


















The National Book Foundation announced the longlist for the 2024 National Book Award for Young People's Literature September 10. Is your favorite book on the list? Read the announcement here.

Each month, Denise will share an "All-In-One Youth Library Program" for librarians to use - and offer:


- · A Special Guest Spotlight
