iowa state university

lowa State University is a major midwestern center of learning for students from all 50 states and more than 85 other nations.

The University is the largest institution governed by the State Board of Regents and offers extensive curricula in agriculture, design, education, engineering, economics, sciences and humanities, and veterinary medicine.

The fall of 1980 marked the opening of the newly-created School of Business Administration, which has the largest enrollment of any school or college at lowa State.

Iowa State was established by the General Assembly in 1858. Its picturesque campus is comfortably situated in a central campus "park," and is a splended combination of conventional and contemporary architectures in wooded and open landscaping.

The ultra-modern South Campus is dominated by the magnificent Iowa State Center, the 50,000-seat football stadium, and the College of Veterinary Medicine. The Iowa State Center was built without the use of state or federal appropriated funds and includes the James Hilton Coliseum, J.W. Fisher Theater, C.Y. Stephens Auditorium, and the Scheman Continuing Education Building.

The beautiful, spacious facilities are showcases for a variety of activities at lowa State, including athletic contests, concerts, lectures, and drama presentations.

Sports are a vital part of life at lowa State, and the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics offers 19 men's and women's sports. Quite a number of Cyclone teams have been nationally ranked in recent years, and several have won national championships.

lowa State's varsity athletes also fare well in the classroom, and academic life is emphasized at all times. Tutor programs are available through the athletic department for anyone needing instruction in specific courses. Top scholars are recognized by the ISU Athletic Council.


Both undergraduate and graduate instruction at Iowa State will be offered on the semester system beginning in the fall of 1981.

coaching staff

The Iowa State women's track and cross country teams have met with continued success under the direction of Coach Ron Renko, now in his second year at Iowa State.


In his ISU coaching debut last year, three Cyclones won Big Eight Conference titles and 12 women qualified for the AIAW national championships. The Cyclones finished in a tie for 24th with eight points and two fourth place finishes. The two-mile relay team turned in one of the best times in the nation (8:45.55) last year while setting an ISU record. Iowa State also was represented in the Olympic Trials by hurdler Kim Whitehead, who finished second in the exhibition 400-meter hurdles.

A native of Anoka, Minn., Renko came to Iowa State after a five-year stay at Golden Valley (Minn.) Lutheran Junior College. He built the Royals into consistent state, regional, and national contenders on both the AIAW and junior college levels, and coached several individual national champions in track and cross country.

Golden Valley's sprint medley teams won national championships in 1978 and 1979, setting JC records each time. The Royals also were second in the 1978 NJCCA track nationals and placed third as a team in 1979.

Renko believes in a balanced track program and has coached 10 national champions in a variety of events, including the sprints, relays, and hurdles.

Renko's cross country teams also have met with success during the past six years. His Golden Valley harriers were runners-up in the 1977 and 1978 JC nationals, while the Cyclones made their sixth consecutive team appearance at the AIAW national championships last fall. Renko has coached six cross country all-Americans and had two women win individual national titles.



Renko attended Anoka High School and received an associate's degree from Golden Valley Lutheran in 1971. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Sioux Falls (S.D.) College, where he was also a nationally-ranked race walker.

A respected clinician, Renko has staffed several track and cross country camps throughout the United States, including Olympia Sports Village, one of the nation's foremost running camps, located in Upson, Wis.

Richard Lee, 25, is in his second year as assistant women's track coach. Lee came to lowa State in 1979 following a stint at South Dakota State University, where he was assistant track and cross country coach for the men's and women's teams.

The Jackrabbit men's track team won the 1979 North Central Conference title, and Lee coached several individual conference champions in the sprints, relays, and high jump. Two of his high jumpers qualified for the 1979 NCAA Division II national championships.

Prior to coaching at South Dakota State, Lee was head coach of both the men's and women's track teams at St. Francis (Minn.) High School.

A native of Cedar, Minn., Lee is a graduate of St. Francis High School and the University of Minnesota-Morris.



a look at the cyclones

hurdles

Iowa State has produced some of the finest 400-meter hurdlers in the nation in recent years, including four-time AIAW national champion Debbie Esser and 1980 Big Eight champion Kim Whitehead. Whitehead decided to return home to New York last December, but the Cyclones have two very capable competitors in senior Ellie Mahal and sophomore Patty McCarthy.

Mahal has shown signs of returning to the form which helped her finish second in the 1978 AAU championships, but consistency has been a problem for the Scarborough, Ontario, native. She captured the AIAW Region 6 400 hurdle title last spring in :59.60, her best clocking in two years. She will be striving to surpass her personal best (:58.40) in 1981 and make a third consecutive appearance at the AIAW nationals.

McCarthy, the Iowa state high school 400 hurdle champion in 1979, won the event at the 1980 Arkansas Relays. However, she has made more of a mark in the relays and sprints. McCarthy was a member of the Cyclones' national-qualifying mile relay team last year.

lowa State recruited one of the finest 100 hurdle competitors in freshman Kelley Mathews. The graduate of Monona Grove (Wis.) High School won prep state titles in both the 100- and 200-meter hurdles last year. Her time of 13.9 (H) in the 100 hurdles was one of the top times in the country by a high schooler.

