## CONSOLIDATED SCHOOLS IN IOWA

The Department of Public Instruction of Iowa receives numerous and varied inquiries relative to the consolidated schools of this state. These inquiries come not only from Iowa superintendents, teachers and school patrons, but also from individuals in other states who are interested in the consolidated school movement. Graduate students in the departments of education in colleges and universities both in this and other states frequently choose some phase of the consolidated school as a basis for thesis study and request our assistance in making their surveys. Departments of Public Instruction of other states and research specialists for the Federal Bureau of Education, submit inquiries from time to time relative to the subject.

To help answer these inquiries, brief bulletins have been issued the past two years, but all too often the material or information requested was not in these bulletins and not available to the department because it was not included in the uniform annual report submitted by the consolidated school superintendents (Form 4 General Statistics, Form 9 Transportation).

In 1924, the form used by county superintendents in making their annual report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction was revised materially and to secure more complete information on the consolidated schools a new section was included; namely, "Special Report of Consolidated Schools." To assist in gathering the required data, the following form was used:

The reports of the county superintendents are filed annually with the Department of Public Instruction and from these reports, Tables I and II of this bulletin have been compiled. It will be noted that some of the material is historical in nature, as the date of consolidation, the area of the district, number of old districts included within the consolidation, the date of building and cost of the same. For the other data, the school year closing June 30th, 1925, was taken as average and representative and the survey made on the reports for that year. Every effort was made to avoid errors by checking the reports of the county superintendents with other records wherever possible.

In the tables, the schools are listed by counties, the counties being arranged in alphabetical order. To facilitate reference to any particular school, an alphabetical list of the three hundred eighty-five consolidated schools with the counties in which they are located precedes the tables.

## THE TYPICAL IOWA CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL

A survey of the following tables indicates that the typical or average Iowa consolidated school has been formed by the consolidation of approximately six independent districts. In area it embraces 26.5 government sections of land or 16,960 acres. The building which houses this consolidated school has been erected at a cost of \$62,000 and is located on a plat of ground containing 5.4 acres. Against this building there remains a bonded indebtedness of approximately \$58,000. The operation of this average consolidated school involves an annual budget of \$25,809, \$20,930 of which is levied for the general fund and \$4,879 for the schoolhouse fund, the annual levy being 53.9 mills.

In this Iowa consolidated school 224 pupils are enrolled, 66 of whom are in the high school and 158 are in the first eight grades. For the instruction of these pupils, approximately five grade teachers and four high school teachers are employed at a salary of \$112.50 per month for grade teachers and \$163.00 for high school teachers. The average daily attendance in this school is 192 pupils, 128 of whom are transported by the district to and from school at a cost per month per pupil transported of \$4.49. For the transportation of these pupils this school uses four horse drawn busses and three motor busses, the pupils traveling a distance one way of 3.8 miles.

One out of every six of the Iowa consolidated schools has a vocational department under the Smith-Hughes plan and one in sixteen offers an approved high school normal training course.

An annual appropriation of \$150,000 is available for state aid to consolidated schools and those that are approved by the Department of Public Instruction for this aid receive annually approximately \$425. Those schools that maintain normal training departments receive annually from the state approximately \$700 for this purpose and those that have vocational departments operated under the Smith-Hughes plan receive federal aid in amounts that vary with the type and extent of the program involved.

## GENERAL SUMMARY

In summarizing the preceding tables, we may say that three hundred eighty-five consolidated schools are in operation in eighty-nine counties in Iowa, there being but ten counties in the state which have no consolidations. These consolidated districts include ten thousand two hundred fifty-four government sections of land, their school sites alone occupying over two thousand acres. Iowa has invested twenty-three million dollars in consolidated school buildings, twenty million five hundred thousand of which is covered by bonded indebtedness. The annual budget of these consolidated schools is approximately ten million dollars, eight million dollars of which is levied for the general fund and approximately two million for the schoolhouse fund.

In these schools eighty-five thousand nine hundred sixty-one pupils are enrolled, sixty thousand eight hundred six of whom are in the grades and twenty-five thousand one hundred fifty-five in the high schools. For the instruction of these pupils, two thousand ninety-one grade teachers and one thousand six hundred fifty-three high school teachers are employed. The median salary per month is one hundred twelve dollars and fifty cents for grade teachers and one hundred sixty-three dollars for high school teachers including the superintendent.

