LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

July 1, 1934.

SUBJECT: Biennial Report.

To: HIS EXCELLENCY, CLYDE L. HERRING, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

I. In accordance with the provisions of Section 42 of the Military Code of the State of Iowa, there is submitted herewith the biennial report relative to the activities of the Adjutant General's Department during the period July 1, 1932, to June 30, 1934.

a. PERSONNEL.

At the present time, the Iowa National Guard is composed of many of the finest men in the State. Young men are being attracted to the Guard each day, and in practically every instance, only the highest type in the community are accepted. The officers in command are professionally qualified, many of whom have attended one of the service schools of the Regular Army.

b. CAMP DODGE.

The Iowa National Guard is most fortunate in having one of the very finest training camps in the entire United States, located approximately twelve miles from the State Capitol, and in addition to the camp proper, there are six hundred acres of government land available for terrain exercises during the summer training period. During the past year the Federal Government has constructed at Camp Dodge two new mess halls and three new bath houses and latrines, at a cost of approximately \$20,000. In addition to this construction, through the Civilian Conservation Corps and the Civil Works Administration, approximately \$25,000 worth of work was completed on the rifle range. This work consisted of straightening the channel of the Des Moines River, construction of several wing dams and the building of a dike to prevent the overflow of the river onto the rifle range proper. This was a most important project in view of the fact that the Des Moines River was cutting through the northern boundary of the rifle range, and during the time of high water flowed completely over the eastern end of the range. The State of Iowa has also obtained from the

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Federal Government the use of sixty (60) acres of federal land north and immediately adjacent to the parade ground. This additional land materially increases the area of the parade ground. The State of Iowa has, at the present time, on file with the National Guard Bureau projects amounting to \$100,000 which have been approved and will be accepted when and if federal funds become available.

c. Armories.

There are no state-owned armories in Iowa, and it is urgently recommended that as soon as economic conditions permit, the State of Iowa inaugurate an armory building program, especially in the larger cities in which National Guard units are located. Many states have state-owned armories which have proved more desirable than the rental system. Outstanding in this respect is the State of Minnesota, which has over sixty (60) state-owned armories.

d. ARMORY DRILL.

The attendance at armory drill during the past two years has constantly increased. Splendid attendance records have been made by a majority of the units of the Iowa National Guard. Each officer and enlisted man attending weekly drill is paid by the Federal Government, the payment being made each quarter. This factor stimulates attendance at drill, thereby bringing up the efficiency of the unit.

e. Inspections.

Inspections of all National Guard units are made each year by officers of the Regular Army. These inspections are made for the purpose of determining the condition of troops as to equipment, housing and readiness for active duty. The federal inspections are also held by Regular Army Officers during the Field Training Period, and they have indicated in their reports that the Iowa National Guard is ready for active duty.

f. MORALE.

(1) The National Guard is an educational institution in that it teaches civic pride, respect for law and order, discipline, etc.

REPORT ADJUTANT GENERAL OF IOWA

The officers and enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard are enthusiastic and energetic. The efficiency of the Iowa National Guard was vividly illustrated during the spring of 1933, when they were called into state service during the Farm Holiday strike. In spite of the fact that during this state service many tense situations were encountered, the discipline and training of the troops was such that every situation was handled tactfully and satisfactorily. A detailed report of this strike is given in the report proper.

(2) The efficiency of the Iowa National Guard is due to the untiring and unselfish efforts of the officers and enlisted personnel, and I desire at this time to express to the officers and enlisted men the sincere appreciation of this department for their hearty cooperation and support.

II. To you, Governor, I desire to extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard for your sympathetic understanding of the problems that confront us and for your hearty cooperation and support in things pertaining to this office. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.

TRAINING OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

The Training Mission of the Iowa National Guard Units is to maintain that stage of combat training which will enable each Unit to be prepared at all times for use by the State or Federal Government for the suppression of domestic disturbances or insurrections, and by the Federal Government, in case of national emergency, for active field service.

The Training Year extends from the close of the Field Training period of one year to the close of the Field Training period of the next year. The Training Year is divided into, a. Armory Training Period, and b. Field Training Period.

Armory Training Period

Armory Training is, in general, that training which can be conducted satisfactorily in the Armories of the Units at their home stations. This consists of training in discipline, use and care of arms, material and equipment, leadership, responsibility of Commanders, protective measures against chemical warfare, and target practice.

The Armory Training is accomplished by following programs and schedules prepared beforehand by higher commanders. Training inspections are made from time to time by higher commanders to observe the progress being made and to determine whether or not the prescribed programs and schedules are being followed.

FIELD TRAINING PERIOD

Field Training consists of the application to practical exercises in the Field of such theoretical and practical knowledge as has been gained during the Armory Training Period. The Field Training for the Iowa National Guard Units is held for a 15-day period, each year, generally in the month of August, at Camp Dodge, Iowa, with the exception of the Artillery Regiment. Due to the fact that no Artillery Range is available in the State of Iowa, the 185th Field Artillery Regiment conducts its Field Training Period for 15 days at Camp Ripley, Little Falls, Minnesota. All expenses incident to the Field Training Period are paid by the Federal Government. This includes transportation, rations, pay, etc.

The Field Training Period is divided into the Morning Period,

which is devoted purely to Military Training; the Afternoon Period, during which the time is devoted to schools for Officers, and noncommissioned Officers, physical training, athletics, field meets, etc.; the Evening Period from 4:30 p. m., during which ceremonies are held and amusements provided.

NATIONAL GUARD IN ACTIVE SERVICE OF THE STATE OF IOWA

Prior to April 28, 1933, a number of disturbances had occurred in Plymouth County, Iowa. These disturbances occurred principally at mortgage foreclosure sales at which times members of the Farm Holiday Association and sympathizers attempted to stop such sales. On the afternoon of April 27th, a large group of Farm Holiday sympathizers and members entered the Plymouth County Court House, removed District Judge Bradley from the bench, took him some distance into the country and subjected him to indignities and injuries.

Early on the morning of April 28th, in response to the urgent requests of city and county law enforcing agencies, Governor Clyde L. Herring directed the Adjutant General to mobilize such organizations, individuals and detachments of the Iowa National Guard, as were necessary to reestablish law and order, and place them on duty in Plymouth County. Plymouth County, and adjacent territory, under proclamation of the Governor and Commander-in-Chief, was placed under martial law.

The following detachments and organizations were directed to mobilize and proceed to Le Mars, the county seat of Plymouth County:

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Colonel Glenn C. Haynes, Commanding 168th Infantry, was designated as Military Commander.

During the same period, many disturbances had occurred in Crawford County. These disturbances, generally, were of the same nature as those in Plymouth County and the law-abiding

and respecting citizens were intimidated by members of the Farm Holiday Association. The District Court, sitting in Denison, the county seat of Crawford County, had directed a certain foreclosure sale and issued orders that the sheriff of Crawford County conduct the sale. Having anticipated trouble, a large number of special deputies had been sworn in and several agents of the State Department of Justice dispatched to the farm. Shortly after the sale had opened, a large crowd, acting upon some signal, charged the sale ring and attacked the deputies and State Agents. Previous to the opening of the sale, both deputies and state agents had been warned not to resort to the use of firearms, but had been armed with axe handles and clubs of various descriptions. The attackers being vastly superior in number, easily overcame the deputies and state agents and administered severe beatings to a number of them.

In answer to the call from the sheriff of Crawford County, Governor Clyde L. Herring directed the Adjutant General to mobilize additional troops and place them on duty in Crawford County.

The following detachments and organizations were mobilized at their home stations and directed to proceed to Denison:

Crawford County and adjacent territory was placed under martial law.

A military district composed of Plymouth and Crawford Counties and territory adjacent thereto was created and Major General Mathew A. Tinley, Commanding the 34th Division, National Guard,
was designated as the Military Commander of the District.

A Military Commission composed of the following officers of the Iowa National Guard, all of whom were lawyers, was appointed to administer the proclamation of the Commander and to gather evidence against all offenders:

Many persons known to have been militantly affiliated with the Farm Holiday Association were arrested by the troops and interrogated by members of the Military Commission. Those against whom no specific charges could be presented were released, while county attorney informations were prepared against those known to have participated in the disturbances in either county.

On May 9th, a Provisional Battalion composed of officers and enlisted men on duty in Plymouth County and consisting of fourteen officers and one hundred and thirty-four enlisted men, was formed and the balance of the troops relieved from further duty and returned to their home stations.

On May 10th, all troops on duty in Crawford County, except detachment Headquarters 34th Division, Co. "L" 168th Infantry and miscellaneous Service personnel, were relieved from further duty in Crawford County and returned to their home stations.

In the meantime, the Military Commission continued their investigation and the preparation of formal charges.

On May 17th, the rule of martial law was lifted and District Court was opened. The proclamation abrogating martial law was read in the District Courtroom.

On the same day the balance of the troops remaining in Crawford County were returned to their home stations. On May 18th, the troops remaining on duty in Plymouth County were returned to their home stations.

The maximum number of troops on duty during the period was forty-six officers and four hundred fifty-eight enlisted men.

