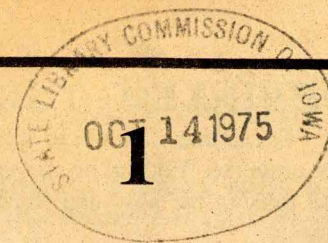


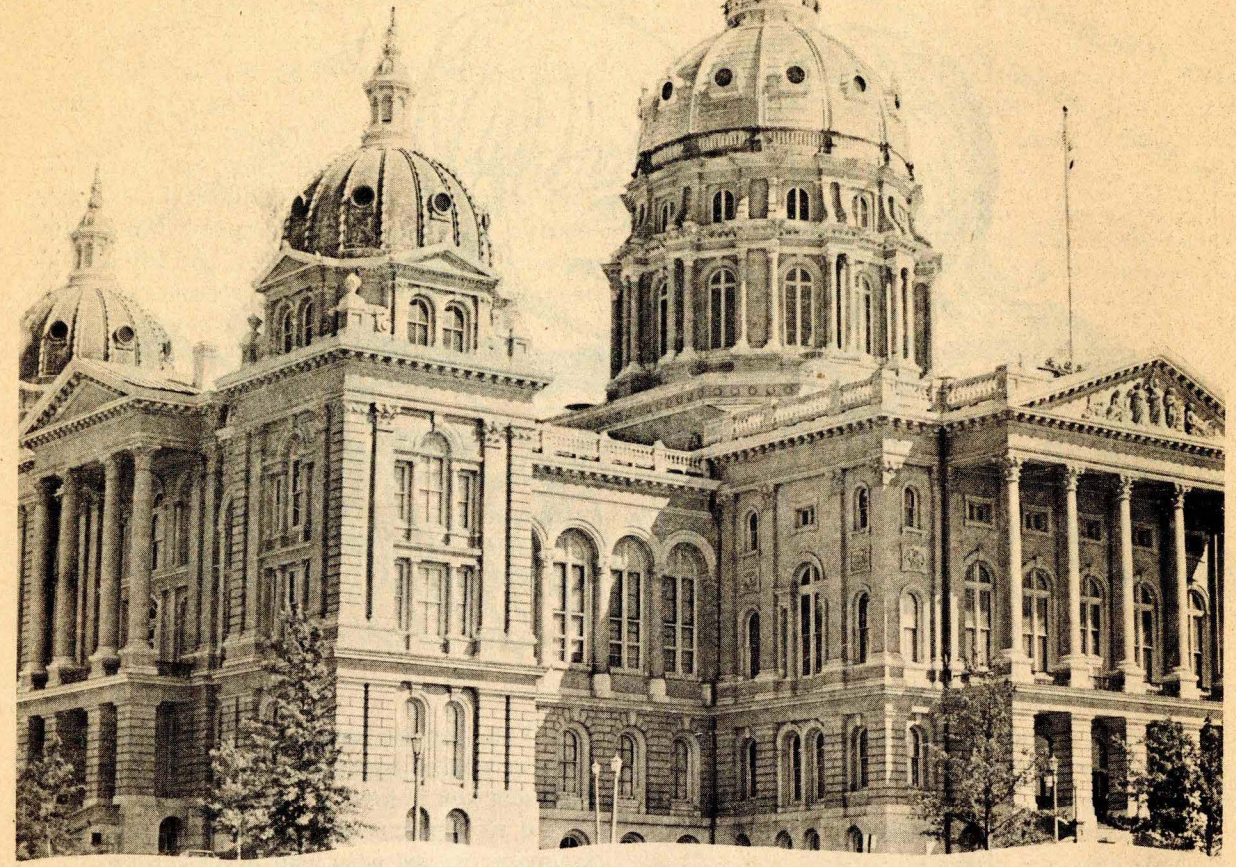

One of the most beautiful buildings in Iowa is the State Capitol in Des Moines. The Capitol belongs to you—and to all the people of Iowa. It is one of the most important buildings in Iowa, as well. Inside the State Capitol, your government works for you.



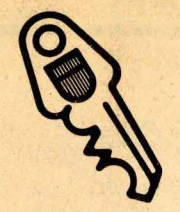
INSIDE THE CAPITOL

Your government has three equal parts, called the three branches of government. All three branches of Iowa government work inside the Capitol.

