

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### LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

July 1, 1930.

Subject: Biennial Report.

To: His Excellency, John Hammill, Commander-in-Chief, State House, Des Moines, Iowa. I. In accordance with the provisions of paragraph 446, Chapter 28, Code of 1927, I have the honor to submit the following biennial report relative to the activities of the Adjutant General's department during the period July 1, 1928 to June 30, 1930.

#### a. Personnel.

At the present time, the Iowa National Guard is composed of many of the finest men in the State. Young men are being attracted to the Guard each day, and in practically every instance, only the highest type in the community are accepted. The officers in command are professionally qualified, many of whom have attended one of the many service schools of the Regular Army.

#### b. CAMP DODGE.

The Iowa National Guard is most fortunate in having one of the very finest training camps in the entire United States, located approximately twelve miles from the State Capitol, and in addition to the camp proper, there are six hundred acres of government land available for terrain exercises during the summer training period. During the past year, the government has constructed, at a cost of \$5,000.00, an Administration Building for Camp Headquarters, and the National Guard has, at a cost of \$10,000.00, erected a Hostess House for use of the families and friends of both officers and enlisted men while visiting in the camp. In addition to construction, the Federal Government has expended considerable money in repairs, the principal allotments being \$2,200.00 for waterproofing all mess halls and headquarters buildings, and \$1,000.00 for reconstruction of the machine shop. It is expected that during the present fiscal year, the Federal Government will construct a new Camp Hospital. The swimming pool is one of the largest in the world, and during the summer is operated for the benefit of the general public by a committee from the Des Moines Playground Association.

#### c. Armories.

There are no State-owned armories in Iowa. Each unit of the Guard must provide its own armory, for which the State pays an annual rental. It is thought, that especially in the larger cities, the State should construct suitable armories on account of the fact that over long periods it would be a much more economical procedure.

#### d. Armory Drill.

The attendance at armory drill continues to increase. Splendid attendance records have been made by a majority of the units of the Guard, during the past two years. Each offi er and enlisted man attending weekly drill is paid by the Federal Government, the payment being made each quarter. This feature stimulates attendance at drill, and attendance at drill engenders efficiency of the unit.

#### e. NEW ORGANIZATIONS.

During the past two years the Militia Bureau has permitted the organization of two additional units of Artillery, viz., a Headquarters Battery, and a Service Battery and Band. These organizations were allocated to Davenport and Boone respectively, and completes the regimental organization. In addition to the above units, the Militia Bureau, with the acquiescence of the State of Kansas, authorized the organization of the 57th Cavalry Brigade Headquarters. This Brigade consists of the 113th Cavalry, Iowa National Guard, and the 114th Cavalry, Kansas National Guard, the Brigade command being allotted to Iowa.

#### f. Inspections.

Inspections of all National Guard units are made each year by officers of the Regular Army. These inspections are made for the purpose of determining the condition of troops as to equipment, housing, and readiness for active duty. The last inspections found the Iowa National Guard in excellent condition, and ready to answer a short notice call for service.

#### g. MORALE.

The Iowa National Guard is an educational institution in that it teaches civic pride, the respect for law and order, and the respect for the property and lives of others. It builds character, and teaches the members how to care for themselves physically. Clean sports are fostered and the men are taught discipline in such a manner that it helps them in every day life. Officers and enlisted men are enthusiastic; enthusiasm usually breeds efficiency; this coupled with the fact that a majority of the officers and a large number of the enlisted men are World War veterans, makes for a State force of the highest type. The efficiency of the Guard was vividly illustrated during the spring of 1929, during the flood at Waterloo. Companies "B" and "D" 133rd Infantry, stationed in that city were called upon by the civic authorities to assist in the protection of life and property, and performed a notable service.

Several lives were saved, and thousands of dollars worth of property was protected due to the efficiency of the two companies. The National Guard stands ready at all times to aid, with both men and equipment, during a catastrophe such as a tornado, fire or flood, and the greater the efficiency of the officers and men, the greater the service performed.

The excellence of the Iowa National Guard is due to the untiring and unselfish efforts of the officers and enlisted personnel, and I desire at this time to take the opportunity to express to the officers and enlisted men the sincere thanks of the department for their hearty cooperation and support. It is gratifying in the extreme to observe the progress made from year to year, and the entire Guard personnel is to be both congratulated and complimented.
- 3. To you, Governor, I desire to extend the thanks of the entire National Guard for your sympathetic understanding of Guard problems, and your hearty cooperation in things pertaining to my office. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.

### THE NATIONAL GUARD

The National Guard of the United States is an efficient military organization of eighteen Divisions, several Cavalry Brigades, Coast Artillery Regiments located in strategic positions, and various Corps and Army special troops—all prepared for field service at the call of either Governor or President. No component of our Land Forces can be expected to furnish more organized combat troops, upon the declaration of a national emergency.

The World War record of the National Guard is worthy of a bright page in our history and should challenge continued loyal support—

That's the glorious achievement of the National Guard, when there were many less encouragements than today.

War Department plans provide for a National Guard of 190,000 young men—honest-to-goodness fellows who are patriotic, ambitious, and willing to train for field service. We sincerely trust that peace may silence the guns of war forever, but the Constitution still provides for the "Common Defense." The National Guard has much to offer.

Forty-eight armory training periods and fifteen days of field service is the program offered. But, the armories in most cities are furnished for social, athletic and various other interesting events. To those who have unusual leadership ability the Federal Government offers the advantages of all military schools—West Point, Infantry School, Command and General Staff and the Army War College. Provisions have been made to send 112 enlisted men to the various service schools, and an average of 25 appointments to West Point each year. In addition to this, 312 officers are authorized to take courses at the various service schools.

Nearly eleven hundred carefully selected officers and non-commissioned officers of the Regular Army have been assigned to instruct the National Guard in connection with their armory and field training.

The State and Federal Governments spend annually for the support of the National Guard over fifty million dollars. This is used for building armories, construction of camps, organizing, equipping and training the officer and enlisted personnel. Over eleven million dollars is paid to the officers and men of the National Guard for drill and camp pay annually.

In other words—the Federal Government supports, with the forty-eight States, District of Columbia, Hawaii and Porto Rico, this organization of 190,000 splendid, manly fellows who are prepared at any time to defend property rights and life, to repel or suppress invasions or insurrection. We want to cooperate to the fullest extent with all the components of the Army, and will go the limit for National Defense.

The National Guard offers the ambitious young men worth while opportunities. This is a challenge in behalf of the National Guard, an opportunity for you to become a part of a live, efficient military organization, one or more units of which are located right in your home town.

The War Department has assigned to the National Guard a worthy mission, and you are invited to have part in training for and achieving that mission.

I. ANNOUNCEMENT OF OUTDOOR TARGET SEASON—The regular outdoor target season for all Troops of the Iowa National Guard, for the calendar year 1929, will be from January 1, 1929, to December 31, 1929, and divided into two distinct periods, as follows:

EXECUTIVE ORDER

1. Under the provisions of Section 453, Chapter 28, Code of Iowa, 1927, the following officers of the Iowa National Guard are appointed members of the Armory Board:

Brig. Gen. W. H. Bailey, AGD Iowa NG—The Adjutant General. Brig. Gen. Guy E. Logan, AGD Iowa NG—Retired Lt. Col. Henry G. Geiger, 168th Inf. Iowa NG. Major Thomas P. Hollowell, Cav. Iowa NG-Res. Major Maxwell A. O'Brien, 113th Cav. Iowa NG.

