

Dear Governor Vilsack:

I am pleased to submit the Annual Report of the Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission for calendar year 2002.

The report speaks for itself. I would simply call your attention to two matters that are of concern.

First of all it was my pleasure to serve at your request on the task force concerning finding a way to make the Iowa Supreme Court decision concerning tax rates revenue neutral. With the good assistance of Jack Ketterer, among others, the task force was able to present two models to the legislature, which meet the criterion of revenue neutrality. I would like to state that it was my pleasure to work with the other members of the tax force on this matter and I greatly appreciated the good work done by commissioner Ed Stanek of the Iowa Lottery.

Governor, it is my belief that either model is doable and, while there is a tax increase on the boats, I believe it is something that the boats can live with now and in the future. The Iowa Gaming Association disagrees with me and has undertaken an extensive lobbying campaign, which is certainly understandable. I simply would like to make the point that the task force did what you instructed us to do with dissenting opinions from the two Democratic legislators on the task force.

With the United States Supreme Court's decision to review the case, everything is up in the air, but I agree with you that this matter should be settled now regardless of the decision of the United States Supreme Court. I am not sure there is anything further I can do to assist you in this matte but, if there is, please let me know and I shall glad to be of further assistance to you.

Secondly, I would like to state that the commission continues to be concerned about the use of gambling treatment funds for other purposes. While I understand that there are many fine programs in the State of Iowa, including substance abuse, that can use government money, it

remains the fact that the use of the gambling treatment funds for other purposes runs contrary to the intent of the law in this matter. In addition, we are beginning to hear proposals to expand gambling in the state and, with expansion will come the opportunity for more problem gambling in the state. It seems to me that we will want to have the best treatment program possible to go along with the industry's desire to have the best gaming environment in the nation. The two must go hand in hand, Governor, and robbing Peter to pay Paul is not the way to see that this is done.

I thank you kindly for your consideration of this letter. It is the pleasure and privilege of the other commissioners and myself to serve at your request on the commission.

COMMISSION MEETINGS

During 2002, the Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission (IRGC) met nine times. Minutes of each meeting are kept on file in the Commission office and are available to the public upon request. The minutes are also available on the Commission's website: www3.state.ia.us/irgc/. Highlights of the meetings follow:

January 10, 2002: The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn, Johnston, Iowa. The Commission took the following actions: approved the final adoption of Rule 491-5.5, requiring the racetracks to provide specific purse information to the Commission at the conclusion of each race meet; approved an Agreement between the Iowa West Racing Association (IWRA) and Iowa Greyhound Association (IGA) with regard to purse supplements for 2002; and approved a Stipulated Agreement between IRGC and Peninsula Gaming Company for a violation of Iowa Code Section 99F.9 (Wagering-Age Restriction), which included a \$10,000 fine.

March 7, 2002: The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn, Johnston, Iowa. Several changes to Administrative Rules were approved under Notice of Intended Action. The Commission approved the 45-day plan for Dubuque Greyhound Park & Casino (DGP&C) and the Thoroughbred and Mixed Meets at Prairie Meadows Racetrack & Casino (PMR&C), as well as a change in the post times for the Mixed Meet. Notice was provided that requests for the Horse Racing Promotion Fund were due in the Commission's office by March 22, 2002, along with an accounting of how the funds awarded in 2001 were utilized. Excursion gambling boat licenses were renewed for the following: IWRA/Ameristar Casino Council Bluffs, Inc.; IWRA/Harveys Iowa Management Co., Inc.; Scott County Regional Authority/Isle of Capri Bettendorf, L.C.; Riverboat Development Authority/IOC Davenport; Clarke County Development Corporation/Southern Iowa Gaming Company; Dubuque Racing Association/Peninsula Gaming Company, LLC; Missouri River Historical Development, Inc./Belle of Sioux City, L.P. (BSC); Upper Mississippi Gaming Corp./Isle of Capri Marquette, Inc.; Southeast Iowa Regional Riverboat Commission/Catfish Bend Casino, L.C.; and Clinton County Gaming Association, LTD/Mississippi Belle II Employees Ownership Co.

<u>April 18, 2002:</u> The Commission met at Lakeside Casino Resort, Osceola, Iowa. The Commission took the following actions: approved an Amended and Restated Credit Agreement for Isle of Capri, Inc., the parent company of the licensees in Bettendorf, Davenport and Marquette; approved the financial audits of the licensees, except the Isle of Capri facilities, as submitted; and distributed the Horse Racing Promotion Fund to the Iowa Quarter Horse Racing Association. The Commission also approved a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order with regard to violations of BSC's liquor license. The Commission received the final report of the Long Range Planning Subcommittee.

May 16, 2002: The Commission met at Harrah's in Council Bluffs, Iowa. The Commission elected Mike Mahaffey and Diane Hamilton to serve as Interim Chair and Vice Chair, respectively. Numerous changes to Administrative Rules were approved under Notice of Intended Action and Final Adopt. The Commission approved an eight-meeting schedule for FY 2003. The Commission approved the payment of audit expenses for the IWRA/IGA Escrow Fund from the escrow fund.

<u>June 20, 2002:</u> The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn, Johnston, Iowa. The Commission approved the riverboat admission fee schedule for FY 2003. The Commission approved the new lease agreement between Racing Association of Central Iowa (RACI) and Polk County. Notice was

provided that applications for the Dog Racing Promotion Fund for FY 2003 were due in the Commission's office by July 10, 2002.

