LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

July 1, 1938.

SUBJECT: Biennial Report.

TO: HIS EXCELLENCY, NELSON G. KRASCHEL, Governor and
Commander-in-Chief, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

I. In accordance with the provisions of Section 467-f42, of Chapter 28 of the Code of Iowa, 1935, there is submitted herewith the biennial report of the activities and expenses of the Adjutant General's Department during the period July 1, 1936 to June 30, 1938.

a. PERSONNEL:

During the period covered by this report, the personnel, the training, and the efficiency of the Iowa National Guard have steadily improved. Through the medium of schools, conferences and army extension courses, the officers and men have taken advantage of every opportunity to better qualify themselves.

b. CAMP DODGE:

During the past biennium, a modern, well equipped garage and machine shop have been constructed with funds appropriated for that purpose by the Forty-sixth General Assembly. This was a much needed improvement to take care of the approximately one hundred motor vehicles issued to the National Guard by the Federal Government.

The Forty-seventh General Assembly appropriated funds for the construction of a new well and pump house, a new roof on the reservoir, and the rehabilitation of the old water supply system. These improvements are now in progress and upon their completion Camp Dodge will have an adequate water supply system.

In addition to the above improvements, considerable work

has been accomplished with the aid of the Works Progress Administration in grading and leveling the camp area proper.

It will be essential that the Legislature appropriate sufficient funds for the reroofing of all mess halls, installing new refrigeration in all mess halls, and for rehabilitating the bath houses and latrines.

The mess halls at Camp Dodge were constructed in 1923 and practically all of the roofs are in very bad condition. The ice boxes in the mess halls were used at Camp Dodge during the World War and have been used by the National Guard since that time. Their condition at the present time is so deplorable that the medical inspectors of both the National Guard and Regular Army have condemned them as being absolutely unfit for further use. The plumbing and fixtures in the bath houses and latrines are also left over from the World War and have been in constant use by the Guard since that time. With some three thousand to thirty-five hundred men from over the state of Iowa training at Camp Dodge each summer, it is necessary that careful attention be given to the sanitation and health of the men. A special appropriation should be made for these improvements as the regular appropriation for the National Guard is insufficient to cover these requirements.

c. ARMORIES:

During the past biennium new armories have been constructed at Iowa City and Neola; a new riding hall has been built at Des Moines, and the armory at Council Bluffs has been remodeled and enlarged making it now one of the finest in the state. The armory at Clinton has also been remodeled.

Additional armory rental should be appropriated by the next session of the Legislature to provide for the following:

Company E 136th Medical Regiment, Sibley—Storage space for ambulances.

185th Field Artillery, Davenport—Improvements to comply with federal requirements for armories.

Company G 168th Infantry, Centerville—New Armory.

Troop F 113th Cavalry, Washington—Armory rental.

Headquarters Troop 57th Cavalry Brigade—To be organized.

Service Company 136th Medical Regiment—To be organized.

II. A detailed report of other activities of the National Guard, general orders published, financial report, et cetera, are contained in this report.

III. To you, Governor, I desire to extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard for your sympathetic understanding of the problems which confront us and for your hearty support and cooperation in matters pertaining to this department. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.

TRAINING OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

The Training Mission of the Iowa National Guard Units is to maintain that stage of combat training which will enable each Unit to be prepared at all times for use by the State or Federal Government for the suppression of domestic disturbances or insurrections, and by the Federal Government, in case of national emergency, for active field service.

The Training Year extends from the close of the Field Training period of one year to the close of the Field Training period of the next year. The Training Year is divided into, *a.* Armory Training Period, and *b.* Field Training Period.

ARMORY TRAINING PERIOD

Armory Training is, in general, that training which can be conducted satisfactorily in the Armories of the Units at their home stations. This consists of training in discipline, use and care of arms, material and equipment, leadership, responsibility of Commanders, protective measures against chemical warfare, and target practice.

The Armory Training is accomplished by following programs and schedules prepared beforehand by higher commanders. Training inspections are made from time to time by higher commanders to observe the progress being made and to determine whether or not the prescribed programs and schedules are being followed.

FIELD TRAINING PERIOD

Field Training consists of the application to practical exercises in the Field of such theoretical and practical knowledge as has been gained during the Armory Training Period. The Field Training for the Iowa National Guard Units is held for a 15-day period, each year, generally in the month of August, at Camp Dodge, Iowa, with the exception of the Artillery Regiment. Due to the fact that no Artillery Range is available in the State of Iowa, the 185th Field Artillery Regiment conducts its Field Training Period for 15 days at Camp Ripley, Little Falls, Minnesota. All expenses incident to the Field Training Period are paid by the Federal Government. This includes transportation, rations, pay, etc.