2. The Board will function in accordance with the provisions of Section 453, Chapter 28, Code of Iowa, 1927, and under such regulations as may be published from time to time by the Adjutant General of Iowa.

JOHN HAMMILL, Governor and Commander-in-Chief.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF ARMORY BOARD-The following regulations, governing the composition and duties of the Armory Board are published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

a. COMPOSITION:

The Armory Board, which is appointed by the Governor, shall consist of the Adjutant General and four officers appointed from the Active, Reserve or Retired Commissioned Personnel of the National Guard. The four officers on the Board, other than the Adjutant General, shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

b. DUTIES:

(1) The Board shall meet at such time and place as may be ordered by the Governor, through the Adjutant General, whenever the occasion demands and for the following purposes:

(a) To fix the Armory Rent Allowance for all Organizations of

the Iowa National Guard.

(b) To act on changes in Armory Rent Allowance, as may be presented for consideration of the Board, by Organization Commanders of the Iowa National Guard.

- (c) To fix the Headquarters Allowance for certain State Staff Officers and all Organizations of the Iowa National Guard.
- (d) To establish regulations governing expenditures from Headquarters and Armory Rent Allowances.
- (2) The Adjutant General will act as President of the Board and will designate the recorder at each meeting of the Board.
- (3) The designated recorder of the Board will keep an accurate record of the proceedings, which will be submitted in writing, as soon as practicable after each meeting of the Board, to the Adjutant General, for the approval of the Governor.
- (4) The Board will be authorized to proceed with its business in the absence of not more than one member of the Board.
- (5) The continued inability of any member of the Board to serve when meetings of the Board are called, will be reported to the Governor by the Adjutant General, in the capacity of President of the Board, and he will submit recommendations for the relief of such member and the appointment of a successor.
- (6) The allowances for members of the Armory Board are prescribed in Section X of these orders.
- (7) The Armory Rent Allowance, fixed by the Board will remain in effect throughout the biennium, unless changed by action of the Board and approved by the Governor. The allowance made by the Board shall, when approved by the Governor, be paid from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the Iowa National Guard.
- (8) Armory Rent Allowance, fixed by the Board, will be construed to include heat, light, water and janitor service.
- (9) All plans and specifications covering construction of new Armories and remodeling of buildings to be used for Armory purposes, must be submitted to the Board for approval before such construction or remodeling is contracted for or accomplished and shall follow, as closely as possible, the requirements outlined below:
  - (a) All buildings constructed, leased or used for Armory purposes must, unless special authority is obtained from the Armory Board, be constructed of brick, cement, stone or other fireproof material, so as to be favorably considered by the Fire Insurance Underwriters' Association.
  - (b) Adequate provision must, in all cases, be made for the protection of Federal and State property against fire, theft and the elements.
  - (c) Modern methods of heating and lighting must be installed and sufficient lavatories, shower baths and water closets provided for.
  - (d) Every consideration must be given the social life of the various organizations and an effort will be made to provide suitable rooms with proper furnishings, etc., to insure and encourage interest in the recreational and athletic activities.
  - (e) Armories constructed or remodeled should conform to the following specifications in order to receive the maximum Armory Rent Allowance:
    - For: Headquarters Companies

Service Companies

Howitzer Companies
Machine Gun and Rifle Companies:

Two stories or more in height.

Basement large enough for indoor Rifle and Pistol Range.

Drill hall not less than 50x80 feet; clear floor space, no posts, 22 ft. ceiling with balcony, if possible, 8 ft. wide and 12 ft. above floor.

Two store rooms, one 60x32 ft. for supply room and one 16x16 ft. for heavy property.

One locker room 16x24 ft.

Two Officers' rooms, one 10x12 and one 12x12.

One Noncommissioned Officers' Room, 12x12. One club or assembly room not less than 20x32 ft.

Two shower baths-Two lavatories.

Indoor Rifle Range in basement, not less than 60 ft. long and two targets in width.

Headquarters Companies, Brigade

Headquarters Companies, Battalion:

The same as above, with the following modifications:

Drill Hall not less than 32x48 ft.

One Store Room 16x20 ft.

For: Headquarters Troop Machine Gun Troop and Rifle Troops:

The same as above for Companies of like strength, except for the following additions:

Paddock 100x100 ft.

Stables containing two box stalls and 32 stalls. One wash rack, with water connections and drains.

One water trough.

Storage space for 10,000 pounds grain and 25 tons of hay and straw.

One saddle room 14x14, with proper equipment to clean and care for all leather equipment. Blacksmith shop 16x16 ft., separated from Stables.

For: Field Artillery and Special Units:

To be furnished by the Board upon request to the Board, through the Adjutant General. The Board will base their specifications for Field Artillery Armories from such specifications as may be obtainable and personal surveys of the locality in which the Unit is to be housed.

(Armory) c. LEASES:

> (1) Leases will be prepared in triplicate, on a standard commercial form for leases and will ordinarily be for a period of one year, beginning preferably with the first day of the fiscal year, be-

ginning July 1.

(2) All three copies of the lease will be submitted to the Adjutant General for approval and will not be considered in effect until approved by him. Leases should be submitted at least ten days prior to the effective date. Two copies of the lease, bearing the approval of the Adjutant General, will be returned to the Unit Commander, one of which should be transmitted to the lessor.

(3) All leases will contain the following clause:

"In the event the National Guard Unit, which is a party to this lease, is disbanded or mustered out, it is agreed, by all concerned that this lease will be cancelled the last day of the month in which the organization herein mentioned vacates the premise. It is further understood and agreed that should the National Guard Unit herein mentioned, be called or drafted into Federal Service, this lease will not be cancelled before the expiration of ninety (90) days after the organization has responded to such call or draft but after such ninety days have expired this lease or contract becomes null and void without further notice.'

(4) Payment of Armory Rent will automatically cease to be made to any Unit in the absence of a lease. All leases will conform to the requirements herein cited and all Unit Commanders will be held responsible for the proper completion of leases.

2. The Board will function under such instructions as may be transmitted by this office to the Adjutant General of Iowa, and under such regulations as may be published from time to time, by the Adjutant General of Iowa.

VI. REGULATIONS GOVERNING COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF ADVISORY BOARD—The following regulations, governing the composition and duties of the Advisory Board, are published for the information and guidance of all concerned:

a. COMPOSITION:

The Advisory Board, which is appointed by the Governor, shall consist of the Adjutant General and the Senior Officer from each Division, Brigade and Regiment of the Iowa National Guard and such other officers of the Iowa National Guard as may be appointed at the discretion of the Governor. All officers on the Board, except the Adjutant General, shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

b. DUTIES:

(1) The Board shall meet at such time and place as may be ordered by the Governor, through the Adjutant General, whenever the occasion demands and for the following purposes:

(a) To recommend such improvements and construction as may be deemed essential for the training and quartering of the

Iowa National Guard Troops, at Camp Dodge, Iowa.

