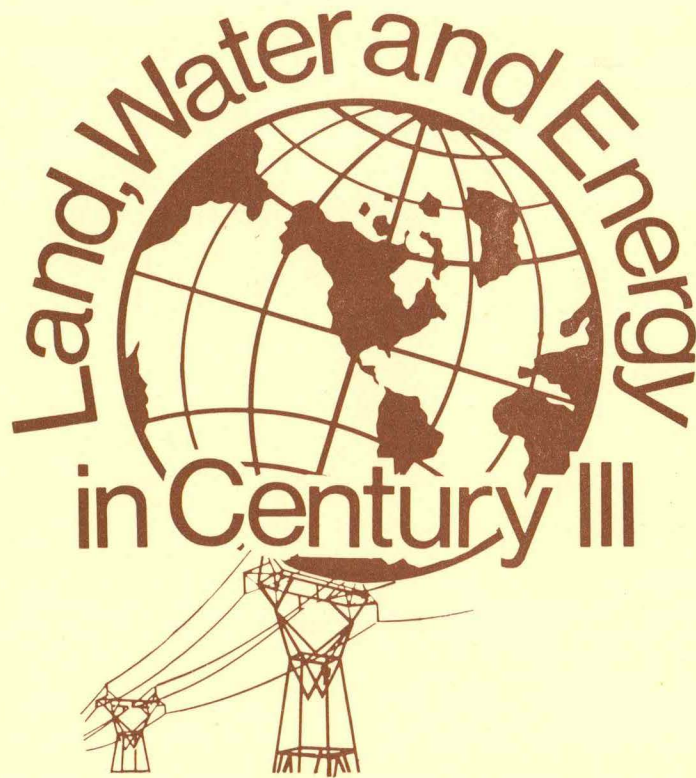

## INTRODUCTION

A major objective of the "Land, Water and Energy in Century III" public affairs program is to increase citizen understanding of public policy relative to Iowa's natural resource base. Because future policy may determine who gets to use our limited resources, citizen participation is needed now to insure fairness, understanding and support for difficult decisions regarding future land, water and energy uses.

As a part of our effort of increasing the understanding of resource issues and access to the public policy making groups affecting land, water and energy uses in Iowa, the Extension Service surveyed major state level policy making agencies, organizations and research groups. Although the directory is not all inclusive, it includes most of the major policy making organizations in Iowa, including (1) state level administrative, legislative/executive, and state university related groups; (2) federal agencies with an Iowa based office; (3) regional units of federal agencies that have jurisdiction in Iowa; and (4) national level legislative committees and the Iowa congressional delegation.

This directory should facilitate citizen participation in two ways: (1) by listing sources of information on land, water and energy issues and (2) by assisting citizens to find agencies to which they may present their views concerning the development of land, water and energy policy. Each group has provided information, including name, address, phone number, director or executive officer, objectives, and substate offices (if any), which should enhance citizen access. In addition, the type of resource materials which they have available for public use or distribution is provided.

Resource materials are not necessarily free of charge. Please contact the agency or organization directly regarding prices and quantities available. Any further questions that you may have regarding the organization should also be addressed directly to that organization.

When an agency has indicated substate offices, we have listed the cities in which they are located. You should check your local telephone directory for addresses and telephone numbers. If you are unable to locate a substate office, contact the state agency for assistance.

In the back of this directory, tips on writing letters to public agencies and legislators are provided. In addition, information on the process of how a bill becomes a law in the Iowa Legislature is outlined. Also included are leadership development and community action publications which are available through the Iowa State University Extension Service. Instructions on how to obtain these publications are provided with the listing.

## A BILL BECOMES LAW . . .

A bill is an idea for a new law, or an idea to abolish or change an existing law. Several thousand bills enter the legislative process in Iowa each time the legislature meets. The following description of how a bill becomes a law in Iowa is provided by the House Public Information Office, Des Moines.

### THE IDEA

Anyone can propose an idea for a bill to a legislator--a private citizen, a consumer group, corporation, professional association, governmental unit, the governor--but most ideas come from the legislator.

### THE PREPARATION

The legislator submits the idea to the LEGISLATIVE SERVICE BUREAU, where a full-time drafting staff puts it into proper legal form.

### THE INTRODUCTION

The primary sponsor files a proposed piece of legislation with the Chief Clerk of the House, who, with the advice of the House legal counsel, insures that the bill is in the proper form and gives the bill a number. On the following day the bill's number, title, and sponsor's name(s) is read to the House for the first time and the Speaker refers the bill to a standing committee or, if it is a committee bill, places it on the calendar.

### COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

After a bill has been referred to a committee, the committee chairman appoints a subcommittee to study the proposal and gather information about the bill. With the subcommittee report as a guide the standing committee studies and debates the bill. It may then recommend:

- amending the bill
- referring it to another committee
- postponing it indefinitely
- reporting it to the House without a recommendation
- reporting it to the full House with a recommendation that it pass.

### THE CALENDAR

A report of the committee's recommendation is returned with the bill to the Chief Clerk, who places the bill on the CALENDAR. The calendar is a daily list of bills ready for the consideration of all 100 House members. Bills are arranged on the Calendar as they are received, except that bills filed each day are placed in numerical order with House bills being placed for first consideration over Senate bills. If a bill is considered to be of outstanding importance it may be brought up for debate out of its order of appearance on the calendar.

### PASSAGE OF THE BILL

The bill is presented on the floor by a floor manager for debate, amendment, and final vote by the members of the House. When all debate is concluded, the floor manager moves the bill be read and pass the House. If a constitutional majority (at least 51 representatives) votes "yes" the bill moves on to the Senate. If less than a constitutional majority votes for the bill, then it is declared to have failed.

### SECOND PASSAGE

Any amendments adopted by the House are now part of the bill as it goes through the Senate. The Senate may pass the bill as it is or amend it and send it back to the House. If the House agrees with the changes, it will pass the bill. If they do not agree, they will return it. If the Senate will not remove its amendments, a CONFERENCE COMMITTEE will be appointed.

### CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

The CONFERENCE COMMITTEE is made up of members of the House and Senate appointed by the presiding officers. They study the disagreements, reach a compromise and write a report. If either house rejects the conference committee report, the bill is assigned to a second conference committee which can rewrite the report and resubmit it to both chambers for approval.



## ● BILL ENROLLMENT

When both houses have passed the bill in the same form it is prepared a final time in corrected form. This is known as THE ENROLLMENT OF THE BILL. Upon completion of enrollment both presiding officers sign the bill. If it is a Senate bill it is certified to the governor by the Secretary of the Senate. If it is a House bill it is certified by the Chief Clerk of the House. It is now ready to be delivered to the governor.

## ● THE GOVERNOR

The bill is on the last lap of its journey. THE GOVERNOR may:

- veto the bill and send it back to the house in which it originated. (It may still be passed by a two-thirds vote of the members of each house.)
- take no action in which case it will automatically become a law in three days
- approve and sign it **THUS MAKING A BILL A LAW.**
