#### IOWA SCHOOL SYSTEM.

#### CORPORATIONS.

#### Classes:

School Township—Usually divided into sub-districts. Some are not.

Independent Corporations—Independent city, town and village districts
and rural independent districts.

#### Membership of Boards:

School Township-If divided into sub-districts, the board consists of one member from each sub-district.

A director-at-large is chosen when the number of sub-districts is even.

If the school township is not divided into sub-districts, the board consists of three members elected by the township at large.

(A few organized under an old law have five members.)

#### Independent Corporations-

For corporations containing territory in a city of the first class (15,000 or more), or a city under special charter, the board consists of seven members.

For other independent city, town or village districts, the board consists of five members.

For rural independent districts the board consists of three members.

### Elections-Meetings:

Regular-Sub-district meeting.

First Monday in March in the sub-districts of school townships.

Notices posted by director of sub-district.

Annual Meeting-Held in all corporations (sub-districts are not corporations) on second Monday in March.

Notices posted by the secretary of the board.

Special—Special sub-district meetings called by the director of subdistrict.

Special meetings of corporation called by the school board.

#### ELECTORS.

Qualifications:—Male citizen of the United States, at least twenty-one years of age, a resident of the state six months, and of the county sixty days next preceding the election, a legal resident of the sub-district or cor-

poration in which he offers his ballot. Female citizens possessing the same qualifications as males, except as to sex, may vote on propositions to issue bonds or to increase the school tax levy.

#### Meetings:

Sub-District Meetings-Time: First Monday in March.

Powers of Electors-Elect a director for the sub-district.

Vote schoolhouse tax on the sub-district.

Limit-Fifteen mills on the dollar including the amount voted at the annual meeting.

Annual Meeting of the Corporation-Time: Second Monday in March.

Powers of Electors—Elect directors in independent districts and directors-at-large in school townships. In town and city districts, elect a treasurer for two years.

When ten day's notice has been given that such propositions will be submitted, the electors have power:

To direct a change of text-books, but the board makes the adoption.

To direct the sale or other disposition of school property, and the disposition of the proceeds of the sale.

To add branches to the course of study.

To instruct the board that school buildings may or may not be used for meetings of public interest other than school.

To direct the transfer of school funds from the schoolhouse fund to either the teachers' or the contingent funds.

To authorize the board to purchase roads to school sites.

To vote schoolhouse tax.

To vote on the question of county uniformity of text-books.

To authorize the board to issue school building bonds.

Special-Called by the board. Ten days' notice required.

Powers of Electors-Direct sale of school property and disposition of the proceeds of such sale.

Vote schoolhouse tax for purchase of sites, roads and the erection of schoolhouses.

To authorize the board to issue school building bonds.

#### OFFICERS.

Superintendent of Public Instruction:—Chosen biennially by the electors of the state. Salary, \$2,200.

Powers and Duties—Has general supervision of all county superintendents and the common schools of the state.

Calls meetings of the county superintendents, appoints institutes, approves institute faculties, visits institutes and other educational meetings, and delivers addresses on educational subjects.

Renders opinions in writing concerning school law to school officers. Hears and determine cases brought before him on appeal from the decision of county superintendents.

Reports biennially to the governor the condition of the schools and

annually to the auditor of state the school population.

Ex officio President of the Board of Educational Examiners and Board of Trustees of the State Normal School.

Ex officio member of the Board of Regents of the State University and

Board of Trustees of the Iowa State College.

County Superintendents:- Chosen biennially by the electors of the county. Number, ninety-nine. Salary, \$1,250, and such additional sum as the supervisors of the county may allow. Eligibility, male or female; holder of two-year county certificate, state certificate or a state -diploma.

Powers and Duties-Charged with the supervision of the schools and teachers and the enforcement of the school law in his county.

Examines candidates for county certificates on the last Saturday, and the Friday preceding, in each month.

Issues certificates valid in his county and revokes the same for cause. Holds a county institute annually.

Visits schools and holds educational meetings.

