

#### LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

July 1, 1942

SUBJECT: Biennial Report.

To: HIS EXCELLENCY, Geo. A. Wilson, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.

1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 467.44 of Chapter 28 of the Code of Iowa, 1939, there is submitted herewith the biennial report of the Adjutant General's Department during the period July 1, 1940, to June 30, 1942.

2. During the period covered by this report, armory training was conducted with the purpose in view of acquainting officers and enlisted men with the duties which would be required of them while undergoing Fourth Army Maneuvers with the entire 34th Division at Camp Ripley, Little Falls,

Minnesota, August 1940. ffl

National Guard for mobilization and induction into active Federal service which measure was contemplated by the President for the purpose of strengthening the common defense. Officers and enlisted men of the State Staff and Detachment were inducted into active Federal Service on various dates ranging from September 20, 1940, to September 15, 1941. The 113th Cavalry was inducted on January 13, 1941. The elements of the 34th Division were inducted on February 10, 1941. The 124th Observation Squadron, Iowa National Guard was organized at Des Moines, Iowa, February 25, 1941, and it, too, was inducted into Federal Service on September 15, 1941.

- 3. The entire Iowa National Guard having been inducted into Federal Service, the Legislature amended the military code of the state to authorize the formation of a State Guard. Deails of the formation of this organization are contained in this report.
- 4. This report also contains general orders published, financial report and detailed report of other activities.
- 5. To you, Governor, I extend the thanks of the entire Iowa National Guard and Iowa State Guard, for your sympathetic understanding of the problems which confront us and for your hearty support and cooperation in matters pertaining to this department. It has been a pleasure to administer the affairs of this office under such agreeable conditions and circumstances.

#### TRAINING OF THE IOWA NATIONAL GUARD

The Training Mission of Iowa National Guard units is to maintain that stage of combat training which will enable each unit to be prepared at all times for use by the State or Federal Government for the suppression of domestic disturbances or insurrections, and by the Federal Government, in case of national emergency, for active field service.

The Training Year extends from the close of the Field Training period of one year to the close of the Field Training period of the next year. The Training Year is divided into Armory Training Period and Field Training Period.

#### ARMORY TRAINING PERIOD

Armory Training is, in general that training which can be conducted satisfactorily in the Armories of the units at their home stations. This consists of training in discipline, use and care of arms, material and equipment, leadership, responsibility of commanders, protective measures against chemical warfare, and target practice.

The Armory Training is accomplished by following programs and schedules prepared beforehand by higher commanders. Training inspections are made from time to time by higher commanders to observe the progress being made and to determine whether or not the prescribed programs and schedules are being followed.

#### FIELD TRAINING PERIOD

The Field Training consists of the application to practical exercises in the Field of such theoretical and practical knowledge as has been gained during the Armory Training Period. The field training for the Iowa National Guard in 1940, was held at Camp Ripley, Little Falls, Minnesota, August 4 to 24, and attended by all elements of the Guard except 7 officers and 6 enlisted men of the State Staff and Detachment. The officers and men of the State Staff and Detachment trained in Des Moines, Iowa. Details of Selective Service were worked out.

All expenses incident to the Field Training Period were paid by the Federal Government. This included transportation, rations, pay, etc.

## EXAMINATIONS FOR UNITED STATES MILITARY ACADEMY

Each year the governor of Iowa is authorized to nominate one or more enlisted men of the Iowa National Guard to take the final examination for entrance to the United States Military Academy, (West Point). The statutes provide that the persons nominated must be selected through the medium of a competitive examination.

In the calendar year 1940, the governor was authorized to nominate one enlisted man of the Iowa National Guard to compete in the final entrance examination.

The examination questions were furnished by the Commanding General, Fort Snelling, Minnesota. The papers were graded by the State Teachers College, Cedar Falls. Six enlisted members of the Iowa National Guard competed in this preliminary examination. Pvt. 1cl Robert W. DeMots, Company L, 133rd Infantry, Sioux City, placed first and was nominated by the Governor to compete in the final entrance examinations. He was later disqualified on account of being below the minimum age limit. The Governor then nominated Sergeant Walter D. Porter of Company G. 133rd Infantry, Fort Dodge.

This department was created by an act of the people in 1922 for the purpose of paying the World War No. 1 veteran, whose service was accredited to Iowa, a bonus. After December 31, 1924, the unused balance of the \$22,000,000.00 appropriated for the bonus was transferred to a disability fund to be used on disabled veterans in need and who were eligible for the Iowa Bonus. During the past two years, we have paid to the needy, disabled Iowa veterans \$98,003.06 in the form of "Disability Bonuses". This is some reduction over the previous biennium and is due to the more availability of employment. We find most veterans are eager to earn their own keep but a person with a disability could not get employment. We now find many disabled veterans employed on full time jobs.

This board co-operates very closely with the 99 County Soldiers' Relief Commissions and we find them doing their work efficiently and unselfishly. During the past few years, these commissions have relied on this office for a source of information in the administration of their duties.

