COLLEGES AND DEGREES

This institution, the head of the school system of the state, was provided for by a statute enacted by the First General Assembly in 1847, in accordance with the constitution of the state adopted 1846.

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS—Students are admitted from above 200 accredited high schools and academies, and from the standard colleges of the state, without examination except in English. Curriculum; numerous elective subjects grouped under three general courses—classical, philosophical, general scientific, and two technical—civil engineering, electrical engineering.

COLLEGE OF LAW—Course extends over three years, nine months each. At completion the degree of LL. B. is conferred.

COLLEGE OF MEDICINE—Course, four years of nine months each. Graduates receive degree of M. D. and are entitled to registration by state board of medical examiners.

COLLEGE OF HOMEOPATHIC MEDICINE—Course, four years of nine months each. Degree of M. D. Registration by state board of medical examiners.

COLLEGE OF DENTISTRY—Course, four years of nine months each. Degree of D. D. S. Graduates entitled to registration by state board of dental examiners.

COLLEGE OF PHARMACY—Course, two years of nine months each. On its completion the degree of Ph. G. is conferred.

Professors and assistants, 160. Students in all departments, 1,442.

Tuition free in the Graduate College, and to impecunious students in the College of Liberal Arts. A nominal tuition in lieu of laboratory fees of \$25 a year in the College of Liberal Arts, and in the College of Law \$30 a semester; Medicine, \$40 and \$25; Dentistry, \$60 and \$40; Pharmacy, \$50 and \$25. Soldiers in the Spanish-American war honorably discharged, in all colleges receive \$25 on tuition.

The cost of living in Iowa City is small. Many students pay their way in whole or in part by their work. Graduate fellowships at \$225, scholarships at \$125, and undergraduate scholarships at \$25 are available.

There are combined courses in the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Law, of Liberal Arts and Medicine, of Liberal Arts and Pharmacy, of Liberal Arts and Dentistry, of Medicine and Dentistry, of Medicine and Pharmacy. A Dean of Women cares for the special inter-

ests of the young women. Semesters begin February 15 and September 24, 1904. Summer session June 20.

This institution was established by the Iowa legislature in 1858, and endowed by the national land grant of congress in 1862. In accepting the grant of the national government, the Iowa general assembly defined the object of this college as follows: "There shall be adopted and taught in the state agricultural college a broad, liberal and practical course of study, in which the leading branches of learning shall relate to agriculture and the mechanic arts, and which shall also embrace such other branches of learning

as will most practically and liberally educate the agricultural and industrial classes in the several pursuits and professions of life, including military tactics."

COURSES AND DEGREES.

Courses of study leading to the following degrees are offered:

1. The course in Agriculture—Department of Agronomy.
2. The course in Agriculture—Department of Dairying.
3. The course in Agriculture—Department of Animal Husbandry.

4. The course in Agriculture—Department of Horticulture.

Each of the foregoing is a four years' course leading to the degree of Bachelor of Scientific Agriculture (B. S. A.).

5. The course in Veterinary Science, of four years, leading to the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (D. V. M.).

6. The course in Mechanical Engineering, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering (B. M. E.).

7. The course of Civil Engineering, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Civil Engineering (B. C. E.).

8. The course in Electrical Engineering, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering (B. Sc. IN E. E.).

9. The course in Mining Engineering, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Mining Engineering (B. Sc. IN MN. E.).

10. The course in Science as Related to the Industries, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.).

11. The course in General and Domestic Science, for women, of four years, leads to the degree of Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.). Women may take any other course desired.

12. Special undergraduate and post-graduate courses are provided along the lines of these respective courses; also short courses in dairying and agriculture, mining engineering, clay working and ceramics, and special course in technological chemistry.

The college is thoroughly furnished with improved laboratories and apparatus. Machine shops with large equipment afford excellent facilities in mechanic arts. The museum and library are selected with special reference to facilitating studies in the courses specified. The best specimens of pure bred stock are provided for illustrative work in animal husbandry. Tuition is free to students of Iowa. For additional information, address,

FUNCTION OF THE SCHOOL.

By statute the school is established for the training of teachers for the public schools and all the courses of study are framed to that end. The entire work has such special object and is therefore conducted on a high grade of efficiency. Bulletins explaining the system of training and instruction are printed for general information.

PROFESSIONAL PUBLICATIONS.

The QUARTERLY BULLETIN gives attention to special studies in educational lines. There has been published thus far a bulletin on school management and another on the teaching of English.

These are sold to teachers at a small price and are valuable helps to them in their work. A new one on physical training will be published during the year.

THE CALENDAR.

Fall Term—September 1 to November 25.

Winter Term—December 1 to March 9.

Spring Term—March 15 to June 8.

Summer Term—June 11 to July 22.

State Certificate examinations occur at the close of every term for the accommodation of the students and teachers.

COURSES OF STUDY.

