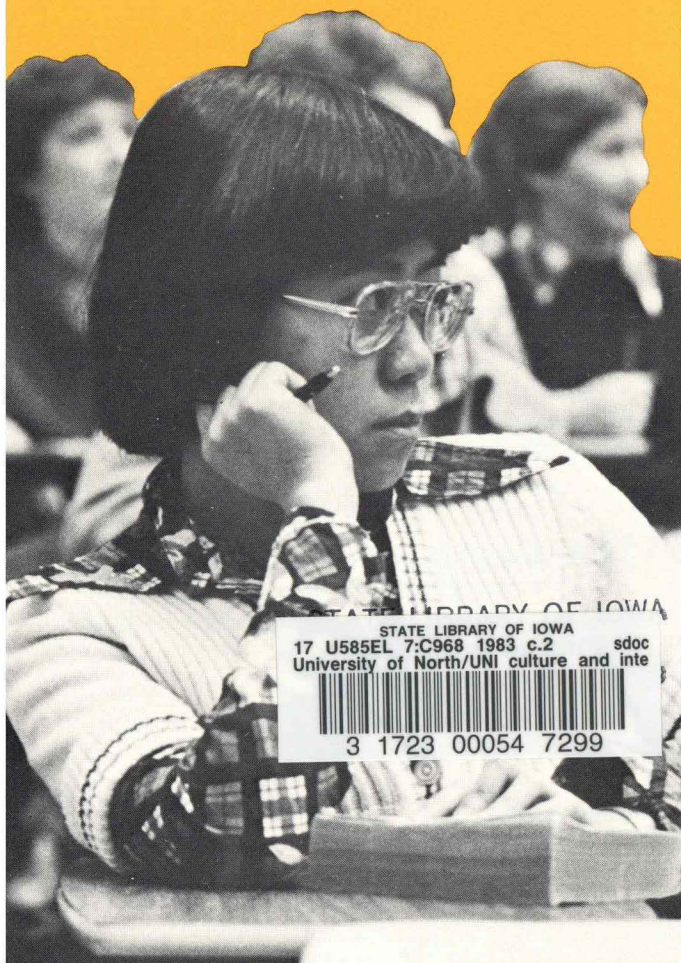

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UNI Culture and Intensive English Program

The Program

The University of Northern Iowa (UNI) Culture and Intensive English Program (CIEP) provides a course of instruction that emphasizes communicative control of spoken and written English for non-native speakers. The Program, which is designed for a maximum of 30 students, is primarily intended for those students who have already attained some proficiency in English.

Six hours of classroom instruction (including individual and group language laboratory work) and out-of-class activities are provided daily during the six-week instructional period. Experienced instructors teach small classes designed to meet the individual needs of students. A Certificate of Completion is awarded to each student upon completion of the program.

The Campus and Community

UNI is the only state-supported university in Iowa located in a major metropolitan area. The Cedar Falls/Waterloo metropolitan area population is 120,000. Cedar Falls is in northeast Iowa, not far from Chicago and Minneapolis. It is accessible via three federal and four state highways and is served by Waterloo Municipal Airport. Both Cedar Falls and Waterloo have abundant recreational, retail and cultural facilities, making this a great place to study, work and live.

Cultural Activities

Field trips and other activities are provided to acquaint students with aspects of American culture and life. All students are eligible to participate in the various social, cultural, and recreational activities available at UNI. In addition, CIEP students normally share dormitory rooms with English-speaking roommates.

Testing

Upon arrival at UNI, students take a placement examination. The results of the examination allow placement of students in those classes which will be of greatest benefit to them. Progress is regularly assessed throughout the Program.

CIEP students also have the opportunity to take the TOEFL examination, which is required of international students for admission to most colleges and universities in the United States.

Eligibility

All persons who have graduated from a secondary school or the equivalent may apply. Students are expected to have a minimum English proficiency of 380 on the TOEFL examination (Test of English as a Foreign Language), or its equivalent.

The CIEP especially welcomes students who are prepared for academic study in English-speaking environments and who wish to improve their English-language skills.

Admission to the University of Northern Iowa

Admission to the Culture and Intensive English Program does NOT constitute admission to the University of Northern Iowa. Admission to the University requires separate qualifications based on high school or university transcripts, personal recommendations, and English language proficiency of 550-600 on the TOEFL examination. Additional courses in English for Speakers of Other Languages are available for University credit after students have been admitted to UNI.

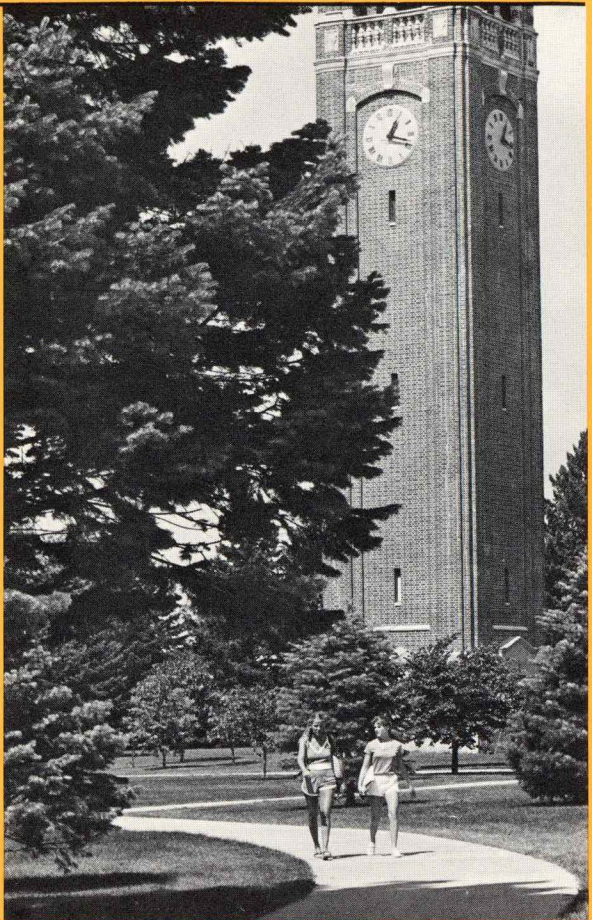
Housing and Meals

Students live and eat in residence halls at the University of Northern Iowa. Admission to the CIEP guarantees students space in University residence halls. The cost for room and board for the six-week Summer Session is approximately \$360. Dormitory rooms will be open from Wednesday, June 8 through Saturday, July 23.