(b) To make such recommendations as may be deemed necessary to increase the efficiency of the Iowa National Guard Troops and for the purpose of recommending methods of training and coordinating the training of all Iowa National Guard Troops.

(2) The senior officer present at each meeting of the Board will act as President and will designate the recorder for that par-

ticular meeting.

(3) The designated recorder of the Board will complete an accurate record of the proceedings, which will be submitted in writing as soon as practicable after each meeting of the Board, to the Adjutant General for the approval of the Governor.

(4) The Board will be authorized to proceed with its business in the absence of not more than three members of the Board.

(5) The continued inability of any member of the Board, to serve when meetings of the Board are called, will be reported to the Governor, by the Adjutant General and, he will submit

such recommendations as may be deemed appropriate for the relief of such member and the appointment of a successor.

(6) The allowances for members of the Advisory Board are prescribed in Section X of these orders:

The Regulations governing expenditures from the Armory Rent Allowance are prescribed in Par. 2 b, Section VIII of these orders.

3. The following Range Allowances, fixed by The Adjutant General, based on the appropriation made by the Forty-third General Assembly of Iowa, and approved by The Governor, under the provisions of Section 454, Chapter 28, Code of Iowa, 1927, for each year of the biennium, beginning July 1, 1929, and ending June 30, 1931, are announced:

#### a. ALLOWANCES:

#### b. LEASES: (Range)

(1) Leases will be prepared in triplicate on a standard commercial form for leases and will ordinarily be for a period of one or two years beginning preferably with the first day of the fiscal year, beginning July 1.

(2) All three copies of the lease will be submitted to The Adjutant General for approval and will not be considered in effect until approved by him. Leases should be submitted at least ten days prior to the effective date. Two copies of the lease, bearing the approval of the Adjutant General, will be returned to the Unit Commander, one of which should be transmitted to the Lessor.

(3) Payment of Range Allowances will automatically cease to be made to any Unit in the absence of a lease. Unit Commanders will be held responsible for the proper completion of leases.

(4) Commanding Officers of Units, whose range firing is conducted on a Federally owned Range will be required to submit a certificate for each semi-annual period, certifying to the fact that the Unit has engaged in outdoor range firing before they will be entitled to the prescribed range allowance. The certificate will be submitted on June 20 and December 20 of each Calendar Year and will be in the form set forth below, over the signature of the Unit Commander.

(5) The Regulations governing expenditures from the Range Allowance, are prescribed in Par. 2 c, Section VIII of these orders.

VIII. PER CAPITA ALLOWANCE AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING EXPENDITURES OF STATE FUNDS—PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF ACCOUNTS CURRENT.

# 1. PER CAPITA (DRILL) ALLOWANCE:

a. Under the provisions of Section 455, Chapter 28, Code of Iowa 1927, a Per Capita (Drill) Allowance of \$4.00 Per Capita, computed on the average enlisted strength during each semi-annual period, will be paid all Unit Commanders of the Iowa National Guard, except as indicated in Par. b below, July 1 and January 1 of each calendar year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

b. Units, whose average attendance at drill, during any semi-annual period, falls below 50 per centum of the average enlisted strength will not be entitled to the Per Capita (Drill) Allowance hereabove cited, during such semi-annual period. The percentage will be obtained by computing the average enlisted attendance at drill during the semi-annual period ending June 30 and December 31 each Calendar Year.

c. The Regulations governing expenditures from Per Capita (Drill)

Allowance are prescribed in Par. 2 d of this Section.

# 2. REGULATIONS GOVERNING EXPENDITURE OF STATE FUNDS:

a. HEADQUARTERS ALLOWANCE: The following Regulations, fixed by the Armory Board, will govern expenditures from the

Headquarters Allowance:

(1) Expenditures from this allowance will be limited to purchase of stationery, not otherwise furnished by the Federal Government or the State of Iowa, purchase of postage, payment of telephone service, official long distance telephone calls, official telegraph messages and such other specific expenditures which may have been authorized by The Adjutant General, prior to having been contracted for.

(2) All payments made from this allowance will be made on "Voucher Checks" Form No. 6, AGO Iowa (Old OAG Form No. 17) with itemized statement of purchase entered thereon, or properly supported by itemized statement. Payments made

on any other type of checks are not acceptable.

b. ARMORY RENT ALLOWANCE: The following Regulations, fixed by the Armory Board will govern expenditures from the Armory Rent Allowance:

(1) Expenditures from this allowance will be confined to payment of rent, heat, fuel, light, water, repairs, purchasing and installation of permanent fixtures, janitor service and such other specific expenditures which may have been authorized by the Adjutant General, prior to having been contracted for.

(2) All payments made from this allowance will be made on "Voucher Checks" Form No. 6, AGO Iowa (Old OAG Form No. 17) with itemized statement of payment or purchase entered thereon, or properly supported by itemized statement, covering items of expenditure. Payments made on any other type of checks are not acceptable.

c. RANGE ALLOWANCE: The following Regulations will govern

expenditures from the Range Allowance:

(1) Expenditures from this allowance will be limited to payment of rent for suitable Terrain or other type of facilities to be used for outdoor and indoor firing with all types of weapons, as well as for reasonable construction work and maintenance of range facilities, payment for labor used in preparing range for firing, telephone service on range and transportation to and from range. The allowance for transportation to and from range to be paid to the individual furnishing the transportation, will be left to the discretion of Unit Commanders.

(2) Disbursements from the Range Allowance, other than those outlined above, may be authorized at the discretion of The Adjutant General. Whenever Unit Commanders are doubtful as to the propriety of certain expenditures from this allowance they should apply to the Adjutant General for written authorization prior to closing purchase or contracting

for labor or services.

(3) All payments made from this allowance will be made on "Voucher Checks" form No. 6 AGO Iowa (Old OAG Form

No. 17) with itemized statement of payment or purchase entered thereon, or properly supported by itemized statement, covering items of expenditure. Payments made on any other type of checks are not acceptable.

PER CAPITA (DRILL) ALLOWANCE: The following regulations, prescribed by The Governor, will govern expenditures from

the Per Capita (Drill) Allowance:

(1) Expenditures from this allowance will be confined to payment of items and payment for services rendered which contribute in general to the comfort and contentment and the mental and physical improvement of the enlisted personnel or the betterment, from a Military standpoint of the Unit as a whole. Payment of items disbursed solely for the benefit of the entire personnel, rather than an individual in particular, should be understood to be only logical expenditures from this allowance, such as cartage on Military Stores to and from depot to Armory, purchase of athletic equipment, club room fixtures and purchase of military text books, publications and equipment, not otherwise furnished by the Federal Government, or the State of Iowa. Under no consideration will funds be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of sponsoring entertainments, dances or like social activities.

(2) In addition to the above, expenditures may be made from this allowance for payment of bills that would ordinarily be paid from the Headquarters, Range or Armory Rent Allowances, when allowances of these funds prove to be insufficient.