1. One branch of Iowa government has the duty of carrying out the laws of the State. It is the **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**. The chief executive of Iowa is the governor.
2. One branch of Iowa government makes court decisions about the exact meaning of Iowa law, in-

cluding decisions about criminal cases. It is the **JUDICIAL BRANCH**. The State's highest court is the Supreme Court. There are nine justices on the Iowa Supreme Court.

3. The third branch of Iowa government writes all the laws for Iowans. It is the **LEGISLATIVE BRANCH**. It is called the General Assembly. There are 100 state representatives and 50 state senators in the Iowa General Assembly.

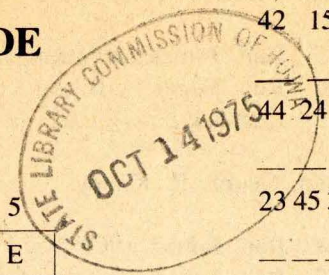

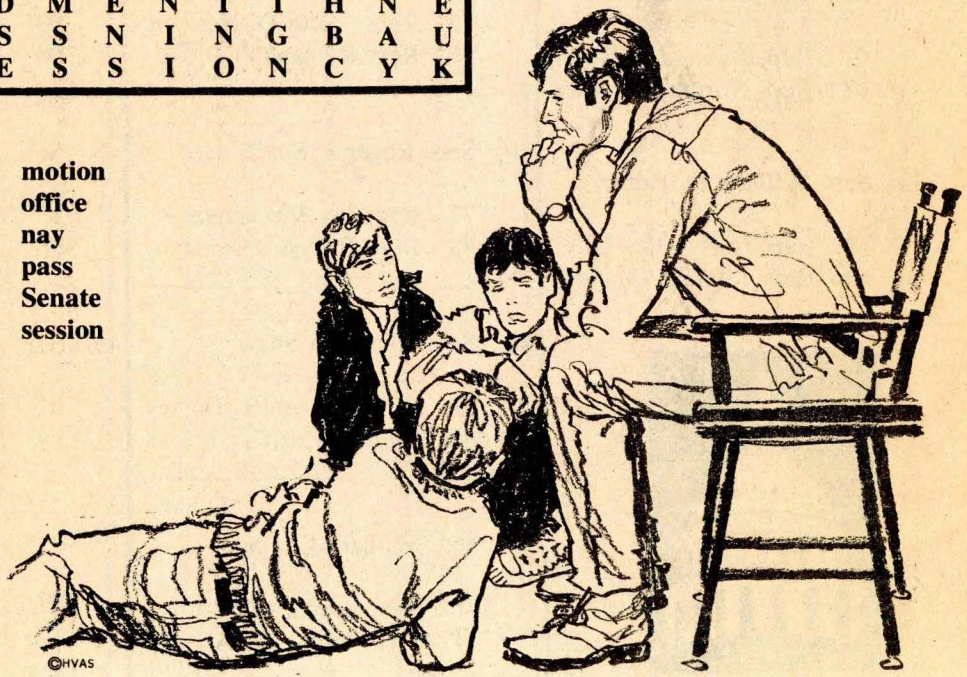

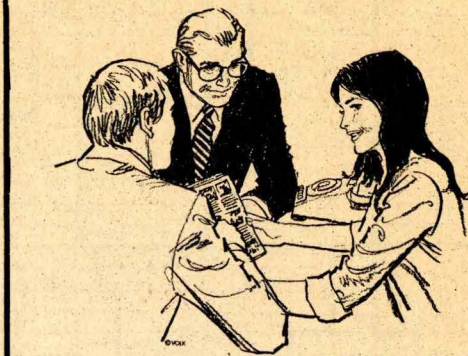

How many people does each senator represent?

Each representative?

The map on the inside pages shows the 100 representative districts, and tells which two representative districts make up each senate district. Look at the map. Next, look at the list of senators and representatives. Find the district number next to his or her name.

Now you can answer the question, "Who is my state representative and who is my state senator?"

YOUR IOWA LAWMAKER

Your representative is elected every two years. Your senator is elected every four years.

FACT TO REMEMBER:

Iowa became a state in 1846. The Iowa General Assembly has met 66 times since 1846. The present legislature is called "The Sixty-Sixth General Assembly." The legislature meets every year. Before 1969, it met only every other year.

Another way to say it is, "The Sixty-Sixth General Assembly will exist for two years." The first year's meeting is called "the first regular session," and the next is called "the second regular session."

The 1976 legislative meeting is "the second regular session of The Sixty-Sixth General Assembly of Iowa."