All persons against whom county attorney informations had been filed were tried in District Court and found guilty of offenses alleged to have been committed.

Mobilization in each instance was accomplished with efficiency and expedition, and the officers and troops ordered to duty were ready to move to the scenes of the disturbances within a very short space of time. Transportation in each case was by bus or truck.

The personnel placed on this duty conducted themselves with a great deal of credit. The discipline at all times was excellent and the morale high. Although this type of service is unpleasant, the officers and enlisted men acquitted themselves with distinction and accomplished their mission without bloodshed or serious injury to any of those whom they sought and arrested.

This mobilization indicated that the troops of the Iowa National Guard, were and are, ready to answer the call of their Commanderin-Chief, on a moment's notice and to accomplish whatever mission may be assigned them, with a minimum of confusion and a maximum of efficiency.

The following proclamations were issued by Governor Clyde L. Herring:

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, there now exists in Plymouth County of this state and territory adjacent thereto, breaches of peace and imminent danger of a continuance thereof and open defiance of law enforcement by certain individuals and large groups and a vicious and criminal conspiracy and assault has been made upon a judge of the district court of Plymouth County, Iowa, while in the discharge of his official duties, endangering his life and threatening a complete breakdown of all law and order and

WHEREAS, the department of justice, civil authorities, local peace officers and citizens are unable to enforce the laws and have requested military aid to reestablish peace, restore law and order, protect public and private property and to protect civil officers in the administration of the laws of this state and

WHEREAS, the territory involved requires the presence of the military forces of this state in order to maintain the public peace and to prevent breaches of the peace and to reestablish law and order,

THEREFORE, I, CLYDE L. HERRING, Governor of the State of Iowa, by virtue of the authority and powers conferred on me as governor by the laws of the sovereign State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim martial law for the territory of Plymouth County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto, and I do hereby order and direct the Adjutant General, Brigadier General Charles H. Grahl, to place such troops on duty in Plymouth County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto, distributing them in such localities as will render them most effective for preserving the public peace and enforcing law and order. He will take such action and use such force as he may deem necessary. He will protect any and all property, officers, citizens and men from unlawful interference and will arrest all persons engaging in acts of violence, intimidation and interference with the enforcement of the laws. He will prevent the assembling and loitering of persons when in his judgment the same is necessary. The public peace and good order will be preserved upon all occasions and throughout the county and no interference will be permitted with officers and men in the discharge of the duties under this order. The rule of Martial Law shall be invoked and extended to all parts of the territory of Plymouth County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto insofar as the same is necessary for the execution of this proclamation. The Adjutant General is further directed and ordered to assist all peace officers in the apprehension and arrest of all persons violating the law in Plymouth County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto. The dignity and authority of the state will be maintained and her power to suppress all lawlessness within her borders must and will be asserted.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereto set my hand and caused to be affixed the Great Seal of the State of Iowa. Done at Des Moines, Iowa, this twenty-eighth day of April, A. D. 1933.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, there now exists in Crawford County of this State, and territory adjacent thereto, breaches of peace and imminent danger of a continuance thereof and open defiance of law enforcement by certain individuals and large groups and a vicious and criminal conspiracy and assault has been made upon officers of the Department of Justice of the State of Iowa, peace officers of Crawford County, and adjoining counties and special deputies appointed by the proper officials of Crawford County, Iowa, while said officers were legally attempting to execute the decrees and orders of the District Court of Crawford County, Iowa, and that said assault was made upon said officers by a large group of persons armed with clubs in resistance to the execution of the processes of said court, thus endangering the lives of said officers and threatening a complete breakdown of all law and order ; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Justice, Civil Authorities, local peace officers, and citizens are unable to enforce the laws and have requested Military Aid to reestablish peace, restore law and order, protect public and private property and to protect civil officers in the administration of the laws of this State; and

WHEREAS, the territory involved requires the presence of the Military forces of this State in order to maintain the public peace and to prevent breaches of the peace and to reestablish law and order;

THEREFORE, I, CLYDE L. HERRING, Governor of the State of Iowa, by virtue of the authority and powers conferred on me as Governor by the laws of the Sovereign State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim Martial Law for the territory of Crawford County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto, and I do hereby order and direct the Adjutant General, Brigadier General Charles H. Grahl, to

place such troops on duty in Crawford County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto, distributing them in such localities as will render them most effective for preserving the public peace and enforcing law and order. He will take such action and use such force as he may deem necessary. He will protect any and all property, officers, citizens, and men from unlawful interference and will arrest all persons engaging in acts of violence, intimidation and interference with the enforcement of the laws. He will prevent the assembling and loitering of persons, when, in his judgment, the same is necessary. The public peace and good order will be preserved upon all occasions and throughout the county, and no interference will be permitted with officers and men in the discharge of the duties under this Order. The rule of Martial Law shall be invoked and extended to all parts of the territory of Crawford County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto, insofar as the same is necessary for the execution of this Proclamation. The Adjutant General is further directed and ordered to assist all Peace Officers in the apprehension and arrest of all persons violating the law in Crawford County, Iowa, and territory adjacent thereto.

The dignity and authority of the State will be maintained and her power to suppress all lawlessness within her borders must and will be asserted.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Plymouth County and Crawford County of the State of Iowa have been declared and ordered by me, under and subject to Martial Law; and

WHEREAS, the National Guard of the State of Iowa has been ordered to, and has assumed charge and control of said counties; and

WHEREAS, a state of lawlessness, violence, insurrection, breaches of the peace and imminent danger thereof still exists and continues in said counties now under Martial Law, and

WHEREAS, there have been infractions and violations of the laws of the State of Iowa, and of the rules and regulations prescribed for said counties, now under Martial Law, NOW

THEREFORE, I, CLYDE L. HERRING, Governor of the State of Iowa, by virtue of my office, and of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Iowa, do hereby order, authorize, and empower the Commanding General of said Military District as hereinbefore defined, including Plymouth County and Crawford County, and all of their sub-divisions, now under and subject to Martial Law to create and appoint a Military Commission to take cognizance and jurisdiction of offenses against the public peace, and of violations of military rules and regulations, now in force, and as may hereafter be promulgated, for the preservation of law and order and the public safety in said counties; and also to take cognizance and jurisdiction of such violations of the Civil Law and the ordinances in force in said counties as the Commanding Officer in his discretion may prescribe, as necessary for the public safety and the restoration of law and order in said counties; and such Commission shall have full power and authority to issue all necessary process for the conduct of its proceedings, with like powers to compel the attendance of witnesses therein, as are exercised by the Civil Courts of the State of Iowa.

The following Proclamation was issued by the Military Commander of the District:

PROCLAMATION

HEADQUARTERS MILITARY DISTRICT OF CRAWFORD AND PLYMOUTH COUNTIES, IOWA

Denison, Iowa, May 1, 1933.

A state of Martial Law having been declared by the Governor of the State of Iowa, and a Military District for Plymouth and Crawford Counties, Iowa, and all of their subdivisions, having been created by the Governor of the State of Iowa, and the undersigned having been placed in command of said Military District. with instructions from the Governor of the State of Iowa to protect any and all property, officers, citizens and men from unlawful interference, and to arrest all persons engaging in acts of violence, intimidation and interference with the enforcement of the laws, and having been directed to create and appoint a Military Commission to take cognizance and jurisdiction of offenses against the public peace and the violations of Military rules and regulations now in force and as may hereafter be promulgated for the preservation of law and order and the public safety in said Counties, the Commanding General of said Military forces hereby proclaims the following rules and regulations which will be in force until further orders:

1. All persons are hereby prohibited from carrying firearms of any kind or character or ammunition therefor, except by express authority of the Commanding General or the officer in direct command in either Crawford or Plymouth County.

2. All persons are directed to desist from giving aid or otherwise supporting the lawlessness hitherto existing in the above named district, and all persons shall return to peaceful occupations, holding no communication of any kind with the lawless person or persons.

3. All rights of property of whatever kind will be held inviolate, and will not be disturbed, except as exigencies of the public welfare may necessitate, by direct command of the Commanding General of the District.

4. All shops and places, except as otherwise specifically directed, will be kept open, as usual in times of peace, and all persons are enjoined to continue their customary peaceful occupations.

5. Excepting as herein provided, or where the existence of Martial Law implies the contrary, the usual laws of the community will be in force; crimes will be subject to military authority. Civil cases will await the ordinary tribunals which are hereby abated during the continuance of Martial Law. Causes in violation of military proclamations will be tried by Military Court.

6. All assemblages in the streets, roads, avenues, alleys or public places of this district either by day or night are prohibited, except by express authority of the Commanding General.

7. All persons found in the streets who appear to be habitually idle and without visible means of support will be placed under arrest.

8. In cases of fire alarm being sounded in the district at any time, the fire department will function as usual, and no assemblage of citizens will be permitted.

9. While it is the desire of the authorities to exercise the powers of Martial Law mildly, it must not be supposed that they will not be vigorously and firmly enforced as the occasion arises.