The War Orphans' Education is gradually drawing to a close as the youngest one of these orphans is now 21 years of age and they have either availed themselves of this aid or soon will have completed their course of study. These War Orphans are granted aid not to exceed \$150.00 per year and this fund has done a great work in aiding these war casualties to prepare themselves to take their place in the business world.

National Defense Act, as amended, and who shall not have been appointed in the National Guard of the United States in the grade for which examined and found qualified prior to the effective date of induction of his unit, is hereby tendered appointment in the National Guard of the United States and commission in the Army of the United States, in the same grade and arm or service for which he shall have been so examined and found qualified.

Each warrant officer and enlisted man of the National Guard who holds appointment as an officer in the National Guard of the United States and a commission in the Army of the United States, or who is tendered such appointment and commission by the terms of this Order, and who is assigned to a unit ordered to active duty under this Order prior to the effective date of induction of such unit, is hereby ordered to active military service as a commissioned officer of the Army of the United States under that appointment and commission.

#### INDUCTION OF THE 124TH OBSERVATION SQUADRON INTO THE ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES

1. The following Executive Order, ordering the 124th Observation Squadron into the active military service of the United States is quoted:

#### EXECUTIVE ORDER

By virtue of the authority conferred upon me by Public Resolution No. 96, 76th Congress, approved August 27, 1940, and the National Defense Act of June 3, 1916, as amended (39 Stat. 166), and as Commander-in-Chief of the Army and Navy of the United States, I hereby order into the active military service of the United States, effective on dates to be hereafter announced by the Secretary of War, the following units and members of the National Guard of the United States to serve in the actice military service of the United States for a period of twelve consecutive months, unless sooner relieved:

All members, both active and inactive, of the units listed above.

All persons so ordered into the active military service of the United States are, from the effective date for each unit as respectively announced in War Department orders, relieved from duty in the National Guard of their respective States so long as they shall remain in the active military service of the United States, and during such time shall be subject to such laws and regulations for the government of the Army of the United States as may be applicable to members of the Army whose permanent retention in the active military service is not contemplated by law.

Commissioned officers and warrant officers appointed in the National Guard of the United States and commissioned or holding warrants in the Army of the United States, and affected by this Order, are hereby ordered to active duty on the dates to be respectively prescribed in War Department orders under such appointments and commissions or warrants.

All officers and warrant officers of the National Guard, appointed in the National Guard, who shall have been Federally recognized or examined and found qualified for Federal recognition, and shall have been assigned to units ordered to active duty under this Order prior to the effective dates respectively to be indicated for such units in War Department orders, who do not hold appointments in the National Guard of the United States in the same grade and arm or service in which they respectively have been most recently Federally recognized or have been most recently examined and found qualified for Federal recognition, are

hereby tendered appointments in the National Guard of the United States in the same grade and arm or service in which they shall have been most recently Federally recognized or examined and found qualified for Federal recognition.

Each warrant officer and enlisted man of the National Guard, assigned to a unit ordered to active duty under this Order, who shall have been examined and found qualified for appointment as an officer in the National Guard of the United States, under the provisions of Section III, National Defense Act, as amended, and who shall not have been appointed in the National Guard of the United States in the grade for which examined and found qualified prior to the effective date to be prescribed in War Department orders for the induction of his unit, is hereby tendered appointment in the National Guard of the United States and commissioned in the Army of the United States, in the same grade and arm or service for which he shall have been so examined and found qualified, effective on the date of induction of his unit.

Each warrant officer and enlisted man of the National Guard who holds appointment as an officer in the National Guard of the United States and a commission in the Army of the United States, or who is tendered such appointment and commission by the terms of this Order, and who is assigned to a unit ordered to active duty under this Order prior to the effective date to be prescribed in War Department orders for the induction of such unit, is hereby ordered to active military service as a commissioned officer of the Army of the United States under that appointment and commission, effective on the date of induction of his unit.

- 2. The processes of induction will be governed by AR 130-10, dated March 27, 1940, "Induction into the Service of the United States."
- 3. The Executive Order No. 8633 dated January 14, 1941, above quoted states "on the dates to be hereafter announced by the Secretary of War." This Executive Order was amended by Executive Order No. 8756 dated May 17, 1941, to include the 124th Observation Squadron, Iowa, which was Federally recognized as of February 25, 1941.

September 15, 1941, is announced as the effective date of induction of the 124th Observation Squadron in the order of the Secretary of War quoted below:

"1. Pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of Executive Order Number 8756, May 17, 1941, amending Executive Order Number 8633, January 14, 1941, ordering certain units and members of the National Guard of the United States into the active Military service of the United States, effective on dates to be announced in War Department orders, September 15, 1941, is hereby announced as the effective date of induction for the following organizations:

124th Observation Squadron Iowa
128th Observation Squadron Georgia

"2. Separate instructions will be transmitted for the troop movements to be made following induction.

"3. Governors and State Adjutants General of the States concerned are being furnished copies of this letter.

Final Armory Drill Pay Roll for the period September 1 to 14, 1941, incl., will be prepared immediately upon induction and forwarded through normal channels.

