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LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

August 29, 1932.

SUBJECT: Biennial Report.

To: HIS EXCELLENCY, DAN W. TURNER, Governor and Commanderin-Chief, State House, Des Moines, Iowa.

1. In accordance with the provisions of paragraph 446, Chapter 28, Code of 1931, the following biennial report relative to the activities of the Adjutant General's Department during the period July 1, 1930, to June 30, 1932, is herewith submitted. Attention is invited to the fact that instead of having a voluminous report printed and bound I am this year submitting this report in letter form, with the financial report attached hereto. This will effect a savings in printing, binding and postage of approximately a thousand dollars. I am convinced this report will serve all of the purposes of a printed and bound report. This office has on file and ready for immediate reference all information heretofore published in the biennial reports.

a. Personnei.

At the present time the Iowa National Guard is composed of the highest type personnel. The training and instruction offered by the Guard are attracting the finest type of men in the state. There have been fewer changes in the officer personnel than ever before.

b. Camp Dodge.

A number of improvements have been made at Camp Dodge in the past two years, including a new camp hospital built at federal expense and a new Brigade Headquarters Building built at state expense. Camp Dodge is at present in the best condition it has ever been.

c. Armories.

There are no state-owned armories in Iowa, and it is urgently recommended that as soon as economic conditions permit that the State of Iowa inaugurate an armory building program, especially in the larger cities in which National Guard units are located. At the present time the state is spending \$125,000 per year for armory rent. A number of states have state-owned armories which have proven more desirable than the rental system. Outstanding in this respect is the State of Minnesota which has over sixty (60) state-owned armories.

d. Armory Drill.

The attendance at armory drill during the past two years has constantly increased. Splendid attendance records have been made by a majority of the units of the Iowa National Guard. Each officer and enlisted man attending weekly drill is paid by the federal government, the payment being made each quarter. This factor stimulates attendance at drill, thereby bringing up the efficiency of the unit.

e. Inspections.

Inspections of all National Guard units are made each year by officers of the Regular Army. These inspections are made for the purpose of determining the condition of troops as to equipment, housing and readiness for active duty. The federal inspections are also held by Regular Army officers during the Field Training Period, and they have indicated in their reports that the Iowa National Guard is ready for active duty.

f. MORALE.

The National Guard is an educational institution in that it teaches civic pride, respect for law and order, discipline, etc. The officers and enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard are enthusiastic and energetic. The efficiency of the Iowa National Guard was vividly illustrated during the fall of 1931 when they were called into state service for the enforcement of the Tuberculin Test Law. In spite of the fact that during this state service many tense situations were encountered, the discipline and training of the troops was such that every situation was handled tactfully and satisfactorily.

- 2. The efficiency of the Iowa National Guard is due to the untiring and unselfish efforts of the officers and enlisted personnel, and I desire at this time to express to the officers and enlisted men the sincere appreciation of this department for their hearty cooperation and support.
- 3. To you, Governor, I desire to extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard for your sympathetic understanding of the problems that confront us and for your hearty cooperation and support in things pertaining to this office. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.