(3) In rare instances and subject to the approval to The Adjutant General, a limited amount of funds may be disbursed from this allowance for the purpose of relieving a responsible and accountable officer for property lost, stolen or destroyed. Such disbursement, however, must be made upon recommendation of the "Unit Council" which will be composed of two Commissioned Officers, other than the responsible and accountable officer and the two senior non-commissioned officers belonging to the Unit. The requirements of two Commissioned officers in the composition of the "Unit Council" is modified to one Commissioned officer when only one officer beside the responsible and accountable officer has been assigned to duty with the Unit. Under no consideration will funds be disbursed from this allowance for the payment of drills attended by officers or enlisted men.

(4) Disbursements from the Per Capita (Drill) Allowance, other than those herein outlined, may be authorized at the discre-tion of The Adjutant General. Whenever Unit Commanders are confronted with doubtful expenditures they should apply to The Adjutant General for written authorization prior to

closing purchase or contracting for services.

(5) All payments made from this allowance will be made on "Voucher Checks" Form No. 6, AGO Iowa (old OAG Form No. 17) with itemized statement of payment or purchase entered thereon, or properly supported by itemized statement, covering items of expenditure. Payments made on any other type of checks are not acceptable.

3. FUNDS: HOW KNOWN AND OFFICIAL DESIGNATION: The official designation of State Funds of Units of the Iowa National Guard, will be as follows: "State funds Tr. A 113th Cav. Iowa NG" or "State funds Btry, D 185th FA Iowa NG."

4. HOW DEPOSITED IN BANK: When State funds are deposited in a bank they will be placed under their official designation as indicated in Par. 3 above, and not to the credit of the officer who is the custodian or the disbursing officer of such funds. No money which does not pertain to the fund in question will be deposited with this account. Funds should be deposited with a reputable banking institution.

# 5. OBLIGATION OF FUNDS IN EXCESS OF AMOUNT ON HAND NOT AUTHORIZED:

Under no consideration will any Unit Commander obligate funds in excess of the amount received from each allowance mentioned in this section, without obtaining specific written authorization from The Adjutant General.

# 6. ARTICLES PURCHASED FROM STATE FUNDS, STATE PROP-

All articles of a permanent nature, purchased from State Funds, will become State Property and The Adjutant General's Office, will furnish the State Quartermaster semi-annually with a list of the property of a permanent nature, purchased from State Funds, which should be taken up by him on the State Property Records of the Units concerned. Unit Commanders will be held responsible and accountable for such articles of State Property purchased with State Funds.

#### 7. BLANK FORMS:

A supply of blank forms for Voucher Checks—Form No. 6, AGO Iowa, (old OAG Form No. 17) will be furnished each Unit Commander annually, without requisition, on July 1 of each calendar year, or as soon thereafter as practicable. Whenever the supply of this blank form proves to be insufficient, requisition should be submitted to The Adjutant General, by letter, for whatever additional number of forms may be required.

# 8. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF ACCOUNTS CURRENT:

a. The following instructions will govern the preparation and submission of Accounts Current:

 Accounts Current will be kept in duplicate on Form No. 7 AGO Iowa (old OAG Form 25-A).

(2) Entries will be made promptly at the time of receipt or disbursement of funds.

(3) All Commanding Officers, who, by virtue of their office are disbursing officers or custodians of State funds, will close their Accounts Current on June 30 and December 31 of each calendar year, or immediately upon being relieved from duty as custodian or disbursing officer of State funds.

(4) The original copy of Accounts Current, embodying all the prescribed data and accompanied by the cancelled Voucher Checks, issued during the period covered by the Account Current, will be submitted to The Adjutant General as soon as practicable at the end of each semi-annual period and in no event later than thirty days from the last day of the semiannual period. The Accounts Current will also be accompanied by the Bank statement for the last month of the semiannual period, showing the balance of State funds in the bank as of the last day of the semi-annual period and whenever this is impracticable the Accounts Current will be accompanied by a written statement submitted over the signature of one of the officers of the particular bank in which the funds are on deposit, which will show the total balance of State funds in the bank, as of the last day of the semi-annual period.

(5) A supply of blank forms for Accounts Current—Form No. 7 AGO Iowa (Old OAG Form No. 25-A) will be furnished each Unit Commander annually, without requisition on July 1 of each calendar year, or as soon thereafter as practicable. Whenever the supply of this blank form proves to be insufficient, requisitions should be submitted by letter to The Adjutant General for whatever additional number of forms may be required.

9. All orders and existing Regulations in conflict with the above pro-

visions are revoked.

IX. ISSUES OF OFFICE EQUIPMENT AND OFFICE SUPPLIES—1. The following allowances of permanent office equipment and expendable office supplies, approved by The Governor, are prescribed for the organizations of the Iowa National Guard:

## a. PERMANENT OFFICE EQUIPMENT-Not expendable.

(1) REGIMENTAL HEADQUARTERS:

(3) COMPANIES, TROOPS, BATTERIES OR DETACHMENTS: Same as Regimental Headquarters except the following: 1 Mimeograph Machine No. 77

1 Steel Typewriter Table

(4) Division and Brigade Headquarters will supply their permanent office equipment from their Headquarters Allowance, announced

in Par. 1 b, Section VII of these orders.

(5) The purchase of such items of permanent office equipment, which may be needed in addition to those issued by the State of Iowa, will be considered proper expenditures from the Headquarters or Per Capita (Drill) Allowances of any organization. In this connection the attention of all organization commanders is called to the provisions of Par. 6, Section VIII of these orders.

(6) All issues of permanent office equipment will be made by the

State Quartermaster.

#### b. OFFICE SUPPLIES—Expendable.

(1) The following semi-annual allowance of expendable office supplies, is prescribed for all Units of the Iowa National Guard:

50 No. 10 envelopes, addressed to AGO

50 No. 10 envelopes, addressed to USP&DO

100 No. 10 envelopes, plain with return

25 Clasp envelopes, 9x12 25 Sheets Carbon paper

250 Sheets letter paper 8x10 ½ 500 Sheets second sheet 8x10 ½

(2) All issues of expendable office supplies will be made by the State Quartermaster.

(3) Requisition to cover replacement for expendable office supplies, actually consumed, will be submitted, in triplicate, on or before July 15 and January 15 of each year.

by War Department, Table of Allowances, will be issued to all Units of the Iowa National Guard, by the U.S. Property & Disbursing Of-

ficer, State of Iowa, just prior to each Field Training period.

d. The purchase of such items of office supplies, which may be needed, in addition to those not otherwise furnished by the Federal Government, or the State of Iowa, will be considered proper expenditures from the Headquarters or Per Capita (Drill) Allowances, of any Unit of the Iowa National Guard.

X. REGULATIONS GOVERNING REIMBURSEMENT FOR TRAVEL AND PAYMENT FOR DUTIES PERFORMED PURSUANT TO INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE—1. The following Regulations will govern reimbursement for travel and payment for duties performed pursuant to orders issued by The Adjutant General's Office:

#### a. ARMORY BOARD:

Members of the Armory Board, will, when attending a meeting of the Board, pursuant to competent orders, be allowed the base pay of their grade, for each day the Board is in session, and transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to the place specified for the meeting and return.

#### b. ADVISORY BOARD:

Members of the Advisory Board, will, when attending a meeting of the Board, pursuant to competent orders, be allowed the base pay of their grade for each day the Board is in session, and transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to the place specified for the meeting and return.

