Dear Governor Ray:

It has been an interesting experience for the public members of the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners to participate in the establishment of this new Board. For a year and a half we have worked together with the professional members to comply with the law as set forth by the Legislature.

Since this is a new licensing board, there were no established rules, application forms, tests or procedures common to long established examining boards. We had to formulate our own guidelines before applicants could be considered. In addition, business relating to the budget, communication, and the Board's operation had to be discussed and resolved in a practical manner. Understandably these starting up procedures required a great deal of the Board's time and attention. In addition, the consideration of the "Grandfather Clause" applicants, as required by law, made stern demands on the professional members time. It is our expectation that this deliberate and carefully considered approach to the functioning of the Board will have prepared a smooth path for its future operations.

We share with our professional members their concern for differences in school accreditation and inconsistencies in individual state requirements. Both cause problems of reciprocity. We believe the only effective way of resolving these problems is the Uniform National Examination as required by the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Board. This is not only for the protection of the people of Iowa, but for reciprocity of Iowans wishing to register in other states.

We think it imperative that the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners be represented at regional and national meetings so that we, as a Board, can be kept informed of progress and changes in the mainstream of the profession and thus be better prepared to serve the public.

We feel that our role as public members is a privilege as well as a responsibility. We do not consider our membership on the Board solely an advisory position, but rather one which is constructive and helpful not only to the Board but to the State and its registered Landscape Architects.

During the course of this past year and a half, we have been observers, participants, and contributors to decisions where appropriate. We support the professional members of the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners in their sincere effort to establish the best and most workable procedures for registration.

A critical review of the Board's responsibilities to the public cited in the Code of Iowa reveals that the Board still has several tasks which to date have been unaddressed. Admittedly, the registration of landscape architects and the practice of landscape architecture itself has a small visibility problem. Even though the profession is as old as Frederick Law Olmsted's development of Central Park in New York City in the mid-1800's, the prospect of registration did not reveal itself until the mid-1950's when California enacted the first state registration law for landscape architects. And even though the Landscape Architecture Department of Iowa State University is one of the oldest and best known departments in the nation, we find a rather low public awareness exists across this State as to the important role that the practice of landscape architecture plays in the preservation of the natural environment and the shaping of the man-made environment.

Finally, we know that the Board will not be able to fulfill its obligations to the State of Iowa as charged by the law, if appropriations are cut drastically in the next two formulative years. In another year and a half the efficiency of the procedures we have established can be tested, evaluated and adjusted. Until then, we feel that the Board should receive the modest financing it has requested. We strongly support the Board's intent to define and require a high level of professional skills of the landscape architects who aspire to practice in Iowa. We want the people of our State to benefit from the service that can be rendered by a registered landscape architect and to have confidence in the capability implicit in a license granted by this Board.

BOARD ACTIVITIES REPORT

The Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners was established in 1974 by an act of the 65th General Assembly. The provisions relating to the administration of the Board's activities are contained in Chapter 118A of the Iowa Code. Minor amendments were made in Chapter 118A in 1976.

The Board conducted its first meeting in Des Moines on June 24, 1975, and eleven additional meetings were held in FY 75/76. The executive secretary was selected in October of 1975 and the Board's Office was also established in that month. The Board Rules were formulated in the fall of 1975 and became effective in February, 1976.

The Board became a member of the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards (CLARB) in July of 1975. Testing services offered by CLARB will be utilized by the Board for written examination of applicants for registration.

Under the provisions of Section 118A.21 Examination not required, which expired on July 1, 1976, the Board received 209 applications for registration. The results of Board action on these applications are summarized below. There were no applications received for written examination during FY 75/76, principally because any individual who was eligible to apply for registration during this period was eligible to apply for registration without examination. The Board will be offering written examination to six applicants in December, 1976.

118A.1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

1. **“Board”** means the Iowa board of landscape architectural examiners established pursuant to section 118A.3.

2. **“Landscape architect”** means a person who engages in the practice of landscape architecture as defined in this section.

