



Attention educators! Is your school looking for funding opportunities for technology and telecommunications? The Iowa Star Schools Project is pleased to announce the availability of 2001-2002 Connectivity Site Contracts for public elementary and middle schools (PK-8).

This \$3,000,000 competitive contract process is made possible by a U.S. Department of Education Star Schools grant. The maximum single award amount for new contracts is \$35,000. The maximum single award amount for continuation contracts is \$12,500.

The primary project goal is to increase access to telecommunications and educational technology resources that expand instructional opportunities beyond the classroom, school building and district. Contracts will fund expenditures related to:

- High speed connections to the school building (external; not leased lines)
- High speed connections within the school building (internal)
- Hardware and/or software that supports connectivity
- Hardware and/or software that supports student produced media
- Staff development to support use of connectivity