The Field Training Period is divided into the Morning

Period, which is devoted purely to Military Training; the Afternoon Period, during which the time is devoted to schools for Officers, and non-commissioned Officers, physical training, athletics, field meets, etc.; the Evening Period from 4:30 p. m., during which ceremonies are held and amusements provided.

FOURTH ARMY MANEUVERS

The Iowa National Guard less the Headquarters of the 57th Cavalry Brigade and the 113th Cavalry, participated in the Fourth Army Maneuvers held at Camp Ripley, Minnesota, August 8th to 22nd, 1937, and conducted under the supervision of the Regular Army.

Camp Ripley as it is today, even though not completed, is considered the nation's finest National Guard camp. It is superbly designed to accommodate eventually an infantry division with a peace-time strength of 8,500 men. The post embraces about 13,000 acres being six and three-quarters miles from north to south and from one to four and one-half miles from east to west with the Mississippi river as its eastern boundary.

Transportation for the operations, all of which had to be accurately and painstakingly planned in advance, involved troop trains handled by eight railroads, moving more than 20,000 miles to concentrate 15,000 officers and men of the Regular Army, National Guard and Organized Reserves at the Minnesota Guard camp. During the mobilization, the maneuvers, and the return of troops to their respective stations government vehicles traveled more than one-half million miles.

To satisfy the appetites of the 15,000 men who took part in the exercises, it was necessary to provide and transport 659,000 pounds of rations including 144,700 pounds of meat, 116,200 pounds of bread, 56,000 pies, 115,000 bottles of milk, 15,500 dozen eggs, 9,500 bricks of ice cream, and 5,000 bunches of green onions.

Ammunition used in the maneuvers in the Ripley area included 67,540 rounds of blank rifle cartridges and 14,900 rounds of blank cartridges for the .30 caliber machine guns.

The operations also required the provision and transportation of almost two million pounds of miscellaneous supplies

including 400,000 pounds of tentage, 174,000 pounds of straw, 130,000 gallons of gasoline and 304,000 pounds of ice.

A fair idea of the communications problem which had to be worked out for the Camp Ripley maneuvers may be conveyed by the fact that in excess of 1,000 miles of modern field telephone wire, more than 1,000 field telephones and 38 two-way radio sets were used.

At a meeting of the officers the morning following the close of the fifth phase, Major General Stanley H. Ford, Seventh Corps Area commander, and Brigadier General Robert McC. Beck, Jr., Chief Umpire, emphasized that training was the object of the maneuvers. Because of the important part played by recently developed mechanisms in war, the training of all grades of personnel to keep abreast of modern warfare, is now more essential than ever before. General Ford transmitted to the corps of officers a message from Major General George S. Simonds, commander of the Fourth Army, urging them to study carefully and incorporate into their thinking the new elements in the art of warfare which were demonstrated at these maneuvers.

In essence the Camp Ripley maneuvers strikingly illustrated the greatly increased mobility brought about by motorizing the infantry-artillery team. That very mobility, by increasing the speed and range of operations, intensifies two major problems of the commanding officer. First, he must have more complete information about the theatre of operations and concerning the enemy's movements. Second, his communications with all the units, under his command, must be so complete that he can instantly transmit orders or make necessary important changes.

The Camp Ripley maneuvers seemed to demonstrate that the extraordinary increase in mobility, which has come with the motorizing of the infantry and the artillery and with the development of the fast tanks, has not been balanced by equally effective means for providing information about the enemy's movements, effective as are the new scout cars and airplane observation. Furthermore, the development and use of field radios, field telephones, and motorcycle messenger service has not yet reached an efficiency to furnish a motorized army with the superior communication service it requires.

General Beck concluded by remarking on the excellent spirit, loyalty and aggressiveness shown by the enlisted personnel during the maneuvers and stressing the fundamental that without such a will to fight all the tactics and mechanized equipment are useless.

Major General Mathew A. Tinley, Commanding General, 34th Division, was the Commanding General of the GREEN forces during the maneuvers. This was the first time since its organization that the 34th Division comprised of National Guard troops from Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota and Iowa had ever been assembled as a division for training.