3. The **“practice of landscape architecture”** means the performance of professional services such as consultations, investigations, reconnaissance, research, planning, design, or responsible supervision in connection with projects involving the arranging of land and the elements thereon for public and private use and enjoyment, including the alignment of roadways and the location of buildings, service areas, parking areas, walkways, steps, ramps, pools and other structures, and the grading of the land, surface and subsoil drainage, erosion control, planting, reforestation, and the preservation of the natural landscape and aesthetic values, in accordance with accepted professional standards of public health, welfare and safety. This practice shall include the location and arrangement of such tangible objects and features as are incidental and necessary to the purposes outlined in this chapter but shall not include the design of structures or facilities with separate and self-contained purposes for habitation or industry, or the design of public streets and highways, utilities, storm and sanitary sewers, and sewage treatment facilities, such as are ordinarily included in the practice of engineering or architecture; and shall not include the making of land surveys or final land plats for official approval or recording. Nothing contained in this chapter shall preclude a licensed landscape architect from performing any of the services described in this section in connection with the settings, approaches or environment for buildings, structures or facilities. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed as authorizing a landscape architect to engage in the practice of architecture, engineering, or land surveying. [65GA, ch 1086, §176]

118A.2 Registration required. A person shall not use the title of landscape architect or any title or device indicating or representing in any manner that such person is a landscape architect or is practicing landscape architecture unless such person is a registered landscape architect as provided in section 118A.11. Every holder of a registration certificate as a registered landscape architect shall display it in a conspicuous place in his principal office. [65GA, ch 1086, §177]

118A.3 Establishment of board. There is established a board of landscape architectural examiners which shall consist of

five members who are registered landscape architects and two members who are not registered landscape architects and who shall represent the general public. Members shall be appointed by the governor, subject to the approval of two-thirds of the members of the senate. A registered member shall be actively engaged in the practice of landscape architecture or the teaching of landscape architecture in an accredited college or university, and shall have been so engaged for five years preceding his appointment, the last two of which shall have been in Iowa. Professional associations or societies composed of registered landscape architects may recommend the names of potential board members to the governor, but the governor shall not be bound by the recommendations. A board member shall not be required to be a member of any professional association or society composed of professional landscape architects.

Appointments shall be for three-year terms and shall commence on July 1 of the year in which the appointment is made. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment of the governor and shall be subject to senate confirmation. Members shall serve no more than three terms or nine years, whichever is less.

The initial five members of the board appointed by the governor as registered landscape architects shall meet the qualifications prescribed in this chapter and shall become registered as landscape architects immediately upon confirmation of their respective appointments without examination. 118A.4 Organization of the board—meetings—quorum. The board shall elect annually from its members a chairman, vice chairman and secretary. The duties of the officers shall be such as are usually performed by such officers. The board shall hold at least one meeting each year at the seat of government, and meetings shall be called at other times by the secretary at the request of the chairman or four members of the board. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. No action at any meeting can be taken without the affirmative votes of a majority of the members of the board. [65GA, ch 1086, §179]

118A.5 Duties. The board shall enforce the provisions of sections 118A.1 and 118A.21 and may employ technical and clerical assistants and incur such expense as may be necessary within the limits of funds appropriated to the board. The board shall make rules for the examination of applicants for the certificate of registration, and shall, after public notice, conduct examinations of applicants for registration. The board shall keep a record of its proceedings. The board shall adopt

and have an official seal which shall be affixed to all certificates of registration granted and the board may make such other rules, not inconsistent with law, necessary for the proper performance of its duty. The board shall maintain a roster showing the name, place of business and residence and the date and number of the certificate of registration of every registered landscape architect in this state. [65GA, ch 1086, §180]

118A.6 Annual report. Before the first day of July of each year the board shall submit to the governor a report of its transactions for the preceding year, together with a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the board. This report shall include the roster of registered landscape architects. A copy of this report shall be filed with the secretary of state. [65GA, ch 1086, §181]