#### c. EXAMINING BOARDS:

Members of Examining Boards for appointment or promotion of National Guard Personnel will, when attending a meeting of the Board pursuant to competent orders, be allowed the base pay of their grade for each day the Board is in session, and transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to the place specified for the meeting and return.

#### d. GOVERNOR'S STAFF:

Officers ordered to duty on the Staff of The Governor, will, when on duty as Aide, pursuant to competent orders, be allowed actual necessary expenses during the period of duty, as well as transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary from home station to the place specified for assembly of the Staff and return.

#### e. OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN ORDERED TO ACTIVE DUTY:

(1) Officers of the Iowa National Guard, ordered to active duty, pursuant to competent orders, will be allowed the base pay of their grade during the period of the ordered duty, as well as transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car charges, when necessary, from home station to place of reporting for duty and return.

(2) Enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard, ordered to active duty, pursuant to competent orders, will be allowed the base pay of their grade and subsistence, or in lieu of rations in kind, when impracticable to furnish same, actual expenses during the period of the ordered duty, as well as transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to place of reporting for duty and return.

### f. DIVISION, BRIGADE, REGIMENTAL AND BATTALION STAFF OF-FICERS ON VISITS OF INSPECTION AND INSTRUCTION:

All Division, Brigade, Regimental and Battalion Staff Officers, detailed to perform visits of inspection and instruction, under competent orders, will be allowed actual necessary expenses during the period of ordered duty, as well as transportation, including Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to place of the ordered duty and return.

# g. OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD AND CANDIDATES ORDERED BEFORE EXAMINING BOARDS:

Officers and enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard, and candidates ordered before Examining Boards, pursuant to competent orders, for

examination, will be allowed actual necessary expenses during the period of the ordered duty as well as Pullman Fare and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to place specified for examination and return.

# h. OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD ORDERED TO PERFORM SPECIAL DUTIES WHICH IN-CLUDE TRAVEL:

Officers and enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard, ordered to perform special duties, pursuant to competent orders, which involve travel, will be allowed actual necessary expenses during the period of this ordered duty, as well as transportation, including Pullman and Parlor Car Charges, when necessary, from home station to the place of the ordered duty and return.

- 2. Officers and enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard and such civilians as may, from time to time, be ordered to perform duties involving travel, pursuant to competent orders, may, when authorized in the written orders, ordering the travel, perform such travel directed by automobile and be reimbursed therefor, at the rate of the actual cost of Railroad fare.
- 3. In addition to the above cited provisions governing reimbursement for travel performed, pursuant to competent orders, by all personnel connected with the Iowa National Guard, all claims for reimbursement will be subject to the following provisions of extracts of rules and regulations issued by the State Board of Audit.

"Rule 1. All claims for reimbursement for expense must be sworn to by the claimant and approved by the head of the department or executive officer of the board or commission, or his deputy.

Rule 3. All claims must be prepared on the typewriter or in ink. If typewritten, the original must be filed. (Such additional copies of claims as are required by the officer certifying claim shall be furnished by the claimant.)

Rule 5. Where telephone or telegraph service is used, statement as to the necessity for same and the name of person with whom communication is held must be filed with the claim. In view of the fact that the expenditures for telephone and telegraph by the employees of the State are becoming enormous, the Board of Audit feels the necessity of urging upon each department the curtailment of such expense and suggests that wherever practical, telegrams or the mails be substituted for telephone communications.

Rule 6. \* \* \* \* \* Charge for breakfast will not be allowed when the train leaves claimant's residence or domicile after 7:00 A. M.

Rule 7. Receipts shall be filed for all items of one dollar or over, covering incidental expenditures and for telephone and telegraph, (except from booth—in which case statement to that effect may be made).

NOTE 3. Pullman fares and dining car meals should be charged under the heading "Hotel Expense" and railroad and bus fares

should be charged under the heading "Transportation."

4. Claims for reimbursement will be submitted in triplicate, as early as practicable, upon completion of duties performed on Form No. 1, AGO Iowa. All copies must be signed and the claimant's signature witnessed by an officer authorized to administer on Oath. The following remark will be entered on all copies following the last listed item of expense:
"Performed in compliance with Par..... SO No...... AGO Iowa, dated....."

I. RESCISSION OF CERTAIN GENERAL ORDERS—Section I GO No. 7, Adjutant General's Office, State of Iowa, Series 1926, relating to the Care and Maintenance of Records—Use of Field Desks, is rescinded.

II. CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF RECORDS—USE OF COMPANY FIELD DESKS—1. The following instructions in connection with the care and maintenance of records and use of Company Field Desks, are published for the information and guidance of all organization commanders whose units are equipped with the Company Field Desks and who are responsible for the proper care and maintenance of records:

a. The following records will be kept in the sections designated below of Field Desk "A":

(1) Lid Section:

(a) Upper Left Section:

This section will contain the following supply of stationery for use during Field Training Periods:

1 gross bands, rubber

1 eraser, rubber, ink and pencil

1 eraser, steel

1 box fasteners, paper 1 tin ink, black tablets 1 tin ink, red tablets

1 tube paste

4 pencils, indelible

2 pencils, lead

- 1 pencil, colored (blue and red)
- 2 penholders 12 pens, steel

Immediately upon completion of each Field Training Period the supply indicated above will be replenished and thereafter kept intact until the subsequent Field Training Period.

#### (b) Lower Left Section:

Memorandum receipts, shipping tickets, receiving reports, statement of charges, report of survey and inventory, audit and inspection reports.

The following supply of blank forms and stationery for use

during Field Training Periods:

#### Blank Forms:

30 Requisitions

8 Receiving Reports

30 Shipping Tickets

12 Charge Sheets

16 Reports of Survey

18 Statement of Charges

12 Company Returns

#### Stationery:

2 blocks, memo or scratch note

1 quire, letter paper, typewriter (1st sheet) 8x10 1/2"

1 quire, letter paper, typewriter (2nd sheet) 8x10 1/2"

1 box, standard carbon paper 8 1/2 x13"

Immediately upon completion of each Field Training period the supply of blank forms and stationery indicated above will be replenished and thereafter kept intact until the subsequent Field Training Period.

(c) Upper Right Section:

National Guard Regulations.

Any other pamphlets or documents suitable in size to be filed in this section and for which no other filing method has been designated.

## (d) Lower Right Section:

Tables of Organization

Equipment Table, National Guard

Loose-leaf binder containing individual Equipment Records (WDMB Forms No. 30)

Any other pamphlets or documents suitable in size to be filed

in this section and for which no other filing method has been designated.

#### (2) Service Record Tray:

The service record tray will contain the service record and all other individual records of each of the active enlisted men of the unit, followed by the service record and all other individual records of "Assigned Reservists," if any.

The service records will be filed in the tray as follows: In front of the guide card "Noncommissioned officers" will be filed the service records of the noncommissioned officers of the unit in each grade, the records being filed in the order of the date of warrant; following the noncommissioned officers and in front of the guide card "Privates First Class" will be filed the service records of the privates first class, in alphabetical order, irrespective of specialists rating; following this group and in front of the guide card "Privates" will be filed the service records of the privates, in alphabetical order, irrespective of specialists rating.