MILITARY CODE

For many years the Iowa National Guard was administered under a Military Code which was obsolete due to the many changes in federal laws and regulations. Pursuant to Paragraph 2, Special Orders No. 20, dated April 1, 1930, a Code Commission was appointed, consisting of the following named officers:

This Commission met several times and drafted a proposed new Military Code. The new Code, however, was not presented to the 44th or the 45th General Assemblies. During the Four-day Officers' School at Camp Dodge, June 5 to 8, 1933, the following named officers were detailed to make additional study of the proposed new Military Code and incorporate therein those provisions which were found necessary from the experience of the National Guard on state duty during the Cow War of 1931 and the Farmers' Holiday during 1933:

The above listed Code Commission met upon several occasions thereafter. On November 16, 1933, the Advisory Board and the Code Commission listed above met with the Senate and House Military Committees of the 45th General Assembly, Special Session, and outlined the new proposed Military Code.

The House and Senate Military Committees then appointed subcommittees to meet with the Code Commission at various times and work out certain changes and amendments to the proposed Military Code. Much credit is due the Code Commission and the Senate and House Military Committees for the conscientious and thorough work in preparing the Military Code for submission to the Legislature. Senator Claude Stanley, Chairman of the Senate Military Committee and Representative Ben B. Doran, Chairman of the House Military Committee, gave every assistance, and made many valuable suggestions to the Code Commission and the Adju-

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tant General's Office in the preparation of the Code. The Senate passed numerous amendments to the Military Code as submitted, and the bill was passed on February 13, 1934, passed the House on March 1, 1934, without further amendments, and was signed by the Governor on March 6, 1934, and published in accordance with the publication clause, and became a law on March 16, 1934.

It is believed Iowa now has one of the outstanding Military Codes of all the states of the Union.

MILITARY CODE OF IOWA

Section 1. MILITARY FORCES. The military forces of this state shall consist of those persons subject to military duty in the militia as defined in the Constitution of the state, and those persons subject to duty in the National Guard as defined in the National Defense Act of the United States, except that honorably discharged soldiers, sailors, and marines of the United States shall be exempt from military service in this state at their election.

Sec. 2. GENERAL DEFINITIONS. When used in this Act the following words, terms and phrases shall have the following meanings:

The word "militia" shall mean the forces provided for in the Constitution of Iowa.

The term "National Guard" shall mean that part of the military force of the state that is organized, equipped and federally recognized under the provisions of the National Defense Act of the United States as the "National Guard of the United States and the State of Iowa." It shall also include the term "National Guard of the State of Iowa."

The word "company" as used in this act shall be understood and construed to include a company of infantry, engineers, signal corps, a flight of the air service, a battery of field artillery, a troop of cavalry, or any similar organization in any branch of the military service authorized by federal law for this state, including a permanent detachment.

The word "battalion" applies in like manner to "squadron" of cavalry, and of the air service.

The term "active service" shall be understood and construed to be service on behalf of the state, in case of public disaster, riot, tumult, breach of the peace, resistance of process, or whenever the same is threatened, whenever called upon in aid of civil authorities, or under martial law, or at encampments whether ordered by state or federal authority, or upon any other duty requiring the entire time of the organization or person, except when called or drafted into the Federal service by the President of the United States.

The term "on duty" shall include periods of drill and such other training and service as may be required under state or federal law, regulations, or orders.

The terms "in service of the United States" and "not in service of the United States," used herein, shall be understood to mean and be the same as such terms are used in the National Defense Act of Congress, approved June third, nineteen hundred sixteen (June 3, 1916), and amendments thereto. Sec. 3. MILITARY ORGANIZATIONS PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for any body of men, other than the National Guard and the troops of the United States, to associate themselves together as a military organization within the limits of this state without the written permission of the Governor, which he may at any time revoke, but this provision shall not prevent civic, social, or benevolent organizations from wearing uniforms and swords not in conflict with the other provisions of this chapter.

Sec. 4. UNIFORM-BY WHOM WORN-WHEN-PENALTY. Every person who at any time wears a uniform of the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or the National Guard, or any part of such uniform, or a uniform or a part of a uniform similar thereto, within the bounds of the state, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and if found guilty of such offense, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars and not more than one hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; provided that nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting officers or enlisted men of the National Guard of the State of Iowa, or any other state, or of the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or revenue service, or forest service, or cadets of any university, college or school, from wearing such uniform or parts of uniform, while on military duty or duty connected therewith; and provided further that nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting members of any veterans' association from wearing their uniforms; and provided further that nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting persons of the theatrical profession from wearing such uniforms in any playhouse or theatre while actually engaged in following their profession, and provided further that nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting the uniformed ranks of civic societies from parading or traveling in a body or being in encampments, or going to or from their places of meeting or assembling in a lodge room in their adopted uniforms.

Sec. 5. NOT TO BE DISCRIMINATED AGAINST. No person shall discriminate against any officer or enlisted man of the National Guard because of his membership therein. No person shall prohibit or refuse entrance to any officer or enlisted man of the army or navy of the United States, or of the military forces of this state, into any public entertainment or place of amusement because such officer or enlisted man is wearing a uniform of the organization to which he belongs. No employer, officer or agent of any corporation, company, firm or other person, shall discharge any person from employment because of being an officer, warrant officer or enlisted man of the military forces of the state, or hinder or prevent him from performing any military service he may be called upon to perform by proper authority, in respect to his employment, trade or business. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed one hundred dollars. or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not to exceed thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 6. ORGANIZATION — ARMAMENT — EQUIPMENT — DISCI-PLINE. The organization, armament, equipment and discipline of the national guard, and the militia when called into active service, except as hereinafter specifically provided, shall be the same as that which is now or may be hereafter prescribed under the provisions of federal law and regulations as to those requirements which are mandatory therein, but as to those things which are optional therein they shall become effective when an order or regulation to that effect shall have been promulgated by the governor.

Sec. 7. COMPOSITION OF NATIONAL GUARD. The national guard shall consist of such organizations as may be specified by the Secretary of War, with the approval of the governor, in accordance with federal law and regulations.

Sec. 8. REGULATIONS GOVERNING. The national guard shall be subject to the provisions of federal law and regulations relating to the government, discipline and uniforming thereof, and to the provisions of the military code of Iowa, and to regulations published pursuant thereto.

Sec. 9. INCORPORATION OF COMPANIES. Companies may incorporate under the chapter of the Code of Iowa authorizing corporations not for pecuniary profit. The articles of incorporation may provide for the methods of administration of civil business, and may provide for such officers as may be deemed necessary. The articles of incorporation shall be approved by the regimental commander and the adjutant general, and such approval indorsed thereon, before the same are recorded. They must provide, among other things, that the name of the corporation shall be identical with the military designation of the organization, and that the officers of the company shall be officers of the corporation.

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Sec. 10. RULES AND BY-LAWS—CAPACITY TO SUE. Each company may make rules and by-laws for its own government, not in conflict with existing laws, regulations and orders, subject to the approval of the regimental commander. Any person who is, by such rules and bylaws, made the custodian of any funds, whether originally derived from federal, state or other sources, shall have legal capacity to sue for the collection thereof or an accounting therefor.

Sec. 11. QUALIFICATIONS OF OFFICERS. Officers of the national guard, except the adjutant general, the assistant adjutant general, the United States property and disbursement officer, and/or the state quartermaster, shall be selected from the classes of persons having the qualifications prescribed by federal law and regulations. They shall be appointed by the governor upon the recommendation of their superiors in the chain of command. They shall be commissioned when they shall have successfully passed such tests as to physical, moral and professional fitness as shall be prescribed by federal law and regulations. Each officer when commissioned shall take the oath of office prescribed by congress, and shall hold office until he shall have attained the age of sixty-four years, unless his commission is sooner vacated by resignation. death or as hereinafter provided. In case the officer has no immediate superiors, within the state, in the chain of command, he shall be appointed, as above provided, upon the recommendation of the adjutant general. The commission shall designate the arm or branch of service in which the officer is commissioned.

Sec. 12. COMMISSIONS MAY BE VACATED. The moral character. capacity and general fitness for the service of any national guard officer may be determined at any time by an efficiency board as provided by federal law and regulations. Commissions of officers of the national guard may be vacated upon resignation, absence without leave for three months, upon the recommendation of an efficiency board, or pursuant to sentence of a court martial. Any officer permanently removing from the state shall resign his commission upon the request of the adjutant general or make application to be placed upon the inactive list, and upon failure so to do, his commission shall be revoked by the governor. Officers rendered surplus by the disbandment of their organization shall be disposed of as provided by federal law and regulations. Officers may, upon their own application, be placed on the inactive list, as may be authorized by federal law and regulations.

Sec. 13. UNASSIGNED LIST. There shall be maintained in the office of the adjutant general a list to be known as the unassigned list, to which officers may be transferred, pending their resignation or removal from the service. Any officer may be transferred by the adjutant general to such unassigned list upon the recommendation of his commanding officer, either immediate or remote. Before such transfer is made the adjutant general shall notify the officer, either in person or by registered letter mailed to his last known address, of the intended transfer. The officer shall have ten days from the date of mailing of said notice in which to apply to the adjutant general for an efficiency board. Should the officer fail to apply for an efficiency board, the transfer shall be made upon the expiration of the ten-day period. If the officer requests an efficiency board, the adjutant general will be governed by the findings of such board. All officers transferred to such unassigned list shall remain subject to military discipline and to courts martial for military offenses to the same extent and in like manner as if upon the active list.

