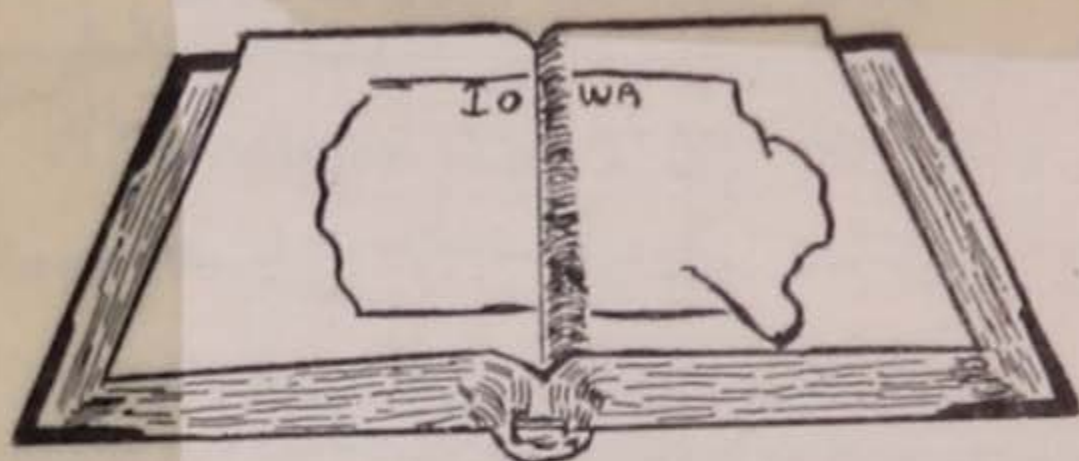

STANDARDS FOR ACCREDITING COLLEGES FOR TEACHERS' CERTIFICATES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTIONS 2634-F, 2634-G AND 2634-H, SUPPLEMENT TO THE CODE OF 1907.

1. The number of class hours for the heads of departments and students shall not exceed twenty a week.

2. A faculty properly qualified shall consist of graduates of colleges who have pursued graduate work in residence at least two years or an equivalent in acquired scholarship approved by the Educational Board of Examiners.

3. The library shall consist of at least seventy-five hundred volumes, selected with reference to college subjects, and exclusive of public documents.

4. The laboratory equipment, except in an institution inspected and approved by the Board as a classical college only, shall be worth not less than \$7,500.00 and so distributed as to establish at least an efficient chemical, physical, botanical and zoological laboratory.

5. The means of support is defined as requiring a permanent endowment of not less than \$200,000.00 or a fixed assured income, or its equivalent, exclusive of tuition, of at least \$10,000.00.

6. The college must maintain at least seven separate departments or chairs, and in case the pedagogical work of the institution is to be accepted without examination the college must maintain at least eight chairs, one of which shall be devoted exclusively to education or at most to philosophy, including psychology and education. The heads of at least five of these departments shall, in no case, devote less than three-fourths of their class hours to college work.

7. The graduates must in addition to the four-year college course show the completion of a four-year secondary course according to the standards established by the State Board of Education as entrance requirements to the collegiate courses of the institutions under the control of said Board and the standing and character of the institution and the nature of its equipment and work must be such as to entitle its graduates to admission to the graduate college of the State University of Iowa.

As required by law, the work of the university is based upon the preparations afforded by the duly accredited high schools of the State, whose graduates are admitted to the undergraduate and professional courses upon presentation of the proper certificates.

A sense of this vital connection with the public schools determines, in a large measure, the requirements for admission to the university, its spirit, and its courses of study. The State through the university undertakes to furnish instruction in the various branches requisite for a liberal education in the liberal arts, law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, fine arts, music, nursing, and in applied science—the various branches of engineering. It also aims to encourage research work in all departments, to produce creative scholars, and thus to do its part in the enlargement of the domain of knowledge. Thus it is the general policy of the institution to foster the higher educational interests of the state broadly and generously interpreted.

V. SUMMER SCHOOL.

A six weeks' Summer Session, offering courses in Agricultural Education, Agricultural Engineering, Animal Husbandry, Dairying, Farm Crops, Home Economics, Horticulture, Mechanical Engineering, Poultry, and Soils and subjects related thereto, such as Bacteriology, Botany, Chemistry, Applied Economics and Social Science, English, History, Literature, Mathematics, Physics, Psychology, etc.