The remaining space of the tray may be used for the purpose of keeping blank forms suitable in size to be filed therein; such as score cards

(all weapons) extract of service record and so forth.

(3) Miscellaneous Record Tray:

The miscellaneous record tray will contain the "Reminder" and the sections designated by the guide cards "Memoranda"—"Clothing" and "Horses" in that order, followed by the current correspondence book with document file, and company council book. Each of these sections will be used as follows:

Reminder:

The reminder will consist of the month cards and date cards which are placed in chronological order in the front of the miscellaneous tray,

the month cards being in rear of date cards.

The date cards will be rotated as follows: On the morning of January 2, the date card "1" will be placed in rear of month card for "January" and in front of and next to the month card "February," the procedure being followed daily with the remaining date-cards for the month in order, so that following the 31st of January the date card 31 will un-cover the January card. The former will be filed in rear of date card 30, and in front of month card "February" and the January card will be filed in rear of month card "December," leaving the "Reminder" for the month of February set up in normal order with a necessary supply of form No. 100 WDMB (Report of National Guard Duty Performed) for use for the month of February.

During the Field Training period the date cards will be rotated daily and during the Armory Drill Period weekly or on each regular drill or

formation of the organization.

A complete set of reminder slips for use in front of the month and date cards of the "Reminder" should be prepared. These slips should anticipate all items of administration in the organization in time for their accomplishment and should be prepared of size 3 1/2 x8". An example of such "Reminder" slips follows:

EXAMPLE 1-(This reminder will be placed in front of the month cards

"January" and "July.")
Articles 1, 2, and 29, 54 to 96, inclusive, and 104 to 109, Reminder inclusive, will be read and explained to every soldier at

the time of his enlistment, or muster in, or within six days after, and will be read January 1st

and explained once every six months to soldiers of every garrison, regiment or company in the service of the United States, (110 A. W.) The articles of War are published in the Manual for Courts-Martial 1928, and in paragraph 7, NGR No. 36-1924-MILITARY DISCIPLINE AND COURTESY.

EXAMPLE 2-(This reminder will be placed in front of the month card "January.")

Reminder

July 1st

January 15th. Submit Account Current for the period July 1-Dec. 31. EXAMPLE 3-(This reminder will be placed in front of the month card "March.")

Reminder

Submit quarterly payroll quarter Dec. 1-Feb. 28.

Reminder slips may also be used to a good advantage in connection with the date cards and used as reminders from one drill night to the

next-EXAMPLE:

On February 21, (which date is on one of the regular drill nights of the Company) the Company Commander receives a communication stating that the Report of Principal of Ordnance Supplies must be submitted not later than March 1. The Company Commander has all his work outlined for February 21, and cannot take care of the Report of Principal of Ordnance Supplies until the regular drill of February 28. He directs the Company Clerk to place a reminder slip in front of the date card "28."

#### EXAMPLE

#### REMINDER

Prepare report of Principal of Ordnance Supplies.

On the regular drill of February 28, the company clerk rotates the date cards and the date card "28" appears to the front with the reminder slip, indicated above, and thereby eliminating the possibility of over-looking to submit the report in question in due time.

In setting up the "Reminder" the current Form No. 100 WDMB (Report of National Guard Duty Performed) which is started at the beginning of the month and kept current from day to day and drill to drill, will be filed in front of the "Reminder" section; and a supply of these blanks for the ensuing quarter will be filed in sets in front of the next three month cards.

The following supply of blank forms will be kept in front of the guide card "August" for use during the Field Training Period:

3 Morning Reports 3 Daily Sick Reports

3 Duty Rosters 30 Ration Returns

Immediately upon completion of each Field Training Period the supply indicated above will be renewed and thereafter kept intact until the

subsequent Field Training Period.

The "Reminder" will also be used as a live file for the Form No. 100 WDMB destined for the permanent file, but whose disposition to the permanent file is to be postponed until these forms cease to be of current import. These forms should be filed in front of the index card of the month in which they are filed, and moved to the back of the "Reminder" with it. When the card next appears a year later these forms will be placed in the permanent file in rear of the payroll covering the period for which these forms were submitted.

#### Memoranda:

In front of the guide card "'Memoranda" will be filed all memorandums and documents, not of permanent value, for which the filing is not directed elsewhere.

To prevent an accumulation of unnecessary or obsolete "Memorandums" and "Documents," in this section, a quarterly inspection of same will be made by the organization commander, who will at such inspection eliminate from the section all items which have become obsolete or unnecessary for future reference.

#### Clothing:

In front of the guide card "Clothing" will be filed the retained copy of all requisitions. Upon the return from the Property and Disbursing Officer of a requisition showing the disposition made by him, the retained copy in the file may be destroyed and replaced by the one returned from the Property and Disbursing Officer. Requisitions should be numbered serially by calendar year; that is, the first requisition of each calendar year should be numbered No. 1.

All requisitions should be retained for a period of at least one year after which they may be destroyed or become a part of the personal file of the organization commander.

#### Horses:

In front of the guide card "Horses" will be filed the descriptive cards of public animals pertaining to the organization. Organizations not furnished with public animals will use this section for the filing of the current "Field Training Memorandums" issued yearly preparatory to each Field Training Period, by the Adjutant General of Iowa. Organizations furnished with public animals will file the Field Training Memorandums referred to above in an improvised folder, which can be made from a property loan record card, immediately in rear of the company council book. As soon as the first Encampment Letter of a new calendar year is issued all encampment letters of the preceding year will be filed in

the first year section of the five year file, until the 1st of January of the subsequent year, when they will pass into the second year section.

Correspondence Book and Document File:

The current Correspondence Book and Document File will be filed immediately in rear of the guide card "Horses." The documents of the "Document File" will be filed in an improvised folder, which can be made from a property loan record card and on which should be marked "Document File." The Correspondence Book and Document File will be kept as prescribed in AR 345-620—Military Records—Correspondence Book and Document File. The closed correspondence books and their corresponding document files will be filed in the "Permanent File" and when the "Permanent File" becomes too crowded these records may, at the discretion of the organization commander, be destroyed or filed in one of the two (2) steel cases provided by the State of Iowa. Great care will be taken not to destroy documents relating to the history of the organization or individuals, or matters of future value which should be kept indefinitely in the "Permanent File."

Company Council Book:

The Company Council Book (for use in the event of a call or draft

into Federal Service) will be filed behind the 'Document File."

The remaining space of the tray may be used for the purpose of keeping blank forms suitable in size to be filed therein; such as Morning Reports, Daily Sick Reports, Duty Roster, Ration Returns and so forth.

#### Note:

File five blotters  $4x8\frac{1}{2}$  in rear of the date cards transferred from the current month to rear of the month card and in front of the month card of coming month, where they will serve as a division between the two months. File the blotter in use with the current form No. 11 WDMB in front of the "Reminder." Fasten a 12x19 blotter to the Capboard with thumb tacks.

b. The following records will be kept in the sections designated below

of Field Desk "B":

#### (1) Lid Section:

(a) Upper Left Section:

This section will contain items of stationery which may be deemed necessary to be carried therein, in addition to the supply of stationery carried in the upper left Section of Field Desk "A".