- I. ALLOWANCE OF STATE FUNDS. 1. Organization commanders are authorized to contract for the following items without prior authority from this office.
  - a. Telephone service for armories.
  - b. Official long distance telephone calls.
  - c. Official telegrams.
  - d. Postage.
  - e. Stationery and office supplies not furnished by the state.
  - f. Cartage to and from armory of military property.
  - g. Janitor supplies not furnished by owner or armories.
- 2. Prior to contracting for or making expenditures for other purposes than those mentioned in paragraph 1, authorization will first be obtained from the Adjutant General. Request for authority to contract for expenditures mentioned in this paragraph will be submitted to the Adjutant General, in triplicate, itemized, and with unit and total cost. Authority may be requested to contract for:
  - a. Athletic equipment.
  - b. Military text books and publications not otherwise furnished by the State of Iowa.
  - c. Miscellaneous equipment for armories.
  - d. Labor necessary for safeguarding armories and military property.
  - e. Any other purposes deemed essential to the morale of the personnel and betterment of the organization.
- 3. a. Organization commanders will submit to the Adjutant General, to reach this headquarters not later than the 5th day of each month, a typewritten list, in triplicate, of obligations contracted for during the previous month showing firm name and amount of each account and the total of the amount obligated for that month. A state warrant will be issued, payable to the organization commander, who will upon receipt of such warrant, deposit it in a local bank in the name of the organization and will make payment therefrom for obligations contracted during the month, by voucher check (Form No. 14-ISG) supplied by these headquarters.
- b. At the close of each quarter, effective March 31, 1942, each organization commander will submit to the Adjutant General, an account current in duplicate on Form No. 19-ISG supplied by these headquarters, showing receipts and disbursements of all state funds for that quarter.

Attached to each voucher check will be the receipted itemized bill covering the expenditures for which the voucher check is drawn. Accounts current will be submitted to reach the Adjutant General's Office not later than the 10th of the month following the close of the quarterly period.

Through a long and varied military career, General Haynes served his country faithfully and well for almost fifty years. ## IOWA STATE GUARD

Governor Wilson in December, 1941, ordered the organization of the Iowa State Guard under authority of Senate File 306, 49th General Assembly of Iowa, to provide military protection for the State of Iowa, during the absence of the Iowa National Guard, which had been called into Federal service by order of the President.

On December 14, 1941, Lieutenant General Mathew A. Tinley, Retired, Council Bluffs, Iowa, was commissioned Lieutenant General in the State Guard and assigned as The Commanding General, Iowa State Guard. Colonel Gerald V. Caughlan of Council Bluffs, and Colonel Otto I. Ronningen of Ames, were commissioned colonels in the Iowa State Guard and assigned to command the 1st and 2nd Regiments of the Iowa State Guard. These officers proceeded to organize their regiments and within thirty days the organization of both regiments was practically completed. Each regiment consists of 16 companies of 3 officers and 60 enlisted men, each, and a medical detachment of 5 officers and 30 enlisted men. The 1st Regiment occupies the southern half of the state and the 2nd Regiment, the northern half. State Headquarters were set up in the Adjutant General's Office under Colonel Percy A. Lainson, Chief of Staff.

A program of 13 weeks intensive basic military training was instituted which resulted in rapid development of the state guard units within a very short period of time. A complete and extensive survey of all vital installations in the State of Iowa was authorized and completed by the personnel of the Iowa State Guard. Adequate plans for the safeguarding of these installations were prepared and filed.

Woolen uniforms were provided by the Federal Government. The state purchased cotton uniforms inasmuch as the Federal Government did not have uniforms available in sufficient quantities. The state guard uniforms are the same as those of the regular army except for the Iowa State Guard shoulder patch and an Iowa collar ornament in place of the U.S. The State Guard officer's uniform is designated by the Iowa State Guard shoulder patch, Iowa collar ornament and blue sleeve braid. An allowance of one hundred dollars was provided each commissioned officer for the purchase of necessary uniforms.

The Iowa State Guard units are equipped with such arms, ammunition, equipment, and other training aids as are available and supplied by the Federal Government, augmented by such other necessary equipment as has been purchased by the State of Iowa. A reserve supply of ammunition and chemical warfare agents is maintained at all times to provide adequate protection in event of any emergency.

Governor Wilson authorized the organization of the Provisional Military Police Battalion, on active duty, in March 1942, to consist of 26 officers and 260 enlisted men. Lt. Col. John T. Lonsdale, Ames, Iowa, was assigned to command this battalion, which reported for duty and intensive training March 10, 1942, at Camp Dodge, Iowa, and was maintained until June 9, 1942, when the personnel was transferred to and redesignated as the First Military Police Battalion, Iowa State Guard. This battalion to consist of battalion headquarters, headquarters detachment, medical detachment and four line companies. The members of the battalion converted the National Guard summer camp buildings and stables of the 113th Cavalry area to barracks, mess halls, schools, and recreation buildings. These buildings being of a permanent nature are available for housing and training troops on a year round basis. All construction work, wiring, plumbing, landscapping being performed by members of the 1st Military Police Battalion.

