IOWA PUBLIC SCHOOL PERSONNEL

Iowa public schools employ a total of 26,467 persons for instructional purposes for the 1956-1957 school year. This is an increase of 581 over the previous school year, 1955-1956.

In the 788 public school districts maintaining approved high schools, 2,072 persons are employed as superintendents, principals, and supervisors; 7,212 as classroom teachers on the high school level; 2,288 as junior high school teachers, and 11,268 in the elementary grades.

In the non-high school districts there are 2,442 elementary teachers employed in the one-room rural schools; 869 elementary teachers in the 240 rural schools with more than one teacher, and 7 teachers on the high school level. The ninety-nine county superintendent's offices account for 309 persons.

PUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT INCREASED 2.5% OVER 1955-1956 SCHOOL YEAR

The total enrollment in the public schools of Iowa for the 1956-1957 school year is 531,029 pupils, as of September 15, 1956.

In the districts maintaining high schools the elementary enrollment increased 15,195 pupils over the 1955-1956 school year and the high school enrollment increased 2,405 pupils.

In the non-high school districts there was a decrease in elementary enrollment, due to school district reorganization, of 4,739 pupils, and an increase of 126 high school pupils.

This makes a net increase of 12,987 pupils or 2.5% in Iowa public schools over the 1955-1956 school year.

The following tables give a detailed break down of enrollment by size of school and pupil teacher ratios.

Note: As you study the above table please keep in mind that common practice does not necessarily indicate that it is educationally sound. You will note that in the 788 high school districts 46% of the districts maintain one-half day kindergarten, while in schools with an enrollment of 200 and above (123 districts) 91% of the high school districts maintain a one-half day kindergarten.

The State Department of Public Instruction recommends, whenever possible, the one-half day program. Detailed information on the recommended kindergarten program is contained in "Portfolio for Teachers of the Five-Year-Old" issued by the State Department of Public Instruction. 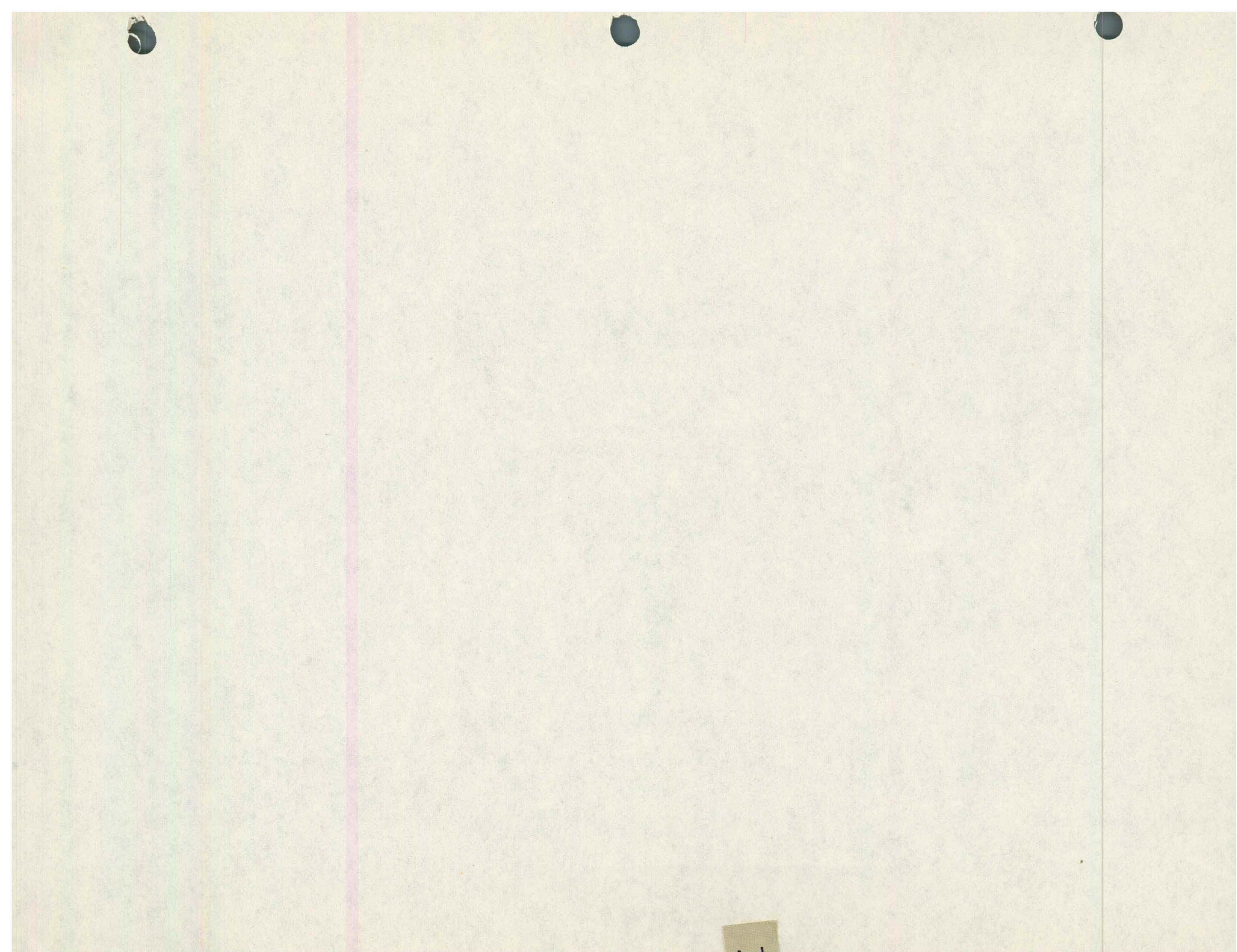

PLEASE NOTE: This study shows that per pupil costs tend to decrease as the size of the school increases. An important factor which is not shown in the study is that larger schools, since they make more efficient use of teachers, invariably offer a broader and more comprehensive program for all of the pupils. Schools having an enrollment of 600 high school pupils and above usually pay substantially higher salaries for teachers, which accounts for their slightly higher costs.