(b) Lower Left Section:

In this section will be carried a supply of blank forms and stationery suitable in size to be carried therein.

(c) Upper Right Section:

Any training pamphlets or documents, suitable in size to be filed therein and for which no other filing space has been designated.

#### (2) Five Year File Tray:

Five Year File Section:

The division cards for this file consist of the "first year," "second year," "third year," "fourth year," and "fifth year" cards, devised to separate the papers to be retained for five years.

All papers destined for file in the five year file, including "sick reports," "reports of individual classification (all weapons)" and "encampment letters" will be filed in front of the guide card "First year." The

"Target record" card follows the fifth year section.

On January 1st, of each year the first-year card will be moved to the front of the five-year file, being replaced by the second-year card. The year cards will be moved forward, third in place of second, fourth in place of third, fifth in place of fourth; so that on each January 1st, after the fifth year of filing, the year's discard will be found in rear of the fifth year card.

The papers in rear of the fifth year card will be removed and destroyed. In this manner all dead records will be automatically worked from the file and the first year card will be in place to receive the papers to be

filed during the ensuing year.

Target Record:

In the front of the guide card "Target Record" in the five year file tray will be filed the individual records of target practice. When a soldier leaves the organization permanently or at the expiration of his enlistment his retained individual target record will be given him or

destroyed, thereafter.

Immediately in rear of the guide card "Target Record" will be filed in separate folders, which can be made from any suitable material, all orders which have been received by the organization since its organization; i. e., one folder for orders issued by the Adjutant General of Iowa, one folder for those issued by the Regimental Commander and one for Company, Troop, Battery or Detachment Orders. Each of the above folders should be marked as follows:

(a) Folder containing orders issued by the Adjutant General's Office,

State of Iowa.

"SPECIAL ORDERS, ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE. STATE OF IOWA—SERIES 1920-1921-1922-1923-1924-1925-1926-1927-1928-1929."

(b) Folder containing orders issued by the Regimental Commander: "REGIMENTAL SPECIAL ORDERS—SERIES 1920-1921-1922-1923-1924-1925-1926-1927-1928-1929."

(c) Folder containing orders issued by the organization: "COMPANY ORDERS—SERIES 1920-1921-1922-1923-1924-1925-1926-1927-1928-1929."

#### Note:

It should be understood that organizations which were organized in 1921 or 1922 would not include in the marking "Series 1920." Organizations which served, at any time, in a separate battalion would have an additional folder for Battalion Special Orders. Whenever the folders herein mentioned become too voluminous as many years of their contents as may be deemed necessary should be extracted and placed in an improvised folder, which should be plainly marked as to their contents, and filed in one of the two steel cases furnished all Units by the State of Iowa.

When the "Permanent File" becomes too crowded the remaining space of this tray may be used for the purpose of filing documents or records normally destined for the "Permanent File," such documents or records may include the retained copies of Annual Armory Inspection Reports.

(3) Permanent File:

In the Permanent File will be filed:

(a) In front of the guide card "Returns": The closed morning reports (Used during Field Training Periods.) Strength returns (The form for strength return having been replaced by Form No. 100 WDMB). This file will, therefore, contain the strength returns submitted until December 31, 1925, and the strength returns, which will hereafter be submitted at the beginning and at the closing of each Field Training Period.

(b) In the Alphabetical Section: The original enlistment records of all enlisted men separated from the Service, as well as Extracts from Service Records, if prepared. In this connection it should be understood that the preparation of extracts of service records in the National Guard

is entirely optional.

Note: 1—When an enlisted man has been discharged more than once all extracts from service records pertaining to him will be fastened together with a paper fastener and only the last copy of his enlistment record filed therewith, all others may be destroyed.

Note: 2—If no papers would be withdrawn from the alphabetical section, this file would in view of the heavy turnover in the enlisted personnel of the National Guard, occupy the greatest part of the permanent file. To prevent the alphabetical section from occupying more space than is actually necessary, at the end of each calendar year the enlistment records of all enlisted men separated from the service three years

should be withdrawn and placed in an improvised folder, i. e., on December 31, 1929, the enlistment records of the enlisted men discharged during the calendar year 1926 should be withdrawn and placed in an improvised folder marked as follows: "Enlistment records of enlisted men separated from the service during the calendar year 1926."

The folders containing these enlistment records will then be filed in one of the two steel cases furnished by the State of Iowa, in which all other records relating to the history of the organization, including old

payrolls may also be properly stored.

(c) In front of the guide card "Payrolls":

The payrolls followed by forms No. 100 WDMB (Report of National Guard duties performed) submitted for the period covered by each payroll; viz.: Behind the payroll for the quarter ending November 30, 1929, the Forms No. 100, for the months of September, October and November, 1929.

In rear of the guide card "Payrolls" will be filed the copies of the annual "Armory Inspection Reports" and if the permanent file is too crowded, then in the "Five Year File Tray."

2. The Loose-leaf binders containing the Army Regulations and Training Regulations as well as the binders containing the General Orders and Bulletins issued by the War Department and the Adjutant General's Office, State of Iowa, will be kept in one of the two steel cases furnished by the State of Iowa.

3. All personnel responsible for the preparation and filing of Military records, will carefully study the instructions herein contained. All Company Clerks will be furnished with a copy of these Orders for personal study. Additional copies of these Orders will be furnished by this office upon request.

## b. ATTENDANCE AND HOUR

(1) Unless otherwise agreed upon between the Inspecting Officer and the Unit Commander the hour for the inspection of personnel will be at 8:00 P. M. Unit Commanders will make a special effort to secure full attendance.

(2) Property and records may be inspected during daylight, at an hour agreed upon between the Inspector and the Unit Commander. All records of Units will be completed to date of inspection and arranged in Field Desks as prescribed in Section I, GO No. 8, AGO Iowa, Series 1929. Weapons issued to personnel will be thoroughly cleaned for the inspection. All weapons not issued will remain in cosmoline as prescribed for arms in storage.

# c. EQUIPMENT (Uniform, Arms and Accessories)

- (1) The commissioned and enlisted personnel of all Units will stand inspection dismounted, armed and equipped for garrison service, as follows:
  - (a) Cap, garrison
  - (b) Shirt, OD flannel
  - (c) Coat, OD wool
  - (d) Shoes, russet leather

(e) Breeches, OD wool (f) Leggins, as issued(g) Belt, web

(h) Pouch and 1st Aid Packet

(i) Side arms as issued (Magazine pocket and 2 extra magazines will be worn with the Pistol)

(j) Saber, for officers

(k) The Weapon (complete) with which each branch is armed

(1) Bugles (Buglers only)

(m) Whistles (for those authorized).

(2) A Squad from each unit of Infantry and Medical Detachment, if so directed by the Inspector, will make up a pack containing:

(a) Meat can

- (b) Knife
- (c) Fork
- (d) Spoon
- (e) Blanket, one (OD wool)

(f) Raincoat

(g) 1 Shelter Tent, half w. 5 pins and 1 pole.

d. Unit Commanders will familiarize themselves, thoroughly, with the blank inspection report provided them by Inspectors and will carefully fill out prior to the inspection, all data required.