Hears and decides cases appealed from the action of school boards.

Is organ of communication between the superintendent of public instruction and directors, officers and teachers.

Reports annually to the superintendent of public instruction the condition of the schools of his county and to the county auditor the school population of the different school corporations.

Classes of County Certificates-County certificates are of the first, second and third classes, special county certificates and kindergarten certificates.

Educational Board of Examiners:-Three ex officio and two appointed members. No salary, but all necessary expenses are paid and those not salaried officers of the state receive three dollars a day for time actually employed.

Membership-Superintendent of Public Instruction member and president, ex officio.

President of the State University member, ex officio.

President of the State Normal School member, ex officio.

One man appointed by the governor for a term of four years.

One woman appointed by the governor for a term of four years.

Powers and Duties-Elect a secretary and define his duties.

Inspect and approve institutions desiring official recognition for the preparation of teachers.

Hold examinations for state diplomas and state certificates.

Issue state diplomas and state certificates and revoke the same for cause.

- Kinds of State Certificates—Regular state certificate, primary state certificate and special state certificate in music, penmanship or drawing, all of which are valid for five years; and two-year state certificate.
- School Boards:—Election—Terms: In school townships, the members are chosen by the electors of their respective sub-districts, on the first Monday in March, for a term of one year; except that members at large are chosen by the electors of the entire township on the second Monday in March. In independent districts, members are chosen on the second Monday in March for a term of three years—one-third being chosen each year. No compensation.

Eligibility-Male or female: If male a qualified elector of the corporation or sub-district. If female, same qualifications except to as sex.

- Membership—In school townships, the board consists of one member from each sub-district, but if the number of sub-districts be even a director-at-large is chosen. If the township is not divided into sub-districts the board consists of three members, chosen by the electors of the entire township.
  - In all independent corporations including all or part of a city of the first class or a city under special charter the board consists of seven members; in all other independent city, town and village districts of five; and rural independent districts of three members.

Meetings-Organization-The board organizes on the third Monday in March by electing a president from among its members.

- On the third Monday in September it elects from outside the board a secretary and a treasurer for one year, except that in independent city and town corporations the electors choose a treasurer on the second Monday in March for a term of two years. The compensation of the secretary and treasurer is determined by the board.
- Special meetings may be called by the president or by the secretary when requested in writing by a majority of the board, but notice must be delivered to each member in person.

Powers and Duties-Select shoolhouse sites and erect schoolhouses according to plans approved by the county superintendent with funds voted by the electors.

Elect teachers and dismiss them for cause, giving them an opportunity to appear and defend, the teacher having the right of appeal.

Prescribe a course of study for the schools of the corporation.

Adopt and contract for text-books for a period of not less than five years.

Purchase text-books for sale to pupils and teachers of the corporation after advertising for and considering bids for furnishing them.

When directed by the electors, to purchase text-books to be loaned to pupils.

Make rules and regulations for the government of themselves, the teachers and pupils and for the protection of school property.

Suspend or expel pupils for cause and authorize teachers to suspend them temporarily, notice being given at once to the president of the board.

Divide the corporation into sub-districts or wards, determine the number of schools that shall be maintained and designate the school each pupil shall attend.

Transport pupils when there will be a saving of expense and the pupils will receive increased school advantages or where they reside an unreasonable distance from school.

Admit non-resident pupils and determine the terms of admission.

Provide for visiting the schools and aid in enforcing the rules and regulations.

When authorized by the electors at the regular annual meeting, permit the use of school buildings for purposes other than public schools.

Provide for the holding and conducting of the annual meeting of the corporation on the second Monday in March and provide by proper notices for the submitting of propositions.

Call special elections.

Financial—Taxes—Estimate the amount needed for the teachers and contingent funds and for the schoolhouse fund to pay on bonds and interest. (The electors vote schoolhouse tax for the erection of schoolhouses.)

Bonds—Issue school funding bonds to pay judgments; school tax funding bonds to the amount of uncollected lawful schoolhouse tax; and, when authorized by the electors, they may issue school building bonds for the purpose of erecting, completing or improving schoolhouses.