TWENTY-FOURTH CAVALRY DIVISION

The Headquarters of the 24th Cavalry Division of which the 113th Cavalry of the Iowa National Guard is a part, was assembled for field training at Camp Dodge, Iowa, August 21 to September 4, 1937.

This headquarters is comprised of officers from Iowa, Kansas, Wyoming, Idaho, Colorado and Washington. Since its organization in 1936, this headquarters has taken its field training in the various states belonging to the division.

This division is commanded by Major General William K. Herndon of the State of Kansas.

SELECTIVE SERVICE

The War Department General Staff has, for the past several years, been conducting a comprehensive study of the operation of Selective Service in the event of a national emergency. Advantage has been taken of the experience gained during the administration of the so-called "World War Draft," with a view to developing a plan which will be entirely workable, should this nation again be called upon to mobilize the man power for military purposes.

In 1936, the state of Iowa was invited to designate an officer of the State Staff, Iowa National Guard, to participate in a conference at Fort Sheridan, Illinois, for the purpose of studying the administration of Selective Service. Lt. Col. R. A. Lancaster, the Assistant Adjutant General, was assigned to this important duty. A second conference was held in 1937, and an invitation has been extended to participate in a similar conference in 1938.

The nine officers assigned to the State Staff have met on a number of occasions for the purpose of studying the part this state would play in the Selective Service, and of perfecting a plan of administering the Selective Service Act, if and when passed by the Congress, within this state. This plan will be revised from time to time to conform with changing situations, and, although not perfect, will be workable. The plan provides for the registration of all manpower of military age, classifying the registrants, and selecting certain of them for induction into the armed forces. The selection will be based upon the least possible disruption of economic and social life, yet provide the armed forces with sufficient personnel to carry the war to a quick and successful conclusion. This system is fundamentally American and democratic, as it places the obligation of service upon those who may best be spared from the economic, social and industrial life, of the state and nation, obligating those not thus selected to make their contribution to emergency.

These studies will be continued and the Selective Service plan for the State of Iowa revised and improved so that a workable plan, based upon serious study will be available, should we be called upon to contribute our share of manpower to another national emergency.

FEDERAL CARETAKERS

The Federal Government now provides caretakers for the care of animals, materiel and equipment issued to the National Guard. These caretakers are paid from federal funds and are very instrumental in the maintenance and proper care of animals, materiel and equipment.

STATE DUTY

A disastrous fire swept through the village of Remsen in Plymouth county, on the evening of July 4, 1936. At the urgent request of the sheriff and mayor, the following organizations, in command of Colonel Gordon C. Hollar, 133rd Infantry, were ordered to active duty and directed to assist the civil authorities in rendering aid to the citizens of Remsen:

Trucks with tents, cots and blankets were dispatched from Camp Dodge.

On account of the holiday, many enlisted men were absent from the stations of their unit. A total of 17 officers and 173 enlisted men reported for duty.

On the same date a fire of serious proportions broke out in the village of Oyens, five miles west of Remsen. Detachments were dispatched to that village to assist the civil authorities.

All troops, except a detachment of 7 officers and 86 enlisted men were relieved on July 6, 1936. This detachment was relieved from further duty on July 7, 1936.

These Instructors, without exception, have been chosen for their high professional qualifications and ability to understand the National Guard, and their interest and desire in seeing this component of our National Defense system brought to the highest point of efficiency. The interest and ability displayed by the personnel detailed as Instructors with the Iowa National Guard

have done much to promote the efficiency, organization, training and discipline of the National Guard, and I wish, on behalf of this department, to express our sincere appreciation for their accomplishments.

EXAMINATIONS FOR UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY

Each year the governor of Iowa is authorized to nominate one or more enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard to take the final examination for entrance to the United States Military Academy, (West Point). The statutes provide that the persons nominated must be selected through the medium of a competitive examination. Examinations are held annually between August 1st and November 15th.

In each calendar year included in this report, the governor was authorized to nominate one enlisted man of the Iowa National Guard to compete in the final entrance examination.

The examination questions were prepared by one of the state educational institutions through the cooperation of the State Board of Education. Upon the completion of the examination the papers were graded by the teaching staff of the educational institution which prepared the questions. For the years covered by this report, the examinations were prepared and graded by the Iowa State Teachers College. Acknowledgment is made of the splendid cooperation of President Latham and the teaching staff of the Iowa State Teachers College and for their valuable assistance in making the examination a success.