Sec. 14. INACTIVE NATIONAL GUARD. An inactive national guard may be organized and maintained as may be prescribed or authorized by federal law and regulations.

Sec. 15. RETIREMENT OF COMMISSIONED OFFICERS. Any commissioned officer of the national guard who has, or shall have served as such officer for a period of not less than ten years in the national guard, or who has, or shall have served, for a period of not less than ninety days, in the army or navy of the United States during any war, and who is honorably discharged therefrom, and who has, or shall have served as such officer in the national guard for a period of not less than five years, who resigns or is retired, or who is now or may hereafter become disabled and retired, may, upon his request in writing to the adjutant general, stating his grounds therefor, be placed, by order of the commander-in-chief, on a roll in the office of the adjutant general to be known as the "roll of retired officers." Any officer registered on the roll of retired officers as above provided is entitled to wear the uniform of the rank last held by him on state or other occasions of ceremony, when the wearing of such uniform is not in conflict with federal law. The adjutant general shall have the power, on good cause shown, to retire any officer, as herein provided in the next higher grade held by said officer during his military service.

Sec. 16. OFFICERS — POWERS AND DUTIES — ADMINISTRATION OF OATHS. In addition to the powers and duties prescribed in this chapter, all commissioned officers of the national guard shall have the same powers and perform the same duties as commissioned officers of similar rank and position in the army of the United States insofar as may be authorized by federal law. They are authorized to administer oaths in all matters connected with the service.

Sec. 17. BONDS OF OFFICERS. Each officer to whom there shall be issued, or who shall be accountable for arms, equipment, uniforms, and any other State or United States property for military uses, or who shall have the control, custody, or disbursement of funds as provided for in this chapter, shall, before the delivery to him of such arms, equipment, uniform, and other State or United States property, and the receipt of such funds, execute and deliver to the adjutant general a bond therefor, with sureties to be approved by the governor, and payable to the state, in such amount as may be fixed by the governor, conditioned for the proper care, use, and return in good order, wear, use, and unavoidable loss and damage excepted, of all such State and United States property, and the proper care and faithful disbursement and accounting of all funds coming into the hands of such officer. Upon the violation of any of the conditions of such bond, action thereon shall be brought by the adjutant general on behalf of the state, and any recovery thereon shall be credited to the guard funds of the state. It shall be the duty

of the attorney general of the state to prosecute all actions upon such bonds.

Sec. 18. ACCOUNTING TO ADJUTANT GENERAL. No further payments shall be made under any provision of this chapter to the accountable officer of any organization or unit who does not fully and satisfactorily account to the adjutant general for all moneys theretofore paid to him under any provision of this chapter.

Sec. 19. FALSE CERTIFICATE OR RETURN. Any officer or soldier of the national guard who knowingly makes any false certificates of muster or false return of federal or state property or funds in his possession shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 20. MISUSE OF FUNDS OR PROPERTY. Any officer or soldier of the national guard who wilfully neglects or refuses to apply all money, in his possession drawn from the state treasury, to the purpose for which such money was appropriated or who fails or refuses to account for or return any state or federal property or funds in his possession shall be guilty of the crime of embezzlement by bailee and punished accordingly.

Sec. 21. COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES, DEATH AND INJURY. Officers and enlisted men while in active service of the state shall receive the same pay and allowances as paid for the same rank or grade for service in the Army of the United States.

In the event any officer or enlisted man shall be killed while on duty or in active service, in line of duty, or shall die as a result of injuries received while on duty or in active service, in line of duty, his dependents, as defined by the Workmen's Compensation law of the state, shall receive the maximum compensation as provided by the said law.

Officers and/or enlisted men who suffer injuries or contract disease, in line of duty, while on duty or in active service, shall receive hospitalization and medical treatment, and the pay and allowances of their grade during the period that they are unable to resume their civilian occupation, but no commissioned officer shall be paid after the termination of said service or duty more than the pay and allowances of a second lieutenant.

All payments herein provided for shall be paid on the approval of the adjutant general by warrant drawn against any state funds not otherwise appropriated.

In the event of compensation for said service, death or injuries, being paid in part by the federal government, the state shall pay only the balance necessary to make the above designated amounts.

Sec. 22. ENLISTMENTS. All enlistments in the national guard shall be as prescribed by federal law and regulations.

Sec. 23. STATE STAFF CORPS AND DETACHMENT. The number and grade of officers and enlisted men in the state staff corps and detachment shall be as prescribed by federal law and regulations, but in case of war, invasion, insurrection, riot or imminent danger thereof, the governor may temporarily increase such force to meet such emergency. All officers of state staff corps and detachment appointed shall have had previous military experience and shall hold their positions until they shall have reached the age of sixty-four years, unless retired prior to that time by reason of resignation, disability, or for cause to be determined by an efficiency board or a court martial, as the exigencies of the case may warrant, legally convened for that purpose, and vacancies among said officers shall be filled by appointment from the officers of the national guard.

Sec. 24. EXEMPTIONS. Every officer and soldier of the national guard shall be exempt from jury duty and the payment of poll tax and/or

labor on the road on account of poll tax during his term of service. No member of the national guard shall be arrested, or served with any summons, order, warrant, or other civil process after having been ordered to any duty, or while going to, attending, or returning from, any place to which he is required to go for military duty. Nothing herein shall prevent his arrest by order of a military officer or for felony or breach of the peace committed while not in the actual performance of his duty. The articles of equipment personally owned by such members shall be exempt from seizure or sale for debt. Every member of the national guard who has faithfully served the full term of his commission or enlistment, shall, upon application, be entitled to an honorable discharge, exempting him from military duty except in time of war or public danger.

Sec. 25. STATE AND MUNICIPAL OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES NOT TO LOSE PAY WHILE ON DUTY. All officers and employees of the state, or a subdivision thereof, or a municipality therein, who are members of the national guard, shall, when ordered by proper authority to active service, be entitled to a leave of absence from such civil employment for the period of such active service, without loss of status or efficiency rating, and without loss of pay during the first thirty days of such leave of absence.

Sec. 26. GOVERNOR TO BE COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF. The governor shall be the commander-in-chief of the military forces, except so much thereof as may be in actual service of the United States, and may employ the same for the defense or relief of the state, the enforcement of its laws, and the protection of life and property therein.

Sec. 27. STAFF OF THE GOVERNOR—HOW SELECTED. The staff of the governor shall consist of the adjutant general, who shall be the chief of staff; the assistant adjutant general, who shall be assistant chief of staff, and twelve aides. The aides shall be detailed at the pleasure of the governor, from the active, reserve, or retired commissioned personnel of the national guard, officers' reserve corps, or the regular army on duty in the state, with the rank then held by them or last held by them.

Sec. 28. THE GOVERNOR MAY ORDER OUT TROOPS. The governor shall have the power, in case of insurrection, invasion, or breaches of peace, or imminent danger thereof, to order into the service of the state such of its military forces as he may think proper, under the command of such officer as he may designate.

Sec. 29. AID TO CIVIL AUTHORITIES. When the law enforcing officers of any subdivision or subdivisions of the state are unable to maintain law and order, the governor shall have the power, on the request of the civil authorities of such subdivision or subdivisions, in case of breaches of peace or imminent danger thereof, to order into active service of the state such of its military forces as he may deem proper, under the command of such officer as he may designate, for the purpose of aiding the civil authorities in maintaining law and order in such subdivision or subdivisions.

Sec. 30. ASSAULT ON TROOPS. Whenever the national guard is called into service under proclamation of the governor for the performance of any duties contemplated in this act, any person who willfully assaults, or fires at, or throws any dangerous missile at, against, or upon any member or body of the national guard so engaged, or civil officer or other persons lawfully aiding or assisting them in the discharge of their duties, shall be deemed guilty of a felony and upon conviction shall be imprisoned in the state penitentiary not more than two years.

Sec. 31. COMPENSATION AND EXPENSES OF THE NATIONAL GUARD. When in active service of the state, pursuant to the order of the

governor, the compensation and expenses of the national guard and claims of the members thereof for injury or illness incurred in line of duty, shall be paid out of any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Sec. 32. COURTS OF INQUIRY. Courts of inquiry, to consist of one or more officers, may, and on the request of the officer involved shall, be instituted by the governor for the purpose of investigating the conduct of any officer, or any accusation or imputation against him, or any acts made the subject of military complaint. Such court of inquiry shall, without delay, report a statement of facts and, when required, the evidence adduced and an opinion with recommendations thereon to the governor, who may, in his discretion, thereupon order a court-martial for the trial of the officer whose conduct has been inquired into.

Sec. 33. JURISDICTION OUTSIDE OF OCCUPIED TERRITORY. Troops occupying a military district established under martial law, may, if necessary, pursue, arrest and subpoena persons wanted in said military district, anywhere within the State of Iowa.

Sec. 34. SERVICE OF PROCESS. All peace officers of the state shall serve process and execute the orders of a military court in the same way and to the same extent as corresponding instruments of civil courts.