VI. EXTENSION DEPARTMENTS.

Agricultural Extension Department:

Through the farmers' institute work, short courses, county fair work and other activities, this department reaches the farmers in every county of the State. It takes the results of the experiment station investigations to the people. Through its many avenues of work, it annually reaches several hundred thousand people. The members of the instructional staff are people with excellent training and a wide range of experience in their work. Some of the activities of the department are: Farmers' institutes; short courses; horse, colt, corn, small grain, domestic science, domestic art, poultry, fruit, vegetable, dairy and truck gardening shows; county fair work; picnics and farmers' meetings; agricultural and home making clubs; boys' and girls' club work; county station work; cow test associations; county organization for agricultural advisers; hog cholera work; aid to public and high school teachers in agriculture and home economics; and sub-collegiate correspondence courses in agriculture, home economics, and manual training.

Engineering Extension Department:

As a department of the general extension work, engineering extension is coördinate with agricultural extension and bears the same relation to the Division of Engineering that agricultural extension does to the Division of Agriculture. The department has its own instructional force, who are, at the same time, members of the Engineering faculty, coöperating closely with the division of engineering and the engineering experiment station. The field of work covered by the department includes two-year vocational courses at Ames, correspondence study courses, extension classes in industrial centers, technical lectures, courses for night schools and industrial schools, manual training for rural teachers, technical institutes, trade courses, bureau of engineering service, and publishing bulletins.

THE COLLEGE YEAR.

Fall Term opens September 2, 1914.

This educational institution began its first year September, 1876, under the title Iowa State Normal School. It became the Iowa State Teachers' College by act of the General Assembly in 1909. It devotes its instruction to the education and training of public school teachers of all varieties and kinds and graduates classes four times a college year. It is not organized to give a general education, as its efforts are devoted to producing efficient teachers who have special capability in some certain field, and hence its service is doubly valuable and reliable.

FREE TUITION TO RURAL TEACHERS.

All students pursuing courses of study for uniform county certificates and for normal diplomas are admitted to the privileges of the College without tuition. All other students pay \$5.00 a term. The expenses of the students are the lowest possible in recognition of the service they expect to perform for the State.

TEACHER STUDY CENTER SERVICE.

The members of the Faculty give instruction on Saturdays at designated places selected by the county superintendent in such counties as arrange for the work. These classes consist of the teachers who are employed other days of the week. By this means the College Faculty enlarges much its work in the State. The members of these study center organizations can complete a course of study by attending summer terms. Through these arrangements any teacher can make advancement in scholarship and training. Three thousand teachers will be enrolled in this special work this year.

COURSES OF STUDY.

All courses taught at this College give diplomas and state certificates when they are completed in accordance with the regulations. Every course requires instruction in education and actual practice in teaching. By this plan every student can be trained for some kind of a successful teacher as their tastes and talents are regarded in every sense.

The aim and purpose of this institution is purely educational. The literary work covers a period of twelve years and is outlined similar to the work done in the public school, having a fully accredited high school. The department of music is supplied with a number of pianos, one pipe organ, and a number of stringed instruments. All students who have any talent in music are given a thorough course in this department. All students are required to do work in the industrial department. The girls are taught knitting, crocheting, fancy-work, hand and machine sewing, and domestic science. The boys are taught netting, weaving, broom-making, cane seating, manual training and piano tuning. These advantages are free to all blind children of school age and those who have vision so defective as to prevent them from attending the public schools, providing they are mentally normal. The school year begins the first Wednesday in September and closes the last week in May. For further information address the Superintendent.

IOWA INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL FOR GIRLS.

The Iowa Industrial School for Girls is situated at Mitchellville, Iowa, one-half mile from the village of Mitchellville and eighteen miles southeast of Des Moines, connected with the latter city by interurban train.

Girls ranging in ages from eight to eighteen, are committed by the court to remain until twenty-one years of age under the control of the State unless discharged for good conduct. A girl upon entering is placed in the hospital for fourteen days; she is then assigned to some one of the five cottages.

In each cottage there are three ladies, that is, a cottage manager, or mother; a kitchen manager; and a teacher whose duties are to carefully look after, guide and guard each girl. There is a kitchen and dining room in each cottage and the ladies and girls of that cottage constitute a family. The meals are prepared and served and the sewing and mending are done in each family. The girls are all taught house-keeping and homemaking.