For the year 1936, ten enlisted men participated in the preliminary examination. Private Robert J. Greenwalt, Company A 168th Infantry, Des Moines, having obtained the highest grade, was nominated by the Governor to compete in the final entrance examinations. These examinations were conducted at Omaha, Nebraska, and, although the nominee obtained a passing grade, he failed to place sufficiently high to obtain the appointment.

For the year 1937, eleven enlisted men participated in the preliminary examinations, and Private First Class Robert J. Greenwalt again was nominated to compete in the final entrance examinations. He did not obtain an appointment.

During the past two years there has been a steady increase in the number of veterans certified to the Bonus Board for aid from the State disability bonus fund. This increase coupled with the fact that the income has been reduced has forced the Board to reduce the amount of relief granted to disabled veterans from one-half of the total amount allowed by the county soldiers' relief commission to one-third, the soldiers' relief commission supplying the other two-thirds.

Approximately five hundred and fifty veterans have received aid each month during the past two years, for a total amount of \$118,635.40. This aid is given only to those veterans whose disabilities are such that they are unable to perform the duties of a gainful occupation.

In view of the fact that numerous inquiries are still being received relative to the original Iowa bonus, these claims, filed during the years 1923 and 1924, have been torn quite badly. A federal works projects was approved and these applications have now been mended and a new guide system installed at a very reasonable cost.

The Bonus Board is also charged with the administration of the World War Orphans' Educational Aid fund. During the year 1937-38, twenty-four students received this aid and during the present school year, twenty-three students have applied for aid. The amount granted to any one student must not exceed \$150.00 per year.

GRAVES REGISTRATION DIVISION

The work of the Graves Registration Division has been greatly facilitated during the past two years by the allocation of two grants, one of \$72,000 and one of \$155,000 by the Works Progress Administration. These have enabled the Graves Registration Division to employ as many as two hundred eighty-eight persons throughout the state. Great care has been exercised in the selection of personnel for this work, special consideration being given to veterans, wives of disabled veterans and widows of veterans.

Through taking advantage of the grants made by the Works Progress Administration, the registration of all veterans' graves in the State of Iowa, will be completed years in advance of what it otherwise would have been. The graves of more than ninety thousand veterans have been registered and it is believed that by the time the work is completed the number will have passed the one hundred thousand mark.

NOTE: Civilian physicians, only, have been designated. Iowa National Guard Medical Officers are authorized to conduct physical examinations for personnel of units located at their stations, and to claim the authorized fee.

2. Medical Examiners will conduct the Physical Examinations in strict conformity with the requirements and standards set forth in NGR No. 28-1924, (STANDARDS OF PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRANCE INTO THE NATIONAL GUARD) and changes or amendments, thereto. They will be held strictly accountable that no applicant for enlistment is accepted who does not possess the required physical and mental qualifications outlined in NGR No. 28. If it is subsequently determined that an enlisted man of the National Guard is suffering from some disqualifying physical or mental defect which existed prior to enlistment, the medical examiner who passed the applicant as physically and mentally fit, will be relieved. Great care will be exercised that only those who possess the physical and mental requirements for the rigors of military service are accepted.

3. Each medical examiner will be authorized a fee of not to exceed 75c for each physical examination of an enlisted man conducted in connection with enlistment or reenlistment.

Bills for payment of physical examinations will be submitted in triplicate, properly certified by the unit commander. These bills will be forwarded to reach the Adjutant General within 10 days after the close of each calendar quarter. (March 31st, June 30th, September 30th and December 31st.)

Unit commanders will be responsible for the submission of bills within the prescribed time limits and will be directed to settle such accounts from their unit funds or their per capita allowance in the event they fail to comply with the provisions of this General Order.

Bills may be submitted monthly if desired. All bills will contain the following information, to be set forth in the following form on letter size paper:

RIFLE RANGES

A survey of all rifle and pistol ranges used by the Iowa National Guard was ordered by the Commanding General 7th Corps Area early in 1938. As a result of this survey, the only range approved for firing was that of Company E 133rd Infantry, Webster City. All other ranges, including the large range at Camp Dodge, were declared unsafe for firing either M1906 or M1930-M1 ammunition. Arrangements were made whereby the Camp Dodge range was adapted for use during the field training period only.

The unsuitability of home station ranges and the fact that the Camp Dodge range may be made available for the field training periods only, seriously affects Cal. .30 rifle firing. The survey indicates, that with the exception of Webster City, none of the ranges provided the required safety features.

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
