming in cooperation with those state agencies which provide services to local governments. If response to this edition so justifies, OPP will periodically revise and update the <u>Catalog</u>. Comments toward improving any future editions would be appreciated.