118A.7 Compensation and expenses. Members of the board shall set their own per diem compensation at a rate not exceeding forty dollars per day for the time actually spent in traveling to and from, and in attending meetings of the board and its committees, and shall receive all necessary traveling and incidental expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties within the limits of funds appropriated to the board. Warrants for payments of expenses of the board shall be issued by the state comptroller and paid by the treasurer of state upon presentation of vouchers signed by the chairman or vice chairman and secretary and authorized by the board. [65GA, ch 1086, §182]

118A.8 Examination. The board shall conduct examinations of applicants for certificates of registration as landscape architects at least once each year, or, if there are sufficient applications, as such additional times as the board may deem necessary. The examination shall determine the ability of the applicant to use and understand the theory and practice of landscape architecture and may be divided into such subjects as the board deems necessary. The board shall determine the annual cost of administering the examinations and shall set the fees accordingly. The public members of the board shall not participate in administering or grading any portion of the examination.

An applicant who has failed the examination may request in writing information from the board concerning his examination grade and subject areas or questions which he failed to answer correctly, except that if the board administers a uniform, standardized examination, the board shall only be required to provide the examination grade and such other information

concerning the applicant's examination results which are available to the board. [65GA, ch 1086, §183]

118A.9 Applications. Any person may apply for a certificate of registration or may apply to take an examination for such certification. Applications for registration shall be on forms prescribed and furnished by the board, shall contain statements made under oath, showing the applicant's education and detail summary of his pertinent practical landscape architectural work and experience. The board shall not require that a recent photograph of the applicant be attached to the application form. An applicant shall not be ineligible for registration because of age, citizenship, sex, race, religion, marital status or national origin. The board may consider the past felony record of an applicant only if the felony conviction relates directly to the practice of landscape architecture. Character references may be required but shall not be obtained from landscape architects. An application for examination shall be accompanied by an examination fee in the amount determined by the board. Each applicant for registration as a landscape architect shall meet one of the following requirements:

1. Graduation from a course in landscape architecture in a school, college or university offering an accredited minimum four-year curriculum in landscape architecture, and a minimum of three years of practical experience in landscape architectural work which in the opinion of the board is of satisfactory character, at least one year of which must be under the supervision of a registered landscape architect or a person who becomes a registered landscape architect within one year after July 1, 1975.

2. Graduation from a nonaccredited course of landscape architecture of a minimum of four years in a school, college or university and a minimum of four years of practical experience in landscape architectural work which in the opinion of the board is of satisfactory character, at least one year of which must be under the supervision of a registered landscape architect or a person who becomes a registered landscape architect within one year after July 1, 1975.

3. A minimum of ten years of practical experience in landscape architectural work which in the opinion of the board is of satisfactory character to properly prepare the applicant for the examination.

A satisfactorily completed year of study in an accredited course of landscape architecture in an accredited school, college or university may be accepted in lieu of one year of practical experience.

A master's degree from an accredited school, college, or university may be accepted in lieu of one year of practical experience.

Any four-year college or university degree may be accepted in lieu of two years of practical experience. [65GA, ch 1086, §184]

118A.10 Foreign registrants. Any applicant who holds a license or certificate to practice landscape architecture issued to him upon examination by a board of examiners in any other state, territory, or possession of the United States, the District of Columbia, or of any foreign country, if the requirements for such license or certificate were, at the time it was issued, in the opinion of the board, equal to or higher than the requirements of this state, may be registered without further examination. [65GA, ch 1086, §185]

118A.11 Registration. When an applicant has complied with the application requirements of this chapter and has passed the examination to the satisfaction of a majority of the registered members of the board, or is a foreign registrant and has qualified for registration under this chapter, and has paid the required registration fee, the secretary shall enroll the applicant's name and address in the roster of registered landscape architects and issue to him a certificate of registration, signed by the officers of the board. [65GA, ch 1086, §186]