County Board of Education:—Only in counties having county uniformity.

County Uniformity—Adoption—Adopted by vote of the electors of rural corporations of the county at the regular annual meetings.

Membership-County Superintendent, chairman.

County Auditor, secretary.

Members of the county board of supervisors.

Powers and Duties-Adopt and contract for text-books and supplies for use in the rural schools of the county after advertising for bids.

Purchase for sale to teachers and pupils the text-books and supplies adopted by them.

Appoint depository agents to handle the books and supplies and make settlement with them.

SCHOOL FINANCES-VALUATIONS; INDEBTEDNESS; FUNDS.

### INDEBTEDNESS.

Limit of. Constitutional: - Five per cent of the value of taxable property.

Legal—One and one-fourth per cent of the actual value of the taxable property. (When the board is petitioned by a majority of the electors and the proposition carries by a two-thirds vote, the limit is two and one-half per cent.) A tax voted is not indebtedness.

### FUNDS.

Schoolhouse Fund:-For erection, completion and improvement of schoolhouses and purchase school sites and roads.

Sources-

District Taxes-Levied by county supervisors.

Voted by electors for erection of schoolhouses and payment of debts incurred for the same; purchase of sites and roads.

Limit-Ten mills on the dollar.

Estimated by the board for payment on bonds and interest.

Limit-Five mills on the dollar,

Proceeds from sale of bonds issued as follows:

School funding bonds to pay judgments and indebtedness from maturing bonds, lawfully authorized.

Authorized by resolution of the board.

Limit-Amount of judgments and maturing bonds.

School tax funding bonds issued in anticipation of uncollected schoolhouse tax.

Authorized by resolution of the board.

Limit-Amount of uncollected schoolhouse tax.

School building bonds for the erection, completion or improvement of school buildings,

Authorized by vote of the electors.

Limit: - See "Indebtedness" under School Finances above.

Contingent Fund:—For incidental expenses, repairs, fuel, rent, free textbooks and text-books purchased for sale. Sources—

District Taxes-Levied by the board of supervisors.

Estimated by the board for the payment of contingent expenses, rent, fuel and repairs.

Limit—Five dollars for each person of school age, except that seventy-five dollars may be estimated for each school, and five dollars additional for each person of school age transportation.

Transfer from schoolhouse fund.

Teachers' Fund:-Pay teachers and tuition.

Sources-

District Taxes-Levied by supervisors.

Estimated by the board for the payment of teachers and tuition.

Limit-Fifteen dollars for each person of school age, including the semi-annual aportionment, but two hundred seventy-five dollars may be estimated for each school.

Semi-Annual Apportionment-Apportioned according to the school population (school age 5 to 21 years.)

Sources:

Permanent- Interest on permanent school fund.

Amount of permanent school fund, \$4,760,520.54.

Temporary-County tax of one to three mills, determined and levied by the supervisors.

Fines.

Institute Fund:-To defray the expenses of the institute.

Sources-

Examination Fees-One dollar for each candidate for a certificate and one dollar additional for each two-year certificate.

Enrollment Fees-Institute attendance is voluntary but a fee of one dollar is charged each one who enrolls.

State Appropriation—Each county in which an institute of at least six days is held receives \$50 from the state.

County Appropriation—The supervisors may appropriate such sum as they deem necessary.

# REQUIREMENTS.

All schools must be inspected before they are placed on the accredited list. The requirements for a fully accredited school are:

- 1. The course of study must not be less than four years of thirty-six weeks each in length, following an elementary course not less than eight years in length.
- 2. The course of study must require of each pupil not more than four recitations daily.
- The entire time of at least three teachers must be given to instruction in high school branches.
- 4. The quality of the instruction given and the character of the textbooks used must be approved by the Collegiate Faculty of the university.
- Schools seeking considerable credit in science must demonstrate their ability to do successful laboratory work.
- Schools seeking considerable credit in history and English must give evidence of a special library equipment for these branches.
- 7. The course of study must include at least two years of foreign language.

