Apply Now for Grant to Attend the 2024 ARSL Conference in Springfield, MA

The State Library is excited to announce grants to four lowa libraries to allow a librarian on staff to attend the **2024 Association for Rural and Small Libraries** (ARSL) Conference in Springfield, MA, September 11-14, 2024. Each grant offers up to a \$1,500 reimbursement for registration, hotel, and transportation.

The purpose of the grants is to help lowa libraries improve library service to their communities through continuing education and training for library personnel. The ARSL Conference is especially relevant to the majority of lowa libraries, which serve populations under 2,500.

The grants will be issued to the **library** (not the individual traveling) in the form of a reimbursement of up to **\$1,500**. Other incidentals, such as meals, will need to be covered by the library or the employee. Because the conference is in the northeast, costs are anticipated to be at least \$2,000 this year.

These competitive grants have a short application form which will require a paragraph (200 words or less) explaining why you want to attend, what you hope to get from the conference and how you plan to share the information with your institution and the wider library community.

The State Library is sponsoring these conversations to give all lowans a chance to hear from the All lowa Reads authors.