118A.12 Seal. Every registered landscape architect shall have a seal, approved by the board, which shall contain the name of the landscape architect and the words "Registered Landscape Architect State of Iowa", and such other words or figures as the board may deem necessary. All landscape architectural plans and specifications, prepared by such landscape architect or under the supervision of such landscape architect, shall be dated and bear the legible seal of such registered landscape architect. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to permit the seal of a landscape architect to serve as a substitute for the seal of a licensed architect, a licensed professional engineer or land surveyor whenever the seal of an architect, engineer or land surveyor is required under the laws of this state. 118A.13 Renewals. Certificates of registration shall expire annually as determined by the board. Registered landscape architects shall renew their certificates of registration and pay a renewal fee in the manner and amount prescribed by the board. A person who fails to renew his certificate by the expiration date shall be allowed to do so within thirty days following

its expiration, but the board may assess a reasonable penalty. [65GA, ch 1086, §188]

118A.14 Fees. The board shall set the fees for a certificate of registration as a registered landscape architect, and for renewal of a certificate. The fee for a certificate of registration and for renewal of a certificate shall be based upon the administrative costs of sustaining the board which shall include, but shall not be limited to, the costs for:

1. Per diem, expenses, and travel for board members.
2. Office facilities, supplies and equipment.
3. Clerical assistance.

All fees shall be collected by the secretary, paid to the treasurer of state and deposited in the general fund of the state. [65GA, ch 1086, §189]

118A.15 Suspension or revocation of certificate. The board may, by a five-sevenths vote of the entire board, suspend for a period not exceeding two years, or revoke the certificate of registration of, or reprimand any registrant who is found guilty of:

1. Any fraud or deceit in obtaining a registration;
2. Any fraud or deceit in his practice;
3. Any gross negligence, incompetence or misconduct in his practice; or
4. Who is found to have been convicted of any felony that would affect his ability to practice landscape architecture. [65GA, ch 1086, §190]

118A.16 Procedure. Any person may file charges with the board against a landscape architect or the board may initiate charges. Such charges shall be in writing, sworn to if by a complainant other than the board, and filed with the board. Unless the charges are dismissed by the board as unfounded or trivial, the board shall hold a hearing within sixty days after the date on which they are filed. The board shall fix the time and place for such hearing and shall cause a copy of the charges, together with a notice of the time and place fixed for the hearing, to be served on the accused at least thirty days before the date fixed for the hearing. Where personal service cannot be effected, service may be effected by publication. At such hearing, the accused shall have the right to appear personally or by counsel, to cross-examine witnesses against him, and to produce evidence and witnesses in his defense. After the hearing, the board may suspend or revoke the certificate of registration. The board may restore the certificate of registration

to any person whose certificate of registration has been revoked. Application for the restoration of a certificate of registration shall be made in such manner, form and content as the board may prescribe. [65GA, ch 1086, §191]

118A.17 Attorney general to assist and witnesses. The board is entitled to the counsel and services of the attorney general or such assistance as he may so designate. The board may compel the attendance of witnesses, pay witness fees and mileage, and take testimony and affidavits and administer oaths concerning any matter within its jurisdiction. [65GA, ch 1086, §192]

118A.18 Unlawful practice. Any person who uses the words landscape architect or any word or any letters or figures indicating or tending to imply that the person using the same is a landscape architect, without having a valid certificate of registration as a landscape architect issued pursuant to this chapter, is guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction may be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or be imprisoned for not more than three months, or be subject to both such fine and imprisonment. [65GA, ch 1086, §193]

118A.19 Injunction. In addition to any other remedies, and on the petition of the board or any person, any person violating any of the provisions of sections 118A.1 to 118A.21 may be restrained and permanently enjoined from committing or continuing the violations. [65GA, ch 1086, §194]

118A.20 Scope of chapter. Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed:

1. To apply to a professional engineer duly registered under the laws of this state.
2. To apply to an architect registered under the laws of this state.
3. To prevent a registered architect or professional engineer from doing landscape planning and designing.