The consolidated schools have enrolled five thousand eight hundred sixty-one tuition pupils, one thousand three hundred sixteen of whom are in the elementary grades and four thousand five hundred forty-five in the high school. Seventy-three thousand seven hundred four pupils are in average daily attendance, this being eighty-five and seven-tenths per cent of the enrollment.

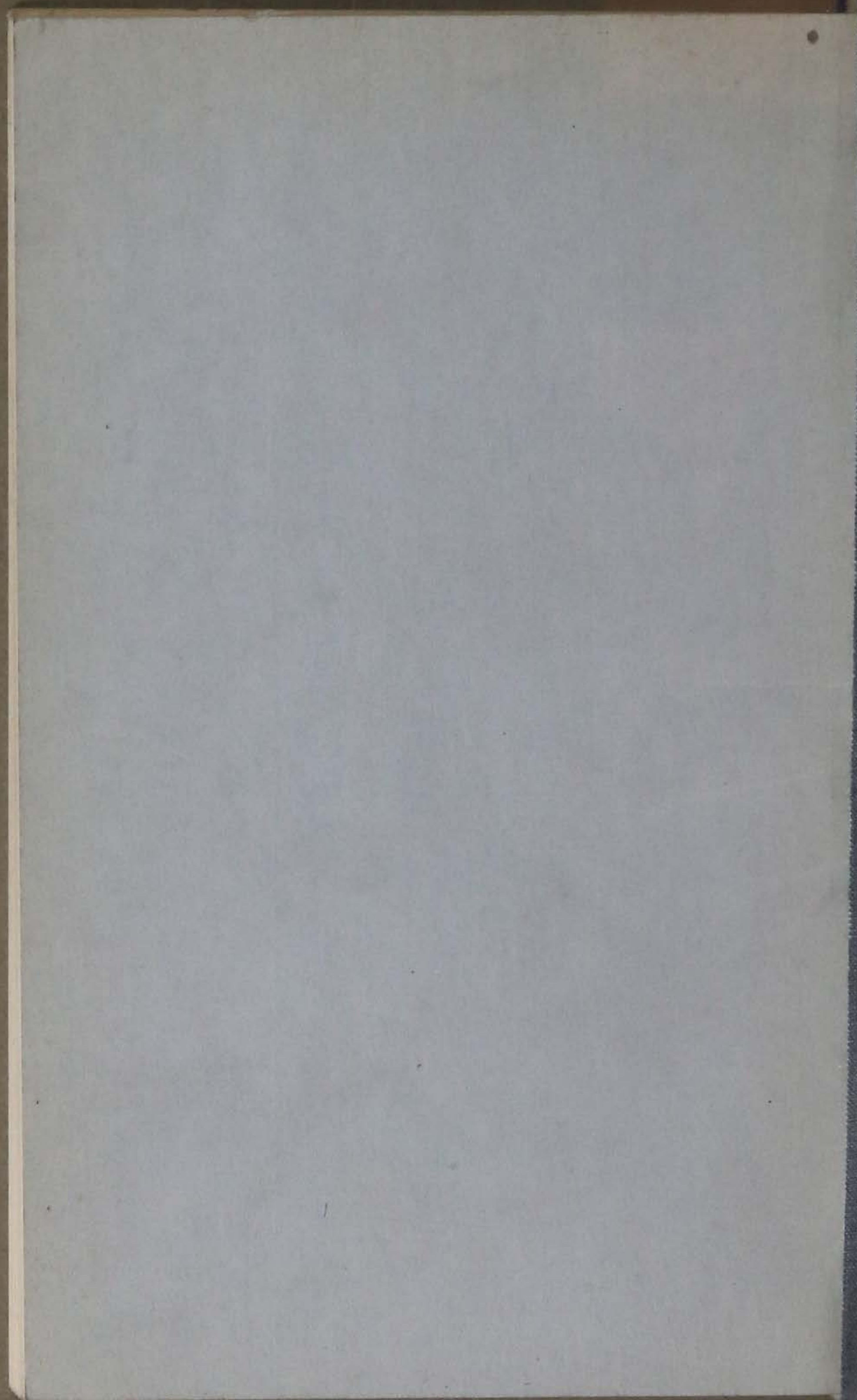