Sec. 35. OFFENDERS MAY BE COMMITTED TO JAIL. In default of payment of any fine, forfeiture, or costs imposed by any military court after approval of sentence by the reviewing authority, the offender shall be committed to any county jail designated by said courts for a period equal to one day for each dollar of fine imposed and unpaid.

Sec. 36. PRISONERS TO BE KEPT IN COUNTY JAIL. The keepers and wardens of all county jails or state institutions are required to receive and confine all military offenders or other persons when delivered to them, under the proper certificate of commitment of a military court or commanding officer, for and during the term of sentence or confinement as set forth in said commitment.

Sec. 37. NOT LIABLE FOR ACTS PERFORMED UNDER ORDERS. The commanding officer and members of any of the military forces engaged in the suppression of an insurrection, the dispersion of a mob, or the enforcement of the laws, shall have the same immunity as peace officers.

Sec. 38. ATTORNEY GENERAL OR JUDGE ADVOCATE TO DE-FEND. If a suit or proceeding shall be commenced in any court by any person against any officer of the military forces for any act done by such officer in his official capacity in the discharge of any duty under this chapter, or against any soldier acting under the authority or order of any such officer, or by virtue of any warrant issued by him pursuant to law, it shall be the duty of the attorney general or judge advocate to defend such person. The costs of such defense shall be paid out of any funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated. Before any suit or proceeding shall be filed or maintained against any officer or soldier as herein provided, the plaintiff shall be required to give security, to be approved by the court in a sum not less than one hundred dollars to secure the costs. If the plaintiff fails to recover judgment such costs shall be taxed and judgment rendered therefor against him and his sureties.

Sec. 39. NO ACTION SHALL BE MAINTAINED. No action or proceeding shall be maintained against any officer by whom a military court is ordered, or against any member of a military court or commission, officer or agent acting under its authority, or reviewing its proceedings, on account of the imposition of a fine or penalty or for the execution of a sentence of any person, unless it be shown that such officer, member or agent has acted from motives of malice.

Sec. 40. ADJUTANT GENERAL. There shall be an adjutant general of the state who shall be appointed and commissioned by the governor, upon the recommendation of a majority of the general officers and regimental commanders of the national guard, upon the expiration of the term of the present adjutant general, and shall have the rank of brigadier general who shall hold office for a term of four years. At the time of his appointment he shall be a commissioned officer of the national guard with not less than ten years' military service in the armed forces of this state or of the United States, at least five of which have been commissioned service, and who shall have reached the grade of a field officer. He shall be removed only upon conviction of a violation of the Articles of War, by a court martial appointed pursuant to such Articles.

Sec. 41. ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL. There shall be an assistant adjutant general of the state who shall be appointed by the governor, upon the recommendation of the adjutant general. He shall have such rank as is consistent with federal law and regulations and at the time of his appointment shall be a commissioned officer of the national guard with not less than five years military service in the armed forces of this state or of the United States, at least three of which shall have been commissioned service and he shall have reached the grade of captain. He shall hold office as provided for the adjutant general.

Sec. 42. DUTIES OF ADJUTANT GENERAL AND ASSISTANT ADJUTANT GENERAL. The adjutant general shall have control of the military department of the state, and perform such duties as pertain to the office of the adjutant general under federal law and regulations. He shall superintend the preparation of all letters and reports required by the United States from the state, and perform all the duties prescribed by law. He shall have charge of the state military reservations, and all other property of the state kept or used for military purposes. It shall be the duty of the adjutant general to cause an inventory to be taken at least once each year of all military stores, property and funds under his jurisdiction. He shall in each year preceding a regular session of the general assembly make out a detailed report of the transactions of his office, the expenses thereof, and such other matters as shall be required by the governor for the period since the last preceding report, and the governor may at any time require a similar report.

The adjutant general shall make and preserve by counties a permanent registry of the graves of all persons who shall have served in the military or naval forces of the United States in time of war, and whose mortal remains may rest in Iowa.

The adjutant general is authorized to enter into an agreement with the secretary of war to operate the water plant at Camp Dodge for the use and benefit of the United States, its successors and assigns, upon such terms and conditions as shall be approved by the governor, provided that such operation shall be at a profit to the state.

The assistant adjutant general shall serve in the office of the adjutant general and aid him by performing such duties as the adjutant general may assign him. In the absence or disability of the adjutant general he shall perform the duties of that office as acting the adjutant general.

Sec. 43. APPROPRIATION FOR INVENTORY. For the purpose of making the inventory provided for in the foregoing section there is hereby appropriated the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary for the biennium ending June 30, 1935.

Sec. 44. MILITARY RESERVATIONS—IMPROVEMENTS. The adjutant general, with the approval of the governor, is authorized to expend from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the national guard, and the permanent Camp Dodge improvement fund, such amounts as may be necessary in the purchase of additional land, erection of buildings and other improvements on the state military reservations and rifle ranges purchased by the state for the use of the national guard or purchased by the United States for the use of the National Guard, when, in his judgment, such buildings and improvements will be for the benefit of the national guard.

SEC. 45. SWIMMING POOL AT CAMP DODGE. The adjutant general shall have authority to lease or operate the swimming pool at Camp Dodge. The net proceeds therefrom shall be deposited with the treasurer of state as a permanent Camp Dodge improvement fund.

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Sec. 46. GOVERNOR TO APPOINT DISBURSING OFFICER. The governor, pursuant to federal authority, shall appoint, designate, or detail, upon recommendation of the adjutant general, an officer of the national guard who shall be property and disbursing officer of the United States for the State of Iowa. He shall receipt and account for all funds and property belonging to the United States in possession of the national guard of this state, and shall make such returns and reports concerning the same as may be required by the secretary of war. He shall render, through the War Department, such accounts of federal funds intrusted to him for disbursement as may be required by the treasury department. Before entering upon the performance of his duties as property and disbursing officer he shall be required to give good and sufficient bond to the United States, the amount thereof to be determined by the secretary of war, for the faithful performance of his duties and for the safekeeping and proper disposition of the federal property and funds intrusted to his care. The said property and disbursing officer may also be the quartermaster of the state.

Sec. 47. STATE QUARTERMASTER. There shall be detailed from the quartermaster corps of the state, an officer who shall be the quartermaster and property officer of the state, and as such, shall have charge of and be accountable for, under the adjutant general, all the state military property, and who may be the United States property and disbursing officer. He shall keep such property returns and reports on the same and shall give such bond to the State of Iowa as the governor may direct.

Sec. 48. ARMORY BOARD. The governor shall appoint an armory board which shall consist of the adjutant general, and four other officers from the active, inactive, or retired commissioned personnel of the national guard. The board shall meet at such times and places as are ordered by the governor. The four officers so appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the governor. The board shall, for each unit of the national guard, fix the rent allowance to be paid by the state for other than state-owned armories, and shall acquire, contract, erect, purchase, sell, maintain, repair and alter state-owned armories subject to the laws made and provided therefor. Said board may lease property to be used for armory purposes, said lease to extend for any period but not to exceed fifteen years.

The board shall fix the amount to be paid to commanding officers of each division, brigade, regiment, battalion, company or other unit of the national guard for headquarters' expenses and shall provide by regulation how the same shall be disbursed by such commanding officers. The actions of the armory board shall be subject to the approval of the governor. The allowances made by the armory board shall, when approved by the governor, be paid from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the national guard.

Sec. 49. TAX EXEMPTIONS OF ARMORIES—USE OF PUBLIC UTILITIES. All personal and real property held and used for armory or military purposes shall be exempt from taxation; and it shall be lawful for any county or city or town which owns public utilities to grant to any organization or unit of the national guard, which is stationed in such place, the free use of such public utilities.

Sec. 50. RIFLE RANGES. The sum of three hundred dollars annually or so much thereof as is necessary is hereby allowed to each company or other unit of the national guard for the procurement, construction, and maintenance of a rifle or pistol range. The payment herein provided shall be made from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the national guard.

Sec. 51. DRILL ALLOWANCE FOR ORGANIZATIONS. Each company or similar unit of the national guard showing attendance and actual drill for those present for such drills as are prescribed in compliance with the national defense act or subsequent amendment thereto, or substitute therefor, and such regulations as may be prescribed from time to time by the secretary of war, pursuant thereto, shall be allowed semi-annually for miscellaneous military purposes, the sum of four dollars per capita, based on the average enlisted strength during such semi-annual period, but when the average attendance during any semiannual period falls below fifty per cent of the average enlisted strength in that period, then and in that event such unit shall forfeit all right or claim to any such allowance. The semi-annual periods herein referred to shall begin January first and July first. This allowance shall be paid from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the national guard, and the adjutant general shall prescribe regulations governing its expenditure.

Sec. 52. TRAINING. The governor may order the national guard into camp for field training each year for such period as he may direct. He may, in his discretion, order such organizations or personnel of the national guard, as he may deem proper, to assemble for purposes of drill, instruction, parade, ceremonies, guard and escort duty, and schools of instruction, and prescribe all regulations and requirements therefor.