All personnel of the Iowa State Guard are authorized and will attend field training for a period of two weeks at Camp Dodge, Iowa, commencing June 28, 1942.

The amendment to the military code of Iowa, which authorized the organization of the Iowa State Guard is as follows:

## S. F. 306 AN ACT

To amend the military code, chapter twenty-eight and one tenth (28.1), Code, 1939, by providing for the organization, administration, employment, and pay of the Iowa State Guard during the period the National Guard of Iowa is in Federal Service.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

Section 1. Chapter twenty-eight and one tenth (28.1), Code, 1939, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

"When any part of the National Guard of the State of Iowa is in active Federal Service the Governor may organize a military force to be known as the Iowa State Guard, to be of such strength and to consist of such organizations as he may deem necessary during the period the Iowa National Guard is in active Federal service."

- Sec. 2. The laws of the State of Iowa pertaining to the administration and employment of the National Guard of the State of Iowa, shall be applicable to the Iowa State Guard. The term of service, enlistment, commission, and condition of discharge in the Iowa State Guard shall be as prescribed by the Governor.
- Sec. 3. The Iowa State Guard shall not be called, ordered, or in any manner drafted as such into the military service of the United States. However, no person shall by reason of his membership in the Iowa State Guard be exempt from Federal military service under Federal law.
- Sec. 4. Officers and enlisted men of the Iowa State Guard while in active service of the State shall receive the same pay, allowances, and compensation as provided by law for members of the Iowa National Guard.
- Sec. 5. Any expense necessary for organizing, equipping, and maintaining the Iowa State Guard shall be paid on approval of the Governor by warrant drawn on any State funds not otherwise appropriated, or funds now or hereafter appropriated for the maintenance of the National Guard.
- Sec. 6. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall be in full force and effect from and after the passage and publication in the Ames Daily Tribune, a newspaper published at Ames, Iowa, and in the Times Republican, a newspaper published at Marshalltown, Iowa.

#### GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 1

AUTHORITY	I
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ADMINISTRATION	IX

- I. AUTHORITY. Pursuant to the authority of Chapter 28.1, Code of Iowa, 1939, as amended by Senate File 306, 49th General Assembly, the unorganized militia of the State of Iowa, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be organized as a defense force for the performance of such duties and missions as may be assigned by the Governor under the laws of the State of Iowa, during the period the National Guard is in the service of the United States.
- II. DESIGNATION. The defense force organized under the provisions of this order shall be designated as the "IOWA STATE GUARD."
- III. ORGANIZATION. 1. General: The organization prescribed for the Iowa State Guard shall conform to such Tables of Organization as shall be formulated by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard. The Iowa State Guard shall consist of such organizations and units as may be prescribed by the Governor.
- 2. Headquarters: The Headquarters of the Iowa State Guard shall be located in the office of the Adjutant General's Department, State Capitol, Des Moines, and shall consist of the Commanding General and such other commissioned and enlisted personnel as the Governor may prescribe.
- IV. TABLES OF ORGANZATION. The several organizations and units comprising the Iowa State Guard shall be organized in conformity with Tables of Organization formulated by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard.
- V. GOVERNMENT. The Iowa State Guard shall be governed, disciplined, trained and equipped in accordance with the provisions of Section 28, Code of Iowa, 1939, and in accordance with regulations promulgated by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, from time to time. Such regulations shall be designated as the "Iowa State Guard Regulations."
- VI. PERSONNEL. General: Insofar as practicable, the personnel comprising the Iowa State Guard shall be selected from those members of the unorganized militia, within the age limits hereinafter provided, who have had prior military or naval service in the armed forces of the United States. All individuals shall be required to pass a physical

examination in accordance with standards of physical examination as prescribed herein. No individual will be appointed, commissioned or enlisted who is not a citizen of the United States or who is a member of or affiliated with a subversive organization.

2. Commissioned: (a) Age Limitations. The age for commissioned officers of the Iowa State Guard shall be not less than 21 years of age. The following age limitations will apply for initial appointments:

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In construing the foregoing, candidates for original appointment shall not have yet reached the anniversary date of birth indicated. The maximum ages for initial appointment may be waived when it can be shown that such waivers are manifestly in the best interests of the State of Iowa.

