- 2- 3 Employed adults seeking upgrading in their jobs attended over 2,400 supplementary courses, while unemployed or underemployed adults seeking new skills attended just under 400 preparatory short courses. This is an increase of over 800 in the supplementary area, or 33 per cent.
- 4 Career courses were attended by almost 48,000 adults in the areas of Agriculture, Distribution, Health, Home Economics, Office, Technical, and Trade and Industry. This is an increase of over 19,000, which is 42 per cent.
- 8 The holding power of all adult courses is excellent as evidenced by the very small statewide average dropout rate of 5 per cent.
- 23 Total reimbursement expenditures for all adult supplementary courses were \$247,844, based upon 40 per cent of salaries and travel.
- 26-27 Average reimbursement for each course was \$96 with an average reimbursement for each adult enrolled of \$6. These amounts are less than half the actual average cost to the schools since reimbursement is made at 40 per cent for teachers' salaries and travel. Reimbursement is not made for administration and other costs.
- 30 Courses are taught by both professional full-time teachers and instructors from business and industry. Over 3,400 teachers were employed, an increase of over 1,300 or 38 per cent.

Special programs were offered in Home Economics for the disadvantaged and Production Agriculture for returning veterans.

Since the financing of the Home Economics programs was from a special funding and not from regular supplementary funds, statistics are not reflected in the charts.

These special programs served over 3,500 persons. This does not include Vocational Home Economics and Vocational Agriculture programs in the local secondary districts.

23 Programs being conducted at the University of Iowa were reimbursed a total of \$4,127 in Fiscal Year 1972. These include: Leadership Training, Supervisory and Management, Executive Development, Labor Law, Union Leadership, and Public Works and Water Treatment Technology.

This year, for the first time, the report includes the five secondary schools offering adult career courses. Highlights and comparisons will be made in the Fiscal Year 1973 report.

MDTA Special Programs

The federal Manpower Development and Training Act provides fully funded training to low income persons in schools throughout the state. Trainees are provided a stipend while being trained. Since these programs are separately funded and administered, the enrollment and expenditures are not part of the regular adult programs and are charted separately.

However, they are included in the report since these programs are part of the overall training opportunities offered to adults in Iowa.