4. To affect or prevent the practice of land surveying by a land surveyor registered under the laws of this state.

5. To apply to the business conducted in this state by any planner, agriculturist, soil conservationist, horticulturist, tree expert, arborist, forester, nurseryman or landscape nurseryman, gardener, landscape gardener, landscape contractor, garden or lawn caretaker, tiling contractor, grader or cultivator of land, golf course designer or contractor, or similar business. However, such person shall not use the designation landscape architect or any title or device indicating or representing that such person is a landscape architect or is practicing landscape architecture unless such person is registered under the provisions of section 118A.11. [65GA, ch 1086, §195]

Any person who within one year after the effective date of this chapter meets the application requirements of section 118A.9 shall upon application receive a certificate of registration without examination upon payment of the registration fee, provided that the practical experience in landscape architectural work need not have been under the supervision of a registered landscape architect but shall be of such a nature as in the opinion of the board to satisfactorily qualify the applicant. CHAPTER 1

DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

540—1.1(118A, 17A) Definitions. As used in these rules of the board, the following definitions of words and terms shall apply.

1. **“Board”** means the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners.

2. **“Landscape architect”** means a person who engages in the practice of landscape architecture under the authority of chapter 118A of the Code.

3. **“Practice of landscape architecture”** means the rendering of professional service or offering to render professional service to clients, including any one or any combination of the professional services defined in section 118A.1.

540—1.2(118A, 17A) Organization and duties. The board shall consist of five members who are landscape architects and two members who are not registered landscape architects and who shall represent the general public. The board shall elect annually from its members a chairman and vice chairman. The board shall enforce the provisions of sections 118A.1 to 118A.21 and shall maintain a roster of all registered landscape architects in the state.

1.2(1) Chairman. The chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings, shall appoint all committees, shall sign all certificates and other official documents, other than correspondence, and shall otherwise perform all duties pertaining to the office of the chairman.

1.2(2) Vice chairman. The vice chairman, shall, in the absence or incapacity of the chairman, exercise the duties and then possess all the powers of the chairman.

540—1.3(118A, 17A) Headquarters of the board. The official mailing address of the board shall be the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners, 1209 E. Court Ave., Suite 305, Des Moines, Iowa 50319. The officers shall be free to carry on their duties in such places as may be designated by the board.

540—1.4(118A, 17A) Meetings. Calls for meetings shall be issued in writing at least one week before the time of the meeting by the executive secretary.

540—1.5(118A, 17A) Order of business. In order that each board meeting may be conducted as expeditiously as possible, the chairman shall prepare an agenda listing all matters to be discussed at such meetings. A copy of this agenda shall be

available to each member of the board. Procedures shall be in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

540—1.6(118A, 17A) Books and records. In addition to the records prescribed by the law, the executive secretary shall keep such additional records as the business of the board may require.

540—1.7(118A, 17A) Seals and certificates.

1.7(1) Individual seal. Each registered landscape architect shall purchase an individual embossed seal as prescribed by the law which shall be in strict accordance with the design as accepted by the board. A rubber stamp, which is an exact replica of the seal, shall also be procured. All landscape architecture documents shall be dated and bear the legible seal and the signature of the registrant who is responsible for the document.

1.7(2) Certificate. Certificates issued to successful applicants shall contain the following information: Full name of the registrant, serial number assigned to the registrant, date of issuance, and issued for the practice of landscape architecture. Certificates shall be signed by all board members and shall bear the affixed seal of the board.

Each registered landscape architect shall also be given an annual renewal certificate, to be provided by the board, which shall contain substantially the same information as shown on the certificate. Such card shall bear the signature of the chairman of the board and shall also have a space for the signature of the registrant, and shall indicate the receipt of payment of the annual renewal fee.

CHAPTER 2 EXAMINATIONS

540—2.1(118A, 17A) Definitions. As used in these rules of the board, the following definitions of words and terms shall apply.

1. **“Evidence”** means any document or record of any kind of drawings, specifications, photographs, diplomas, registrar's statements, published data and certified personal statements as may be required as a part of any action on the part of the board.

