Workday Learning Updates

Hi, folks! Many of you have reached out with some version of: "What's going on with all those emails from Workday?" And it's a fair question! The short answer is that we're working on the technical side to get the email notifications to a place where they're more helpful.

The longer answer follows: Basically, if you register for a live webinar, but aren't able to attend (which is totally fine!), Workday will send you a message saying you were "Dropped" from the class, and the course will fall off your "My Learning" list. You will still receive the email alert that you can register for the Webinar Archive version of the course and view it for credit.

If you *did* attend the live webinar, but did not complete the evaluation within the 30-day window, you will get a "Dropped" message after 30 days and the course will fall off your "My Learning" list. You can email <u>LibContEd@iowa.gov</u>, and we can manually re-open the evolution window, if needed.

Remember, an evaluation in Workday Learning is a "Lesson" component of each course.

I am working with the Department of Administrative Services to try and set up reminders for that 30-day evaluation window. Oh, and wouldn't it be nice if your name was included in that email instead of "[Not Available]"? We'll get there, thanks for your patience!