There is a domestic science department where a young lady, a college graduate, teaches the science of cooking and sewing to a class of twenty-four girls; twelve in the morning and twelve in the afternoon class.

There is a sewing department where girls are taught to make their own underwear, house and afternoon dresses. Also the suits, jackets and skirts, for girls who are ready to leave the school on parole.

There is a laundry school where girls under a competent teacher are taught laundering.

There is a graded school where girls attend school one-half day each. All grades are taught as far as the high school. There is also a chapel where services are conducted each Sunday; also entertainments held during the week.

An orchestra, composed of eighteen girls instructed by a competent lady orchestra leader, furnishes music for Sunday services and entertainments for the school.

Vocal music and Folk-lore games and dances are also taught under the supervision of a graduate teacher of Folk-lore. All girls are instructed in fancy work; embroidering, crocheting, tatting, etc.

The girls do all the gardening, transplanting plants, weeding and harvesting the garden products and small fruits. They also care for and raise chickens and ducks. The lawns and flower beds are the work of the girls. Each girl has a flower bed of her own and a prize is given in the month of September for the one having the best kept lawn and flower beds.

Everything is done from the day a girl enters the school until she leaves to fit her for a housekeeper and homemaker. When a girl is ready to be paroled, she is turned over to the care of the State Agent, a lady of most excellent judgment, who finds homes and investigates the same, previous to placing a girl. After having placed her in a home, she visits her and has regular reports from the girl and employer.

By good conduct a girl may earn her way out of the school and likewise when out on parole. Good conduct brings a reward by an honorable discharge. Six months good time counts three months off for her. At present there are one hundred and fifty girls in the school, and seventy-five girls in outside homes.

The institution is under the management of the Board of Control of State Institutions. There has been recently completed a new primary school which takes the pupils from Kindergarten through the first grade. The grade school provides for the other eight grades and the first year in high school. In all, there are fifteen teachers employed. The institutional population numbers nearly six hundred; most of the children are of school age. The course of instruction is of high standard.

All things needed for the comfort and health of the children are provided by the institution. Children are given thorough training in habits of industry, in doing the necessary work of manufacturing clothing and caring for the different interests of the institution.

There is an excellent library of juvenile literature which is used freely and to great advantage.

INSTITUTION FOR FEEBLE-MINDED CHILDREN, GLENWOOD.

Superintendent, GEO. MOGRIDGE, M. D.

Under management of the Board of Control of State Institutions.

The purpose of the institution is to provide special methods of training for that class of children deficient in mind, or marked with such peculiarities as to deprive them of the school benefits and privileges provided for children with normal faculties. Such methods of discipline and training are adopted as will tend to make each child as nearly self-supporting as practicable, and to approach as near as possible the movements or actions of normal people. It further aims to provide a home for those who are not susceptible of mental culture, relying wholly upon others to supply their wants. Although children of this department are classified as non-improvable—possessing only a low degree of mentality—facilities are provided for such training as may tend to correct their habits and develop an interest in their own welfare.

In the School Department lessons are imparted in the elements of instruction taught in common schools as well as industries suited to their capacities. Girls learn plain and fancy sewing and household work, while the boys are detailed to work on the farm, in the garden, in the shoe-shop, carpenter shop, and to assist in the various departments of the institution.

The law provides for admission between the ages of five and forty-six years. Applicants may be admitted at any time during the year. By request a blank Application for Admission will be mailed to any address, which may be filled out by the parents, guardians county board of supervisors or county attorney, and returned to the Superintendent, who, by the direction of the Board, passes upon the eligibility of the applicant, and notifies the correspondent accordingly.

SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF, COUNCIL BLUFFS.

Superintendent— HENRY W. ROTHERT.

Under management of the Board of Control of State Institutions.

This institution is not a hospital, an asylum, or place of refuge, but a school, a part of the public school system of the state. Admissions are free at any time to all Iowa deaf children of suitable age and capacity as well as to such who are too deaf to secure an education elsewhere. There is no charge for board, tuition or books; parents only provide for transportation and furnish the necessary clothing and in cases where parents are unable to meet these expenditures the Superintendent is authorized by law to provide same and charge to the county from whence the pupil hails.

The school opens the first Wednesday after the second Monday in September and continues uninterruptedly for nine months.