- (b) Physical Examinations. All candidates for appointment or promotion in the Iowa State Guard shall undergo a physical examination by a medical officer, active or retired, or by a contract surgeon, in conformity with the standards of physical requirements hereinafter prescribed. No candidates for appointment or promotion shall be accepted with a physical defect which would preclude rendering proper military service in the Iowa State Guard or which defect, if easily aggravated, might be the basis of claim for compensation against the state. Physical examination reports will be made on ISG Form No. 5.
- (c) Professional Examinations. All candidates for appointment or promotion in the Iowa State Guard may be required to undergo such professional examination and ability tests to determine their fitness and qualification for office as may be prescribed from time to time. The Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, may, at his discretion, waive such professional and ability tests when the applicants military record justifies such action. Professional and ability tests may be waived by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, for one year, prior to the expiration of which time the officer concerned may be required to take such examinations and tests as the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, may determine.
- (d) Oath of Office. Upon satisfactorily passing the prescribed physical examination, and professional examination and ability tests, unless waived, each officer shall immediately execute the required oath of office on ISG Form No. 6. The oath of office shall be administered by an officer of the Iowa State Guard, or any civil officer authorized to administer oaths under the laws of the State.
- (e) Commissions. Upon receipt of the Oath of Office, or as soon thereafter as practicable, there will be issued to each officer, a commission, signed by the Governor.
- (f) Retirements and Separations. Officers of the Iowa State Guard may be retired as provided by Chapter 28, Code of Iowa, 1939, or may be separated by discharge, acceptance of resignation or physical disqualification. Upon the return of the National Guard to State Service, all commissions shall be vacated automatically, unless specifically extended by the Governor.
- (g) Grades. The several commissioned grades, rank and precedence shall be as prescribed by law and regulations for officers of the National

Guard. Appointments in the Iowa State Guard shall be limited to grades from Second Lieutenant to Colonel, inclusive, except that the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, may be a Brigadier General, Major General or Lieutenant General.

- (h) Commands. Appropriate commands for the several grades of line officers shall be, in general, as follows: A regiment for a colonel; a battalion for a lieutenant colonel or major; a company or detachment for a captain, and a platoon for a first or second lieutenant.
- 3. Enlisted. (a) Age limitations. Enlistments in the Iowa State Guard shall be confined to those individuals who have reached the eighteenth anniversary of the dates of their birth and who have not passed their fiftieth birthday anniversaries. An individual who has enlisted prior to his fiftieth birthday and reaches the age of fifty while serving in such enlistment, may be retained in the service and may re-enlist. No individual may continue to serve after he has reached his sixty-fourth birthday. Waivers for age for original enlistments may be granted by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, when manifestly in the best interests of the State of Iowa.
- (b) Term of Enlistment. Individuals eligible for enlistment will normally be enlisted for a period of three years and shall serve for that period unless sooner discharged by proper authority. Individuals who have served 90 days or more in the armed forces of the United States during War, or who have served one complete three-year enlistment in any of the armed forces of the United States or who have completed the Citizens Military Training Camps, including the Blue Course or who have completed two years in the basic course of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps, may enlist for one year. On completion of any enlistment in the Iowa State Guard, an individual may reenlist for one year.
- (c) Physical Examinations. All applicants for enlistment shall be required to satisfactorily pass a physical examination in conformity with standards of physical requirements hereinafter prescribed. The results of such physical examination shall be entered on ISG Form No. 1—Enlistment Record.
- (d) Enlistment Record. ISG Form No. 1 (Enlistment Record), shall be accomplished for all applicants for enlistment in accordance with instructions contained therein. This form shall be accomplished in duplicate. The original copy shall be retained in the files of the organization or unit in which the individual is enlisted and the duplicate copy shall be forwarded to the Headquarters, Iowa State Guard, State Capitol, Des Moines, Iowa.
- (e) Discharges. The enlisted personnel of the Iowa State Guard may be discharged or mustered out of service at any time for the convenience of the State. Orders for discharges shall be issued by the Headquarters, Iowa State Guard, upon the recommendation of the commanding officers concerned. Enlisted men of the Iowa State Guard may be discharged for removal from state or station, dependency, enlistment in the armed forces of the United States, induction in such forces, physical disability not incurred in line of duty, or pursuant to a sentence of a General Court Martial.
- (f) Prohibited Enlistments: Individuals who are registered under the Selective Training and Service Act of 1940, as amended, and who have been placed in Class I-A, II-A, II-B, IV-C, IV-D, IV-E or IV-F, or who have been convicted of a felony, or who are in a status of parole from any conviction of sentence of a civil court, or who are members of any of the armed forces of the United States, including the reserve components, thereof, are prohibited from enlisting in the Iowa State Guard.

VII. STANDARDS OF PHYSICAL EXAMINATION. 1. General. No candidate for appointment as a commissioned officer or applicant for enlistment will be accepted for service in the Iowa State Guard who has not passed a satisfactory physical examination as herein prescribed. The purpose of standards of physical requirements is to secure the greatest possible efficiency and uniformity in conducting physical examinations for entrance into the Iowa State Guard. Medical Examiners and Line Officers should interpret these standards with discretion and not construe them arbitrarily. Medical Examiners will exercise great care in the examination of candidates for appointment, promotion or enlistment, who suffer from serious defects of vision or hearing, chronic discharges from the ear or ears; toxic conditions associated with abnormal conditions of the thyroid or other ductless glands; valvular disease of the heart; tuberculosis; epilepsy, mental disease or deficiency; and irremediable defects of the feet or teeth. The following defects shall be disqualifying for commissioned or enlisted personnel:

### (1) Eyes:

- a. A minimum vision of 20/100 in each eye, correctible to 20/40 in either eye, when no organic disease of either eye exists. Correcting formula will be recorded as follows: Vision R. E., 20/30 corrected to 20/20 plus 1.50 D. cyl. 1800. Vision L. E., 20/100 corrected to 20/40 minus 2.00 D. sph. with minus o.50 D. cyl. 90o.
- b. Trachoma.
- c. Chronic conjunctivitis.
- d. Pterygium encroaching upon cornea.
- e. Complete or extensive destruction of eyelids, adhesions to each other or eyeballs.
- f. Inversion or eversion of the eyelids or lagophthalmus.
- g. Trichiasis, ptosis, blepharospasm or chronic blepharitis.
- h. Ulcers of the cornea or corneal opacities encroaching on the pupillary area which reduces the acuity of vision below the standards noted above.
- i. Irregularities in the form of the iris, or anterior or posterior syenchiae sufficient to reduce acuity of vision below the standards noted above.
- k. Loss or disorganization of either eye or pronounced exophthal-
- 1. Night blindness.
- m. Color blindness for red, green or violet.

#### (2) Ears:

- a. Unless the acuity of hearing is at least 15/20 in both ears.
- b. Total loss of an external ear, marked hypertrophy or atrophy.
- c. Acute or chronic suppurative otitis media or chronic catarrhal otitis media.
- d. Mastoiditis, acute or chronic.

## (3) Height and Weight:

- a. If less than 64 inches or more than 78 inches.
- b. Excessive overweight or underweight.

## (4) Skin:

- a. Eczema of long standing or which is rebellious to treatment.
- b. Mycosis fungoides.

Actinomycosis.

d. Extensive psoriasis or ichthyosis.

Acne upon face or neck amounting to positive deformity.

f. Elephantiasis.

Pediculosis or scabies.

- Ulceration of the skin of long standing or of syphilic origin. Scars which show a tendency to break down and ulcerate.
- Obscene, offensive and indecent tatooing on parts of body subject to exposure.

## (5) Head:

Stigmata of degeneration. a.

Tinea in any form.

Tumors which would interfere with wearing of military head-

d. Monstrosity of the head or hydrocephalus.

Hernia of the brain.

Deformities of the skull of any degree associated with evidence of disease of the brain, spinal cord or peripheral nerves.

## (6) Teeth:

Unless there are a minimum of three serviceable natural masticating teeth above and three below, opposing. Teeth which have been satisfactorily restored by crown or restored by dummies attached to bridgework may be considered as serviceable.

b. Marked pyorrhea alveolaris.

Gross prognathism or irregularity which interferes with serviceable occlusion.

### (7) Neck:

Cervical adenitis of other than benign origin including cancer, Hodgkins disease, leukemia, tuberculosis and syphilis.

Exaphthalmic goiter or myxedema.

Tumor or cysts of benign nature so large as to interfere with wearing of the uniform or military equipment.

Torticollis. d.

#### (8) Spine:

Lateral deviation of spine from the normal midline of more

than two inches (scoliosis).

b. Curvature of the spine of any degree in which function is interfered with or in which there is noticeable deformity when the applicant is dressed (scoliosis, kyphosis, or lordosis).

c. Fracture or dislocation of vertebrae.

d. Abscess of the spinal column, partial or complete.

Vertebral caries (Pott's disease).

Abscess of the spinal column or its vicinity.

f. g. Osteoarthritis of the spinal column, partial or complete.

Fracture of the coccyx. h.

#### (9) Chest:

a. Congenital or acquired deformities which result in reducing the chest capacity and diminishing the respiratory function to such a degree as to interfere with vigorous physical exertion.

b. Pronounced contraction of the chest with adhesions following pleurisy or empyema.

c. Deformities of the scapula sufficient to interfere with carrying of military equipment.

Absence or faulty development of the clavicle.

Suppurative periostiles or caries or necrosis of the ribs, the sternum, the clavicle or the scapula.

Fractures of the ribs with faulty union interfering with function. Tumors which interfere with wearing of the uniform or military equipment.

h. Unhealed sinuses of the chest wall following operation.

# (10) Lungs:

a. Active pulmonary tuberculosis.

b. Inactive pulmonary tuberculosis if extensive.

c. Acute or chronic pleurisy or empyema.

d. Chronic bronchitis, chronic pneumonia, asthma, or bronchiectasis.

Actinomycosis, hydatid, cysts or abcess of lung.

Tumor or lungs, pleura or mediastinum.

# (11) Heart and Blood Vessels:

a. All valvular diseases of the heart,

b. Hypertrophy or dilation of the heart. An apex beat located at or beyond the left nipple line or below the sixth rib, and of heaving character indicating serious enlargement.

c. Pericarditis, endocarditis, myocarditis or angina pectoris.

A heart rate of 100 or over or of 50 or under, when proved to be present in a recumbent position and on observation and reexamination over a sufficient period of time.

Marked cardiac arrhythmia or irregularity.

f. Arteriosclerosis.

Hypertension evidenced by a persistent systolic blood pressure above 150. In persons under 25 years of age a persistent systolic pressure above 150 shall be cause for rejection.

Aneurysm of any variety in any situation.