The governor shall also provide for the participation of the national guard, or any portion thereof, in field training at such times and places as may be designated by the secretary of war, pursuant to any act of congress.

Sec. 53. INSPECTIONS. The governor may order such inspections of the different organizations, units and personnel of the national guard as he may deem proper and necessary.

The forms and mode of inspection shall be prescribed by the adjutant general.

Sec. 54. SERVICE AND MERIT BADGES. The adjutant general, from the funds appropriated for the support and maintenance of the national guard, shall procure and issue to the members of the national guard, entitled thereto, merit and/or service badges for such service and periods of service, under such regulations and according to the design and pattern thereof, as may be determined by the adjutant general. Members of the national guard who, by order of the President, have served or shall serve in federal forces during a national emergency, shall be entitled to count the period of such federal service toward the procurement of a service badge. Sec. 55. TRESPASS. Any person who shall trespass upon any military reservation, camp or armory, in violation of the orders of the commander thereof, or officer charged with the responsibility therefor, or shall molest, or interfere with any member of the national guard, in the discharge of his duty, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. The commanding officer of such force may order the arrest of such person and cause him to be delivered to a peace officer or magistrate.

Sec. 56. DISTRIBUTION AND RECOVERY OF GOVERNMENT PROPERTY. The commanding officer of a company receiving clothing or equipment for the use of his command shall distribute same to the members of his command, taking receipts and requesting the return of each article at such time and place as he shall direct.

Upon the direction of any company commander it shall be the duty of the county attorney of the county where such military organization is located, to bring action in the name of the State of Iowa against any person for the recovery of any property issued by said company commander or his predecessor, or for the value thereof as set forth in the price list promulgated by the federal government.

All sums so collected shall be paid to such company commander and used for the replacement of military property charged to the organization.

Sec. 57. SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT. All arms, clothing, equipment, and other military property furnished or issued by the federal government or the state or for which an allowance has been made, shall be used for military purposes only, and each officer and soldier upon being separated from the military service of the state, or upon demand of his commanding officer, shall forthwith surrender such military property in his possession to said commanding officer. Any member of the national guard who shall neglect to return to the armory of the unit, or place in charge of the commanding officer of the organization to which he belongs, any arms, clothing, equipment, or other military property or portion thereof, belonging to the federal government or the state, upon being notified by said commanding officer so to do, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 58. DESTRUCTION OR INJURY OF MILITARY PROPERTY. Every person who shall willfully or wantonly injure or destroy any articles of arms, clothing, equipment, or other military property furnished or issued by the federal government or the state, and refuses to make good such injury or loss; or who shall sell, dispose of, secrete or remove the same with intent to sell or dispose of it, shall be punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, or be imprisoned in the county jail for not more than four months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 59. CALL BY PRESIDENT-TERM OF SERVICE, Whenever the United States is invaded or in danger of invasion from any foreign nation, or of rebellion against the authority of the government of the United States, or the President is unable, with the regular forces at his command, to execute the laws of the Union, it shall be lawful for the President to call forth such number of the national guard as he may deem necessary to assist in repelling such invasion, suppressing such rebellion, or to assist in enabling him to execute such laws, and to issue his orders for that purpose, through the governor, to such officers of the national guard as he may think proper; and the President may specify, in his call, the period for which such service is required, and the guard so calld forth shall continue to serve during the term so specified, either within or without the territory of the United States, unless sooner relieved by order of the President; provided that no commissioned officer or enlisted man of the guard shall be held to serve beyond the term of his existing commission or enlistment.

Whenever the President shall require, in any of the designated instances, more troops than can be supplied by the national guard, the governor shall, in his discretion, organize forthwith such other national guard forces as he may deem necessary, or order into the service of the United States so many of the unorganized militia of the state as is required, designating the same by draft if a sufficient number do not volunteer, and shall commission officers therefor.

Officers and enlisted men called into federal service through the guard' shall upon completion of such service continue to serve the balance of their enlistment period the same as though it had not been interrupted by such service.

Sec. 60. ARTICLES OF WAR SHALL GOVERN. Whenever any portion of the national guard shall be in "active service" as defined by Section 2 of this chapter, the articles of war governing the armies of the United States as now or hereafter in effect, shall be in force and regarded as a part of this chapter, so far as said forces are concerned, until said forces shall be relieved from said duty; except that confinement in the penitentiary shall be in the penitentiary of this state, and provided that offenses committed while in active service may be tried and punished by a court-martial lawfully appointed, after this active duty has terminated, and if found guilty the accused shall be punished according to the articles of war and the rules and regulations governing the United States armies, but within the limits prescribed by federal law for courts martial in the national guard; and provided, also, that in any case when the offense charged is also made an offense by the civil law of this state, the officer whose duty it is to approve the charge may, in his discretion, order the person charged to be turned over to the civil authorities for trial.

Sec. 61. FINES—DISPOSITION. The proceeds of all fines in summary, general and special court-martial cases shall be paid to the adjutant general and paid into the maintenance fund of the national guard, and all costs of prosecution shall be paid out of the same fund.

Sec. 62. UNITED STATES ARMY REGULATIONS. All matters relating to the organization, discipline and government of the military forces not otherwise provided for in this chapter shall be decided by the custom, regulations, and usage of the United States army.

Sec. 63. CONSTITUTIONALITY. Should the courts of this state or of the United States declare any of the provisions of this chapter unconstitutional, illegal or void, such decision shall not invalidate any other provision herein contained.

2. Medical Examiners will conduct the Physical Examinations in strict conformity with the requirements and standards provided in NGR No. 28-1924 (STANDARDS OF PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS FOR EN-TRANCE INTO THE NATIONAL GUARD) as may be amended from time to time. They will be held strictly accountable that no applicant for enlistment is accepted who does not possess the required physical and mental qualifications outlined in NGR No. 28. If it is subsequently determined that an enlisted man of the National Guard is suffering from some disqualifying physical or mental defect which existed prior to enlistment, the medical examiner who passed the applicant as physically and mentally fit, will be relieved. Great care will be exercised that only those who possess the physical and mental requirements for the rigors of military service are accepted.

3. Each medical examiner will be authorized a fee of not to exceed 75c for each physical examination conducted.

Bills for payment of physical examinations will be submitted in triplicate, properly certified by the unit commander. These bills will be forwarded to reach the Adjutant General within 10 days after the close of each calendar quarter. (March 31st, June 30th, September 30th and December 31st).

Unit commanders will be responsible for the submission of bills within the prescribed time limits and will be directed to settle such accounts from their unit funds or their per capita allowance in the event they fail to comply with the provisions of this General Order.

II. JURISDICTION, DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF COM-MANDERS-1. Zone commanders command all personnel and establishments of the Iowa National Guard within the territorial limits of their zones, except those that may hereinafter be exempted.

2. Succession to Command:

a. In the event of the death, disability or temporary absence of the zone commander or his executive officer, the next senior line

officer residing within the zone, wherever he may be stationed, will, except as otherwise ordered or required, exercise the functions of such zone commander or person in command or in charge until relieved by proper authority.

- b. When different zone or commanders of the military forces of the State of lowa happen to join, be reinforced or do duty together, the officer highest in rank of the line of the National Guard shall command the whole and give orders for what is needful in the service, unless otherwise directed by proper authority.
- 3. Duties and Responsibilities of Zone Commanders.
 - a. Zone commanders are responsible, under the direction of the Adjutant General, State of lows, for the preparation of the defense plans of their zones and for such execution in connection therein, in times of emergency, as may be assigned them. In particular domestic disturbances, disaster, caused by flood, fire, cyclone, etc., with a view to enforcing the law, preserving life and property and assisting in relief work.
 - b. Each zone commander will organize a staff from among the officers stationed within his zone, consisting of: An executive officer, an S-1, S-2, S-3, S-4, and such special staff officers and limited enlisted personnel as may be necessary. The staff will be prepared to function, as such, both individually and collectively, upon short notice.
 - c. Zone commanders will be responsible that all officers and noncommissioned officers are familiar with the powers and limitations of the National Guard when on active service under martial law.
 - d. Zone commanders have the important function of coordinating their plans with the various county authorities, peace and relief agencies where, in case of sudden emergency, there shall be no lost effort or overlapping of duties.
 - e. Each zone commander will prepare in typewritten form, a general plan for the mobilization, administration and tactical employment of his troops when ordered out as A UNIT for an emergency. The names and addresses of his Staff will be included. A copy will be furnished the Adjutant General, the commanding officer of each neighboring zone, each field officer within the zone and each zone staff officer.
 - f. Zone commanders and their staffs will keep informed as to local disturbances and with a view as to how best their troops might be employed and supplied in case they should be called on active service.

III. ORDERS FOR ZONE MOBILIZATION-1. Orders for Zone Mobilization will be issued by telephone from this office directly to the zone commander. To save time and expense, unit commanders will likewise be notified to mobilize and report at a designated assembly point or as otherwise desired by the zone commander.

2. If it is deemed necessary, Staff Officers will be authorized by the Adjutant General to travel by personally owned automobiles to more quickly join the zone commander at a designated locality in order to save time in the preparation of the necessary orders for the employment of the troops to follow.

