buildings, and the Lied Recreation Center. Enjoy exploring the rich history and traditions of each hall!

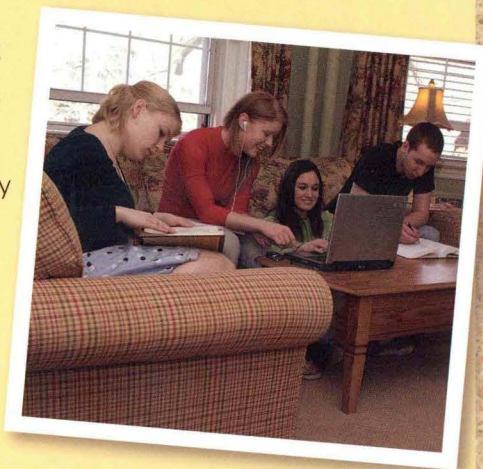


Barton-Lyon-Freeman

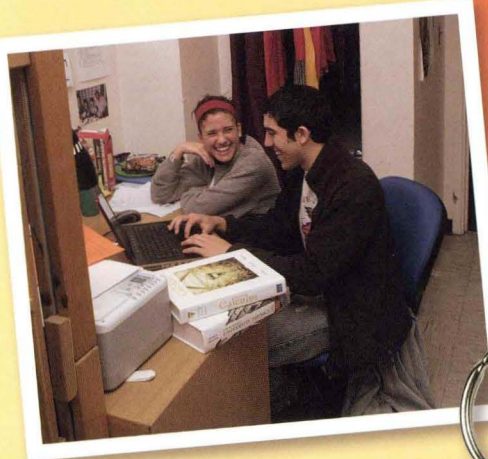

Maple Hall

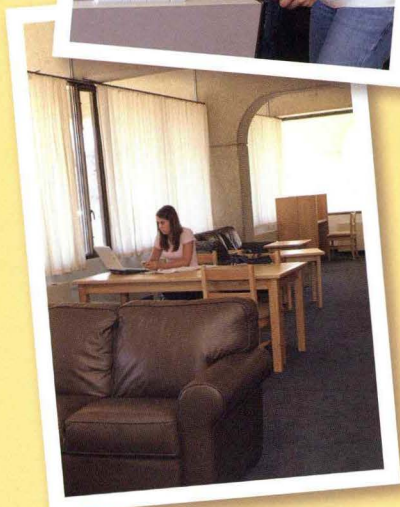
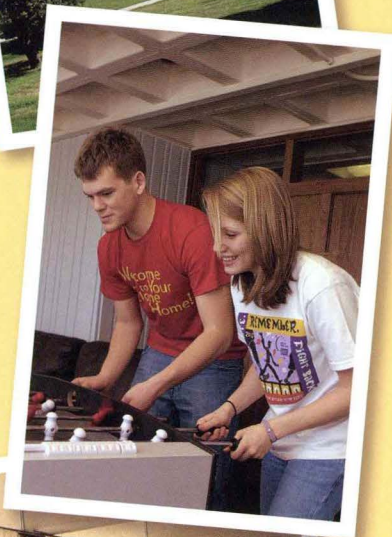
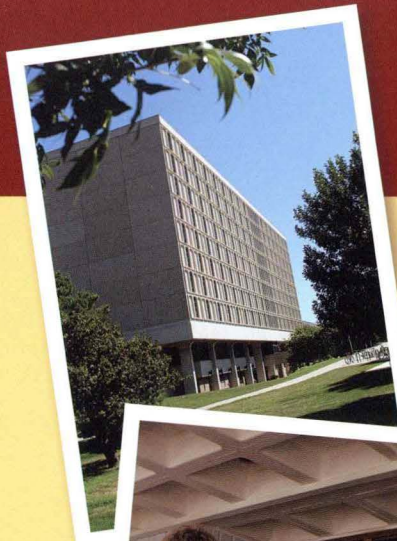

