Auditor of State Rob Sand today released a report on the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired, Council Bluffs, Iowa for the year ended June 30, 2023.

The School is governed by the Board of Regents, State of Iowa and provides day school educational programs for visually impaired youth, as well as a variety of resource services for mainstreamed During the year ended June 30, 2023, the School provided outreach services to students. 734 students and the average cost per student was \$12,276, compared to 723 students and an average cost per student of \$13,066 for the prior year.

AUDIT FINDINGS

Sand reported one finding related to the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired. The finding is on page 3 of this report. Sand recommended the School comply with the Iowa Legislative Acts related to the maximum number of full-time equivalent positions. The School's response to the recommendation is included in the report.

McKenzie Snow, Director of the Iowa Department of Education:

The Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired is a part of the State of Iowa and, as such, has been included in our audits of the State's Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) and the State's Single Audit Report for the year ended June 30, 2023.

In conducting our audits, we became aware of an item concerning the School's operations for which we believe corrective action is necessary. As a result, we have developed a recommendation which is reported on the following page. We believe you should be aware of this recommendation, which pertains to the School's statutory requirements and other matters. This recommendation has been discussed with School personnel and their response to this recommendation is included in this report. While we have expressed our conclusion on the School's response, we did not audit the School's response and, accordingly, we express no opinion on it.

We have also included certain unaudited financial and other information on page 5 of this report to report an average cost per student for the School for the five years ended June 30, 2023, as required by Section 11.28 of the Code of Iowa.

This report, a public record by law, is intended solely for the information and use of the officials and employees of the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired, citizens of the State of Iowa and other parties to whom the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired may report. This report is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

We would like to acknowledge the many courtesies and assistance extended to us by personnel of the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired during the course of our audits. Report of Recommendations to the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired

Finding Related to Statutory Requirements and Other Matters:

<u>Iowa Code Compliance</u> – The 2022 Iowa Legislative Acts, Chapter 1149 appropriated from the general fund of the State of Iowa to the Iowa Educational Services for the Blind and Visually Impaired for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023 a specific dollar amount to be used for salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes and also established a limit of full-time equivalent positions of not more than 56. During fiscal year 2023, the average number of full-time equivalent positions employed by the School and paid from the School's general fund exceeded the amount allowed by 8 positions.

<u>Recommendation</u> – The School should take steps to comply with the maximum allowable full-time positions as set by the Iowa Legislative Acts.

Response – The Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School contracts with the 9 Iowa AEA's and the Des Moines Public Schools for Teacher of the Visually Impaired and Orientation and Mobility services. This placed us over the FTE listed in the legislation – the faculty are IBSSS employees, but the salary and benefits are paid back to the school through the contracts.

<u>Conclusion</u> – Response acknowledged. The School should take steps to comply with the maximum allowable full-time positions as set by the Iowa Legislative Acts.