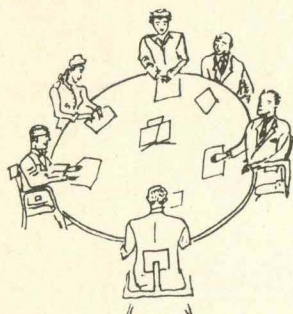
EDITOR'S NOTE: *The demand for this article which appeared in the March, 1956, issue of the Department's Educational Bulletin has been so great that it is reprinted for your convenience. The chart included in this article on pupil teacher ratios and high school tuition costs are for the 1956-1957 school year.*

This article proposes to suggest how lay citizens can and are participating in the planning of new districts.

Citizens committees studying and planning for proposed reorganization numbered more than 300 as of July 1, 1956. Since that time the number of such committees has grown rapidly.

These committees have come into existence in many different ways. Members have been appointed by boards of education of each district affected, by county board or county superintendents.

Steering Committee



These committees largely have started with what has most often been called a steering committee. Such a committee has normally consisted of from seven to fifteen people. Its functions have been about as follows:

- ▶ Organize themselves—elect officers
- ▶ To get the membership for an over-all committee of 35 to 40 people
- ▶ Arrange for the first meeting of the whole committee, issuing notices of the time and place of such meeting
- ▶ To orient themselves and then the committee as a whole as to purposes of such a study group
- ▶ Arrange for a resource person familiar with committee functions to be present
- ▶ Organize the committee as a whole—elect officers—into five subcommittees
- ▶ Arrange for a discussion of the committee as a whole to divide itself into five subcommittees

Area and school population
 School program or curriculum
 Building and school plant facilities
 Transportation
 Finance

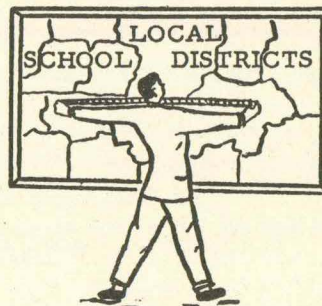
- ▶ See that each subcommittee has an understanding of what they are to do and how they should go about it
- ▶ Coordinate the work of the subcommittees since there is a great deal of interdependency among them
- ▶ See that reports of subcommittees are reproduced and that an over-all report of the committee as a whole is prepared and made ready for distribution

▶ Act as the public relations leader for the committee as a whole. See that small meetings throughout the area are called so that the public can be informed and their questions answered

▶ Help provide resource people for the subcommittees and the committee as a whole. For example, informed persons in the areas of school population, school finance, curriculum, school buildings, and transportation.

The Subcommittees

Area and School Population Subcommittee



- To tentatively determine the area (or areas) to be studied, using maps, design the boundaries of such an area (or alternative areas)

- To determine the number of pupils to be served and to spot by residence the pupils to be transported by grades and to make a pre-school census

- To locate the attendance centers that might be used and to suggest the grades that each attendance center should house

School Program and Curriculum Subcommittee

- To evaluate present programs offered in existing districts

- To suggest a program for the new district, listing the subjects to be offered and the educational services that should be provided. For example, in the high school program—basic subjects—

How many years in the English skills — literature, speech, dramatics, grammar, debate, journalism

Foreign Languages—Latin, French, Spanish

Mathematics—general, algebra, geometry, advanced mathematics

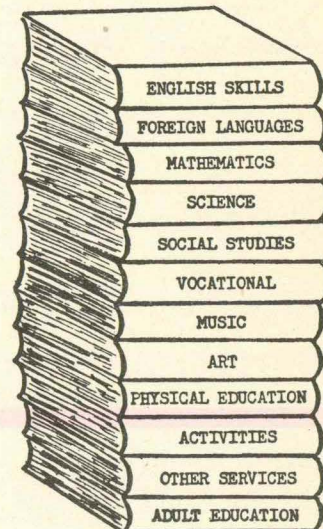
Science — general, biology, physics, chemistry (with adequate laboratories)

Social Studies—history, sociology, economics, government, citizenship

Vocational Subjects—agriculture, shop, home making, distributive education (business education — typing, shorthand, bookkeeping, etc.)

Music—instrumental and vocal

Art—all grades

SALARY STUDY IN THE 788 DISTRICTS MAINTAINING APPROVED PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOLS
FOR 1956-1957 SCHOOL YEAR

The school districts of Iowa are grouped for this salary tabulation according to HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENTS. The five groups are: 0 - 99; 100 - 199; 200 - 299; 300 - 399; 400 and above.

The median is the middle point; the first quartile indicates a point in rank with one quarter below it; the third quartile has one quarter above it. One-half of the numbers are between the first quartile and the third quartile.

The tables should be read in this manner: In Table I there are 456 superintendents whose median annual salary is \$5,603.00; one-half of these superintendents receive between \$5,200.00 and \$6,030.00. (Whenever a superintendent listed his salary plus house, \$600 was added.) The remainder of this table and the other tables should be interpreted in like manner.

In these tables an asterisk (*) indicates that, because of the small number recorded, no computation has been made.
