

IEOP

The Intensive English and Orientation Program (IEOP) is a complete, full-time program in spoken and written American English. It is located on the campus of Iowa State University (ISU). IEOP emphasizes the language skills that are necessary for successful university study in the United States:

- ·Speaking in classroom discussions,
- ·Taking notes from lectures,
- ·Reading efficiently,
- ·Writing clearly, and
- •Communicating with people on and off campus.


An important part of the program is learning about the people and customs of the United States. IEOP plans many activities that take students into the community of Ames and other places in Iowa. ISU students also work with IEOP students in small conversation groups, as tour leaders, and in the language laboratory.

Requirements for Admission to IEOP

- 1. A completed secondary school education or the equivalent
- 2. Financial support to cover school, insurance and living expenses
- 3. A completed application form with a \$50 deposit (nonrefundable)



Curriculum

IEOP has five levels of instruction. Students take a placement test at the beginning of a term to determine the level they will attend. A term is 15 weeks (8 weeks in summer). After 8 weeks, another test measures their progress.

Each student has 20 to 25 hours of instruction each week in speaking, listening, reading, vocabulary, writing, and grammar. All instructors are trained and experienced teachers of English as a second language. Classes are small, and students speak often with the teacher and with each other during the lessons.

For new students, an 8-week orientation class is required twice a week. This introduces important crosscultural information which helps their adjustment to the United States and to university life.


Students in the advanced level may enroll in one ISU course. This requires conditional admission to ISU, permission of the academic department, and the payment of additional tuition.