Each item of evidence shall be clearly marked to insure positive and certain identification. It shall be the entire responsibility of the applicant to satisfy the board as to the sufficiency of the record and the evidence.

2. **“CLARB”** means the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards.

540—2.2(118A, 17A) Applications. An application for a certificate of registration shall be submitted on the form provided by the board and will be received at any time during the regular business hours at the office of the board. An application to take the written examination shall be filed with the board at least sixty days prior to the opening date of the examination.

2.2(1) Law and rules. The executive secretary for the board shall forward a copy of the law and a copy of the rules of the board with each application sent to the applicants.

2.2(2) Evidence. Each applicant shall submit, with the formal application for a certificate of registration, authentic proof of the statements made therein, by attaching documentary evidence to show the board that the applicant is clearly eligible under the section of the law upon which the application is based. Evidence submitted shall be exemplary of the total length of time for the experience cited. All documents should be 8½" x 11" when possible. All documents become the property of the board and are not returnable.

Applicants shall submit evidence for the years of experience which qualify them for registration. The board reserves the right to request additional evidence or information from each applicant in cases where questions concerning qualifications may arise.

2.2(3) Fees. The examination fee (\$50.00) or the exemption filing fee (\$50.00) shall accompany the application. Examination fees and exemption filing fees are not refundable.

540—2.3(118A, 17A) Procedure for processing applications. Each applicant shall be considered individually by the board and approved or disapproved on a roll call vote. The action taken by the board on each application shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting and an outline of the action taken by the board shall be filed with the application.

A personal appearance before the board, if required, shall be at the time and place designated by the board.

Willful failure to supply additional evidence or information within thirty days from the date of the written request from the board, or to appear before the board when such an appearance is deemed necessary by the board, may be considered just and sufficient cause for disapproval of the application.

Unless otherwise provided by law, any appeal from the action of the board shall be filed with the board within fifteen days from the date of mailing the notice containing a copy of such decision.

Correspondence relative to a request by the board for additional evidence or any appeal by the applicant shall be sent by registered mail.

540—2.4(118A, 17A) Examination of applicants. Examinations shall be conducted by the board annually during the month of June and again in December if the number of applicants warrant holding an examination.

Notice shall be given to applicants to be examined at least thirty days in advance of such examinations.

540—2.5(118A, 17A) Written examination. The written examination shall consist of the uniform national examination published by CLARB and shall include supplementary questions developed by the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners to reflect Iowa conditions.

2.5(1) Instructions. A copy of examination instructions and notice of the date and location of the examination will be furnished to each applicant after the applicant has been accepted by the board as eligible for admittance to the examination.

2.5(2) Re-examinations. An applicant failing any section of the examination will be required to retake only that section failed at the next examination administered by the board. Fees for re-examination will be prorated and based upon the number of sections requiring re-examination.

If the failed sections are not retaken and passed at the next examination, the application shall terminate and the applicant will be required to file an original application and pay the required fees before being eligible to again take the examination. This action is subject to appeal if there are unusual and extenuating circumstances which prevent re-examination at the next examination date.

The applicant must file a statement of intent to appear for re-examination sixty days prior to the date of the examination.

2.5(3) Grades. The board shall notify the examinee of the examination grade. All examination documents shall be retained by the board. An examinee may inspect the graded examination in the presence of a board member or the executive secretary.

540—2.6(118A, 17A) Exemption from the examination. Applications (including evidence to be examined by the board) for a certificate of registration under section 118A.21 must be postmarked or received at the office of the board not later than June 30, 1976.

The board may also exempt from written examination any applicant who holds a CLARB certification or who holds a license or certificate to practice landscape architecture issued upon written examination by a board of examiners in any other state, territory or possession of the United States, the District of Columbia, or any foreign country, if the requirements for such license or certificate were, at the time it was issued, in the opinion of the board, equal to or higher than the requirements of this state.

Applications in this category shall include evidence to be examined by the board.

