July Is Known For ...

In turning the calendar page to July, many libraries are rolling with Summer Reading Programs. It's summertime, it's vacation time, it's hot! If you want a diversion, If you have some display table space or if you're looking for some fun social media posts, here are



some ideas based on what the month of July is known for:

- July was named in honor or Julius Caesar, whose birthday was July 12.
- President John Adams didn't win this argument: he urged congress to celebrate American Independence Day on July 2 because that was the day when the Continental Congress voted in favor of declaring independence from England. Two days later, on July 4, the Continental Congress signed the Declaration of Independence, so that day won out as the national celebration. July 4th has only been a federal holiday since 1941.
- John Adams and Thomas Jefferson actually died on the same day in the same year. And on a very fitting day: they both died on July 4, 1826. Thomas Jefferson was 83 years old, John Adams was 90.
- July is also known as National Hot Dog Month, probably because July is also known as the **Dog Days of Summer** 😊 July is also **National Ice Cream Month**.
- July 14 is Bastille Day, citing the beginning of the French Revolution. July 23 is the National Day of the Cowboy, July 30 is National Cheesecake Day.

And don't forget Shark Week—your books and movies on this topic alone could cover a display table! The Discovery Channel rolls with **Shark Week July 7-13**. This year hosted by John Cena, Shark Week is good TV! Looking Ahead To ...



The Public Library Annual Survey

Knowing this is our July 4th celebration week, yes understandably Halloween seems a long way off ! Just consider this a look ahead to the *FY24 Public Library Annual Survey*, which will be due on **October 31.** For many newly hired directors, this will be a first-time task.

<u>Scott Dermont</u> sent a bulletin to Iowa library directors in late May concerning the *Survey*. He wrote: *"Starting July 1, 2024, there will be several new changes to the way we*

collect data for the electronic resources portion of the survey. IMLS, the federal agency that provides and supports the annual survey, reviewed many of these questions and decided to make some changes. When we change the Iowa version of the annual survey, we will be consistent with the electronic resources data collected nationwide. Please note that we do not expect libraries to begin any new services. This is a new way of counting **existing** services that libraries may, or may not, already offer. The way you answer these new questions will have no bearing on your current or future accreditation status."

Seven questions will actually be deleted, including the question asking for total website visits. Scott explains that the new questions are all Y/N replacements for the more dataintensive questions that were removed. Rather than asking for total number of downloadable items, or use of databases, instead the questions will ask if your library provides those services. For instance, new questions will ask

- Did the library provide access to e-books purchased solely by the library?
- Did the library provide access to e-books purchased via a consortium, cooperative, or other similar group at the local, regional, or state level?
- Did the library provide access to e-books provided by the state library agency or another state agency?

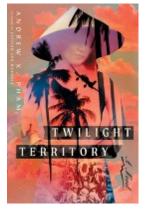
Note that the **FY24 Public Library Annual Survey** will open in **August;** again, **the due date is October 31.** The State Library will send notice to all public library directors with the link to the survey, user name, password, and instructions. You will be able to download a print version of both the survey and instructions. However, the final report must be submitted using the online form only. You can request your login information by contacting Toni Blair or your District Office.