The program of studies includes the entire range of preparation for primary school, grammar school, and high school teachers, much specialization being allowed to suit the particular work. At the same time there are courses of study for music teachers, art teachers, librarians, physical training teachers, and other special lines allowing much latitude for the kind of preparation preferred.

EQUIPMENT.

There is good equipment in all departments including library, laboratories, art rooms, museum, and gymnasium, particularly selected for the work of training teachers.

PHYSICAL TRAINING.

There are three Physical Directors in the Faculty, and students are required to give attention to health and physical development. All the games suitable for public schools of different grades and ages are taught in classes, much attention being given to both the theory and the practice of the same in the gymnasium. Physical examinations are given students in order to scientifically direct their work for their special benefit. One of the most modern gymnasiums in the West will be ready for service in 1904-1905.

SOLDIERS' ORPHAN'S HOME, DAVENPORT.

Superintendent—M. T. Gass.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

There is in connection with this institution a school building, pleasant, commodious and well lighted, and it is the policy of the board to have the course of instruction of the highest standard. A kindergarten is operated in connection for the very young pupils.

The average number in the home is about 480, and the age ten and one-half years. The limit beyond which children are not kept in the home is sixteen years of age.

It is the aim to provide the children with plenty of good, comfortable clothing, and to have them taught to take good care of the same. Their clothing is all manufactured at the home, the large girls assisting in its manufacture. The table is supplied with a good variety of plain, wholesome food, and a reasonable amount of luxuries.

A library of well selected juvenile literature is a source of pleasure and profitable entertainment to the children. As from necessity the pastimes and pleasures of the children are otherwise somewhat circumscribed, they are well supplied with books and reading matter of suitable character for their improvement and enjoyment. The new chapel erected recently, is a handsome and much needed addition to the home.

The object of these institutions is the reformation of juvenile delinquents. It is not a prison. It is a compulsory educational institution. It is a school where wayward and criminal boys and girls are brought under the influence of Christian instructors and

taught by example, as well as precept, the better ways of life. It is a training school where the moral, intellectual, and industrial education of the child is carried on at one and the same time.

Any boy or girl over 7 and under 16 years of age, who has become criminal, vagrant or incorrigible, may be committed to these schools by any court of record. Any boy or girl may be discharged or paroled from these schools at any time after one year's training, upon satisfactory evidence of reformation.

INSTITUTE FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, GLENWOOD.

Superintendent—George Mogridge, M. D.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

The purpose or objects of the institution are to provide special methods of training for that class of children deficient in mind or marked with such peculiarities as to deprive them of the benefits and privileges provided for children with normal faculties. The object is to make each child as nearly self-supporting as practicable, and to approach as near as possible the movements and actions of normal people. It further aims to provide a home for those who are not susceptible of mental culture, relying wholly on others to supply their wants. The age of admission is between 5 and 21 years, and feeble-minded women may be sent there until 45 years of age.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, COUNCIL BLUFFS.

Superintendent—Henry W. Rothert.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

This institution is free to all who are too deaf to be educated in the common schools. They must be sound in mind and free from immoral habits and contagious diseases. No charge is made for board and tuition.

The school opens on the first day of October each year and continues until the last day of June. Pupils should be on hand promptly at the opening of the school and remain until the end of the session.

COLLEGE FOR THE BLIND, VINTON.

Principal—Thos. F. McCune, Vinton, Iowa.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

The school term begins on the first day of September, and ends about the 30th day of June. It is desirable that the students enter at the first and remain until the close. They may, however, be admitted at any time, and they are at liberty to go home whenever their parents send for them.

The department of music is supplied with twenty-three pianos, one pipe organ, several cabinet organs and a sufficient number of violins, guitars, bass viols and brass instruments. Every student capable of receiving it is given a complete course in this branch.

In the industrial department, the girls are required to learn knitting, crocheting, fancy work, hand and machine sewing; the boys, netting, mattress making and cane seating. Those of either sex, who so desire, may learn carpet weaving.

These advantages are free to every person, either blind or of defective vision, and of suitable school age and capacity, in the state. All that the friends are expected to do is to pay the traveling expenses and furnish clothing. If they are unable to clothe the pupils, the necessary clothing will be furnished here and the bill sent to the county from which the pupil comes.

Regulations Governing Uniform Examinations for Teachers' County Certificates.

OPINION OF ATTORNEY-GENERAL:

Section 2622 of the Code provides:

"He (the superintendent of public instruction) shall be charged with the general supervision of all the county superintendents and the common schools of the state."

Section 2735 provides:

"He (the county superintendent) shall at all times comply with the direction of the superintendent of public instruction in all matters within that officer's jurisdiction, and serve as the organ of communication between him and school township, district or independent district authorities, and transmit to them or the teachers thereof, all blanks, circulars or other communications designed for them."

It was the intention of the legislature in enacting these statutes to give to the superintendent of public instruction the general supervision over all school matters in the state, and to make the county superintendent of schools in each county the means whereby the rulings and acts of the superintendent of public instruction are conveyed to or communicated to the persons within the county.