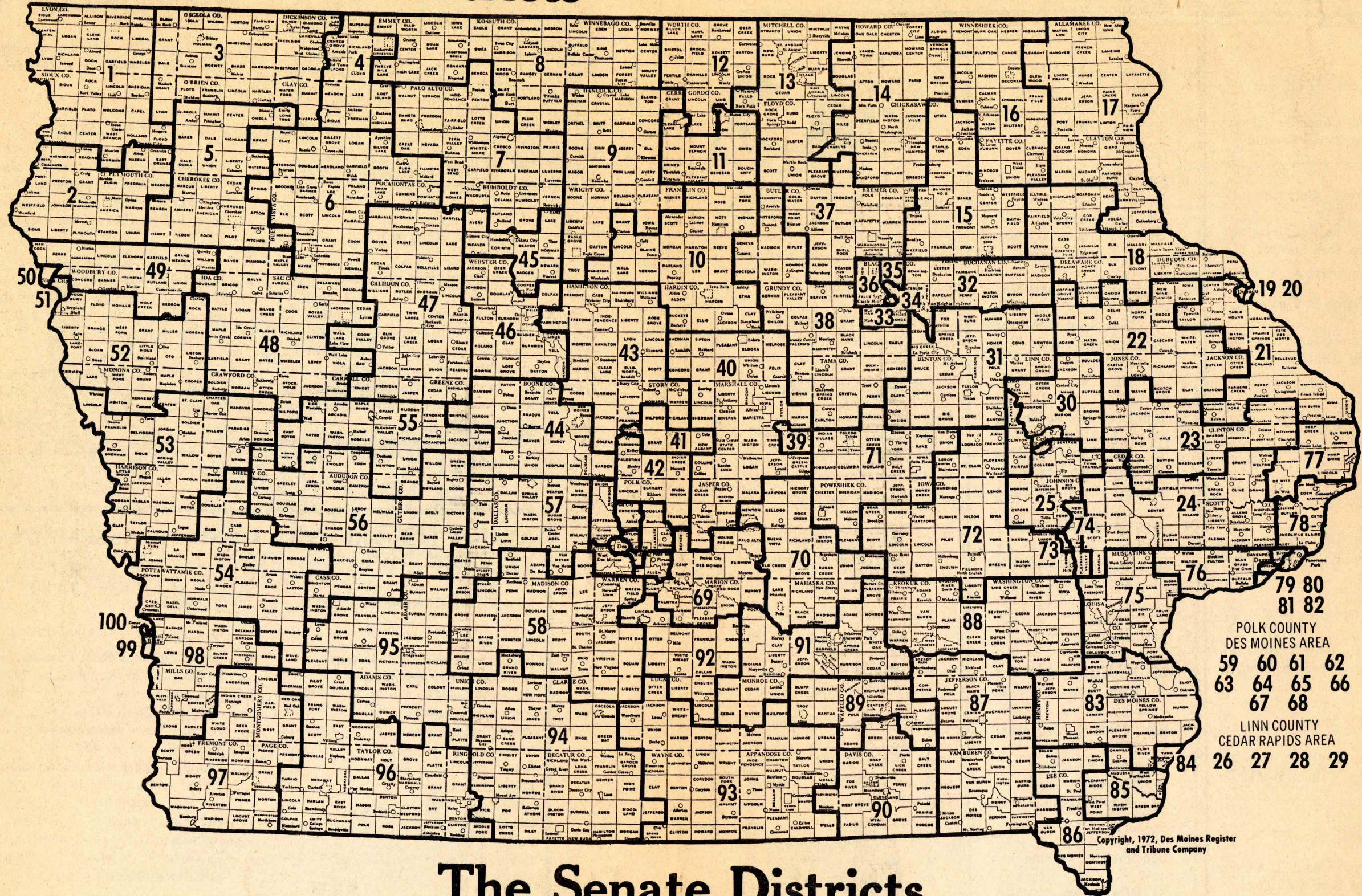

Among all 150 legislators, 12 list their occupation solely as "legislator." The Assembly includes 8 who are in insurance or real estate, and several in a wide variety of other businesses including: an auto dealer, a furniture store owner, a lumber retailer, and a pharmacist. There are auctioneers, a security broker, and a certified public accountant. Also listed are: an artist, a fire captain, two factory workers, a journalist, a construction worker, and two cereal company employees.

There are 2,825,000 Iowans. Each of the 100 state representatives represents an equal number of Iowans.