Private academies, seminaries, normal schools or other secondary schools meeting the conditions mentioned above, or their equivalent, may be accepted on the same basis as high schools.

Partially accredited schools must meet the same general requirements as the fully accredited schools, but in the former there may be but two teachers, the course of study must be three years in length, recitation periods must be forty minutes long, no teacher may have more than eight recitations daily, and the principal can have but six.

In accepting the grant of the national government, the Iowa general assembly defined the object of the college as follows: "There shall be adopted and taught in the state agricultural college a broad, liberal and practical course of study, in which the leading branches of learning shall relate to agriculture and the mechanic arts, and which shall also embrace such other branches of learning as will most practically and liberally educate the agricultural and industrial classes in the several pursuits and professions of life, including military tactics."

#### THE PROVINCE OF THE NORMAL SCHOOL.

The Normal School was founded in 1876, for the special education and training of teachers for the common schools. The Board of Trustees was

organized to employ such administrative officers as might be necessary and such members of the Faculty as the needs of the work done might require. The students are limited to those who have intention of devoting their lives to the profession of teaching and the program of studies is specially planned and managed to that purpose.

# MANAGEMENT OF THE WORK.

There are four sessions in each school year known as fall term, winter term, spring term and summer term. Classes are admitted at the opening of each session, and are graduated at the close of each session. Graduates are given large assistance in getting remunerative appointments. Undergraduates are also given assistance to appointments. The entire program of studies as printed in the quarterly bulletin is obtainable each term. The standard required is specially strong, definite and complete as the students are to be teachers. Large attention given to the fundamental English branches.

# SPECIAL LINES OFFERED BY THE SCHOOL.

In addition to the common courses uniformly given in English, Latin, science, history, civics and mathematics, there are courses in music, art, manual training, domestic science, physical training, German, Greek and kindergartning, so that opportunity is given for specialization in modern types of education such as the public schools must have if they are to adapt themselves to the needs of modern civilization. These special and modern types are given so much time and attention that the best preparation is assured.

# BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENTS.

The following buildings are now provided and are fully equipped for the purpose planned: (1) North Building, (2) South Building, (3) Administration Building, (4) Auditorium Building, (5) Steam Plant, (6) Power Plant, (7) Gymnasium, (8) Superintendent's home, (9) President's cottage. The equipment in every case is that of the most modern and the most effective kind, specially suited for the work required. The shops, laboratories, library and art rooms are of the latest and best kind, while the gymnasium in apparatus, bathing privileges and provisions for health is one of the first in character in service in the United States.

# STATE INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.

FOR BOYS, ELDORA.

Superintendent-Lyman D. Drake.

FOR GIRLS, MITCHELLVILLE.

Superintendent-F. P. Fitzgerald.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

The object of these institutions is the reformation of juvenile delinquents. It is not a prison. It is a compulsory educational institution. It is a school where wayward and criminal boys and girls are brought under the influence of Christian instructors and taught by example, as well as precept, the better ways of life. It is a training school where the moral, intellectual and industrial education of the child is carried on at one and the same time.

Any boy or girl over 7 and under 16 years of age, who has become criminal, vagrant or incorrigible, may be committed to these schools by any court of record. Any boy or girl may be discharged or paroled from these schools at any time after one year's training, upon satisfactory evidence of reformation.

# SOLDIERS' ORPHANS' HOME, DAVENPORT.

Superintendent-F. J. Sessions.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

There is in connection with this institution a school building, pleasant, commodious and well lighted, and it is the policy of the board to have the course of instruction of the highest standard. A kindergarten is operated in connection for the very young pupils.

The average number in the home is about 480, and the age ten and onehalf years. The limit beyond which children are not kept in the home is sixteen years of age. It is the aim to provide the children with plenty of good, comfortable clothing, and to have them taught to take good care of the same. Their clothing is all manufactured at the home, the large girls assisting in its manufacture. The table is supplied with a good variety of plain, wholesome food, and a reasonable amount of luxuries.