2. Inspectors will be extended all possible assistance. An officer, preferably the Commanding Officer, will arrange to be with the Inspector from the time of his arrival until completion of the inspection. III. APPOINTMENT AND PROMOTION OF COMMISSIONED OF-

FICERS OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD.

1. The following Regulations, governing the submission of recommendations for the purpose of filling vacancies, by appointment or promotion, which may exist, from time to time, in the commissioned personnel of the Iowa National Guard, will become effective at once:

## a. BY WHOM AND HOW RECOMMENDED:

(1) Whenever a vacancy occurs in the commissioned personnel of any organization of the Iowa National Guard, the Commanding Officer thereof will take the necessary steps with a view of filling the vacancy as soon as practicable, by submitting recom-

mendations as outlined in Par. (2) below:

(2) Recommendations for the filling of vacancies in the commissioned personnel of the Iowa National Guard, by either appointment or promotion, will be submitted in letter form by the Organization Commander in which the vacancy exists and will be submitted to the Adjutant General, through the prescribed chain of Military Channels.

(3) Letters of recommendation will be accompanied by the follow-

ing documents:

(a) In the case of original appointment and when the person recommended is not in the Military Service, the letter of recommendation will be accompanied by two letters of recommendation as to morals, character and habits, from reliable citizens of the community in which the candidate resides, who are not connected with the Military Service. These letters should preferably be submitted on letterhead paper: viz.: paper that will readily indicate the position of the writer and should be addressed to "The President, Examining Board for Iowa National Guard Officers." The letter of recommendation of the Organization Commander will embody the following information:

All names in full General education Place and date of birth Prior service, if any Occupation Military qualifications.

(b) In the case of an original appointment and when the person recommended is an enlisted man of the Iowa National Guard, the letter of recommendation will be accompanied by two letters of recommendation cited in Par. (a) above and in addition thereto by a "Special" Efficiency Report which will be furnished by the Adjutant General upon request.

(c) In the case of promotion the letter of recommendation will, in all cases, be accompanied by a Special Efficiency Report

on WDMB Form No. 67.

# b. RECOMMENDATIONS, WHEN SUBMITTED:

Letters of recommendation for the filling of vacancies will be submitted on or before the 15th day of the last month, in each quarter; viz.:

December 15th March 15th June 15th September 15th

Inasmuch as examining boards for Iowa National Guard Officers will convene the first week in each quarter, letters of recommendation, which are not submitted so as to reach the Adjutant General's Office by the dates specified above, will necessarily be held in abeyance for another quarter, unless an emergency exists, which warrants immediate action.

# c. RECEIPT OF RECOMMENDATION-HOW ACKNOWLEDGED:

Acknowledgment of receipt of recommendations, which are approved by the Adjutant General, will be in the form of a memorandum addressed to the person recommended and will inform the indidividual concerned as to the office for which he has been recommended; the approximate date on which he will be ordered to appear before the Board to determine his qualifications for the grade and branch for which he has been recommended, as well as the scope of the examination. Recommendations which are disapproved, either because the candidate does not conform to the prescribed State standard for the Iowa National Guard Commissioned Personnel, or for the reason that the person does not fall within one of the eligible classes prescribed in Par. 25 NGR No. 20-1927, as amended, will be returned by the Adjutant General to the Commanding Officer who submitted the recommendation, through the prescribed chain of Military Channels, with a statement as to reason for disapproval.

#### d. EXAMINING BOARDS:

Examining Boards, for the examination of the Commissioned Personnel of the Iowa National Guard, for all branches of the service, will ordinarily convene the first week in each quarter of the calendar year, at such place as may be designated by the Adjutant General.

# e. SPECIAL EFFICIENCY REPORTS:

The Special Efficiency Reports required to be submitted in the case of appointment or promotion for officers and enlisted men, will be prepared on the prescribed blank form for annual Efficiency Report (WDMB Form No. 67) and will be marked at the top thereof "Special." The Special Efficiency Report must accompany the letter of recommendation and will be indorsed as required in the case of Annual Efficiency Reports, by all Commanding Officers in the tactical chain of command. Special Efficiency Reports, submitted in the case of appointment or promotion for officers and enlisted men, will ordinarily cover a period of one year from the date of preparation of same, unless the officer or enlisted men reported upon have been in the service less than one year.

In the preparation of Special Efficiency Reports submitted for officers and enlisted men who are recommended for appointment or promotion, Organization Commanders, initiating Special Efficiency Reports, will bear in mind that it is contemplated that the officer or enlisted man reported upon will be rated in his present grade rather than the grade for which recommended, either for appointment or promotion. In this connection it may be well to state that an examining board could not ordinarily pass an enlisted man who appears before it for appointment as 2nd Lieutenant, whose efficiency report rates him throughout as "Average" for his present grade, hence, enlisted men who do not rate above average in their present grade should not be considered suitable commissioned material.

#### f. ELIGIBILITY:

Commanding Officers responsible for the submission of recommendations to fill vacancies in the commissioned personnel of the Iowa National Guard, either by appointment or promotion, will familiarize themselves with the provisions of Section II NGR No. 20-1927, as amended, and will make certain that individuals recommended fall within one of the classes prescribed in Par. 25 NGR No. 20-1927, as amended. Also that individuals recommended conform to the limitations as to age as prescribed in Par. 23 NGR No. 20-1927, as amended.

# g. WAIVERS:

Unless it is manifestly to the best interest of the service no application for waiver of age, physical defect or examination in technical subjects of branch for which recommended, will receive favorable consideration. Whenever desired to recommend an individual to fill a vacancy in the commissioned personnel of the Iowa National Guard and it is found that he is over the age limit prescribed for the grade for which recommended or that he has a physical defect of a degree that can be waived or it is desired that the technical subjects in the branch for which recommended be waived for a period of one year, application for waivers for such conditions as outlined above, should, in every case accompany the letter of recommendation and must be approved by superior officers in the tactical chain of command.

It will be the policy to consider unfavorably applications for any type of waiver that is not to the best interest of the service, hence, in order that application for waivers may be given due consideration, such application should outline, in detail, the provisions under which the waiver is recommended and the reason which warrants favorable consideration. Application for waiver

of age for grade, if desired, will, in all cases, set forth the date of birth of the person for whom the waiver is desired.

2. Due to the fact that it has been demonstrated, during past years, as a result of examinations conducted by various Boards that Commanding Officers have recommended candidates and enlisted men who did not possess the required qualifications for original appointment in the National Guard, commanding officers will be held strictly responsible for the recommendation of candidates and enlisted men to fill existing vacancies in the commissioned personnel of the Iowa National Guard. Hereafter before submitting recommendations. Commanding Officers will ascertain that candidates or enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard are reasonably qualified educationally and professionally, and if necessary such information will be obtained by conducting a test in the prescribed subjects for the grade and branch for which the individual is being recommended.

In connection with the above the particular attention of all Organization Commanders is directed to the provisions of Par. 54 NGR No. 20-1927, as amended, which refers to qualifications, tests and

general fitness of officers and enlisted men and candidates for appointment or promotion in the National Guard. By Order of The GOVERNOR:
