
## 2023 HIV and Hepatitis Prevention Program Snapshot Integrated Testing Services: PrEP Screening & Referral




Of those who tested for HIV through Integrated Testing Services (ITS) in 2023, **5,746** met the CDC classification to be indicated for PrEP by criteria.

- **57% of those indicated were aware of PrEP** (compared to 52% over the five-year period represented).
- 18% reported PrEP use in the preceding 12-month period (compared to 16% over the five-year period represented).
- 16% reported PrEP use as 'current' on the date of testing (compared to 13% over the fiveyear period represented).

Data are not de-duplicated. Numbers represent test encounters not unique individuals.

### Populations Indicated for PrEP by Criteria:

- Men who have sex with men (MSM);
- Females and Transgender Women who have MSM partners;
- People who have been diagnosed with sexually transmitted infection in the previous five years;
- People who exchange sex for drugs, money, or other things that they need (and their partners);
- People who use injection drugs (and their partners); and
- People who have partners living with HIV.



# Among those people who were indicated for PrEP by CDC criteria who reported no current or

recent PrEP use (4,687):

- 83% received PrEP education as part of the testing encounter (compared to 75% in 2022);
- 33% accepted linkage-to-care support (compared to 28% in 2022) and;
- 8% accepted a referral to a PrEP provider (compared to 9% in 2022).