I. INDOOR GALLERY TARGET PRACTICE SEASON. 1. Effective at once, the Indoor Gallery Target Practice Season is announced and will remain in force until rescinded or amended by this office:

> Regular Season.....January 1st to April 30th Supplementary Season......May 1st to June 30th

2. Targets for the regular season will be forwarded to reach the State Ordnance Officer not later than May 10th of each year. Targets received after that date will not be considered.

Targets for the supplementary season will be forwarded to reach the State Ordnance Officer not later than July 10th. No targets received after that date will be given consideration.

3. All available personnel of organizations will be required to fire during the regular season. Recruits and personnel who on account of illness, work, or business cannot complete their firing during the regular season will be permitted to fire during the supplementary season. Those firing during the supplementary season will be kept to the minimum.

Personnel enlisting subsequent to June 30th will not fall within the sixty days service requirements for attendance at camp and will not be authorized or permitted to fire for record.

II. ISSUE OF STATE MARKSMANSHIP INSIGNIA SUSPENDED. 1. The award and issue of marksmanship insignia heretofore made by the State of Iowa for qualification in Indoor Target Practice is, effective at once and until further notice, suspended.

The award of appropriate qualification insignia authorized by Par. 43 AR 600-35, and Section III, TR 150-10, will be continued and may be obtained upon proper requisition.

NATIONAL GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES.....

I. NATIONAL GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES. 1. War Department General Orders No. 3, dated April 4, 1934, announces the establishment of the National Guard of the United States. The National Guard of the United States is a reserve component of the Army of the United States and is constituted as consisting of those National Guard units now or hereafter federally recognized, and the officers, warrant officers, and enlisted men, federally recognized, in accordance with law, who are members of the authorized active or inactive National Guard of the several states, territories, and the District of Columbia, and who may be appointed, enlisted and appointed, or enlisted, as the case may be, in the National Guard of the United States, in accordance with the provisions of the National Defense Act, as amended.

2. COMMISSIONED OFFICERS—OATH OF OFFICE. To accept appointment in the National Guard of the United States each officer up to and including the grade of Colonel will be required to execute a new oath of office (MB Form 337). The names of general officers will be submitted to the President for nomination to the Senate, as provided by law. These general officers, upon receipt of notice that they have been confirmed, will be required to execute new oaths of office. Blank oaths of office will be furnished in the near future without requisition and will be accompanied by instructions for their accomplishment.

Present officers of the National Guard Reserve may be appointed in the National Guard of the United States provided there is a war vacancy in each case to which they may be assigned. In the case of these officers, acceptance of the appointment will be indicated by the execution and forwarding of an oath of office (MB Form 337) accompanied by a Report of Physical Examination unless such physical examination has been accomplished within the past twelve months and is now on file in the National Guard Bureau.

3. WARRANT OFFICERS AND ENLISTED MEN WHO NOW HOLD APPOINTMENTS IN THE OFFICERS' RESERVE CORPS. This personnel will be tendered appointments in the National Guard of the United States if there is a war vacancy in each case within the state. In each case, the Oath of Office and Report of Physical Examination will be required to be executed.

4. ENLISTED IN THE NATIONAL GUARD OF THE UNITED STATES. All enlisted men now members of federally recognized National Guard Units will be enlisted in the National Guard of the United States for the unexpired portion of their present enlistment. To accomplish this, a new enlistment form will not be used, it being only necessary that the oath on the original enlistment record on file in the organization be again administered by the officer designated in appropriate orders as Recruiting Officer. After administering the oath, which will be identical with that contained on WDMB Form No. 21, with the deletion of the words, "and I do agree to accept from the United States and the State of such pay, rations, and clothing or other allowances as are or may be established by law," the officers administering the oath will make appropriate notation on the enlistment record under his signature of the date on which this was done. Any blank space on the enlistment record may be utilized for this purpose. Or if additional space is necessary it may be provided by pasting additional paper to the form under the Certificate of Inspection and Enlistment.

Hereafter enlistments in the National Guard and in the National Guard of the United States will be simultaneous, and one enlistment record will cover both. As at the present time, the original enlistment record will be retained in the organization and the duplicate forwarded to this office.

5. DISCHARGE OF ENLISTED MEN. Hereafter, when an enlisted man of a federally recognized unit is discharged, he will at the same time be discharged from the National Guard of the United States, and a notation to that effect will be entered upon his certificate of discharge

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from the National Guard. This notation will be entered upon Remarks or if sufficient space thereunder is not available, the remarks will be entered in the blank space in the lower left hand section of the reverse side of the certificate of discharge. The remarks will take the form, "This certificate also covers discharge from the NG of the US."

It will be noted that the enlisted strength allotted to the various units is 14 less than the total enlisted strength allocated to the State of Iowa by the National Guard Bureau. This differential is necessary in order that the maximum allocated enlisted strength may not be exceeded at any time.

ARMY SERVICE SCHOOLS

Each year the War Department authorizes National Guard Officers and enlisted men to attend certain of the Army Service Schools. The schools are conducted at the expense of the federal government and are of inestimable value to the National Guard. Officers and enlisted men are recommended and selected to attend these Service Schools with particular attention being paid to their educational and physical qualifications and their intention of remaining in the military service.

The National Defense Act provides that the Secretary of War shall detail Regular Army Officers and Non-commissioned Officers to duty with the National Guard of each state, to act as Instructors for the National Guard. The State of Iowa has been extremely fortunate in the type of officers and non-commissioned officers detailed as Instructors with the National Guard in this state. These Instructors, without exception, have been chosen for their high professional qualifications and ability to understand the National Guard, and their interest and desire in seeing this component of our National Defense system brought to the highest point of efficiency. The interest and ability displayed by the personnel detailed as Instructors with the Iowa National Guard have done much to promote the efficiency, organization, training and discipline of the National Guard, and I wish, on behalf of this department, to express our sincere appreciation for their accomplishments.

NATIONAL MATCHES

National Rifle and Pistol Matches formery conducted at Camp Perry, Ohio, were discontinued in 1931, on account of lack of Federal appropriations. In order to maintain interest in rifle and pistol shooting and to afford individual and team competitors the opportunity to enter competitions, the National Rifle Association in conjunction with the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Civilian organizations, inaugurated Regional Matches. These matches are held in various parts of the country, at centrally located points. Such a match was conducted at Fort Des Moines, Iowa, in 1932.

This team entered the various team matches and the individuals were entered in many of the individual competitions. The expenses of the team were defrayed from appropriations available to this department.

Prior to the regional matches, the team was assembled at Camp Dodge, and under the tutelage of Team Captain, Lt. Col. Fred S. Hird, prepared themselves for the matches. Neither time nor funds were available for a general tryout. It was therefore necessary that the material be selected from shooters of known ability.

The Iowa National Guard team finished well up in the competitions and some of the individual members were awarded places in individual competitions.

Regional Matches in this area were not held in 1933.

IOWA SOLDIERS' BONUS BOARD

The Iowa Soldiers' Bonus Board is composed of R. J. Laird, Adjutant, Iowa Department American Legion, chairman; Charles H. Grahl, the Adjutant General, secretary; C. W. Storms, Auditor of State, and Leo J. Wegman, Treasurer of State. J. J. Miller is Executive Secretary.

The final date for filing for the Iowa bonus was December 31, 1924. Of the 106,645 claims filed 102,804 were approved and paid, 3,626 were disapproved for cause and 215 were cancelled for various reasons. A total of \$20,179,540.57 was expended in payment of the original bonus at the rate of fifty cents per day for every day of active service with a limit of \$350.

In accordance with the original Bonus Law, the amount remaining from the original appropriation of \$22,000,000 was set aside as a Disability Fund. This fund amounted to \$1,820,459,43 when it became operative and the first payments were made on March 1, 1928. Payments are made only from the income from this fund which amounts to \$80,385 each year. On June 30, 1934, the total cash and bond resources of this fund was \$1,846,609.73.

Payments from this fund are made only in cases of total disability to Iowa veterans who received or were entitled to receive the Iowa bonus. Payments are made only when the County Soldiers' Relief Commission has first made a payment from the County Soldiers' Relief Fund to the veteran. These payments are matched in a like amount from the State Disability Fund. The number of veterans receiving aid is ever increasing and during the month of June, 1934, a total of 442 veterans were given aid from the State Disability Fund.

In the office of the Bonus Board, there is on file service record cards for 114,217 veterans whose services were accredited to the State of Iowa. There is a continual demand for information from these records as well as from the original applications for the bonus.

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GRAVE REGISTRATION DIVISION

W. F. HATHAWAY, Secretary

For the purpose of perpetuating the memory of those who have served in the military and naval forces of the United States, in time of war, and to provide information to patriotic organizations, to assist in the encouragement of the honorable custom of decorating their graves on Memorial Day, as has been originated and so worthily carried on by the Grand Army of the Republic, this Division is charged with the duty of compiling a record of their burial places within the state.

The law providing for this was passed at the request of The American Legion and other patriotic organizations of the State, and is considered by them as very important, in their desire to honor the memory of the service of war veterans. They have pledged their assistance in securing the necessary information from the field to accomplish their purpose. The American Legion has placed a splendid organization in each county in their Posts, and invited other organizations to participate in the work. Recognition is given alike to departed veterans of all wars.