Mathews had a fine indoor season, competing in the 60-yard hurdles and mile relay. She probably will do some quarter-mile work this spring.

sprints

Team co-captain Sumetia Wells is beginning to come into her own as a quarter miler, and Renko expects the Denver, Colo., Junior to be a big point producer this spring. Wells' best effort last year was :56.55, but she has a personal best of :52.8 (H) in the event. She also will run a leg in the mile relay.

Mahal and McCarthy also will run the quarter for ISU; Mahal was third in the Big Eight last year in:56.00. Junior college transfer Julie Kosowski (Golden Valley Lutheran College) has bests of:24.8 in the 200 meters and:57.3 in the 400. She should contribute heavily in the relays.

middle distances

Renko is optimistic about the middle distance trio of Christine McMeekin, Diane Vetter, and Wren Schafer, three proven competitors with national meet experience. McMeekin, the former British Olympian from Glasgow, Scotland, has personal bests of 2:02 in the 800 meters and 4:12.5 in the 1,500. She could be shooting for national titles in those events this year.

Schafer turned in her personal best time in the 880-yard run last spring (2:09.5), and Renko feels she will continue improving. Schafer also will try the 1,500 meters this spring, an event Renko says more suits the junior from Hector, Minn.

An 800- and 1,500-meter specialist for most of her career, Vetter won the Big Eight 3,000 meters last spring in a meet record and career-best 9:38.50. It could be her strongest event again this year, according to Renko.

Vetter is coming off one of her better indoor track seasons. A versatile athlete, she will run any event from the quarter mile to the 5,000 meters.

Vetter, Schafer, and junior Jane Lange comprised three-fourths of ISU's two-mile relay team last year. The Cyclones finished fourth in the event at the 1980 AIAW nationals in a school record 8:45.55. McMeekin will anchor this season, leading Renko to believe that the Cyclones again have the potential to challenge for national honors.

distances

The Cyclones lost their top two distance runners (Mary Seybold and Bridget Seip) to graduation, so Renko will be counting upon senior Sheila Frank and freshman Francine Sandoval to take up the slack. Frank missed the fall cross country season with an injury, but should be full strength for her final track season. She has a personal best of 36:20.00 in the 10,000 meters. Sandoval, a rookie from Fort Madison, Iowa, will be giving the 5,000 and 10,000 meters her first shot. She had a fine cross country season for the Cyclones last fall.

Senior Betsy Bowers, back after a year's absence from track, and much-improved junior Barb Rus complete the distance corps.

field events

throws

Two former lowa high school stand-outs, Melanie Heitman and Connie White, are lowa State's main threats in the shot put and discus. Heitman won the javelin throw at the 1980 Drake Relays, but is more proficient with the discus. The former state champion from Williamsburg set the ISU record of 148-6 in the event last spring.

White shattered the ISU shot put record during the indoor season and probably will duplicate that feat during the outdoor campaign. She won the state shot put title at Laurens-Marathon High School in 1980.

jumps

Senior Cindy Van Farowe and freshman Jill Andersen will compete in the long jump for Iowa State, while Diane Doles, also a spiker on the Cyclone volleyball squad, will high jump. Doles had a personal best leap of 5-8 last year at East Leyden High School in River Grove, Ill.

Colleen Hanna Sophomore Sprints, relays Nassau, Bahamas

Has developed into the Cyclones' finest short sprinter . . . tied school record in the 100 meters last spring with an :11.70 clocking . . . also had personal best of :25.07 in the 200 meters . . . came to lowa State last March from the Bahamas, where she had been a top-flight runner . . . was her country's high school sprint champion in 1979 . . . also was a member of the national 4×100 -meter relay team as a prepster . . . attended Government High School . . . industrial administration major . . . born 11-14-62.

Melanie Heltman Sophomore Discus, shot put, javelin Williamsburg, Iowa

Quickly established herself as a fine collegiate thrower last season . . . set ISU discus record of 148-6 against Nebraska . . . has personal best of 150-1 in the event . . . very versatile thrower . . . has bests of 42-11 in the shot put and 149-10 in the javelin toss . . . won the latter event during the 1980 Drake Relays . . . also won the high school discus throw at the 1979 Relays . . . a four-time Iowa state high school discus champion while at Williamsburg High School . . . also won the 1978 state shot put championship . . . physical education major . . . born 5-13-61.







Jane Lange Junior Middle distances Davenport, Iowa

Versatile runner and key relay performer for the Cyclones ... a member of the two-mile relay team, which finished fourth in the AIAW nationals last spring ... has personal best of 2:08.90 in the 800 meters (1977) ... former lowa state high school 440-yard dash champion ... attended West High School and competed for her father, Don Lange ... also has earned three letters in cross country at lowa State ... accounting major ... born 8-26-60.