A library of well selected juvenile literature is a source of pleasure and profitable entertainment to the children. As from necessity the pastimes and pleasures of the children are otherwise somewhat circumscribed, they are well supplied with books and reading matter of suitable character for their improvement and enjoyment. The new chapel erected recently, is a handsome and much needed addition to the home.

# INSTITUTE FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, GLENWOOD.

Superintendent-George Mogridge, M. D.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

The purposes or objects of the institution are to provide special methods of training for that class of children deficient in mind or marked with such pecularities as to deprive them of the benefits and privileges provided for children with normal faculties. The object is to make each child as nearly self-supporting as practicable, and to approach as near as possible the movements and actions of normal people. It further aims to provide a home for those who are not susceptible of mental culture, relying wholly on others to supply their wants. The age of admission is between 5 and 21 years, and feeble-minded women may be sent there until 45 years of age.

# SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, COUNCIL BLUFFS.

Superintendent-Henry W. Rothert.

Under the management of the board of control of state institutions.

This institution is free to all who are too deaf to be educated in the common schools. They must be sound in mind and free from immoral habits and contagious diseases. No charge is made for board and tuition.

The school opens on the first day of October each year and continues until the last day of June. Pupils should be on hand promptly at the opening of the school and remain until the end of the season.

# COLLEGE FOR THE BLIND, VINTON.

Principal.-Thos. F. McCune, Vinton, Iowa.

Under management of the board of control of state institutions.

The school term begins on the first day of September, and ends about the 30th day of June. It is desirable that the students enter at the first and remain until the close. They may, however, be admitted at any time, and they are at liberty to go home whenever their parents send for them.

The department of music is supplied with twenty-three planos, one pipe organ, several cabinet organs and a sufficient number of violins, guitars, bass viols and brass instruments. Every student capable of receiving it is given a complete course in this branch.

In the industrial department, the girls are required to learn knitting, crocheting, fancy work, hand and machine sewing; the boys, netting, mattress making and cane seating. Those of either sex, who so desire, may learn carpet weaving.

These advantages are free to every person, either blind or of defective vision, and of suitable school age and capacity, in the state. All that the friends are expected to do is to pay the traveling expenses and furnish clothing. If they are unable to clothe the pupils, the necessary clothing will be furnished here and the bill sent to the county from which the pupil comes.

# Regulations Governing Uniform Examinations for Teachers' County Certificates.

### CLASS OF CERTIF. CATES.

Teachers' certificates issued by county superintendents shall be of three grades, namely: first, second and third. A special certificate and a kinder-garten certificate are authorized by law.

### FIRST GRADE.

Term.—Certificates of this grade shall be issued for a term of two years.

Educational requirements.—The examination of candidates shall include competency in and ability to teach orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics, physiology and hygiene, including special reference to effects of alcohol, stimulants and narcotics, elementary civics, elementary algebra, elements of physics, elementary economics, and music.

Experience. - Candidates must submit proof of thirty-six weeks' successful experience in teaching.

Standing required.—For certificates of this grade, candidates must attain an average standing of 90 per cent; and in orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics. physiology and hygiene a standing of at least 85 per cent, with no other branch below 80 per cent.

Renewals and endorsements. - See note.

#### SECOND GRADE.

Term.—All second grade certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—The examination of candidates shall include competency in and ability to teach orthography, reading, writing, arithmetic, geography, grammar, history of the United States, didactics, physiology and hygiene, including special reference to effects of alchol, stimulants and narcotics, and music.

Experience.—In counties issuing only two grades of certificates none is required. Counties issuing three grades may require evidence of at least one term of successful expenience.

Standing required.—Candidates must attain an average standing of at least 85 per cent, with no branch below 75 per cent.

Renewals and indorsements. - See note.

#### THIRD GRADE.

Term.—At the discretion of the county superintendent certificates of this grade may be limited to one or two terms.

Number of certificates. - Certificates of this grade should not be granted more than once or twice to the same person.