Begin with a Powerful Partnership

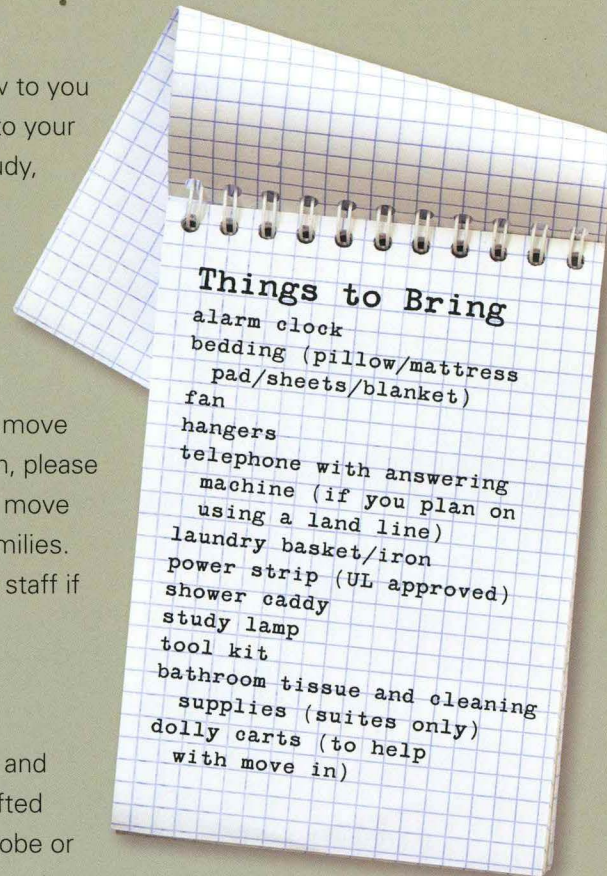
Sharing a room or apartment with another person may be new to you and just like any shared situation, communication is key. Talk to your Community Advisor(CA) about facilitating a roommate agreement to get ahead of the game.

Move In

With so many students coming to campus, it isn't possible to move everyone in on the same day. To find out when you can move in, please refer to our website, www.housing.iastate.edu. Making the move to college can be an emotional and stressful time for many families. Remember to have patience on move-in day and talk with our staff if you have any questions. We're here to help!

What Does My Room Come With?

Each residence-hall room has the following: study desk, chair, and wastebasket (one per resident); standard extra-long twin or lofted bed with mattress (one per resident); chest of drawers, wardrobe or closet (one per resident); access to campus network and Ethernet; cable television service; and window drapes/blinds.

Internet Access

All of our residence halls offer fast wireless internet and hard-wired Ethernet. To use wireless, you do not need a private access point in your room as it will slow down the wireless system. In our apartment communities, hard-wired Ethernet access is available.

Telephone Service

In our residence halls and SUV apartments, you can elect to contract separately for your landline telephone service for a low monthly fee. Telephone service is part of the rate in Frederiksen Court Apartments.

Parking

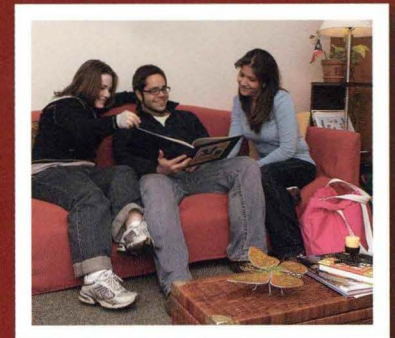
The city of Ames and Iowa State have a public bus system called CyRide. The bus system is free to all students. If you choose to bring a car and you'll be living on campus, you need to purchase a parking permit from ISU Parking. You do this through AccessPlus beginning in July. Spaces are on a first-come first-served basis.