Ellie Mahal Senior Hurdles, sprints Scarborough, Ontario

lowa State's best bet in the 400 hurdles this year ... two-time AIAW national qualifier in the event ... has had many outstanding races during her career ... finished second in the 400 hurdles during the 1978 AAU Championships in Los Angeles ... was sixth in the 1978 AIAW nationals and ninth in 1979 ... also has been a member of several school-record-setting relay teams ... a three-time Canadian national team member ... still holds several Canadian junior records in the 100 and 200 meters, and the 400 hurdles ... graduate of Markham District High School ... interior design major ... born 3-21-57.

Kelley Mathews Freshman Hurdles, relays Monona, Wis.

The Cyclones' top sprint hurdle prospect ... won Wisconsin prep titles in the 100- and 200-meter hurdles last spring ... had a time of :28.02 in the 200 hurdles, which was a national high school record in 1980... very versatile athlete ... probably will run the quarter mile or mile relay this spring ... also has long-jumped 18-11 ... had a fine indoor track season ... ran both the 60-yard hurdles and mile relay ... attended Monona Grove High School ... industrial administration major ... born 12-31-61.





Patty McCarthy Sophomore Hurdles, relays Hawarden, Iowa

Along with Ellie Mahal, will compete in the 400-meter hurdles for the Cyclones . . . won the event on a rain-soaked track during the 1980 Arkansas Relays . . . also was a member of Iowa State's national-qualifying mile relay team last season . . . won the Iowa state high school 400 hurdle title in 1979 and the 100 hurdle championship in 1978 . . . attended West Sioux High School . . . physical education major . . . born 9-26-60.

Christine McMeekin Senior Middle distances Glasgow, Scotland

Currently one of the finest middle distance runners in the country . . . former British Olympian . . . ran the 800 meters during the 1978 Games in Montreal ... has a personal best of 2:02 in the event . . . also competed in the 1,500 meters during the 1978 Commonwealth Games in Britain ... best 1,500 meters time is 4:12.5 . . . made her first contact with ISU following the 1978 Commonwealth Games and ran track for the Cyclones in 1979 . . . injuries hampered her that season, but she recovered in time for the fall cross country campaign . . . won Big Eight and AIAW Region 6 titles that fall, and later finished 18th in the World Cross Country Championships in Paris (March 1980) . . . underwent surgery for a chronic Achilles tendon injury last August in London . . . came back strong during the 1981 indoor season . . . qualified for the AIAW nationals in four events . . . has a twin sister. Evelyn, who also ran track for ISU in 1979...leisure studies major...born 1-12-56.

Another strong middle distance runner for the Cyclones ... ran the 880 and was a member of the two-mile relay team last year ... turned in her best 880 time during the AlAW national meet with a 2:09.5 split during the two-mile relay ... paced ISU to a fourth place finish in the event ... also will run the 1,500 meters this spring ... transferred to lowa State in 1979 from Golden Valley (Minn.) Lutheran College ... ran track and cross country for the Royals, and captured the individual national NJCCA cross country title in 1978 ... attended Buffalo Lake Public High School ... won three Minnesota state high school 440-yard dash titles (1976-78) ... also anchored her prep team's mile relay quartet to three state championships ... has earned two letters in cross country at lowa State ... physical education major ... born 5-13-60.

Diane Vetter Senior, co-captain Middle distances Chardon, Ohio

The veteran of the Cyclone track team . . . heads into her final collegiate season with a score of honors behind her . . . is the defending Big Eight 3,000 meters champion... turned in her best time in the event last year (9:38.50) ... also has career bests of 4:20.7 in the 1.500 meters and 2:07 in the 800 meters . . . helped the Cyclones' two-mile relay team finish fourth nationally last spring . . . probably is the most versatile runner on the team . . . can run anything from the quarter mile to the 5,000 meters . . . earned all-America honors in 1978 via the Cyclones' two-mile relay team, which finished second nationally that year . . . won Big Eight indoor 1,000-yard run titles from 1978-81 ... also has earned four letters in cross country ... was a member of ISU's AIAW national champion harriers in 1977 and 1978... prepped at Chardon High School... began her track career with the Blue Ribbon Track Club in Wickliffe, Ohio, at age 14... advertising design major... born 5-30-56.

The Cyclones' top threat in the quarter mile . . . led off ISU's national-qualifying mile relay team last spring . . . has personal best of :53.8 (H) in the 400 meters . . . also has collegiate career best of :12.17 in the 100 meters . . . is coming off one of her best indoor track seasons . . . previously competed for the Colorado Flyers Track Club in Denver . . . attended Manual High School, but competed only on the club level . . . psychology major . . . born 2-6-60.

Connie White Freshman Shot put, discus Laurens, Iowa

Along with Melanie Heitman, gives Iowa State good strength in the throwing events . . . already has put her name in the Cyclone recordbook . . . broke the ISU indoor shot put record in her first collegiate meet . . . has personal best of 44-1 in the event (outdoors) and a best of 149-6 in the discus . . . won the Iowa state high school shot put title in 1980 . . . attended Laurens-Marathon High School . . . physical education major . . . born 1-31-62.