Educational requirements .- Same as for second grade.

Experience. - None is required.

Standing required.—Candidates for certificates of this grade must attain an average standing of at least 80 per cent, with no branch below 65 per cent.

Renewals and indorsments. - See note.

#### SPECIAL CERTIFICATES.

Term.—Special certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—Candidates for this certificate need be examined in such branches only as they shall be employed to teach. Special certificates may be issued to teachers of music and other special branches, including high school studies.

Standing required .- Optional with the county superintendent.

#### KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATES.

Term.—Kindergarten certificates shall be issued for a term not to exceed one year.

Educational requirements.—"Any teacher in kindergarten shall hold a certificate from the county superintendent certifying that the holder thereof has been examined upon kindergarten principles and methods and is qualified to teach in kindergartens."

Standing required .- Optional with county superintendents.

### DATE OF EXAMINATIONS.

The examination of applicants for all certificates shall be held on the last Friday and Saturday in each month, at the county seat. Special examinations may be held elsewhere in the county at the discretion of the county superintendent. Applications made at irregular times should be rejected, unless good reasons are given for not attending the regular examinations.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- All applicants shall be at least eighteen years of age. Any candidate attempting to deceive as to his age, will be denied a certificate; and should the falsehood not be discovered until after a certificate is issued, said certificate shall be promptly revoked.
- 2. Candidates undertaking the first grade examination and failing to attain the standard required for a certificate of that grade may be given a certificate of a lower grade, provided the percentages attained are as high as those required in the grade for which the certificate is granted.

- County superintendents may at their discretion supplement examinations with additional questions, and for sufficient reasons refuse to grant a certificate to a candidate after he has attained the required standing.
- 4. Applicants may be required to present such evidences of good moral character as the county superintendent shall demand. The superintendent must be fully satisfied in every particular mentioned in the law before issuing the certificate.
- The examination papers of applicants for certificates and any testimonials with regard to the moral character of the applicants belong to the county superintendent individually, and are for his guidance alone.
- 6. The county superintendent is the sole judge of the manner and extent of the examination he will require of applicants for certificates to teach, and unless fully satisfied in all respects it is his duty to refuse to grant a certificate.
- Candidates to whom a first grade or two years' certificate is granted shall pay two dollars. Applicants for all other certificates issued by a county superintendent are required to pay a fee of one dollar.

#### NOTES.

The State Board of Educational Examiners is authorized by sections 2628 to 2632 of the Code to issue state diplomas, state certificates, state primary certificates, and special state certificates.

County Centificates. 'If the examination is satisfactory, and the applicant is of good moral character, of which fact the superintendent shall require proof unless he has a personal knowledge thereof, and is in all other respects possessed of the necessary qualifications of an instructor, a certificate to that effect shall issue for a term not to exceed one year. But to applicants passing an examination in the following additional branches: elementary civics, elementary algebra, elements of physics and elementary economics, a certificate shall issue for a term of two years, upon proof of thirty-six weeks' successful experience in teaching.' Section 2737, School Laws of 1902.

RESEWALS. "The county superintendent has no authority under the law to renew. endorse, or duplicate a certificate either in his own county or one issued in another." Opinion of Attorney-General. Note 7, Section 2737, School Laws 1902.

KINDERGARTES CERTIFICATES. ''Any teacher in kindergariens shall hold a certificate from the county superintendent certifying that the holder thereof has been examined upon kindergarten principles and methods, and is qualified to teach in kindergartens.'. Section 2777, School Laws of 1902.

SPECIAL COUNTY CERTIFICATES. 'Candidates for examination in special studies need be examined in such branches only; but no special teacher shall be employed to teach any study not included in the certificate." Section 2786, School Laws 1902.

VALIDITY AS TO SUBJECTS TAUGHT. "The statute requires an examination upon certain subjects before a certificate can be given the applicant to teach in the public schools, but it does not provide either in terms or by implication that instruction may not be given by a teacher who has received a certificate, upon branches not included in the examination." Opinion of Attorney-General.