Under the power so conferred by the legislature, the superintendent of public instruction has authority to prescribe the conditions under which county superintendents shall issue certificates to applicants therefor, and to prescribe the names and character of the certificates to be issued by the county superintendents.

I think it is also within the power of the superintendent of public instruction to specify the minimum age of applicants to whom certificates may be issued by county superintendents.

The State Board of Educational Examiners is authorized by sections 2623 to 2632 of the Code to issue state diplomas, state certificates, state primary certificates, and special state certificates.

To County Superintendents:

In harmony with the opinion of the Attorney-General the following regulations with reference to uniform examinations for teachers' certificates are hereby prescribed for the guidance of county superintendents, to take effect September 15, 1902.

REGULATIONS.

CERTIFICATES.

Teachers' certificates issued by county superintendents shall be of three grades, namely: first, second and third. A special certificate and a kindergarten certificate are authorized by law.

FIRST GRADE.

Term.—Certificates of this grade shall be issued for a term of two years.

Educational requirements.—The examination of candidates shall include competency in and ability to teach orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics, physiology and hygiene, including special reference to effects of alcohol, stimulants and narcotics, elementary civics, elementary algebra, elements of physics, elementary economics, and music.

Experience—Candidates must submit proof of thirty-six weeks' successful experience in teaching.

Standing required.—For certificates of this grade, candidates must attain an average standing of 90 per cent; and in orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics, physiology and hygiene a standing of at least 85 per cent, with no other branch below 80 per cent.

Renewals and indorsements.—Under the laws of this state there is no provision for the renewal of a certificate or for the indorsement of one by another superintendent. Section 2737 provides for the *issuing* but not for the renewing or indorsing of a certificate. A certificate may not be issued upon an examination taken in another county or state. In addition to furnishing any credentials or other written evidence which the county superintendent may require, the applicant must appear in person.—Opinion Attorney-General.

SECOND GRADE.

Term.—All second grade certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—The examination of candidates shall include competency in and ability to teach orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics, physiology and hygiene including special reference to effects of alcohol, stimulants and narcotics, and music.

Experience.—In counties issuing only two grades of certificates none is required. Counties issuing three grades may require evidence of at least one term of successful experience.

Standing required.—Candidates must attain an average standing of at least 85 per cent, with no branch below 75 per cent.

Renewals and indorsements.—See same heading under First Grade.

THIRD GRADE.

Term.—At the discretion of the county superintendent certificates of this grade may be limited to one or two terms.

Number of certificates.—Certificates of this grade should not be granted more than once or twice to the same person.

Educational requirements.—Same as for second grade.

Experience.—None is required.

Standing required.—Candidates for certificates of this grade must attain an average standing of at least 80 per cent, with no branch below 65 per cent.

Renewals and indorsements.—See same heading under First Grade.

SPECIAL CERTIFICATES.

Term.—Special certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—Candidates for this certificate need be examined in such branches only as they shall be employed to teach. Special certificates may be issued to teachers of music and other special branches, including high school studies.

Standing required.—Optional with the county superintendent.

KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATES.

Term.—Kindergarten certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—"Any teacher in kindergartens shall hold a certificate from the county superintendent certifying that the holder thereof has been examined upon kindergarten principles and methods and is qualified to teach in kindergartens."

Standing required.—Optional with county superintendent.

DATES OF EXAMINATIONS.

The examination of applicants for all certificates shall be held on the last Friday and Saturday in each month, at the county seat. Special examinations may be held elsewhere in the county at the discretion of the county superintendent. Applications made at irregular times should be rejected, unless good reasons are given for not attending the regular examinations.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. All applicants shall be at least eighteen years of age.
2. Candidates undertaking the first grade examination and failing to attain the standard required for a certificate of that grade

may be given a certificate of a lower grade, provided the percentages attained are as high as those required in the grade for which the certificate is granted.

3. County superintendents may at their discretion supplement examinations with additional questions, and for sufficient reasons refuse to grant a certificate to a candidate after he has attained the required standing.

4. Applicants may be required to present such evidences of good moral character as the county superintendent shall demand. The superintendent must be fully satisfied in every particular mentioned in the law before issuing the certificate.

5. The examination papers of applicants for certificates and any testimonials with regard to the moral character of the applicant belong to the county superintendent individually, and are for his guidance alone.

6. The county superintendent is the sole judge of the manner and extent of the examination he will require of applicants for certificates to teach, and unless fully satisfied in all respects it is his duty to refuse to grant a certificate.

7. Candidates to whom a first grade or two years' certificate is granted shall pay two dollars. Applicants for all other certificates issued by a county superintendent are required to pay a fee of one dollar.

Teachers wishing to teach studies not named for county certificates should take examination in such subjects and have the same placed on the certificate.