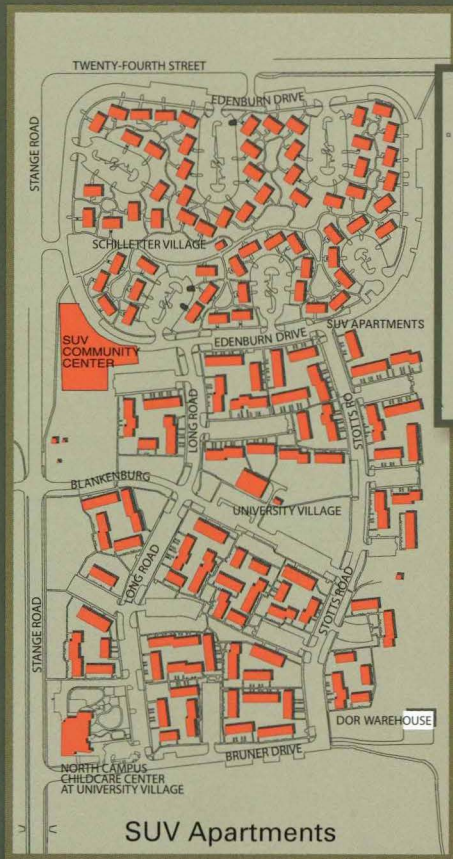


Live On...Again!