Intermittent claudication.

k. Raynaud's disease.

Thrombophlebitis of one or more extremities, if there is a persistence of the thrombus or any evidence of obstruction to circulation in the involved vein or veins.

# (12) The Abdomen:

Muscular ruptures of the abdominal wall sufficient to interfere with function.

b. Fistula from visceral or body lesions or following operation.

c. Hernia of any variety.

d. Large tumor of the abdominal walls.

Scar pain if severe.

Chronic diseases of the stomach and intestines. f.

g. Gastroenterostomy for relief of gastric orduodenal ulcer. h. Ptosis of the stomach or intestine.

i. Chronic diseases of the liver, gall bladedr, pancreas or spleen. k. Chronic appendicitis.

Chronic peritonitis or peritoneal adhesions.

m. Chronic enlargement of the liver.

Chronic enlargement of the spleen, if marked.

Jaundice.

p. Proctitis or stricture of the rectum.

q. Hemorrhoids. r. Fistula in ano.

# (13) Pelvis:

Malformation and deformities sufficient to interfere with func-

Disease of the sacral joints.

c. Urinary fistula.

d. Stricture or prolapse of the rectum. e. Fissure of the anus or pruritis ani.

Fistula in ano or ischio-rectal abscess. External hemorrhoids sufficient in size to produce marked symtoms. Internal hemorrhoids if large or accompanied with

hemorrhage or protuding intermittently or constantly.

(14) Genito-Urinary System Including Venereal Diseases:

Acute or chronic nephritis or diabetes mellitis or insipidus. uresis or retention of urine.

Blood or pus in the urine to a marked degree.

Floating kidney, hydronephrosis, pyonephrosis, pyelitis, tumors of the kidney, or renal calculi.

Acute or chronic cystitis. d.

e. Vesical calucli, tumor of the bladder, incontinence of urine, enuresis or retention of urine.

f. Hypertrophy or abcess or the prostate gland or chronic pros-

Urethral stricture or urinary fistula.

Epispadias or hypospadias when the urine cannot be ejected without soiling of clothing or surroundings or when accompanied by evidence of chronic colon bacillus infection of the genitourinary tract.

i. Phimosis when prepuce is adherent in whole or in part to the

glands.

k. Hermaphroditism.

1. Amputation of the penis if it interferes with micturition.

m. Pronounced atrophy of the testicles or loss of both.

Undescended testicle when the organ is in the inguinal canal or when outside the canal lying against the pubic bone. Infantile genital organs.

Syphilis in any stage.

p. Chronic orchitis or epididymitis.

Gonococcus infections, acute or chronic, including gonorrheal arthritis, chancrois or buboes.

(15) The extremities:

a. All anomalies in the number, the form, the proportion and the movement of the extremities which produce noticeable reformity or interfere with function. Atrophy of the muscles of any part, if progressive or if suffi-

cient to interfere with function. Benign tumors, if sufficiently large to interfere with function. Ununited fractures, fractures with shortening or callous forma-

tion sufficient to interfere with function.

Complete or partial ankylosis.

Amputation of any portion of a limb, except fingers or toes, or resection of a joint.

Excessive curvature of a long bone, or extensive, deep or adherent scars.

Disease of the bones or joints.

i. Chronic synovitis or floating cartilage or other internal derangement in a joint.

Varicose veins in an extremity when they cover a large area or are markedly tortuous or much dilated or associated with edema, varicocele or hemorrhoids or are accompanied by subjective symptoms.

1. Varices of any kind situated in the leg below the knee if associated with varicose ulcers or scars from old ulcerations.

Chronic edema of a limb.

Deviation of the normal axis of the forearm to such a degree as to interfere with execution of the manual of arms.

Chronic neuralgia, particularly sciatica.

p. Web fingers.

q. Permanent flexion of one or more fingers as well as irremedial loss of motion of these parts if sufficient to interefere with execution of the manual of arms.

Total loss of either thumb, loss of more than one phalanx of the right index finger.

Perceptible lameness or limping.

Knock-knee, when applicant is unable to take the position of a soldier.

u. Club foot, unless defect is so slight as to produce no symptoms during vigorous exercise. Flat foot when accompanied with symtoms of weak foot or when foot is weak on test. Pronounced cases of flat foot attended with decided eversion of the foot and marked bulging of the inner border due to inward rotation of the astragalus, are disqualifying regardless of the presence or absence of subjective symptoms.

v. Loss of great toe or loss of two toes on either foot.

w. Ingrowing toenails when marked or painful.

x. Hallux valgus when sufficiently marked to interfere with locomotion or when accompanied with painful bunion.

Bunions sufficiently pronounced to interfere with function. у. Hammer toes when existing to such an extent as to interfere Z. with wearing of military shoes.

Corn or callous on the soles of the feet when they are tender or painful.

Hyperidrosis or bromidrosis. bb.

cc. Habitually sodden feet with blistered skin.

# (16) Nervous System:

aa.

Insanity, epilepsy or convulsions or any history thereof.

Idiocy, imbecility, mental deficiency or moronism (an applicant having the mental age of ten years or less).