540—2.7(118A, 17A) Certificate of registration. Applicants will be notified by the board of their eligibility or their ineligibility.

2.7(1) Payment. Upon payment of the initial certificate of registration fee (\$50.00), the board will issue the certificate of registration to the landscape architect.

2.7(2) Registration number. The certificate will indicate the registration number of the landscape architect. This registration number must appear on the landscape architect's seal and on all works signed by the landscape architect.

2.7(3) Certificate. Only one certificate of registration shall be issued to a registered landscape architect. A duplicate certificate may be issued by the board should the original certificate be lost or damaged. A letter of application for a duplicate certificate shall be submitted to the board together with the fee (\$10.00) for the duplicate certificate.

Registrants shall display the certificate in a conspicuous place in their principal office or place of employment.

540—2.8(118A, 17A) Annual renewal of registration. All registrations shall expire after June 30 of each year and shall be renewed annually. A renewal notice shall be sent to all registrants not later than the last business day in May of each year.

The annual renewal fee of \$50.00 shall be due and payable on the first day of July of each year and shall become delinquent after the thirty-first of July. A thirty-one-day grace period for renewal is allowed following the date of expiration (June 30).

2.8(1) Registration withdrawal. Any registrant in good standing upon fully retiring from landscape architectural practice, may withdraw from registration by giving written notice to the board.

2.8(2) Reserved.

540—2.9(118A, 17A) Reinstatement of registration. An application for the reinstatement of a certificate of registration shall include a description of the professional activities of the applicant during the period of nonregistration.

Before reinstating any certificate of registration, the board shall collect all past-due annual renewal fees plus a penalty of \$25.00, unless special exemption is granted by the board.

540—2.10(118A, 17A) Fee schedule. Under the authority provided in chapter 118A of the Code, the following fee schedule is adopted:

2.10(1) Fees. Fees are not refundable.

2.10(2) Checks and money orders. All checks and money orders submitted to the board shall be made payable to the Iowa Board of Landscape Architectural Examiners.

COUNCIL OF LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURAL REGISTRATION BOARDS

HISTORY

Registration in the profession of landscape architecture was first accomplished in 1953 when the legislature in California passed a registration law. Prior to this time, the profession itself had gone through several struggles with the prospect of registration. Discussion in the early 1900's by the American Society of Landscape Architects set the foundation for registration, but it was during the post-World War II period that a ground swell of activity in direction of professional registration became clearly evident. Sister professions of civil engineering and architecture organized as professional societies in the 1850's and registration in those professions followed more closely their organization into professional societies than did registration of landscape architects.

COUNCIL OF LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURAL REGISTRATION BOARDS

In 1961, with the number of states requiring registration growing, and the potential of all states eventually passing registration laws, there was a recognized need for a group to coordinate the overall approach to registration in the United States, thus the Council of Landscape Architectural Registration Boards (CLARB) was founded. The stated purpose of CLARB was, "..... to facilitate exchange of information among the several State Boards for licensing arrangements and to study and advise regarding related matters."

While many of the aspects of CLARB's purpose were carried out to the benefit of the member states and the profession, it was not until 1970 that the problem of reciprocity was dealt with in a significant manner. In 1970, the first critical step towards reciprocity was taken with the adoption of the Uniform National Examination (UNE).

The objectives of CLARB are to promote high standards of landscape architectural practice; to foster the enactment of uniform laws pertaining to the practice of landscape architecture; to equalize and improve the standards for examination of applicants for state registration; to compile, maintain and transmit professional records to member boards for registered landscape architects desiring this service; and to certify records and recommend registration for landscape architects who meet the standards of the Council for interstate and/or foreign registration.

Today, 34 states possess landscape architectural registration laws with at least six other state legislatures considering the prospects of registration. It is interesting to note that these 34 states represent more than 85% of the population of the United States. All 34 states are members of CLARB.

The Iowa Board became a member of CLARB in 1975 and will be utilizing the various services offered by CLARB. The chairman of the Board represented Iowa at CLARB's annual meetings in 1975 and 1976.