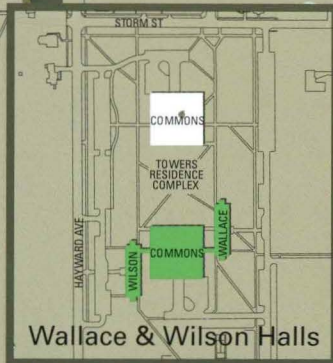

ISU Housing Map



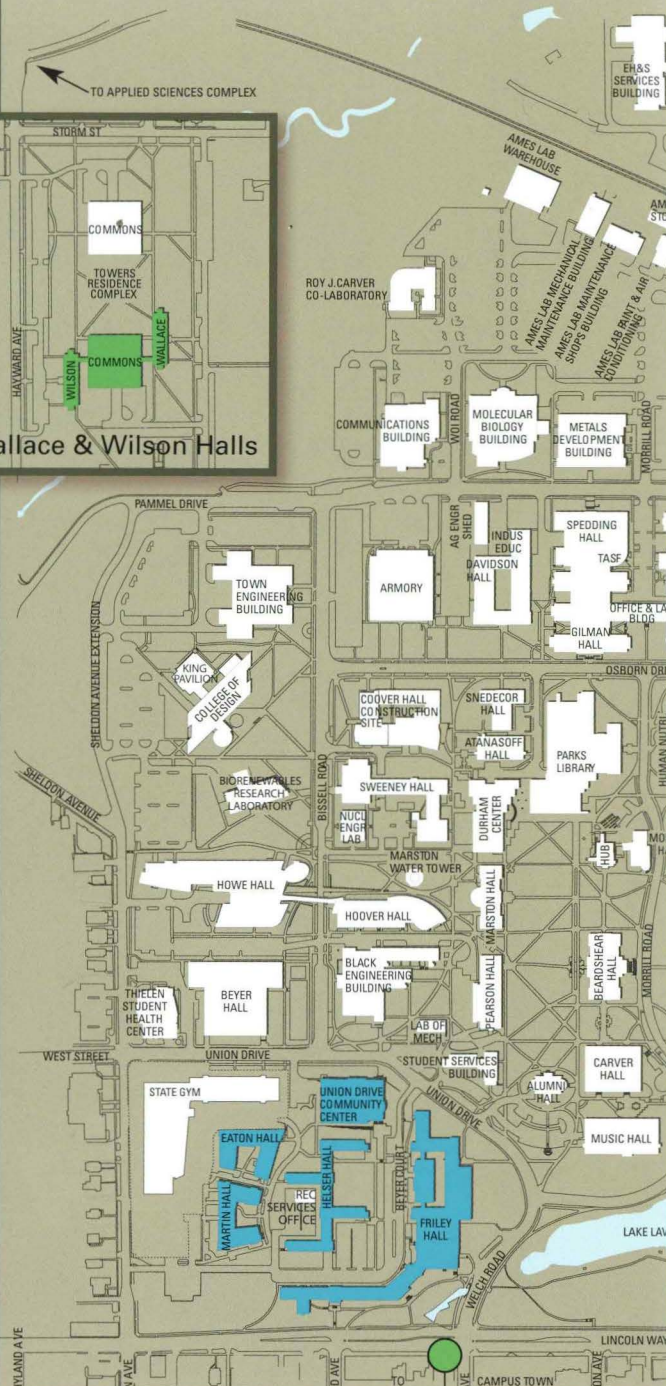
SUV Apartments

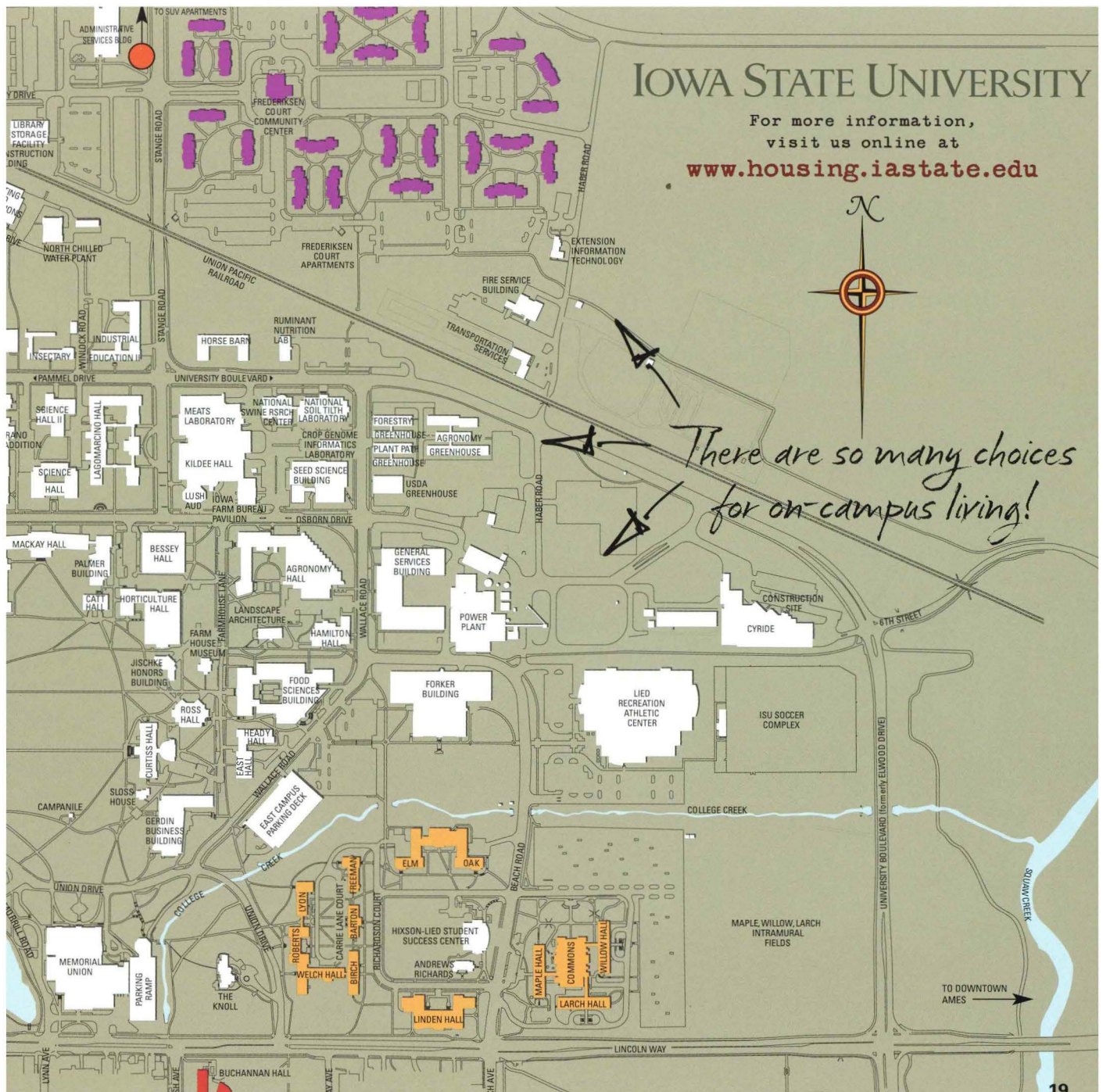

Living Green!