The conventions of veterans and patriotic organizations have requested me to attend and address their meetings in the interest of this work with the view of securing increased activity among their local groups.

During the first year of this work, close attention was given to the conditions of old cemeteries and the proper marking of veterans' graves. The result has been to expand the program to include proper care and marking of every grave, in addition to registration. More than 25,000 names have been received for registry. The amount of information given varies, from where only the name is given, to a very complete account of the service. These number, according to the wars in which they served, approximately as follows: Civil War, 20,500; Spanish-American, 1,850; World War, 2,250; other wars, 500.

The Memorial Commission, charged with the duty of locating and identifying burial places of those who served during the Revolutionary War and are buried in the state, and to erect a monument, have a list of 25, 15 of them definitely identified with service in that war and the others will be traced for their service. This Division is cooperating fully with the Commission, which has rendered good service.

Eleven counties have reported their field work completed and are preparing information for final registration. Nearly fifteen counties have completed all but from one to three townships. Several others have completed half of their county.

Since January 1st there has been an unusual interest in the marking of unmarked graves with government headstones. This office has distributed more than 2,000 application blanks to Legion Posts and others who request them. Old headstones of poor material and disappearing inscriptions are being replaced with new ones. At the end of the fiscal year of 1933, there were 543 government headstones shipped to Iowa, and in 1934 there were 588.

A very serious condition has been found to exist with reference to so many old cemeteries, that have long ago been abandoned and allowed to grow up in weeds and brush. Nearly all these have veterans buried in them as well as prominent people of the early pioneer days of the state. A very successful publicity campaign was carried on, that had for its purpose the arousing of interest by the public to secure proper care. Veterans' organizations will propose legislation to remedy these conditions, at the next session of the General Assembly.

Last winter, when the government established the Civil Works Administration in Iowa, a Grave Registration project was approved and unemployed veterans used to search cemeteries for veterans buried in them. A summary of reports received throughout the state, show that they worked a total of 7,899 hours, and were paid for 5,780 hours, the remainder being voluntary and without expectation of pay. They received a total of \$2,890 from the government and \$275 was paid them by Legion Posts for transportation expense to cemeteries. They reported a list of 13,300 names found in 450 cemeteries they searched. Very few of these names were registered with the state, however, owing to the termination of the CWA, sooner than was expected.

Authorization of a Grave Registration project, under the Federal Emergency Relief Administration, that succeeded the CWA, has been secured and much more work may be done through this agency during next year.

Publicity given the work throughout the state and neighboring states, has attracted a number of inquiries from states that have not yet been engaged in a like program. Some have made preparation of plans to bring it before the legislatures of their respective states. The public in general has expressed appreciation for the work being done.

The question of proper location of flags on veterans' graves, as well as the length of time they should remain there, has been given careful consideration and it is anticipated that a uniform plan that may be used as a common custom by all over the state will be worked out by a meeting of representatives from all patriotic and service organizations during the next year.

Veterans' organizations, their auxiliaries, and other patriotic organizations are showing increased interest in the matter of registering the burial places of departed veterans, as well as in marking and caring for them. Some have adopted a program of their own that will cooperate with this Division. With this splendid cooperation it is anticipated the completion of the work will come sooner than was at first expected.

IOWA AERONAUTICS COMMISSION

The Special Session of the 45th General Assembly enacted a law to create a Commission of Aeronautics; to prescribe the powers and duties thereof; to provide for investigations and hearings by said Commission; to provide for certain law enforcement duties thereof, and for appeal from the orders of said Commission.

This Commission functions through the Office of the Adjutant General and with his advice and assistance administers the Act. The members of the Aeronautical Commission appointed by the Governor and approved by the Senate are as follows:

The Commission has done much to acquaint the people of the state with the Iowa Air Laws, with a view towards eliminating the practice of flying unlicensed ships, and flying by unlicensed pilots.

This Commission was effective June 10, 1934. The work of the Commission to date has been largely in an educational way, although it has been necessary to make a few arrests of violators of the Iowa Air Laws.

Enacted by the Forty-fifth General Assembly, Extra Session: Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

Section 1. Commission created. There is hereby created within the Department of the Adjutant General, a commission of aeronautics which shall consist of three persons, not more than two of whom shall belong to the same political party and who shall be appointed by the Governor, with the approval of two-thirds of the members of the Senate in executive session.

Sec. 2. Tenure. The members of said commission shall hold office for four years, except, that on the first commission, one member shall be appointed for the period ending on the third Monday in January, 1935, one for the period ending on the third Monday in January, 1936, and one for the period ending on the third Monday in January, 1937.

Sec. 3. Vacancies. Vacancies on the commission shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the balance of the unexpired term.

Sec. 4. Compensation—expenses—offices. The members of the aeronautical commission shall serve without compensation. The commission shall be given office space in the offices of the Adjutant General, who shall supply necessary stenographic and clerical help from the personnel of his office as well as necessary records and stationery. The Eexcutive Council of the State of Iowa shall designate rooms within the State House for any hearings herein provided held in Des Moines and Court rooms of the District Court in the County where the hearing is held shall be used for other hearings. The members of the commission shall be reimbursed by the Adjutant General for any actual necessary expenses incurred by them in attending upon hearings. All other expenses in connection with administration of this Act shall be paid from the appropriations to the Department of the Adjutant General.

Sec. 5. Investigations and hearings. The commission or any commissioner, or officer of the commission designated by the commission, shall have the power to hold investigations, inquiries and hearings concerning matters relating to aeronautics, and all accidents in aeronautics within this State. All hearings conducted by the commission shall be open to the public.

Sec. 6. Oaths—subpoenas. Each commissioner, and every officer of the commission designated by it to hold any inquiry, investigation or hearing, shall have the power to administer oaths and affirmations, certify to all official acts, issue subpoenas, compel the attendance and testimony of witnesses, and the production of papers, books, and documents. On request of the commission or any officer or member thereof subpoenas as above authorized shall be issued by any Court of record or by the clerk thereof in vacation.

Sec. 7. Contempt-procedure. In case of failure to comply with any subpoena or order issued under authority of the said commission, or its authorized representative, the commission, commissioner or officer may invoke the aid of any District Court in this state. The court may thereupon order the witness to comply with the requirements of the subpoena, and give such evidence as he may be able touching the matter in question. Any failure to obey the order of said Court may be punished by the Court as a contempt thereof.

Sec. 8. Records and testimony. The reports of investigations, or hearings, or any part thereof, shall not be admitted in evidence or used for any purpose in any suit, action, or proceedings, growing out of any matter referred to in said investigation, hearing, or report thereof, except in case of criminal or other proceedings instituted by or in behalf of the commission under the provisions of the Act, nor shall any commissioner or employee of the said commission be required to testify to any facts ascertained in, or information gained by reason of, his official capacity, and, further no commissioner shall be required to testify as an expert witness in any suit, action or proceeding involving any aircraft.

Sec. 9. Co-operation. It shall be the duty of the commission to properly instruct every State Highway Maintenance Policeman, and every county and municipal officer charged with the enforcement of state and municipal laws, to enforce, and assist in the enforcement of the laws of this state pertaining to aeronautics.

Sec. 10. Injunction. The commission is further authorized to enforce the provisions of the aeronautics laws of the State by injunction in the District Courts of this State.

Sec. 11. Appeal-procedure. Any party aggrieved by any final ruling or decision of said commission may take an appeal therefrom to the District Court of the county of his residence if within this State, or if he resides outside the State then to the District Court of the county where the matters ruled upon by said commission arose. Said appeal to be taken and perfected by serving upon any member of said commission a notice of said appeal stating briefly the ruling or decision appealed from. Said notice shall be served as original notices are served in the District Court and by filing the same in the office of the clerk of the District Court to which said appeal is taken within thirty (30) days from the making of the order or decision appealed from. The appeal shall be docketed for trial not less than ten (10) days after the filing in the clerk's office of said notice of appeal and shall be tried by the District Court, the parties filing such pleadings as they may desire, subject to the prevailing rules of pleading in this State. Upon trial of the appeal the court shall hear evidence as to matters concerning the order in question, as to the condition of the property in question and the manner of its operation, and shall enter judgment either affirming or setting aside the order of the commission, or the court may remand the matter to the commission for further hearing. The filing of the notice of appeal shall operate as a supersedeas. Other departments and political sub-divisions of this State are further authorized to co-operate with the Aeronautics Commission in the development of aeronautics and aeronautic facilities within the State.

Sec. 12. Failure to appeal—waiver. If no appeal is taken from the order of the commission within the period fixed, the party against whom the order was entered, shall be deemed to have waived the right to have the reasonableness or lawfulness of the order reviewed by a Court and there shall be no trial of that issue in any Court in which suit may be instituted for the penalty for failure to comply with the order.

Sec. 13. Administration. The commission shall co-operate in every way with the Department of the Adjutant General and with his advice and assistance shall administer this Act. The commission may make and adopt such rules and regulations for the administration of this Act as it may deem necessary—not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.