<u>July 18, 2002:</u> The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn, Johnston, Iowa. The Commission elected Mike Mahaffey and Diane Hamilton as Chair and Vice Chair, respectively, for FY 2003. The Commission approved a rule change under Notice of Intended Action which would increase the threshold amount for contract submissions. The Commission also approved the Final Adoption of several rule changes. The Commission approved the distribution of the Dog Racing Promotion Fund to the IGA with several conditions. The Commission approved Stipulated Agreements with Harveys Iowa Management Company and RACI for violations of Iowa Code Section 99F.9 (Wagering – Age Restrictions). Each was assessed a \$10,000 administrative penalty.

<u>September 10, 2002:</u> The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn in Johnston, Iowa. Executive Session was held for the purpose of receiving background information from the Division of Criminal Investigation pursuant to Iowa Code Section 21.5(1)g. The Commission reviewed the financial audits of the three Isle of Capri facilities – Isle of Capri Bettendorf, Isle of Capri Marquette and Rhythm City. The Commission approved a Stipulated Agreement with RACI for a violation of Iowa Code Section 99F.9 (Wagering – Age Restrictions), which included a \$10,000 administrative penalty. A legislative subcommittee was named.

October 17, 2002: The Commission met at Isle of Capri Bettendorf, Bettendorf, Iowa. The Commission approved the final adoption of Rule 429-5.4(8). The Commission approved a new Sponsorship and Operations Agreement between Ameristar Casino and IWRA, and an amendment to Harveys Iowa Management, Inc.'s Amended and Restated Excursion Boat Sponsorship and Operations Agreement. The Commission named an arbitration panel to determine the amount of gaming revenues to be utilized for purse supplements at Bluffs Run Casino (BRC) and DGP&C. The Commission renewed the racetrack and racetrack enclosure licenses for IWRA/BRC and Dubuque Racing Association/DGP&C. RACI requested that their license renewal be deferred until the November Commission meeting.

November 21, 2002: The Commission met at Stoney Creek Inn, Johnston, Iowa. The Commission heard an objection to the purse agreements between RACI and the thoroughbred and quarter horse racing associations. The agreements were approved as submitted. The Commission approved the renewal of the racetrack and racetrack enclosure licenses for RACI. The Commission received, and approved, a report from the legislative subcommittee, with the recommendations being forwarded to the Legislature





LABORATORY TESTING

The Iowa Racing and Gaming Commission, through comprehensive drug testing of participating animals, strives to protect the integrity of the sport of racing in Iowa. Iowa's urine and blood testing program is the backbone of the agency's policing functions. The drug testing program was conducted by Iowa State University Veterinary and Diagnostic Laboratory, the Commission's racing chemist.

Through chemical analysis of urine and blood samples collected from racing animals at the tracks, the Commission ensures that foreign substances are not being administered to racing animals pursuant to Iowa Code Chapter 99D.25.

The following is a summary of the samples tested and positive tests reported by the Laboratory in 2002 for the Commission.

IOWA BREEDERS' FUND

The Department of Agriculture maintains a database of thoroughbred, standardbred and quarterhorses that have qualified to be Iowa-foaled horses, as well as greyhounds that have qualified as Iowa-whelped dogs according to Iowa Code Chapter 99D.22 and Administrative Rules of the Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship.

An amount equal to 12% of the winner's share of any purse won by an lowa-foaled horse or lowa-whelped dog is withheld by the licensee from the breakage and paid at the end of the race meeting to the Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship for redistribution as breeders' awards.

lowa Code Chapter 99D.11 and 12 authorize distribution of the remaining breakage as follows:

At horse tracks, 2% of the remaining breakage is distributed to the Horse Promotion Fund and the balance of the breakage at horse tracks is distributed as purse supplements to the owners of winning lowa-bred horses.

The remainder of the breakage at greyhound tracks is divided, with 25% funding a stakes race restricted to registered lowa-whelped greyhounds, 2% funding the Dog Promotion Fund and 73% distributed as purse supplements to the owners of winning lowa-whelped greyhounds.

One percent of the exotic wagers, including 3 or more horses, dogs or races, is distributed as provided in 99D.12 above.

The amounts created from the total breakage and a portion of the casino revenues as statutorily required, were paid out as follows in 2002:

IOWA'S WAGERING DOLLAR

IOWA'S PARI-MUTUEL DOLLAR

Actual percentage withheld from each wagering dollar depends on the type of wager. Chapter 99D.11(5) authorizes takeout up to 18% on win, place, and show wagers; 24% on doubles (two dogs/horses/races); and 25% on triples (3+dogs/horses/races). Pari-mutuel taxes may range from 0 to 6% on live races based on increasing levels of mutuel handle. Simulcast wagering is taxed at 2% of the pari-mutuel handle. (Chapter 99D.15)

Breakage (the odd cents by which the amount payable on each dollar wagered in a pari-mutuel pool exceeds a multiple of ten cents) is distributed to the owners and breeders of lowa-foaled horses and lowa-whelped dogs.

IOWA'S GAMING DOLLAR

lowa's gaming industry consists of slot machines, table games, and other games of chance as authorized by the Commission. Slot machine statistics are kept on the total amount wagered and adjusted gross revenue. Each slot machine must have at least an 80% pay-out to the patron. Available data for table games includes the drop and ratio of adjusted gross revenues to the drop.

The tax based on adjusted gross revenues from gambling games is: Up to \$1,000,000, 5%; above \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000, 10%; above \$3,000,000 20%. This tax is distributed 1/2% each to the city and county, .3% to gambler's treatment, and the remainder to designated state funds.

On January 1, 1997, the tax based on adjusted gross revenue over \$3,000,000 from gambling games at racetrack enclosures was raised from 20% to 22%, increasing by 2% each succeeding calendar year until the rate is 36% in 2004. The lowa Supreme Court ruled that different gaming tax rates for riverboats and racetracks were a violation of the equal protection clause of the Constitution. As a result of this ruling, the tax rate was reduced on June 12, 2002 from 32% down to 20%. The distribution of the tax remains the same.