Constitutional psychopathic state.

Chronic alcoholism or drug addicition. d.

Locomotor ataxia, paresis or cerebrospinal syphilis. e.

Multiple sclerosis, syringomyelia, paralyses, paraplegia, monof. plegia, hemiplegia or hemiparesis.

Psychoneurosis, neurasthenia, psychasthenia, hysteria, hysterical paralysis or hysterical stigmata,

Chorea or marked muscular tremors.

Somnambulism or history thereof. k. Muscular atrophies and dystrophies. Neuritis, beriberi or severe neuralgia.

m. Stuttering or stammering to such a degree as to interfere with performance of military duties.

Unequal or irregular pupils unless cause is other than neurological.

o. Brain tumors.

p. History of having been committed to an institution for the care of the insane.

History of any skull injury with secondary symtoms or any evidence of impaired nervous function.

History of excessive nervousness or depression to an undue

Injury involving peripheral nerves which result in impaired function to an extent that would interfere with performance of military duties. Other organic or severe functional diseases of the nervous sys-

- (17) Waivers: Upon the recommendation of the Medical Examiner, and when approved by the unit and organization commander, the Regimental Commander may grant waivers for certain disqualifying defects for a candidate for appointment or promotion as an officer or for an applicant for enlistment. Such waivers shall cover the grade to which the officer is appointed or promoted and shall not continue in effect for further promotion unless again granted by the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard. In the case of enlisted personnel, waivers shall be in effect only for the enlistment period covered by the waiver.
- (18) Medical Examiners: Physical examinations may be made by any medical officer, active or retired, of any of the armed forces of the United States or by any Contract Surgeon of the Iowa State Guard. If medical officers are not available in any community, the organization commander may recommend any reputable physician or surgeon to the Commanding General, Iowa State Guard, for appointment as a Contract Surgeon. Contract Surgeons shall be allowed seventy-five cents (75c) for each physical examination, which amount shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Adjutant General's Department or other funds available for such purpose. Claims for examination fees shall be submitted to the Adjutant General's Department prior to the 10th day of the month following the close of each calendar quarter (April 10, for the period January 1 to March 31; July 10, for the period April 1 to June 30; October 10, for the period July 1 to September 30; and January 10, for the period October 1 to December 31).

VIII. THE PRESCRIBED UNIFORM. The Iowa State Guard shall be equipped with such uniforms as may be prescribed hereafter.

IX. ADMINISTRATION. The business of the Iowa State Guard shall be conducted in accordance with approved military procedure, and with existing laws and regulations, and such regulations as may be prescribed in the Iowa State Guard Regulations.

## GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 3

The death of Captain James Allen, of the Iowa State Guard Staff, occurred at Des Moines, Iowa, on March 5, 1942, as a result of complications due to an appendectomy. Captain Allen was born in Maxwell, Iowa.

The following is the military service of Captain Allen in the World War and Iowa State Guard:

Enlisted in the Minnesota National Guard, April 17, 1917, First Minnesota Field Artillery.

Inducted into Federal Service June 17, 1917, as 151st Field Artillery.

Served overseas from October 18, 1917, to April 6, 1919.

Engagements: Lorraine, Champagne-Marne; St. Mihiel, Meuse-Argonne.

Second Lieutenant, United States Reserve Corps, Ordnance Department, 1923 to 1933.

Captain, Iowa State Guard, January 16, 1942, to March 5, 1942, assigned to General Tinley's Staff as Transportation Officer.

As an enlisted man of the 151st Field Artillery during the World War and as a Reserve Officer in the United States Reserve Corps and Officer in the Iowa State Guard, Captain James Allen faithfully served his State and Nation. He was loyal to his superiors, exacting in his demands and considerate of those he commanded. His natural leadership qualities and military conduct were an inspiration to those with whom he came in contact.

The Iowa State Guard sincerely mourns the loss of Captain Allen and extends sincere sympathy to the members of his family.

#### GENERAL ORDERS NUMBER 4

The death of Privates 1cl Jack W. Packard and of Robert H. Gilliland occurred on the highway southeast of Des Moines, in the early morning hours of April 10th, 1942, as the result of an automobile accident.

Private 1cl Packard was born in Centerville, Iowa, on February 7th, 1917.

Private 1cl Gilliland was born in Centerville, Iowa, on October 22nd, 1911.

Both Private 1cl Packard and Private 1cl Gilliland were married; and both enlisted in the Iowa State Guard in Headquarters Company, Second Battalion, First Regiment, on January 5th, 1942.

These enlisted men were serving on detail duty with the Provisional Military Police Battalion, in training at Camp Dodge, Iowa, at the time of their death. Privates 1cl Packard and Giland were faithfully serving their state; they were loyal to their superiors and were considered excellent soldiers.

- 3. Procurement of commissioned and enlisted personnel for the organization of the Supply Company, Iowa State Guard, will be in accordance wth paragraphs 1 and 2, Section IV, General Orders Number 1, Headquarters, Iowa State Guard, dated February 11, 1942.
